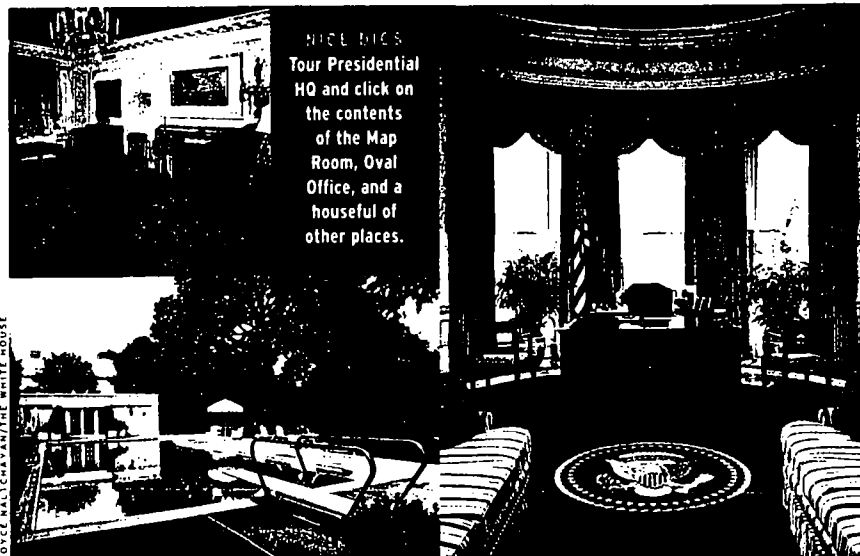

AN INSIDE TOUR OF THE WHITE HOUSE

ATTACHÉ editor JAY HEINRICHS reports on a new CD-ROM
that shows you **THE PRESIDENCY** in ways you've never seen.

NOTHING BEATS THE ACTUAL EXPERIENCE of being inside the White House—that uniquely American combination of public meeting place, office building, art museum, and private residence. But the next best thing, a product that just came on the market, is a surprisingly close second. It's a new CD-ROM of the White House, created through a partnership between the White House Historical Association, the American Architectural Foundation, and the software publisher Autodesk. The disc, titled *The White House Is Our House*, shows you aspects of the place you'd never see unless you had some pretty serious connections. Visit the private quarters, examine the scorch marks that were left after the Brits torched the building in 1812, then snoop around the kitchen and the florist. Scope out the President's swimming pool, behind the Oval Office. And, of course, gaze around the Oval Office itself, from the viewpoint of the President's own chair. The only feature lacking is one that would let you click on the red phone and reach Boris Yeltsin.

But you *can* click on an object such as a painting, and it will lead you to a treasure trove of information, slide shows, and videos. In the Blue Room, for instance, pivot to your left after you come in the door and you'll find William Ranney's whimsical painting "Boys Crabbing." Click on it and you'll be invited to take the disc's First Ladies Tour (Mrs. Ford said the painting reminded her of her own kids crabbing), the Children's Tour, or the Arts Tour. There's also an Architecture Tour, a President's Tour (of course), and an introductory Public Tour—one you don't have to wait in line for. An on-screen map shows you where you are at all times, and a special Explore! feature lets you roam at will.

The vast White House archives have been converted into the CD-ROM, which is geared to kids in the fifth through the ninth grades. A built-in feature lets them do reports, which is a bit of a shame: Their schoolwork may prevent you from monopolizing this irresistible CD yourself. It's compatible, by the way, with both Windows and Macintosh—a nice bipartisan gesture. ★
