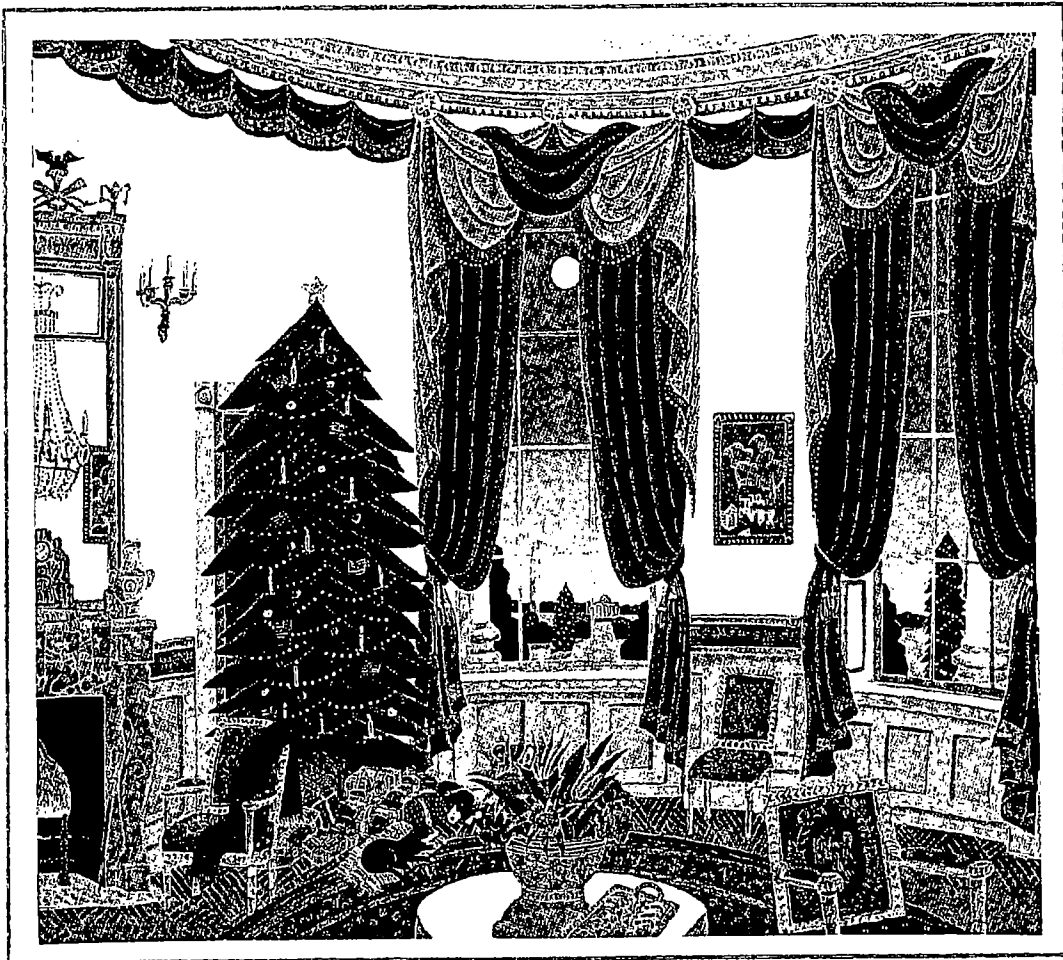

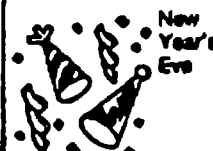

Dear Mr. President and Mrs. Clinton:

Thank you so much for including me in one of your Christmas parties this year. It is always such an honor - and I mean that, even as a cynical journalist - to enjoy the beauty of the people's house and the hospitality of the First Family during the holidays.

When I went through the photo line, I thanked you for something else that is more important. But because time was short and you had many hours of standing there ahead of you it was not the place to talk. Hence this letter.

I am so proud of you for standing up on behalf of Medicare. Not just holding back the deepest cuts but defending the very concept of the system. Sen. Bob Dole was wrong: it HAS worked, and worked fabulously. It has prolonged American lives and saved millions from bankruptcy.

I don't think most voters understand that not just numbers are at stake in this issue but the existence of the most basic safety net for the middle class.

I was the Hearst Newspapers White House correspondent during the Kennedy and Johnson administrations. I covered much of the battle for passage of Medicare and Medicaid. The Republicans and conservative Southerners, in thrall to the doctors and insurance industry and constipated by their ideology, were opposed to it then, and still are.

I was there in the Cabinet room when President Johnson finally forced old Harry Byrd to publicly agree to letting it come to a Senate vote. Johnson made it sound as though Byrd were humanitarian of the century; the senator, who had resisted for decades, did not have the grace to be embarrassed.

Johnson managed it only by making the massage of Byrd a priority, milking the fresh emotions of the Kennedy legacy - and paying a heavy political price. He had to abandon cost controls.

Johnson was well aware this meant trouble ahead. "The important thing is to get the concept on the books," Johnson told me. "We can worry about the details later."

It appalls me that the Republicans want to undercut and eventually destroy Medicare, let alone Medicaid, without adequate public debate over the merits of their privatization scheme. It took thirty years to put Medicare in place; it should not be wiped out for a mess of potage in a political nanosecond.

If the subject were fully aired, I feel confident the whole revisionist scenario would be handily rejected by voters. Give us the minor problems in a system we know and trust, backed by the federal government, rather than a return to the days of insurance scams and impoverishment in old age.

I have written about this, but editors pick and choose which of my columns to run, and this subject is among their least favorite. Alas, I have not been able to make it exciting; this is no doubt one of your problems too.

P6(b)(6)

I just wanted you to know that on this subject you both have a big fan and I hope that you will not get discouraged. In the long sweep of history, Johnson's failure in Vietnam will be balanced by his foresight and political skill in giving Americans the financial stability of Medicare and Medicaid. I hope your own reputation will come to be based partly on KEEPING the system he won for us.

May your new year be successful in every way.

OUTSTANDING LISTS

I have asked the NSC for a list of names and addresses of those individuals who have worked on the recent peace negotiations. I have requested of Betsy Ebeling that the convention people in Chicago compile a list of contacts in the Chicago area whose assistance will be useful during the convention. I have discussed with Joe Trahern in Political Affairs a list of names from Iowa. Public Liaison has called to say that staff in that office are suddenly aware that a holiday card is going out and they have failed to submit a number of names. I have asked that if possible these names be submitted to me on contact labels. I realize that this does not look as good as the hand-addressed, but I believe that we are at the point where perfection must give way to expediency.

Even with the requests listed above, we will have by my estimation 70,000 cards remaining. We need to determine today or tomorrow at the latest the best possible use for these cards. Should I contact Political Affairs and ask that them to request a set number of names from their state contacts?

Should we ask for a few names from every state or simply confine the numbers to key states?

POSTAGE

I have listed below the amount spent to date on postage. Joe Trahern from Political Affairs assures me that he is more than willing to discuss postage with the DNC - if it comes to that.

**WHITE HOUSE CHRISTMAS 1995 CELEBRATES THE CLASSIC CHRISTMAS POEM
"A VISIT FROM ST. NICHOLAS"**

WASHINGTON, DC -- **"TWAS THE NIGHT BEFORE CHRISTMAS, WHEN ALL THROUGH THE HOUSE..."** is the theme for this year's Christmas at the White House. Ornaments for the White House Christmas trees have been donated by architects, needlepointers/embroiderers, culinary schools, and elementary schools.

"WHEN ALL THROUGH THE HOUSE..." The hundreds of ornaments decorating the White House Christmas tree, an 18 1/2 foot Fraser fir located in the Blue Room, were donated by members of the American Institute of Architects and architecture students. The ornaments depict the architects' vision of "all through the house." 271 AIA Chapters and 162 architecture schools from around the United States donated an estimated 600 ornaments for the Blue Room tree.

"STOCKINGS WERE HUNG BY THE CHIMNEY WITH CARE..." 204 needlepoint and embroidered stockings are also hung with care on the Blue Room tree. The stockings were made by the American Needlepoint Guild and the Embroiderers Guild of America. The stockings vary in size and are the design of the individual needlepointer/embroiderer featuring images from the poem.

"WHILE VISIONS OF SUGAR PLUMBS..." The four 17 foot trees in the Grand Foyer of the White House are decorated with ornaments from culinary schools. The estimate 2000 gingerbread, marzipan, sugar, cookie dough, salt dough, pastillage and chocolate ornaments were donated by both career and professional culinary programs as well as nonvocational culinary programs.

"THE CHILDREN WERE NESTLED ALL SNUG IN THEIR BEDS..." Master White House Pastry Chefs Roland Mesnier and Franett McCullouch have created First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton's childhood home in Parkridge, Illinois. Located in the State Dining Room, the 70 pound ginger bread house features rooms decorated for Christmas complete with stockings hung from the mantel with care and children all snug in their beds.

The tree skirt for the Blue Room tree consists of individual quilted panels representing each of the fifty states, territories and the District of Columbia. The quilted hunter green velvet panels are each uniquely designed, using a variety of quilting techniques.

STOCKING STUFFER TIPS:

- o There are 40,280 white lights used on the Christmas trees throughout the White House. 5,040 of which are used on the Blue Room tree.
- o The mantels in the Green Room and the Red Room are decorated by two groups from the Washington Architectural Forum Architecture in the Schools and Community Design Services. The forum was established by the Washington, DC Chapter of the AIA to encourage and foster public participation and involvement in the built environment of the Washington metropolitan area.
- o The traditional White House creche is the focal point of the East Room. The creche was made in Naples, Italy in the late 18th century and features 47 carved wood and terra cotta figures. The creche was a gift to the White House from Mrs. Charles Engelhard, Jr. of Far Hills, NJ, and has been displayed at the White House since 1967.
- o The White House Menorah will be in the West Wing. The Menorah was designed by craft artisan Zachary Oxman of Hillsboro, Virginia.
- o The trees in the Diplomatic Reception Room will be decorated by the Department of Education's Blue Ribbon Schools. The Blue Ribbon School Program, sponsored by the United States Department of Education, recognizes and supports primary and secondary schools that are noted for their exceptional arts education programs.

1995 WHITE HOUSE CHRISTMAS CARD FEATURES THE BLUE ROOM

Washington, DC -- The 1995 White House Christmas Card is a reproduction of Thomas McKnight's "White House Blue Room." Featuring the Blue Room, the casein on canvas painting was done especially for this year's Holiday Card. (Casein is the mixing of paint pigment with a milk protein.) The card was printed by American Greetings at its Corbin, Kentucky plant and will be sent to approximately 300,000 families.

American artist Thomas McKnight who lives in Palm Beach, Florida and Litchfield, Connecticut, also created last years Holiday Card, which featured the Red Room. Mr. McKnight began working of this year's Holiday Card in February. In 1982, McKnight was one of thirty artists selected to paint easter eggs for a White House and Smithsonian exhibit, and his 1988 serigraph "Constitution" was chosen as the official image for the U.S. Constitution Bicentennial. A print of the serigraph by McKnight hangs in the private quarters of the White House.

The Democratic National Committee paid for all production and mailing cost associated with this year's card. Reproduction of the 1995 White House Christmas Card must credit the artist, Thomas McKnight.

OF INTEREST:

- Stockings for the President, Mrs. Clinton and Chelsea are hung on the mantel.
- Socks, the first cat, is sitting beside the fire.
- Sleeping under the Christmas Tree is "Shadow" the McKnight family dog.
- The painting on the wall is of the view from the McKnight's home in Litchfield, Connecticut looking at the historic Inn which President George Washington overnighted.

o How tall is the tree?

The tree is 18 1/2 tall and weighs 600 pounds. The tree will be place in the Blue Room.

o Where is the tree from?

The Fraser Fir is from Ashe County North Carolina and was grown by Ron Hudler and Danny Dollar. This is the first time they have ever entered a state or national contest.

o When will the tree be decorated?

The tree will be moved into the Blue Room on Thursday, November 30th after the last public tour of the White House. The White House will be officially closed on December 1st and 2nd as approximately 40 volunteers decorate for the holiday season.

o What is this year's holiday theme at the White House?

The theme for the holiday decorations is a surprise which will be officially unveiled at the pres preview at 10:00 AM Monday, December 4th at 10:00 AM.

NOTE: The tree is being presented to you at the South Portico this year so that we get a different picture. If someone should ask why the tree is coming up the south driveway, a possible answer is, "Our most important arrival ceremonies are held on the South Lawn. This is certainly an important arrival and a much anticipated White House guest!"

On Monday morning at 10:00 AM you will unveil the White House Christmas decorations. We will rotate press into the Blue Room in three wave (1) still photographers only, (2) writers and tv correspondents with camera crews, (3) writers and tv correspondents with camera crews. Nancy Clarke will be available if there are any specific questions that you may have about the decorations.

Following the preview in the Blue Room you will have the option to move to the State Dining Room for a photo opportunity with Roland and Franette beside the ginger bread house.

The following are suggested talking points:

- o It takes three days to decorate the White House for the Holiday Season. The White House closed after the last tour on Thursday, December 1 and decorating is completed by noon on Sunday. This is the only time the White House closes to tours other than government holidays.

- o The theme for the White House Christmas is "The Twelve Days of Christmas." You should tell the story of your family acting out Christmas Carols.

- o The Christmas tree located in the East Visitors' entrance of the White House is decorated with ornaments crafted by students from Blue Ribbon Schools, a school recognition and improvement program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education.

- o The tree in the Blue Room is from Clinton County, Missouri. It is a Colorado Blue Spruce and is 18 1/2 feet tall. It is decorated with ornaments donated by students who attend college/university art and design schools and by members of the National Society of Tole and Decorative Painters. The students and tole painters designed ornaments in any way their imaginations and talents would take them. We asked only that they remain true to the spirit of the original Christmas Carol.

-- Art Schools - Every University/College that had an art department was contacted. Approximately 100 design schools participated.

-- Tole Painting - A general term historically used to describe decorative painting on tin surfaces. This general definition has grown to encompass many painting styles, methods, techniques and mediums. The National Society of Tole and Decorative Painters has more than 30,000 members.

- o There are 40,280 lights used to decorate the Christmas Trees, 5,040 of those lights are on the Blue Room Tree.

- o The Blue Room Christmas Tree skirt is green velvet and contains quilted pieces representing each of the 50 states, territories and the District of Columbia.

- o The Blue Room tree has a youthful innocence about it. It has the same magical feel as this year's Christmas Card.

- o The White House Christmas Card, "White House Christmas," is of the Red Room and was done by American artist Thomas McKnight. The card was printed by American Greetings at its Corbin, Kentucky plant.

NOTE: McKnight's painting, "White House Christmas," will be temporarily placed on an easel in the Red Room.

- o The Ginger Bread House is made of approximately 70 pounds of ginger bread and, because of its size, had to be constructed in the China Room. Nothing is used that isn't edible.

Possible Questions:

Why did the White House contact Ralph Lauren to help with decorating for the holidays?

- o Ralph Lauren and his creative team are well known for creating classic traditional decor. They were very generous with their time and talent. Ralph Lauren is certainly the designer with the greatest name recognition, but over the past two weeks we've been fortunate to have floral/interior designers from all over the country helping prepare/decorate for the holidays.

NOTE: Contacting Ralph Lauren is a continuation of your philosophy of asking the best and brightest to lend their talents and time to the "Peoples House." Who knows, the next fashion design sensation may be one of the students who contributed an ornament to the White House.

What happens to the ornaments after Christmas?

- o The ornaments become part of the White House permanent holiday collection. There is a Christmas tree on the ground floor that is decorated with Angel ornaments which were donated last year.

What are your families plans for Christmas? Will you be in Arkansas, Washington or Camp David?

Is there a menorah at the White House?

o Yes. One of last years craft artist designed a very joyful menorah which is on display in the West Wing. Also, may staff has a menorah in their offices in the OEOB.

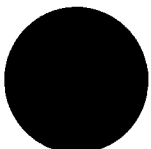
