Solving The Riddle Of AIDS

NASA-Industry Team Aims to Solve the Structure of HIV

The World Health Organization estimates that 13 million people have been infected with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), which causes Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), with an additional one million children infected perinatally. These numbers may triple by the year 2000. A critical component of the struggle to combat the AIDS pandemic is elucidating the precise molecular structure of the virus. A unique collaboration between NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center and American Bio-Technologies (ABT) Inc., Cambridge, MA, aims to provide such structural data on an unprecedented scale.

The research project will employ advanced high-resolution x-ray crystallography technology and expertise developed at Marshall to build a three-dimensional atomic model of HIV. "This is crucial for designing inhibitory drugs and other therapies, developing vaccines, and improving diagnostic tools," said ABT president Simon McKenzie.

The resulting data could help provide a more complete understanding of antibody structure and antibody-antigen interaction. "From the perspective of drug design, this is absolutely imperative because the virus has turned out to be much more complicated than was anticipated," said Dr. Daniel Carter, leader of the Marshall research team. "In the end, it's probably going to come down to understanding the detailed interactions of these proteins at a molecular level."

NASA's association with ABT began shortly after Marshall researchers determined the first structure of a human

monoclonal antibody that recognizes the AIDS virus. The antibody, Fab 3D6, binds to a coat protein in HIV-1 known as GP41. Carter approached ABT in hopes that it could provide a larger fragment of GP41 to extend the analysis to the protein-antibody complex. McKenzie, who was impressed by

well as HTLV-1 and HTLV-2, both human leukemia viruses, and SIV-1, which causes AIDS in the green monkey. "It's been eight years since the viral genome was determined for HIV-1 and still only two of the protein structures are known," said Carter. "If we succeed in determining just one there

Marshall's successes in crystallizing proteins, suggested broadening the project's scope.

"He asked if we would like to have them all—all the proteins of HIV-1, HIV-2, and the related retroviruses—which was just incredible," recalled Carter. "Most crystallographers feel fortunate to have one or two. Altogether, the project will have access to 100 recombinant proteins and antibodies—as far as I know, there's no collaboration like this anywhere else in the world."

Marshall researchers will receive proteins from the two strains of HIV as

will be 50 percent more information available."

ABT, a 28-person bioengineering firm founded in 1987, is a worldwide supplier of recombinant HIV proteins but does not conduct structural AIDS research on its own. "It's a very unusual project," said McKenzie. "Most people only contemplate trying to analyze one protein because the process is very difficult, arcane, and fraught with disappointments."

The x-ray crystallography technique involves passing an x-ray beam through

X-ray diffraction of crystals such as this one of a human monoclonal antibody bound to part of the AIDS virus can yield clues to molecular architecture and, in turn, ways to design drugs, vaccines, and diagnostic tools.

single protein crystals repeatedly to obtain hundreds of diffraction patterns. These patterns, created as the atoms within the crystal scatter the x-rays, are compiled and analyzed on a computer to assemble a model of the protein's molecular architecture.

Success depends upon the production of large, high-quality crystals of the proteins. Unfortunately, each protein presents a new challenge and unique solubility characteristics. "We grow them by screening literally thousands of different conditions—changing pH and precipitating agents to reduce solubility, varying temperature, protein concentration, and other variables," explained Carter, who received NASA's 1990 Inventor of the Year award for using x-ray crystallography to solve the 3D structure of human serum albumin, the principal blood protein. "The result is a gigantic matrix and you have no idea if or where the crystals are going to grow."

Marshall's new 7500-square-foot Laboratory for Structural Biology, scheduled to open in November, will provide added work space and computer graphics facilities for the massive undertaking. The new laboratory will support the group's microgravity research on the space shuttle, which also may benefit the AIDS project. "The microgravity experiments assess quality differences between crystals grown at 0g versus 1g," explained Carter. "It's now well established that some crystals grow better at 0g. The likelihood is very high that microgravity will benefit the crystal growth of some of the AIDS-related proteins."

Carter expects the research to have spinoffs in a variety of areas. "These other viruses [HTLV-1 and HTLV-2] cause cancer and I think future researchers will find that many specific types of cancers are caused by retroviruses—understanding how to stop them is extremely important." Concurring is the National Institutes of Health, which has called structural biology a "linchpin in US biotechnology research" providing critical insights into molecular function that can speed the search for means to prevent or cure diseases. □

On behalf of Washington State's AIDS Services and Prevention Coalition (ASAP), we would like to congratulate you on your recent appointment as National AIDS Policy Coordinator for the Clinton Administration.

As the former Secretary of the Washington State Department of Health, you are especially familiar with the ASAP Coalition, its purposes, and priorities. We wish to take this opportunity, however, to provide you with a detailed outline of our views, hopes, and expectations regarding a coordinated federal response to HIV and AIDS.

In general, we write to you to encourage your support for a more determined and better coordinated federal response to the epidemic of HIV and AIDS. More specifically, we ask for your support to expand the resources available for the prevention of HIV infection; for the cost-effective treatment and care of those with HIV disease; for supportive, non-medical service needs of individuals and families affected by HIV; and for research leading to effective therapeutic treatments, vaccines, and ultimately a cure for AIDS.

Each of these priority areas is an equally important element of an effectively coordinated federal response to the HIV/AIDS epidemic. ASAP believes that it is critically important that each priority area be fully supported and not forced to compete with other priority areas for adequate funding and support. Each priority area must also respond to the unique needs of populations most at risk and most affected by HIV and AIDS, including men who have sex with men, persons of color, injection drug users, women, and the developmentally disabled. Federal programs must also recognize and deal with the unique challenges of cultural diversity, language barriers, and the growing need for services in rural communities.

In order to achieve these goals, ASAP believes that our nation must have a National AIDS Action Plan which fully implements all recommendations of the National Commission on AIDS and initiates a program aimed at producing a cure for AIDS with the same enthusiasm that landed American astronauts on the moon. President Clinton should initiate this process with a major television address outlining the administration's National AIDS Action Plan.

Elements of the National AIDS Action Plan must include:

- a plan for dealing with the trilateral epidemic of AIDS, TB, and homelessness;
- an end to discrimination against persons with HIV by lifting travel and immigration restrictions and by fully implementing the ADA;
- protection of the interests of PLWAs in the process of implementing health care system reform;
- federal support for syringe exchange programs and other targeted, community-based prevention programs without federal restrictions on the content of prevention materials;
- funding for substance abuse treatment on demand;
- a print and electronic media campaign with explicit prevention messages that is broadcast in the "prime-time" market.

Implementation of the National AIDS Action Plan will require full funding for all titles of the Ryan White Care Act and a doubling of the resources available to states and locales for targeted education and prevention programs, including HIV antibody counseling and testing. Funding for the AIDS Housing Opportunities Act must be increased to prevent the homelessness of persons with AIDS. AIDS research funding for the National Institutes for Health must be increased to support expanded clinical trials and vaccine research.

We know that Congress and the Administration face enormous challenges grappling with our nation's lagging economy, the federal budget deficit and the urgency of health care system reform. However, twelve years of executive level neglect of the HIV and AIDS epidemic must be transformed immediately into national leadership and resolution to, at last, face this crisis directly.

Determined effort and leadership now can only mean an ultimate cost savings to the federal government by reducing the number of persons afflicted with AIDS who require care; retaining those citizens as productive contributors to our nation's well-being; and reducing the costs of care for those who inevitably are faced with the devastating consequences of AIDS.

Kristine, on behalf of all the members of ASAP and our dedicated, hard-working staff and volunteers, we wish you well in your role as National AIDS Policy Coordinator and offer our assistance in any way possible as you face the challenges ahead of you.

Clinton's new AIDS czar is U-M doctoral candidate

WASHINGTON — President Clinton today named Kristine Gebbie, a former state health administrator, to be the nation's first AIDS czar, saying the nation must "look for unprecedented remedies to unprecedented problems."

"We must redouble our government's efforts to promote research, funding and treatment for AIDS," Clinton said in a ceremony on the White House south lawn.

He called Gebbie, whose formal title will be AIDS policy coordinator, "a proven health-care leader" who will bring years of experience to the

job.

Gebbie, a doctoral candidate in health policy at the University of Michigan and a former nursing professor, served as the Washington state secretary of health from 1989 until leaving the post this spring.

She currently chairs the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's AIDS advisory committee, which is reviewing all of the center's AIDS programs.

She will oversee a \$2.7 billion effort to combat the disease and lend comfort to its victims.

"This position has never existed before but circumstances now require us to look for unprecedented remedies to unprecedented prob-

lems," Clinton said.

The appointment would "assure our nation no longer ignores an epidemic that has already claimed too many of our brothers and sisters, our parents and children, our

friends and colleagues," he said.

Gebbie said she was "thrilled to have a chance" to work on the problem.

"We've all been working a balancing act with this epidemic for a long

time," she said. "For too long, most of that balancing and coordination has had to happen at the local level."

Health and Human Services Secretary Donna Shalala said the appointment "sends a very clear message that health care in this country is very much the responsibility of health professionals, not just doctors but nurses and other kinds of health providers."

Gebbie steps into a post that so far has existed only in title. The authority and duties have not been publicly defined.

"I think the nature of the job description will determine the effectiveness of that job," said Dr. June

Osborn, the chairwoman of the National Commission on AIDS and dean of the U-M School of Public Health. She called Gebbie a "very able person."

Candidate Clinton pledged support for AIDS research, government help for victims and to push to end discrimination against those infected with the virus. He also promised to appoint a policy coordinator, or AIDS czar, to oversee those efforts.

Although the AIDS community initially was hopeful because of Clinton's election, it has expressed increasing impatience for faster action from the administration.
