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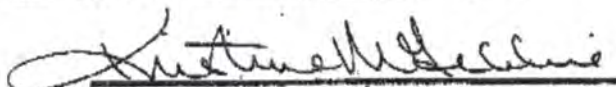

1. The undersigned (the "Prospective Nominee"), by his or her signature below, acknowledges and consents to consideration by the President of the United States for appointment or nomination to a position within the Executive Branch.
2. The Prospective Nominee agrees that, following completion of a preliminary investigation into the Prospective Nominee's background using procedures established by the Office of White House Counsel, the Prospective Nominee may be identified publicly as a person the President intends to nominate for appointment to a position in the Executive Branch, and consents to such identification.
3. The Prospective Nominee further agrees that, notwithstanding such identification: (i) the Prospective Nominee will not, at such time, have actually been nominated by the President; (ii) an investigation into the personal and financial background of the Nominee will continue, including but not limited to completion of an investigation by the FBI or another organization doing security investigations for the United States government; (iii) the Prospective Nominee will have no vested interest of any kind in the position for which he or she is considered; (iv) consideration of the Prospective Nominee may be withdrawn at any time by the President; and (v) upon completion of all investigation into the Prospective Nominee's background, the Prospective Nominee may be asked, as part of his or her confirmation or appointment, to divest certain assets, to resign certain positions, and/or to agree to recuse himself or herself from involvement in matters which may arise in the conduct of Prospective Nominee's official duties.

KRISTINE M. GEBBIE
Candidate for AIDS Czar

I. Introduction

Kristine M. Gebbie was Secretary of the Washington State Department of Health from 1989 until the spring of 1993, when she was replaced by incoming Democratic Governor Mike Lowry. She has also been a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Washington School of Nursing since 1990 and an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Oregon Health Science University School of Nursing since 1980.

II. Biographical Information and Professional Record

Ms. Gebbie received her B.S. in Nursing from St. Olaf College in Minnesota in 1965 and her M.S. in Nursing from the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA) in 1968. She is currently a Ph.D. candidate in Health Policy at the University of Michigan School of Public Health.

After graduation in 1968, Ms. Gebbie began a teaching career as an instructor and lecturer at UCLA's School of Nursing. She left in 1972 to become an Assistant Professor of Nursing, and later an Associate Clinical Professor, at St. Louis University in Missouri. During that time, Ms. Gebbie was also directing a program to prepare nurses for practice in varying environments that was funded by a United States Public Health Service Training Grant. In 1974, Ms. Gebbie undertook the added responsibility of coordinating the operation of all outpatient clinics for St. Louis University Hospital. Two years later, she was promoted to Assistant Director of the hospital, where she remained until 1978.

From 1978 to 1989, Ms. Gebbie served the State of Oregon first as Assistant Director for Health and then as Administrator of the Oregon Health Division. In 1989, she was appointed by Democratic Governor Booth Gardner to serve as Secretary of the Washington State Department of Health.

Ms. Gebbie has been active in a number of professional organizations, including the American Public Health Association and the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO). She was President of ASTHO in 1984 and 1985 and Chair of its HIV Committee from 1985 to 1988. Ms. Gebbie is currently the Chair of the Centers for Disease Control's Advisory Committee on the Prevention of the HIV Infection and a member of the editorial board of the Journal of Public Health Policy. From 1987 to 1990, she was on the AIDS Oversight Committee at the Institute of Medicine. In 1988, President Reagan appointed Ms. Gebbie to serve on

the Presidential Commission on the HIV Epidemic, under the direction of Admiral James Watkins.

III. Views and Philosophy

Ms. Gebbie has been a prolific speaker and writer about HIV and AIDS since the early days of the disease. The public record indicates that Ms. Gebbie is primarily concerned with promoting education to stop the spread of HIV and ending discrimination against those who have the disease.

While most of her views can be considered in the mainstream of public health professionals, Ms. Gebbie has offered some provocative ideas and suggestions. In a 1988 lecture at the University of Missouri Law School at Kansas City entitled "AIDS and Government: Regulation of Sexual Behavior", she said "we must find a way to support sustained changes in behavior in an intimate, private, essential part of life, and do so without irreparably violating social norms." Ms. Gebbie advocated a greater commitment of resources to study sexual behavior, particularly among homosexuals, so that AIDS education strategies can be better targeted. She also stated that societal inhibitions need to be overcome in order to develop effective educational tools.

As part of her recommendations, Ms. Gebbie endorsed the use of specifically erotic video tape materials as "helpful in teaching safer sex practices in some detail to gay men." She admitted that "this material would be labeled pornographic by many in our social system and a few politicians have made a great deal of political hay out of assuring us that our tax dollars are not 'misspent' in this terrible way." Nevertheless, Ms. Gebbie concluded that "to stop HIV we must be able to speak explicitly to all groups of sexually active individuals and to do so in a language that will be effective." She asked rhetorically of her critics, "Is this a flouting of our basic values or is it an acknowledgement of the value of all life?"

Ms. Gebbie has been on the leading edge of many issues surrounding HIV. She faults government officials in general for the promotion of research and treatment over education, arguing that the latter is "less specific than buying or building a piece of equipment, and it's hard to quantify." According to a 1986 report in The Los Angeles Times, Ms. Gebbie headed a ASTHO committee report that recommended collecting the names of individuals infected with HIV and notifying their sexual contacts. The recommendation was attacked by the National Gay Task Force and the American Association of Physicians for Human Rights as potentially having "seriously damaging consequences." Ms. Gebbie responded by saying opponents were "overreacting" and had failed to realize that the proposals were only "a framework [and] a suggestion" and "not radical new things." She also emphasized the public health community's "long-time history" of keeping records confidential to prevent

discrimination. In a subsequent article entitled "Guide to Public Health Practice: AIDS Confidentiality and Anti-Discrimination Principles," Ms. Gebbie wrote that "ensuring the confidentiality of HIV-related information is critical to maintaining and promoting public confidence in the public health system." She also called for penalties for any "unauthorized disclosure of HIV-related information" by public or private organizations.

As early as 1987, as Oregon Health Administrator, Ms. Gebbie actively promoted the use of condom advertising on radio and television as a way to stem the spread of HIV. In 1989, the Oregon Health Division developed an advertising campaign aimed at bringing anti-AIDS messages to four high-risk groups. According to a report by United Press International, members of the AIDS Coalition to Unleash Power (ACT-UP) were "upset that none of the material specifically use[d] the word 'gay.'" Ms. Gebbie responded that the use of the word "would alienate men who have sex with other men on occasion but who do not identify themselves as homosexuals." "Gay" remained out of the campaign because those men were specifically targets for the messages. In the late 1980s, Ms. Gebbie also supported the development of a poster for education in the gay community that showed two nicely dressed men with their arms around each other and the slogan "We Can Live Together--The Best Weapon We Have Against AIDS Is Ourselves." The transit advertising company in Oregon pulled the poster because of purported outcry over public display of homosexuality.

In 1987, Ms. Gebbie was appointed by President Reagan to the Presidential Commission on the HIV Epidemic (the AIDS Commission). She filled one of two vacancies created by the resignation of the original chairman and vice chairman, who cited a lack of administration support for the commission as the reason for leaving. The Los Angeles Times reported that "gay rights spokesmen and others...were pleasantly surprised" by Ms. Gebbie's appointment. The article stated that Ms. Gebbie was "a strong proponent of education and prevention to curtail the epidemic, and she advocates voluntary--rather than mandatory--testing for AIDS infection." A spokesman for the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force said that Ms. Gebbie would "add a voice of reason to what is otherwise an unreasonable group of people." Representative Henry Waxman (D-CA) called her "a thoughtful and diligent advisor on AIDS policy." Ms. Gebbie was appointed even after attacking then-Secretary of Education William Bennett for entering the debate on proper AIDS education. "I think Secretary Bennett should stick to education and leave public health to Surgeon General (C. Everett) Koop," United Press International quoted her as saying.

Ms. Gebbie suggested that the AIDS Commission adopt recommendations calling for legislation that would enable the Surgeon General to request the President to declare public health emergencies and, upon such a declaration, would require the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services to designate a "special

assistant Secretary of Health" for a term of one year. The proposal was not adopted. Ms. Gebbie was a strong proponent of the AIDS Commission's recommendation for legislation to prohibit discrimination against HIV-infected people and was a vocal critic of President Reagan's dismissal of the Commission's findings. A 1988 article in The Washington Post quoted her as saying the Reagan Administration's response sounded "like somebody missed the point we were trying to make...It may be that we'll have to wait for a new administration."

In 1989, Ms. Gebbie published an article entitled "The President's Commission on AIDS: What Did It Do?" in which she concluded that it "did not do much, if anything, to bring [President Reagan] into the HIV response, possibly because he is so shielded by the conservative voice." She was proud, however, that the AIDS Commission "may have taken some of the wind out of the sails of extremists in Congress by failing to give them any additional weapons." Ms. Gebbie also credited the AIDS Commission for helping to "translate the epidemic into language which is accessible for many citizens" and for reinforcing the central role the public health system should play in the debate. She detailed a number of specific criticisms of the Reagan Administration's approach, including the "failure to offer each child born a comprehensive health and health education program...and [the] failure to really understand the dangers of creating a permanent underclass." Concerning funding for HIV research and programs, Ms. Gebbie concluded that "it is probably not that HIV gets too much, but that other [health] issues get too little." "On balance," she concluded, "I think this Commission did an incredible job."

Ms. Gebbie has also taken strong positions with respect to a woman's right to choose to terminate a pregnancy. In 1991, after the U.S. Supreme Court upheld the constitutionality of a federal regulation prohibiting family planning agencies that accept federal funding from informing women about abortion, Ms. Gebbie wrote an op-ed piece in The Seattle Times denouncing the decision. "Every woman has the right to choose which courses of action fit her life the best," she wrote. In 1992, Ms. Gebbie announced that the Washington State Department of Health would circumvent the regulation by ensuring that the determination of pregnancy and any subsequent counseling in local family planning programs was state funded, not federally funded. "It [will be] business as usual," a published news release quoted Ms. Gebbie as saying. "We cannot let...the 'gag rule' prevent pregnant women from having complete information on their options." Ms. Gebbie took a similar step in Oregon in 1983 when the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services established regulations requiring parental notification if minor children received certain federally financed family planning services. An Associated Press report said the state would provide birth control services to girls under 18 in order "to preserve teen-agers' confidentiality."

IV. Noteworthy Events

There are a few reports in the public record of events that occurred during Ms. Gebbie's service in Oregon and Washington that are noteworthy.

In 1985, as Oregon Health Division Administrator, Ms. Gebbie fired State Medical Examiner Dr. William Brady for selling skin samples and organs from cadavers to pay for office parties and furniture and for performing private autopsies using public facilities. Dr. Brady denied any wrongdoing, repaid the state \$17,000, and was eventually cleared by the State Board of Medical Examiners. He sued Ms. Gebbie for defamation of character and wrongful discharge and requested \$2.5 million in damages. A 1986 United Press International article reported that Dr. Brady said he "was denied a fair hearing...[and that Ms.] Gebbie's actions held him up to ridicule and forced him to seek psychiatric care for depression." Another UPI article reported that Ms. Gebbie did allow Dr. Brady and his chief deputy, Dr. Larry Lewman, to present "compelling evidence" in their favor before making a final decision. After the hearing, Dr. Brady was fired, but Dr. Lewman was not.

The case went to trial and, as the Associated Press reported, the jury "ruled that [Ms.] Gebbie deprived [Dr.] Brady of his constitutionally protected liberty interests without due process of law" when she fired him. In 1989, the U.S. Supreme Court let stand the Court of Appeals ruling upholding the award. Ms. Gebbie had appealed on the grounds that the Appeals Court ruling put government employers in an "untenable position" and, further, that she was entitled to qualified immunity and acted in good faith. There is no indication in the public record about any post-judgment negotiations or payment.

There is also one report from The Business Journal of Portland that indicated that in 1987 Ms. Gebbie withdrew herself from the selection of a Portland hospital to house a new state trauma center because of "a possible conflict of interest." There is no further elaboration in the public record. Also while in Oregon, Ms. Gebbie in 1986 sent a bill for \$73,060 to then-Soviet Union President Mikhail Gorbachev for monitoring fallout from the nuclear accident at Chernobyl. Nothing in the public record suggests that there was ever a response.

V. Summary and Analysis

The public record portrays Kristine Gebbie as a highly qualified public health expert who has been a leader in the fight against HIV and AIDS during her years in public service. Her views generally appear to be within the mainstream of the public health community, but her advocacy of educational tools such as sexually explicit video tapes and research of intimate homosexual behavior could be considered provocative and controversial. Some of her other views, such as increased

advertising for the use of condoms, might be attacked by conservative groups. In addition, some of her actions as Oregon Health Division Administrator could be used by some groups to oppose her nomination.

A review of the available public record reveals no additional information that may reflect negatively on Ms. Gebbie's nomination as AIDS Czar.
