Here are some ideas for upcoming column/s and notes from meeting with HRC last Thursday. Thought I'd put this out so you can be pondering the variables before our meeting on Wed.

The column deadline we'll be focusing on in our meeting is Tuesday, January 20.

That week, as of Thursday's planning meeting, these are the events possibly on her calendar.

Service Project at MCI Center with children

Announcement of "Saving Our Treasures"

Goucher Race Speech

## Service Project:

Could be a great event, but she will just have done a column on service tied to the Medal of Freedom Winners. The plan is to start with MLK's call to service and move on to celebrate lives of service, not just the MoF winners, but also Service Corps Award winners. (Michael is trying to find out about this.)

If we stick to MoF in the first column, we can still do the Service Project at MCI Center, but otherwise, it is probably redundant.

One approach could be to talk about people who've spent their entire lives in service in the first column. In the second column, take it back to the rest of us - kids, service corps workers, HRC - and make that column a call to service in the spirit of MLK. (Remember, we have two MLK pegs: his real birthday which is the day the

President announces MoF and the fed holiday, which is the day of the Service Project.)

### Saving Our Treasures

When we talked about the column due the night of the State of the Union, HRC clearly wanted to focus on Treasures. But, she didn't, at that point, have on her schedule a SOT event the previous week.

I will speak with Ellen about her thoughts on the Millenium and the column (there was a Millenium column on 2/25/97). We need to try to devise a tentative strategy on this as there will be so many Millenium-inspired events this year and next. Already, we know about the lecture on Feb. 11, and possible Preservation and Trails Events.

There will obviously be more than one column.

The question is: Do we do Treasures this week, or wait until the SoU speech next week?

### Goucher Event

HRC didn't seem very interested in this.

### DC Event and \$ in Budget

HRC is very interested in this. If there is a DC event this week, and if it's not jumping the gun to announce the \$ in the speech, this is probably a good week for DC. Then we would do the Treasures in the SoU column next week.

Bobbie, Christy, Laura, Michael and I met yesterday to talk about a process for the column. After that, I met with Melanne to get her input.

First, we agreed that a weekly meeting with Bobbie, Christy, Laura, Michael, Jen and/or Nicole, and me would be useful to discuss upcoming topic ideas. We have scheduled this meeting for Wednesdays at 10 a.m. in Bobbie's office.

At that meeting, we will try to come up with three ideas for the next week's column. I will then send you and Melanne a memo detailing the three ideas. When I get word back from you or Melanne with a decision, Michael can begin to collect material. He wants to get started on that as early after Wednesday's meeting as possible.

I trust that among these ideas will be some that aren't suitable for the current week, but would make good topics at some point. If you agree, I will proceed to work on those for our "evergreen" file.

Yes No After I have a draft, I will send it to you or Melanne simultaneously. Christy and Laura would also like to see drafts as we may be working on the same topics.

We also talked about topics for upcoming weeks.

Next week is the announcement of the Medal of Freedom winners. There are a couple of ways to turn that into a column:

Yes No We can write about one winner;

Yes No We can write about all the winners;

Yes No The winners will be announced on Martin Luther King's Birthday; we can talk about MLK's call to service and how these citizens represent the best examples of lives of service; we can also expand to talk about the service awards and service projects that you and the President will undertake on the 19<sup>th</sup>. (We can also mention the expansion of the Peace Corps)

Yes No Another idea for next week would be education, linked to the President's trip to Texas to highlight educational programs.

Yes No Another idea is NASA's naming of the 1<sup>st</sup> woman commander of a Space Mission. I'm not sure of the date of this announcement.

Yes No The next column is due on Jan. 20. One idea for that week is to talk about your upcoming UNICEF speech (January 26) and the importance of the United Nations.

Yes No The next column is due Jan. 27. That's the day of the State of the Union address and we can write about that, perhaps highlighting the "Saving America's Treasures" initiative.
