Dear President Clinton:

Greetings from the American Cancer Society, the American Medical Association, and The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, the host organizations for the 11th World Conference on Tobacco OR Health to be held in Chicago, Illinois from August 6-11, 2000. As Co-Hosts of the Conference, we would like to extend an invitation to you to open the 11th World Conference on August 6, 2000 and participate in what we believe will be an important part of global tobacco control history. The Conference is held only every three years in different locations around the world, and the U.S. will host it for the first time in 25 years.

The President of the host country traditionally opens the meeting with a brief keynote speech at the Opening Ceremony. In 1997, the Honorable Jiang Zemin, President, People's Republic of China, addressed the 10th World Conference on Tobacco OR Health in Beijing. An address by the President of our country would signal to the world's tobacco community the importance of working globally to prevent four million deaths per year, and would acknowledge your leadership and the strong positions your administration has taken on tobacco.

The Opening Ceremony will be held on Sunday, August 6, 2000 at 7:00 pm at the Auditorium Theatre in downtown Chicago. Dr. Gro Harlem Brundtland, Honorary Co-Chair of the Conference and Director General of the World Health Organization (also former Prime Minister of Norway) will formally commence the Opening Ceremony with a brief speech, to be followed by your address. If your schedule permits, there will be a brief VIP reception and press event with Dr. Brundtland and other dignitaries prior to the ceremony from 5:00 to 7:00 pm.

Uniting an estimated 4,000 leaders concerned about the global epidemic of diseases from tobacco, the Conference specifically aims to: present new knowledge about the effects of tobacco on health, the environment, and society; share successful prevention and control strategies from around the world; focus attention on the impact of tobacco advertising, marketing, and promotion as it relates to newly targeted populations and countries; stimulate the formulation of tobacco prevention and control goals and strategies for both developed and developing countries; and continue to develop networks and participant capabilities to implement national and regional tobacco control plans.

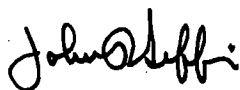

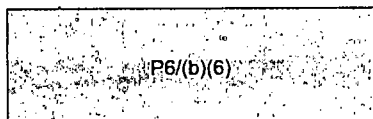

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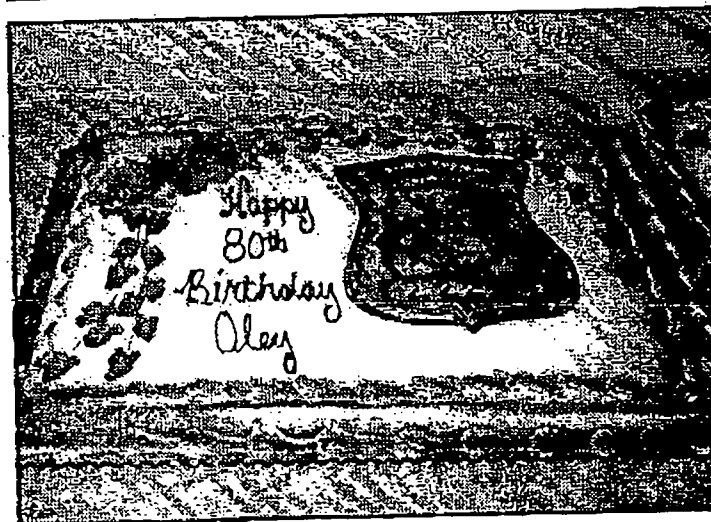
