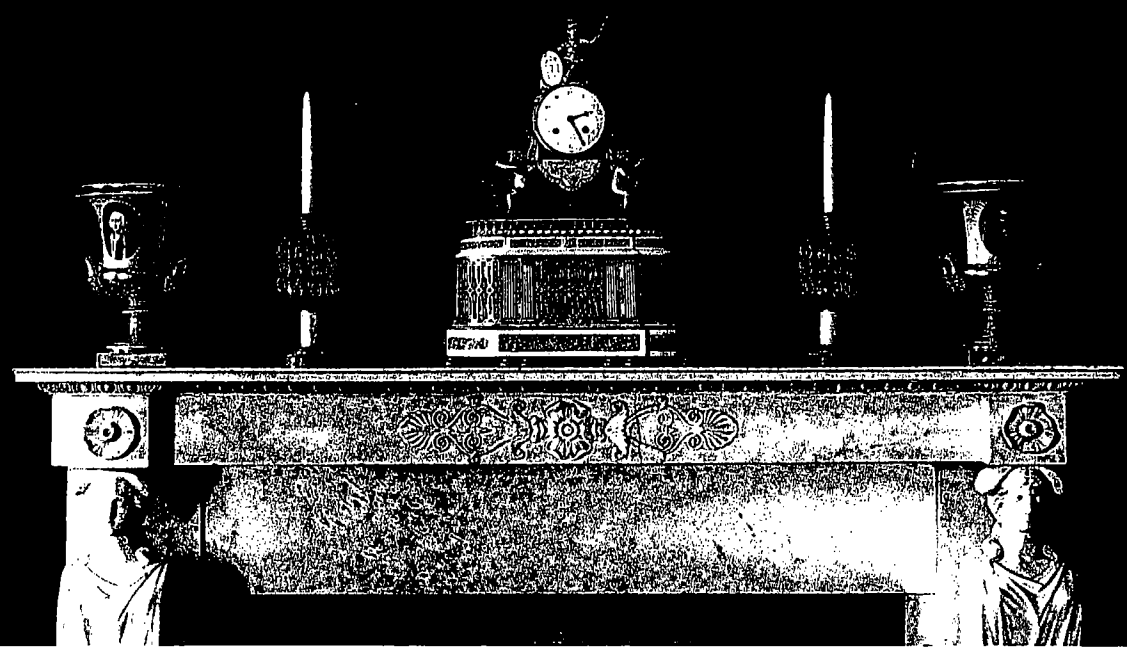

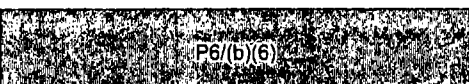

(1) Question Presented

Whether the First Lady is a member of the Committee for Preservation of the White House ?

(1) Brief Answer

No; the First Lady is *not* an ex-officio member of the Committee for Preservation of the White House. However, it is the custom of the committee to "invite" the First Lady to serve as "honorary chairperson" of the Committee for the Preservation of the White House.

(2) Question Presented

Whether "additional" members may be appointed to the Committee for the Preservation of the White House?

(2) Brief Answer

Yes; one of the provisions for the ex-officio membership of the committee allows for the appointment of "so many other members as the President may from time to time appoint."

DISCUSSION

(1) Ex-Officio Committee Membership.

The ex-officio membership, established in Executive Order 11145 *as amended* by Executive Order 11565, is as follows: the Director of the National Park Service; the Curator of the White House; the Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution; the Chairman of the Commission of Fine Arts; the Director of the National Gallery of Art; the Chief Usher of the White House; and so many other members as the President may from time to time appoint.¹ Executive Order No. 11,144, 29 F.R. 3189 (1964) *as amended* by Executive Order No. 11,565, 35 F.R. 16,155 (1970). The First Lady has never been an ex-officio member of the Committee. *Id.*

¹ Prior to amendment, in 1970, the number of private citizens who were a part of the committee was limited to seven. Executive Order 11,145, 29 F.R. 3189 (1964).

The private citizens who are appointed members of the Committee serve for two year terms. The most recent term for those members expired on January 20, 1993; no new appointments have been made. "Note to File", April 23, 1993, *sent to the Office of Policy as a part of the Committee Justification Statement*, per Sanna Osborne, National Park Service. All of the most recently appointed members on the committee are "professionally distinguished in fine arts." United State Department of the Interior, Annual Report to the President on Federal Advisory Commissions 1991, The Committee for the Preservation of the White House; Rex Scouten, White House Curator.

The current membership of the committee needs to be "appointed" and legislative authority allows the President to appoint any number of additional members to the Committee.²

(2) The First Lady's Role on the Committee.

The White House is the "home of the highest elective officer of the United States." Executive Order No. 11,1445, 29 F.R. 3189 (1964) *as amended by* Executive Order No. 11,565, 35 F.R. 16,155 (1970). The First Lady is the hostess and mistress of the White House. *See e.g.* Aikman, Lonnelle, The Living White House, 7th ed., White House Historical Assn., 1982. As such, it is "understood" that the Committee exists to aide the First Lady as the mistress of the Executive Residence. Rex Scouten, White House Curator. It is further understood that the First Lady can fulfil any role she chooses on the Committee. *Id.*

Nonetheless, the First Lady "officially" participates in the committee's activities only upon accepting the customary invitation to serve as the honorary chairperson of the Committee. *See Minutes of the May 10, 1990 Meeting of the Committee for the Preservation of the White House*. There is neither a statutory reference to the First Lady's role on the committee, nor a delineation of her role in the Committee's records. *See generally*, Records of the Committee of the Preservation of the White House *maintained by* James J. McDaniel, Associate Regional Director of the National Park Service, White House Liaison.
