**PRESIDENT CLINTON: COMMEMORATING AND STRENGTHENING
THE BRADY LAW
November 30, 2000**

Today, joined by Jim and Sarah Brady, President Clinton will celebrate the 7th anniversary of the signing of the Brady Law by announcing new efforts to strengthen enforcement of this landmark legislation. The President will announce that since passage of the Brady Law, more than 611,000 felons, fugitives, and domestic abusers have been prevented from buying guns through background checks. To make enforcement of the Brady Law even more effective, the President will: 1) ask the Treasury and Justice Departments to develop a new system for notifying state and local law enforcement officials of felons and other prohibited persons who have tried to illegally buy guns in their communities; and 2) name 12 new cities that will take part in the Administration's Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII) to crack down on illegal gun trafficking by tracing all crime guns to their source. Finally, the President will announce the release of the 1999 national and city reports on YCGII which contain detailed findings on over 64,000 crime guns recovered by law enforcement in YCGII cities and submitted to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF) for tracing.

STOPPING MORE THAN 611,000 FELONS, FUGITIVES, AND DOMESTIC ABUSERS FROM BUYING GUNS WITH BRADY. The President will announce that Brady Law background checks have stopped more than 611,000 prohibited persons from purchasing firearms since this historic legislation was signed into law on November 30, 1993. Of this total, the successful National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), which was launched in November 1998, has blocked nearly 300,000 illegal sales in only two years.

CALLING FOR A NATIONAL NOTIFICATION SYSTEM ON ILLEGAL ATTEMPTS TO PURCHASE FIREARMS. The President will ask the Attorney General and the Treasury Secretary to build on the success of NICS by using new technology to develop a national notification system that more effectively and efficiently provides information to state and local law enforcement about all persons who sought to illegally buy guns and were denied by NICS background checks. Currently, NICS provides immediate notice to state and local law enforcement of denied firearms sales to fugitives and persons under domestic violence restraining orders, and the ATF ensures that all denials are appropriately reviewed and investigated. Now that NICS has completed its second successful year of operation, technological progress can help take this success even further. At the President's request, the Department of Justice will work with the FBI and the Treasury Department to develop a system that provides more information more quickly to local law enforcement about denials of other categories of persons who are denied firearms sales through NICS background checks.

TRACING CRIME GUNS AND CRACKING DOWN ON GUN TRAFFICKERS. In July 1996, President Clinton issued a directive establishing the Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII) to focus resources on reducing youth gun violence. The initiative brings together federal, state, and local law enforcement officials to provide information about the illegal sources of guns recovered from juveniles and adult criminals and to strengthen enforcement of the nation's gun laws. Presently, 38 cities across the country are participating in the Administration's YCGII.

Expanding YCGII to 50 cities. Today, President Clinton will announce the planned expansion of YCGII to 12 new cities: Albuquerque, NM; Austin, TX; Baton Rouge, LA; Greensboro, Winston-Salem, and High Point, NC; Indianapolis, IN; Jacksonville, FL; Long Beach, Anaheim and Santa Ana, CA ; Nashville, TN; Newark, NJ; Oklahoma City, OK; Pittsburgh, PA; and Stockton, CA. ATF will work with local law enforcement in each of these cities to submit all crime guns seized for tracing and use the information to identify and locate illegal gun traffickers and other gun criminals.

Releasing the third annual report of YCGII. Today, the President will announce the release of the ATF 1999 Crime Gun Trace Reports including a national report on YCGII, as well as individual city reports for participating YCGII localities. The reports are available at www.atf.treas.gov. Among the key findings from the national report:

- **Youth and guns present a serious crime problem.** About 43 percent of all crime guns were recovered from young people: 9 percent from juveniles age 17 and under, and 34 percent from youth age 18-24.
- **Handguns are the weapon of choice for juveniles and criminals.** Handguns comprised 78 percent of all traced crime guns, with semiautomatic pistols accounting for 50 percent of all traced guns. Long guns (shotguns and rifles) accounted for 21 percent of traced crime guns.
- **Many crime guns are acquired in multiple sales.** The acquisition of handguns in multiple sales can be an important trafficking indicator. Handguns sold in multiple sales reported to the ATF National Tracing Center accounted for 22 percent of all handguns sold and traced in 1999.
- **Newer guns play a large role in crime.** Almost a third of all crime guns (32 percent) recovered in 1999 and more than 40 percent of those recovered from youth were purchased in 1996 or later. Newer guns manufactured in the U.S. from 1993-1999 accounted for more than half of all the crime guns traced in YCGII.
- **The most frequently traced guns are concentrated among a small number of makes and models.** Ten firearms accounted for 24 percent (15,211) of all trace requests (64,337), while over 1,500 different firearms accounted for the remaining crime guns (49,426).

Using trace information to put gun traffickers out of business. During the first two quarters of FY 2000, ATF's 23 field divisions initiated 874 illegal firearms trafficking investigations involving 231 youth and juvenile firearms possessors, and 161 youth and juvenile firearms traffickers. ATF estimates that at least 14,600 firearms were trafficked as part of these 874 investigations. To date, nearly 40 percent of these investigations have been forwarded by ATF agents to federal, state and local prosecutors for prosecution.

CALLING FOR AN UNPRECEDENTED INCREASE FOR GUN ENFORCEMENT. The President will repeat his call on the Congress to finish its work and send him a final budget that contains his proposal to fund the largest national gun enforcement initiative in history. The President's historic initiative will fund an increase of 500 ATF agents and inspectors, the hiring of hundreds of federal, state and local gun prosecutors, expanded crime gun tracing including more funds for YCGII, more ballistics testing to solve more gun crimes, and research funding for "smart gun" technology.

URGING THE CONGRESS TO CLOSE THE DANGEROUS GUN SHOW LOOPHOLE.

The President will challenge the Congress to follow the lead of states like Oregon and Colorado that recently passed ballot measures to close the gun show loophole that allows criminals to buy firearms at gun shows – without a Brady background check and no questions asked. The President will also urge Congress to enact other common sense gun safety measures such as requiring safety locks for handguns, banning the importation of large capacity ammunition clips and barring violent juveniles from owning guns for life.

Presidential Directive on Creating National Notification System

Q: Would a national notification system require state and local law enforcement to arrest every individual that is denied by NICS when they illegally attempt to purchase a firearm?

A: The purpose of a national notification system is to provide federal, state and local law enforcement with quicker and more complete information on persons who have illegally attempted to purchase firearms in their community. This system will help state and local police to better assess crime threats in their communities and how to address them, as well as improve the coordination of enforcement efforts with federal law enforcement agencies. The bottom line is that each case must be handled on an individual basis as law enforcement agencies deem to be appropriate, but that local agencies can better ensure public safety by being supplied with more information on crimes committed in their communities.

Q: When will the national notification system be completed?

A: The Attorney General and the Treasury Secretary expect to have a plan developed within 30 days on implementation of the new notification system.

Q: Why hasn't the FBI already been sharing this information with state and local law enforcement? Does the fact that the Administration is creating this system mean that the NRA has been right to blame them for not effectively enforcing the Brady Law?

A: First of all, there is no question that the Brady Law and NICS have been incredibly successful. Let's remember that the primary purpose of the Brady Act is to ensure that federally licensed gun dealers do not sell firearms to felons, fugitives, stalkers and other restricted persons. Today's announcement that it has kept guns out of the hands of over 611,000 prohibited persons since its passage shows that it has achieved this goal. Also, in a very short period of time, the NICS system has developed the capacity to process over 17.5 million background checks and has already prevented nearly 300,000 prohibited persons from purchasing firearms in the last two years alone.

The reason that a national notification system was not created sooner is simple: the technology was not ready yet. Implementation of the Brady Law presented great challenges to both federal and state law enforcement agencies because most states did not have sophisticated background check systems for gun sales in place before the passage of

the Brady Act in 1993. Moreover, the creation of the NICS, which is handling literally millions of queries, was also massive undertaking. However, it has been a challenge that states and the FBI have successfully met, and America is safer because of it. Now that we have met our goals and the NICS system has completed its second year of functioning smoothly and effectively, we are pressing forward and working to make it an even more powerful enforcement tool by creating a national notification system.

With regard to the NRA's criticism, we would point out that if it were up to them, there would be no Brady Law, Assault Weapons Ban, or numerous other common sense gun safety measures already in place that are helping to save lives. As we have stated before, this Administration has a comprehensive approach to reducing gun violence that includes both smart prevention, stronger gun laws and tough enforcement. The success of our approach is clear: Gun violence is down 35% and gun prosecutions are up 16% since 1992. We are working to save lives and fight crime, and are here today because we are dedicated to continuing this fight.

Q: Do any states currently have notification systems in operation?

A: We are aware of systems in Illinois and Oregon that we understand to be quite successful, and appear to be very similar to what the President has directed the Attorney General and the Treasury Secretary to establish at the federal level. The Justice Department is currently working with law enforcement officials in each of these states to learn more about their operations.

Q: Does the NRA support the creation of a national notification system? Is there support on Capitol Hill for this system?

A: The President provided \$5 million in his FY 2001 Budget request to build a national notification system and to provide incentive funding for states that operate their own background check systems to create notification systems. However, this request was not funded despite bipartisan support from pro-gun Republicans, such as Chairman Harold Rogers, for legislation sponsored by Congressman Rod Blagojevich of Illinois to create a notification system.

Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative

Q. What are the ATF Crime Gun Trace Reports?

A. The Crime Gun Trace Reports are annual reports that ATF produces for law enforcement officials in cities participating in the Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative. Law enforcement officials in these cities commit to tracing all the crime guns they recover. The reports analyze the results of gun trace requests made by law enforcement agencies throughout the country. This year ATF has produced a national report and 36 individual city reports.

Q. What is the Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII)?

- A. The YCGII is an ATF enforcement program focused on assisting law enforcement in finding out how children, criminals, and other prohibited persons are obtaining firearms, and using that information to support more effective investigations of traffickers and other gun offenders. The program also focuses on developing crime gun tracing capability in cities so that federal state and local law enforcement operating them have all available strategic and investigative information about crime guns.

Q. How does YCGII work?

- A. The cornerstone of the program is trace information from illegal gun trafficking. Police departments in cities participating in the initiative agree to trace all of their recovered crime guns with the ATF National Tracing Center. ATF traces the firearms and provides trace information and analyses to law enforcement officials. This information supports investigations and allows city –by- city overviews of the crime gun problem. It also reflects some regional & national trends in illegal firearm diversion & trafficking.

Q. Why are only 36 of the 38 participating cities contained in the Crime Gun Trace Reports?

- A. All YCGII partners are included in the reports with the exceptions of Salinas, CA, and Seattle, WA. This is because at the time of deadline for the trace data, these 2 cities had traced too few crime guns to meet the minimum criteria established for the study.

Q. What is a crime gun?

- A. Any firearm illegally possessed, used in a crime or suspected to have been used in a crime. An abandoned firearm may also be categorized as a crime gun if it is suspected of being used in a crime or illegally possessed. As a practical matter, law enforcement agencies make the determination what guns to trace.

Q. What are the existing YCGII cities?

- A. The 38 YCGII cities are: Atlanta, GA; Baltimore, MD; Birmingham, AL; Boston, MA; Bridgeport, CT; Charlotte/Mecklenburg, NC; Chicago, IL; Cincinnati, OH; Cleveland, OH; Dallas, TX; Denver/Aurora, CO; Detroit, MI; Gary, IN; Houston, TX; Jersey City, NJ; Las Vegas, NV; Los Angeles, CA; Louisville, KY; Memphis, TN; Miami, FL; Milwaukee, WI; Minneapolis, MN; New Orleans, LA; New York, NY; Oakland, CA; Omaha, NE; Philadelphia, PA; Phoenix, AZ; Portland, OR; Richmond, VA; Salinas, CA; San Antonio, TX; San Jose, CA; Seattle, WA; St. Louis, MO; Tampa, FL; Tucson, AZ; and Washington, DC.

Q. Do you anticipate an increase in the number of cities participating in YCGII?

A. At the current time, we anticipate that the number of YCGII cities will reach 75 in the upcoming few years. The expansion of this initiative will continue pending budget allocations in future fiscal years.

Acknowledge: Secretary Summers; Attorney General Reno; Deputy Attorney General Eric Holder; Treasury Undersecretary for Enforcement Jim Johnson; Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms Director Brad Buckles; police and law enforcement organizations from across the country; members of Handgun Control, the Million Mom March and other gun safety organizations; and leaders from the religious community including the National Council of Black Churches and the American Jewish Congress.

I especially want to thank Jim and Sarah Brady for their courage and determination—for standing up to the special interests and leading a grassroots crusade to take back our streets and reclaim our families and our future. A few years ago, I awarded Jim the Medal of Freedom. Earlier this year, we named the White House Briefing Room in his honor. But no honor that we can bestow on Jim or Sarah Brady can ever match all they have given to us. We thank you.

Today we celebrate more than an anniversary of a bill signing. Seven years ago today marked the beginning of the end of a debate about how we fight crime in this country.

Before then, there was much tough talk here in Washington, but not much action. Jim and Sarah and all of you had been battling for the Brady Bill for seven years. A vast majority of the American people supported it. But Washington offered little more than rhetoric. Many came to believe the crime rate would never go down.

But you didn't give up. Police and Principals, community leaders and clergy, mayors and moms—joined hands and won this battle. Together, we did more than put a new law on the books, we laid the foundation for a tough, smart anti-crime strategy founded on a proper balance of punishment and prevention, and rooted in the values of community and common sense.

Passage of the Brady bill soon led to an historic anti-crime bill--more than 100,000 additional community police officers—tougher penalties—a ban on assault weapons—and support for the most innovative local crime-fighting strategies to keep our kids out of trouble.

By working together through the years, we have transformed life in America. Last year the overall crime rate fell for the eighth consecutive year--the longest continuous drop in crime on record, giving us the lowest crime rate in 26 years. The violent crime rate is at its lowest level in decades and the murder rate is at a 33-year low.

Gun violence has declined significantly since 1993—
and federal firearms prosecutions have increased 16
percent since 1992.

Today, we have more good news. The latest figures
are in and I'm proud to announce that the Brady Bill has
now stopped more than 611,000 felons, fugitives and
domestic abusers from buying guns. Plenty of people said
the Brady Bill wouldn't make a difference. 611,000
rejections later, we know better. It makes a difference.
There are more children alive today—more police officers
alive today—more citizens alive today--because we made
the Brady bill the Brady Law.

Notwithstanding the claims from the other side, not one hunter has missed a day of deer hunting season.

Now there are no more excuses. We can't throw up our hands and say fighting crime is beyond our control. We know what works and we have work to do. Despite our success, 30,000 Americans—including 10 children every day—are lost to gunfire. None of us believes America is as safe as it should be--and none of us should be satisfied until America is the safest big nation in the world. So today, we are marking this anniversary in the best way possible—by working to make the Brady Law stronger and our nation safer.

First, we know we can get guns out of the wrong hands by strengthening the hand of law enforcement. Today, I am calling on Attorney General Reno and Secretary Summers to build on the success of the National Instant Criminal Background Check system and develop a new system for notifying state and local law enforcement officials when felons and other restricted individuals try to illegally buy guns. This is about utilizing technology to enhance enforcement of our nation's gun laws.

Second, as we keep criminals from getting guns through the front door of a gun shop, we must do even more to lock the back door by cracking down on illegal gun traffickers.

Secretary Summers spoke of the national initiative we launched four years ago which builds on the success of cities like Boston in tracing guns seized from young criminals.

Today, I received the initiative's third annual report which contains detailed findings on over 64,000 crime guns recovered by law enforcement and sent to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms for tracing. This data paints a clear picture of where juveniles and criminals are getting their guns, how they are getting them and what kind of guns they are getting.

And it shows that kids and guns continue to present a serious crime problem—about 45 percent of all crime guns were recovered from young people.

ATF and its state and local partners are putting all of this trace information together to put gun traffickers behind bars. In the last year alone, ATF initiated almost 900 criminal trafficking investigations. Today, I'm announcing that we plan to expand our efforts to 12 more cities—stretching from Newark to Nashville, from Oklahoma City to Anaheim, California. Those who illegally peddle guns to our children will get a simple message: We will find you. We will prosecute you. And we will punish you.

Third and finally, I renew my call to Congress to finish its work and send me a final budget that includes my proposal to fund the largest national gun enforcement initiative in history—including resources for 500 ATF agents and inspectors, and hundreds of federal, state, and local gun prosecutors. Talking about strong enforcement is not enough—Congress needs to give communities the tools to do the job.

Congress also ought to do more to help prevent gun crimes from happening in the first place by passing our long-overdue common-sense gun safety measures and closing the gun show loophole. It's the right thing to do. If this Congress can't do it, the next one ought to.

Earlier this month, the voters of Oregon and Colorado approved initiatives to require background checks at gun shows. Bipartisan support is building around the country. We can't stop now.

Perhaps that message of perseverance and hope is one of the most important lessons the Brady Law has taught us. We don't have to give up on our neighborhoods. We don't have to give up on our kids. We don't have to tolerate a level of fear and violence and insecurity that no civilized society ought to tolerate. We can make America safer. You have proven it. Let's keep going and let's not stop until America is the safest big country in the world. Thank you.

I. PURPOSE

To celebrate the seventh anniversary of the Brady Law and to: 1) call for the development of a new system to notify state and local law enforcement officials of felons and other prohibited persons who have tried to illegally buy guns in their communities; 2) announce 12 new cities to participate in the Administration's Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII); and 3) release the 1999 national and city reports on YCGII.

II. BACKGROUND

Today you will be joined by Attorney General Reno, Secretary Summers and Jim and Sarah Brady to commemorate the seventh anniversary of the Brady Law, announce new numbers that demonstrate that the Brady background checks are working, call for the development of a new system to make the Brady Law even more effective, and release the 1999 Youth Gun Crime Interdiction Report detailing guns recovered by law enforcement.

Keeping Guns Out of the Hands of Criminals:

Over 611,000 felons, fugitives, and domestic abusers stopped from buying guns with Brady. Today you will announce that the Brady Law has stopped more than 611,000 prohibited persons from purchasing firearms since you signed it into law on November 30, 1993. Of this total, the successful National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS), which was launched in November 1998, has blocked nearly 300,000 illegal sales in only two years.

Calling for a national notification system on illegal attempts to purchase firearms. You will direct the Attorney General and the Treasury Secretary to build on the success of NICS by using new technology to develop a national notification system that more effectively and efficiently provides information to state and local law enforcement about

all persons who sought to illegally buy guns and were denied by NICS background checks. Currently, NICS provides immediate notice to state and local law enforcement of denied firearms sales to fugitives and persons under domestic violence restraining orders, and the ATF ensures that all denials are appropriately reviewed and investigated. Now that NICS has completed its second successful year of operation, technological progress can help take this success even further. Under your directive, the Department of Justice will work with the FBI and the Treasury Department to develop a system that provides more information more quickly to local law enforcement about denials of other categories of persons who are denied firearms sales through NICS background checks.

Tracing Crime Guns and Cracking Down on Gun Traffickers:

In July 1996, you issued a directive establishing the Youth Crime Gun Interdiction Initiative (YCGII) to focus resources on reducing youth gun violence. The initiative brings together federal, state, and local law enforcement officials to provide information about the illegal sources of guns recovered from juveniles and adult criminals and to strengthen enforcement of the nation's gun laws. Presently, 38 cities across the country are participating in the Administration's YCGII.

Expanding YCGII to 50 cities. Today, you will announce the planned expansion of YCGII to 12 new cities: Albuquerque, NM; Austin, TX; Baton Rouge, LA; a triad of Greensboro, Winston-Salem, and High Point (NC); Indianapolis, IN; Jacksonville, FL; a triad of Long Beach, Anaheim and Santa Ana (CA); Nashville, TN; Newark, NJ; Oklahoma City, OK; Pittsburgh, PA; and Stockton, CA. ATF will work with local law enforcement in each of these cities to submit all crime guns seized for tracing and use the information to identify and locate illegal gun traffickers and other gun criminals.

Releasing the third annual report of YCGII. Today, you will announce the release of the ATF 1999 Crime Gun Trace Reports including a national report on YCGII, as well as individual city reports for participating YCGII localities. The reports are available at www.atf.treas.gov. Among the key findings from the national report:

- **Youth and guns present a serious crime problem.** About 43 percent of all crime guns were recovered from kids and young people: 9 percent from juveniles age 17 and under, and 34 percent from youth age 18-24.
- **Handguns are the weapon of choice for juveniles and criminals.** Handguns comprised 78 percent of all traced crime guns, with semiautomatic pistols accounting for 50 percent of all traced guns. Long guns (shotguns and rifles) accounted for 21 percent of traced crime guns.

- **Many crime guns acquired in multiple sales.** The acquisition of handguns in multiple sales can be an important trafficking indicator. Handguns sold in multiple sales reported to the ATF National Tracing Center accounted for 22 percent of all handguns sold and traced in 1999.
- **Newer guns play a large role in crime.** Almost a third of all crime guns (32 percent) recovered in 1999 and more than 40 percent of those recovered from youth were purchased in 1996 or later. Newer guns manufactured in the U.S. from 1993-1999 accounted for more than half of all the crime guns traced in YCGII.
- **The most frequently traced guns are concentrated among a small number of makes, and models.** Ten firearms accounted for 24 percent (15,211) of all trace requests (64,337), while over 1,5000 different firearms accounted for the remaining crime guns (49,426).
- **Using trace information to put gun traffickers out of business.** During the first two quarters of FY 2000, ATF's 23 field divisions initiated 874 illegal firearms trafficking investigations involving 231 youth and juvenile firearms possessors, and 161 youth and juvenile firearms traffickers. ATF's initial estimates that at least 14,600 firearms were trafficked as part of these 874 investigations. To date, nearly 40 percent of these investigations have been forwarded by ATF agents to federal, state and local prosecutors for prosecution.
