Summit Bank founder reaches another peak

The Financial Women's Association of San Francisco announced that Shirley Nelson, chairman and CEO of Summit Bank in Oakland, will be the recipient of the second annual Financial Women of the Year Award to be presented at a Sept. 23 luncheon.

Nelson's banking aspirations were nurtured in the small Appalachian town of Celina, Tenn., where she grew up observing the prestigious and well-dressed men — and they were all men — handle the community's banking needs.

"I would stand and peep into the windows to watch the bankers," she recalled. "I was so impressed."

She left Celina at 16 to pursue her big-city ambitions in Nashville, where she married, and later moved to Kodiak, Alaska. She worked her way up from being a bank teller in Kodiak to founding Summit in 1979.

Nelson, who does not have a college degree and who raised her son as a single mother, credited her parents for instilling in her a strong work ethic.

"My belief in myself has propelled me," she said.

"The financial field was challenging to break into, and it holds great promise for women today," she said. "It's been exciting and rewarding, and not a day has gone by when I haven't learned something new."

In founding Summit, she saw an opportunity to build a bank focused on serving doctors and other professionals. The bank has enjoyed 15 years of growth and has been voted consistently by Northern California CEOs as one of the best managed banks under \$100 million in assets.

"Shirley is a shining example of what can be accomplished by entrepreneurial women who choose the path of finance," said Anne Golden, senior investment manager at Montgomery Asset Management and co-chair of the FWA scholarship program. "She's an inspirational force."

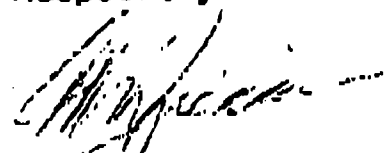
