Born in P6(b)(6) Tom Savage attended St. Andrew's School, Middletown, Delaware (1971-1975) and received a B.A. Degree in Art History from The College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia (1975-1979). He holds an M.A. Degree in History Museum Studies from the Cooperstown Graduate Program of the State University of New York (1975-1981).

While a student at St. Andrew's School, he served as a guide at the Odessa, Delaware properties of the Winterthur Museum (1979-1975) and while a William and Mary student, as an interpreter in the exhibition buildings of Colonial Williamsburg (1976-1979).

Mr Savage attended the Graduate Summer Institute at The Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts, Winston-Salem, North Carolina in 1978, and in 1979, served as Marcia Wadhams Carleton Intern at the Webb-Deane-Stevens Museum in Wethersfield, Connecticut, properties of the National Society of the Colonial Dames in the State of Connecticut. In addition to internships in this country, he has studied in England at The Attingham Summer School on the British Country House (1980), The Attingham Study Week (1987 - 1992), The Victorian Society Summer School in London (1984), and the Cambridge Choral Studies Seminar, Cambridge, England (1985). Mr. Savage serves on the Board of Directors of The American Friends of the Attingham Summer School. He is a member of the Furniture History Society and in 1990 presented the society's annual distinguished scholar's lecture at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London.

In 1981, Mr. Savage was the recipient of a National Museum Act Internship to serve as Acting Curator of Historic Charleston Foundation and was subsequently hired (September 1981) as that institution's first full-time Curator. In this capacity, he oversees the museum division of the Foundation which includes the nationally important Nathaniel Russell House (1808). He is the author of monographs on the Russell House and the Edmondston-Alston House (1828) and lectures frequently in this country and in England on Charleston architecture and decorative arts.

KAKI HOCKERSMITH

Allied Member, A.S.I.D.

Kaki Hockersmith is an interior designer whose style reflects her dynamic imagination and long standing commitment to the arts. Over the years, she has distinguished herself as a designer who, rather than impose a specific style on her clients, tries to combine her expertise and vision with their personalities, taste and lifestyles. Acknowledged as one of the most respected and influential designers in her native state of Arkansas, Ms. Hockersmith's reputation as an innovative force in her profession has begun to spread across the country. Having served as the designer of the Arkansas Governors Mansion for Governor Bill Clinton and First Lady, Hillary, she has again been selected by the Clintons to design the Presidential residence and offices of The White House.

Ms. Hockersmith was born in P6/(b)(6) Her father, Thomas C. [003]
Hockersmith, a graduate of Yale University, founded one of the most successful advertising and public relations firms in the region. Among his clients were many of Arkansas' most important politicians, the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission and Arkansas Parks and Tourism. While enrolled as a student in the Little Rock public school system, Ms. Hockersmith worked part-time in her father's company, honing her communications skills.

She attended William Woods College in Missouri for two years where she majored in English and History. She returned to Arkansas to complete her undergraduate education at Henderson State University. After graduating *cum laude*, Ms. Hockersmith undertook an overseas study tour in which she explored European traditions in visual art, architecture, and literature.

Ms. Hockersmith began her career as a designer at Dillard's Department Stores, one of the country's largest upscale retail chains, where she created the overall layouts and design specifications for the furniture departments in seven stores located in three different states. This early work revealed her talent for coordinating the disparate elements of complex projects. Responsible for creating individual vignettes with separate styles, Ms. Hockersmith chose the paints, colors, and paper; made decisions about the window treatments; and selected and orchestrated the various architectural elements.

Ms. Hockersmith also directed a gallery program for Dillard's in which she merchandised the furniture departments of each of the seven stores; purchased the accessories; and coordinated her selections with furniture and linen buyers. When Dillard's decided to remodel its flagship store in Little Rock in 1979, she was commissioned to design its new furniture department.

In 1980, Ms. Hockersmith launched her career as an independent designer. She purchased a nondescript retail outlet store for window and wall coverings, and transformed it into "Kaki Hockersmith Interiors," attracting both residential and commercial clients seeking professional advice and design work. Among her company's high profile commercial clients are banks, restaurants, a medical clinic, apartment complexes, and law offices.

During this period, the demand for Ms. Hockersmith's services on behalf of residential clients also expanded. In 1991, she was selected by then Governor and First Lady, Bill and Hillary Clinton, to remodel and redecorate the family quarters of the Arkansas Governors Mansion. Her most important challenge was to modify the use of space in the fifty-year old building to better suit the needs of the State's young and active First

Family. She met with the Clintons to develop an overall renovation plan, and to determine their general style and color preferences. Ms. Hockersmith's remodeling plans included the design of new storage areas including closets, bookcases and media units; modernization of bathrooms; the addition of decorative and overhead lighting where none had formerly existed; and the selection of paints, wall and window coverings and hardware. In response to the enormous growth in business, Ms. Hockersmith relocated her office and showroom to Little Rock's chic Pulaski Heights section, where she could expand her inventory and range of services. While functioning as her professional base, the retail business now features fine arts, accessories, and occasional furnishings, and houses a large and varied sample library. ^{in the White House}

While Ms. Hockersmith's ability to create spaces which reflect the essence of her clients' taste is well known, her own preferences include a fondness for antiques, Neo-classical and 19th Century period styles, as well as sophisticated contemporary products and furnishings. She also favors eclectic mixes which include European antiques, and accessories, fine art, and rugs — elements which she believes are essential to good design. Her broad color palette includes monochromatic combinations of neutrals, as well as bright pastels, and deep shades of red, green, blue and gold.

In recent years, Ms. Hockersmith has been among the leading advocates for the arts in Little Rock. One of her priorities has been to develop both community interest in and commercial markets for contemporary art. She has also been involved in numerous charitable events, and has received widespread acclaim for her design work in five designer-house projects in Arkansas and Louisiana.

Ms. Hockersmith's current charitable project is the design of the dining room for the 1993 Arkansas Symphony Designer House which opened on April 16th at the Ragland House, a Queen Anne mansion located in the historic "Quapaw" quarter in Little Rock. She selected an opulent Victorian style, and chose elements to invoke a feeling of an elegant dinner party which might have occurred one hundred years ago. Among the elements in the room are: hand crafted wall panels; custom colored trompe l'oeil coffered ceiling paper and the crown mold with corbels which are patterns adapted from two 19th Century mansions in Newport, Rhode Island; a cast iron English fireplace mantle; window treatments with Victorian-style layered cornices and valances over handmade draperies with an Italian damask design; and a rare 19th Century French Aubusson carpet with a unique garden of scattered leaf designs surrounding a large medallion. The dining table includes an overlay with a well-known leaf damask pattern and an underskirt which matches the draperies. A fruit motif is repeated throughout the room, and can be found on the china, the hand painted places cards and on a variety of accessories. The dining room also is filled with a broad mix of fine arts and antiques representative of the Victorian Age.

Ms. Hockersmith is married to Max C. Mehburger, a Little Rock attorney and avid yachtsman. They have two daughters, Michelle (age 23) and Mary (age 21). Ms. Hockersmith's creative abilities also go beyond the world of design. A recent article in *Southern Living* featured Ms. Hockersmith and her talents as a gourmet cook and innovative hostess.

A: No. The renovations of the Executive Residence involve purchases by a private entity, so any procurement laws or competitive bidding requirements do not apply.

Q: But wasn't this a White House project?

A: While the First Family determines what renovations are desirable, it is the White House Historical Association that determines independently whether or not its funds will pay for the improvements. The Historical Association is never under an obligation to fund any particular renovation work unless it independently approves the payment.

Q: Shouldn't competitive bidding requirements apply to work in the White House?

A: We are aware of no competitive bidding that has ever been used in connection with White House renovation work. The competitive bidding requirements simply do not apply to work funded by private organizations such as the Historical Society. Moreover, we are aware of no instance where such a requirement was applied when Congressionally appropriated funds were used to support renovation work.

Q: Would the competitive bidding rules apply if you were to use Congressionally appropriated funds to help pay for the renovations?

A: No. As I've said, we are also aware of no prior instance where the procurement laws were so applied. In any event, this question really has no bearing here, since no public funds are being used to pay for the renovations.
