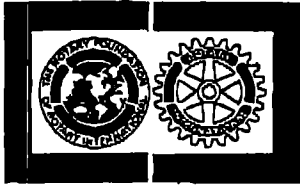

Dear President Clinton,

On behalf of Rotary International, we respectfully request a brief meeting on Thursday, December 21, 2000 to thank you for your support of the global polio eradication initiative during your Administration. Your leadership in this important initiative has greatly reduced the threat of polio for children throughout the Western Hemisphere, Europe, and the endemic regions of Africa and Southeast Asia. The United States is the biggest contributor to the campaign, totaling \$111.4 million in Fiscal Year 2000 alone.

Polio will be the second disease to be eradicated from the world. Smallpox was certified eradicated in 1979. As a result of your Administration, among donor nations, the United States has taken the major leadership role in a multilateral effort to eradicate polio, and over the last three years has contributed 40% (\$200 Million) of all donor funds used to eradicate polio.

The polio eradication initiative represents a historic partnership between the public and private sector to positively impact global health, with Rotary International investing nearly \$500 million by the time polio is eradicated. Your role in this initiative has been instrumental for continuing the task of remaining on track for certification of eradication by 2005. The United States will save \$230 million a year once polio is eradicated and worldwide savings will total \$1.5 billion. The benefits of polio eradication, which you have led the world in providing to humankind, will be immeasurable.

Once again, on behalf of Rotary International we commend you for your leadership and support in efforts to eradicate polio. We look forward to working with you on this important initiative in the future.

On Tuesday, October 10, 2000, the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) will host its 20th Anniversary Dinner, celebrating two decades of service to low-income urban and rural communities nationwide. I would be honored if you would join us for this event so that we can thank you personally for all you have done to support community-based development during your eight years in office. This dinner will take place at the Waldorf Astoria, where we will also be honoring Paul Tagliabue from the NFL and Art Ryan from Prudential for their work with LISC over the years.

As you may know, shortly after leaving Treasury, I became chairman of LISC's Board. 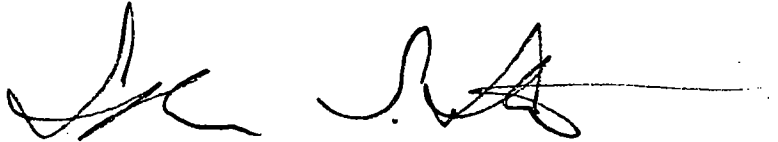

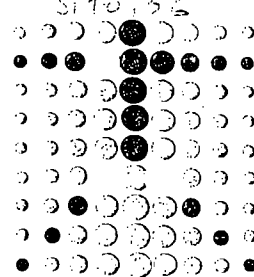

Dear President Clinton:

I would first like to congratulate you upon approaching the conclusion of your two terms of leadership of America. It has been with great pride that I recall our association in Arkansas and how Bill Bowen and Anne Bartley first introduced us in 1987, and with your encouragement Kay Arnold joined our Board of Trustees in 1989.

Mr. President, you have been most generous in our awards and leadership recognition programs during your terms of office. We were pleased to have honored you with our Bridge Builders Award for your pioneering work of opening economic opportunity between the United States and Africa. 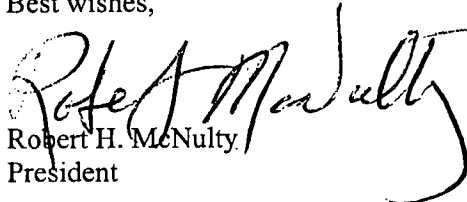

PURPOSE: To honor the Blue Ribbon Schools, which are selected from
throughout the country for their high standards of excellence

BACKGROUND: The Blue Ribbon Schools Recognition Program identifies and
gives national recognition to a diverse group of public and private
schools that are judged unusually effective in meeting local, state,
and national goals. Blue Ribbon Schools must meet the following
criteria: strong leadership; a clear vision and sense of mission that
is shared by all connected with the school; high-quality teaching;
an appropriate, up-to-date curriculum; policies and practices that
ensure a safe environment conducive to learning; strong parental
interest and involvement; and evidence that the school helps all
students achieve, regardless of their abilities.

State departments of education, the Department of Defense, the
Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the Council for American Private
Education forward nominations to the U.S. Department of
Education. A 100-person panel of outstanding educators and other
professionals reviews the nominations. The most promising
schools are visited for two days to verify the accuracy of the
information the school has provided and to report on school
climate and instruction. After a review of the reports of these
visits, the 100-person panel makes its recommendations to the
Secretary of Education, who announces the schools selected.

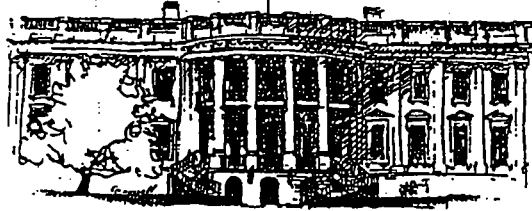

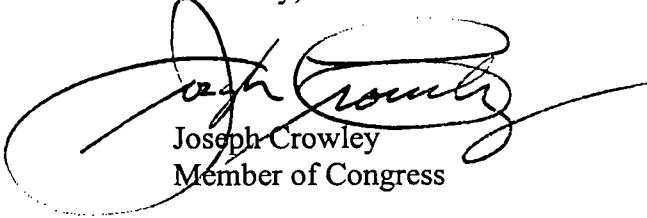

Dr. Geraldine Chahey, a tenured full professor of psychology at Kingsborough Community College/CUNY, is an educational leader with a wide range of administrative and teaching experience. Dr. Chahey earned a doctorate in management and labor relations at Rutgers University.

Dr. Chahey's leadership skills were clearly demonstrated by her election and re-election for over twenty years to a variety of administrative and policy making positions in the PSC/CUNY including nine years as one of the four principal city-wide officers. The officers responsibilities included establishing personnel policies; negotiating and implementing collective bargaining agreements; financial analyses and planning; authorization of fiscal expenditures; long range financial projections; supervision and review of the elections and credentials committee, the committee for part time instructional staff, the committee for librarians, the legislative and lobbying committee; establishing and supervising official publications.

Leadership in the area of finance was demonstrated by Dr. Chahey's serving on the Federal Credit Union Board of Directors for nine years where she served as vice president for six years. Dr. Chapey has published extensively in the areas of psychology, management and labor relations and education. For six years, Dr. Chapey served as the editor of the national refereed journal, Leadership in Education. During the last decade she has been a weekly columnist in community several newspapers.

In recognition of her administrative talents Dr. Chapey was appointed by the Governor to the NYS Department of Mental Health Advisory Council at Creedmoor Hospital. Because of Dr. Chapey's expertise in management and labor relations, the New York State Senate appointed her to the New York State Labor Department Committee on Employment and Unemployment. Dr. Chapey demonstrated a continued commitment to standards and quality education while she served as a regional coordinator for the NYS Mentoring Program. Dr. Chapey was recognized for her visionary leadership by the Association of Teachers when they selected her as the Teacher of the Year. Papal honors were bestowed upon her when she was appointed as a Dame in the Sovereign Military Order of the Knights and Dames of Malta. In addition, Cardinal O'Connor recognized her outstanding service by elevating her to the position of Commander in the Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre.

Dr. Chapey was the founder and is the chairperson of the community based Trinity Senior Services, an organization that raises money to provide services for 1500 seniors. She has also served for nine years as a member of the Board of Outreach Project, a rehabilitation program for children ages eight to sixteen, with alcohol and drug problems. Dr. Chapey was recently appointed the treasurer of the Outreach Board.

Because of her significant achievements, Dr. Chapey has been invited to speak at international and national professional conferences throughout the United States and internationally in Brazil, Hong Kong, Austria and Ireland.

Dear John:

You and I had the opportunity to briefly speak on June 15, when I was lobbying off the Senate floor on the FY-2001 Department of Transportation appropriations bill. At the time, I was working with Millie Webb, President of Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), in support of retaining Senator Lautenberg's provision establishing a national .08% Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) level. We were successful in retaining it in the Senate bill despite strong opposition from the Senate Republican leadership. Fortunately, Senator Richard Shelby had agreed to include the drunk driving provision in the bill and steadfastly opposed strong overtures from Senators Lott and Nickles to strike it on the Senate floor.

This is the exact same provision that was adopted by the Senate in 1998 by a vote of 62 to 32 and was supported by Secretary Slater and President Clinton. In fact, at the time, there were two or three events at the White House in support of including the provision in the TEA-21 bill (surface transportation bill). Unfortunately, because of alcohol industry opposition and money and behind the scenes work by Representative Delay and Speaker Gingrich, the provision was dropped in conference despite the best efforts of Senators Chafee and Lautenberg.

We have a very good chance to enact this drunk driving bill this year as part of the DOT Appropriations bill. I am writing to ask that the White House do a public event with MADD and the other health and safety groups that are fighting to retain this provision. Drunk driving is one of the top safety concerns of the American public, public opinion polls show strong support for this .08 provision (77%), the provision is supported by Republicans and Democrats, and 18 states already have this law. Research shows that there is a drop in drunk driving fatalities in states that have enacted a .08% BAC law and that if every state had .08 it would save 500 to 600 lives annually.

MADD and others have been working with Bruce Reed's office on possibly organizing an event. I am concerned that time is running out. Our intelligence indicates that the House Republican Leadership is putting pressure on Conference Chair Frank Wolf, who strongly supports the .08 provision, to have this bill finished by the Republican Convention and keep this provision out. Members we have visited have expressed interest in seeing the White House and President be

more visible in their support if we are to succeed. The White House events in 1998 were instrumental in our efforts to have a strong Senate vote as well as alert the news media and public about the congressional debate on this issue. The Republican leadership clearly does not want to publicly vote on a drunk driving law in an election year and alcohol interests are working behind the scenes with the leadership in the Senate to drop this provision. We have already garnered editorial support from the Washington Post and in 1998 the New York Times and numerous other major newspapers endorsed adoption of a .08 national drunk driving law. We are working to have these newspapers restate their support.

I know the President's schedule is very tight and there has been some discussion of doing an event next week. If you would lend your support to arrange a public White House event we would all greatly appreciate it. Coincidentally, this year is MADD's 20th anniversary and enactment of this law would be a terrific victory for drunk driving and a legacy for the Clinton Administration's commitment to highway safety.

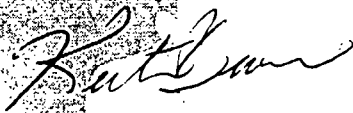

As there are few if any non-degree jobs that can accommodate wheelchair-bound individuals, higher education has become a necessary step for many physically-challenged people. The next logical step would be to take the proper measures to obtain a degree and then an appropriate job. The question here is how do they get to the proper learning facilities?

They have been receiving assistance through an Illinois state-funded program called DORS. That program has since been canceled much to the dismay and serious inconvenience of the two students. They received notification ONE day before the start of the fall semester. These students have been forced to resort to public transportation that is not 100% handicap-accessible. This coupled with busing schedules has resulted in continual tardiness on the students' behalves. At this point in time there is no acceptable alternate transportation methods for these wheelchair-bound individuals.

They have attempted to contact the appropriate state individuals to rectify the situation only to be met with the "We cannot be bothered with this matter" attitude. This is absolutely and 100% completely unacceptable. These physically-challenged voters have gone to the polls every election with faith that their choices will represent and do what is best for them. Could they have been wrong in placing their faith in some or all of these choices?

We are currently living in a society that laments individuals for not attempting to improve their lives. The voters directly affected by this situation have the desire and the ability to take charge of their lives. How can they do so if their civic leaders fail to offer the necessary assistance? They are not asking others to pay for every aspect of their lives just a helping hand in getting to school.

There are many non-handicap voters who are extremely dismayed by the treatment given to these two individuals. They have questioned on several occasions the wisdom of their decision to elect certain individuals as their leaders. Many of these concerned voters are not financially able to assist the individuals in question. They are prepared to do everything else in their power to help such as participation in this write-in campaign and the possibility of electing new leaders to get the job done.

Many of these voters, including myself, only want what is the God-given right of every American: life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. These two, as well as other, physically-challenged voters may not get to fully exercise that right if they cannot get to school.

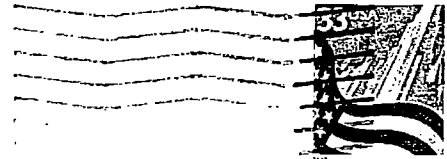

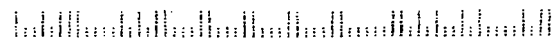

Re: Arkansas Medicaid State Plan Amendment, Supplemental Medicaid Payments Using the Upper Payment Limits

Thank you for your time on the telephone today. As you requested, we are outlining the problem in memo form.

Under the authority of current federal regulations, the State of Arkansas is requesting amendments to our current State Medicaid Plan to provide supplemental Medicaid payments to the University Hospital at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences (UAMS). There are two different amendments being requested; one for an inpatient supplemental payment and one for an outpatient supplemental payment.

In brief, these supplemental payments are possible under current federal regulations (42 CFR 447.272 for inpatient payments and 42 CFR 447.321 for outpatient payments) by calculating the difference between what the Arkansas Medicaid program pays for health care services and what the Medicare program would have paid had these services been reimbursed by Medicare. In Arkansas, as a rule, Medicaid pays approximately 80% of what Medicare pays for similar health care services. Thus, under current federal regulations cited above, states may claim additional federal financial participation (FFP) by calculating these upper payment limits using different methodologies for inpatient and outpatient services.

Because HCFA believes that some states have abused the opportunities created by these regulations by using them to capture Medicaid funds for non-Medicaid purposes, there is an imminent threat by Administrator Westmoreland to promulgate new regulations. If this occurs, it would closeout this avenue for Arkansas and other states that may have state plan amendments pending or in process.

Unlike other states that have taken advantage of the current regulations, these supplemental Medicaid payments obtained through Arkansas' proposal would benefit UAMS as a provider of essential Medicaid services in Arkansas.

As we discussed, we believe that we have made a solid case for our state plan amendments that were filed in early May and are following the proper procedures with our state Medicaid agency and HCFA. However, if Westmoreland promulgates new regulations that change the current environment, Arkansas will be precluded from pursuing the supplemental payment which UAMS, a unique provider in our state, badly needs.

We have many documents with additional details should you need them.

I hope the arrival of spring finds you well and that you had time to take a short break to enjoy the cherry blossoms.

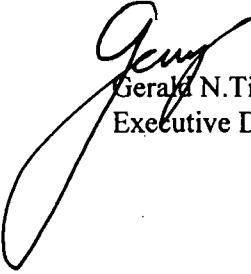
I am writing today to ask your help. Every year, the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company (MetLife) and the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) honor the State and National Principals of the Year. The awardees are chosen by their respective states, and then a national panel of judges selects the National Winner. This will be the first year that states will be able to select both a middle level and a high school principal, thus doubling the pool of awardees to approximately 106.

As you are well aware, both the National and State Teachers of the Year and the Blue Ribbon Schools are annually honored at a special White House ceremony. On behalf of NASSP and our 42,000 members (principals and assistant principals at middle level and high school), I ask you to consider the following question: Isn't it appropriate and necessary to honor our nation's principals in a similar way? THE NATIONAL CAMPAIGN WAS FORMED BECAUSE WE SHOULD NOT BE THE MOST DANGEROUS INDUSTRIALIZED NATION FOR CHILDREN -- WE, WITH ALL OF OUR TALENT, AND RESOURCES, AND POWER -- SHOULD BE THE SAFEST COUNTRY FOR OUR CHILDREN.

WHEN PRESIDENT CLINTON ASKED ME TO HEAD UP THE CAMPAIGN LAST YEAR, IT WAS BECAUSE ASTRONOMIC VIOLENCE RATES IN THIS COUNTRY DID NOT BEGIN WITH COLUMBINE, AND HAVE NOT GONE AWAY SINCE. OUR RATES REMAIN SO MUCH HIGHER BECAUSE, AS A PEOPLE, WE HAVEN'T COMMITTED TO DO THE THINGS THAT DRAMATICALLY CHANGE VIOLENCE RATES. PEOPLE WHO'VE STUDIED VIOLENCE KNOW, THERE IS NO GREAT MYSTERY TO WHY PEOPLE BECOME VIOLENT AND THERE IS ALSO NOTHING MAGICAL ABOUT HOW TO PREVENT VIOLENCE. WE CONVENED THE NATION'S LEADING ACADEMIC EXPERTS (**ACKNOWLEDGE DEBORAH PROTHROW STITH AND JOHN DEVINE**) AND -- ALTHOUGH SCHOLARS COME AT THE ISSUE FROM DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVES -- THEY ALL AGREED ON THE FUNDAMENTAL THINGS: WHAT MAKES THE U.S. MORE VIOLENT THAN OTHERS IS NOT OUR BIOLOGY, BUT OUR CULTURAL ATTITUDES AND OUR CHOICES ABOUT VIOLENCE. THERE ARE

SPECIFIC THINGS THAT ALL SECTORS CAN DO: MEDIA, INDUSTRY, PARENTS, TEACHERS, AND YOUTH THAT ARE PROVEN TO MAKE COMMUNITIES LESS VIOLENT, AND CHILDREN SAFER.

WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT VIOLENCE IS THAT THE BIGGEST SINGLE PREDICTOR OF FUTURE VIOLENCE IS VIOLENCE ITSELF. VIOLENCE BEGETS VIOLENCE. IF WE WANT TO KNOW WHY CHILDREN BECOME VIOLENT WE NEED TO LOOK FIRST AT THE LESSONS WE TEACH THEM ABOUT VIOLENCE. WHEN WE HIT A CHILD TO MAKE THEM STOP DOING SOMETHING, WE TELL THAT THEM THAT VIOLENCE IS A WAY TO RESOLVE A CONFLICT. WHEN WE TELL CHILDREN THAT BULLYING IS NORMAL, AND THAT IF THEY WANT RESPECT THEY NEED TO GET IN THE FIRST PUNCH, THAT TELLS CHILDREN THAT VIOLENCE IS THE WAY TO GET RESPECT. WHEN WE TELL A KID THAT CHEAP SHOTS AND OTHER DIRTY TACTICS ARE OKAY ON THE SPORTS FIELD, WE TEACH THE LESSON THAT VIOLENCE IS OKAY AS LONG AS YOU WIN. WE KNOW THAT KIDS WHO ARE NEGLECTED BY THEIR PARENTS ARE NEARLY TWICE AS LIKELY TO BE VIOLENT. BUT AS NEIGHBORS, WE FEEL AWKWARD ABOUT REACHING OUT TO A CHILD WHO IS NOT OURS, GETTING TO KNOW THAT CHILD'S NAME, INVITING HIM OVER FOR A FAMILY DINNER, OR OFFERING TO BE HIS FRIEND. INSTEAD, WE SAY, "WITH THOSE PARENTS, THAT KID DOESN'T STAND A CHANCE," AND WE LEAVE IT AT THAT. WE KNOW THAT OVER 1,000 CHILDREN ARE KILLED BY HANDGUNS EACH YEAR THAT THEY FIND IN THEIR HOMES, BUT WE FEEL AWKWARD ABOUT ASKING A NEIGHBOR IF THEY HAVE A GUN IN THE HOUSE BEFORE OUR CHILD

GOES THERE TO PLAY. IT IS AMAZING HOW QUICK WE ARE TO PUT
SPRINGFIELD, AND PADUCAH AND JONESBORO, AND OWENBORO, AND
LITTLETON, AND THE D.C. ZOO, AND LITTLE KAYLA MITCHELL FROM FLINT
MICHIGAN IN THE PAST, AS IF THIS IS SOMETHING THAT HAPPENED A LONG
TIME AGO, THAT WAS INEXPLICABLE. I FOUND A SPEECH A FEW DAYS AGO
THAT WAS GIVEN BY ^{President} ~~THE GOV.~~ CLINTON IN MEMPHIS IN 1993. HE ASKED THEN,
"WHEN WAS AMERICAN GOING TO PULL TOGETHER AND SAY THAT THERE IS
SOMETHING TERRIBLY WRONG ABOUT CHILDREN BEING SHOT ON HALLOWEEN
NIGHT FOR SPORT, CHILDREN WATCHING THEIR SIBLINGS BLEED TO DEATH IN
THE SCHOOL CORRIDOR. 154 CHILDREN MURDERED IN THE STREETS OF BOSTON
IN ONE YEAR. HE SAID THIS IN 1993 "EVERY DAY, IN AMERICA A HUNDRED AND
SIXTY THOUSAND CHILDREN STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL BECAUSE THEY ARE
SCARED THEY WILL BE HURT IN THEIR SCHOOLS. ~~THIS CANNOT GO ON.~~"

THIS WAS 1993. THIS DID NOT BEGIN WITH COLUMBINE.

NONE OF THE ATTITUDES THAT I'VE DESCRIBED ARE INEVITABLE. WE
ACCEPT THEM ONLY BECAUSE PEOPLE TEND TO BELIEVE THINGS ARE A
CERTAIN WAY BECAUSE THEY HAVE TO BE THAT WAY. WE'VE SEEN SOME OF
THESE NOTIONS DISPELLED DURING OUR LIFETIME: WOMAN'S WORK, HOLY
WAR, MUTUALLY ASSURED DESTRUCTION. BUT I'LL GIVE YOU ANOTHER
EXAMPLE. WHEN I WAS GROWING UP DRUNK DRIVING WAS THE NORM.
PEOPLE BRAGGED ABOUT IT. MOVIES DEPICTED THE LOVABLE DRUNK

STAGGERING TO THE CAR. WE EVEN HAD A PHRASE: ONE FOR THE ROAD. IN FACT, FRIENDS LET FRIENDS DRIVE DRUNK: IT WAS A MARK OF FRIENDSHIP, A BONDING EXPERIENCE. IT TOOK COUNTLESS THOUSANDS OF SENSELESS DEATHS BEFORE WE FINALLY CAME TO REALIZE THAT THIS SOCIAL NORM WAS STUPID AND DESTRUCTIVE. WHEN PEOPLE FIRST CHALLENGED THE IDEA, SUGGESTED THAT AMERICANS WOULD STOP DRINKING AND DRIVING, IT SEEMED IMPOSSIBLE. I RECALL THERE WAS A GROUP IN MY SCHOOL THAT CALLED ITSELF DAMM – DRUNKS AGAINST MEDDLING MOTHERS. DESIGNATED DRIVERS WERE SEEN AS WIMPS. BUT LOOK HOW FAR WE’VE COME. NOW, A PERSON WHO DRIVES DRUNK IS A PARIAH. THE PHRASE ONE FOR THE ROAD IS UNFATHOMABLE. MOVIES NEVER DEPICT THE CHARMING DRUNK DRIVER. AND WHAT HAS HAPPENED? DRUNK DRIVING DEATHS ARE DOWN 60%.

THERE IS NOTHING NATURAL ABOUT VIOLENCE ANY MORE THAN THERE IS ANYTHING NATURAL ABOUT DRUNK DRIVING.

SO WHAT WILL IT TAKE TO CHANGE? PEOPLE HAVE TO BE OPEN TO CHANGE. IN 1993, THEY WERE NOT READY. PEOPLE CARED, BUT NOT ENOUGH PEOPLE. IT TOOK SOMETHING AS TERRIFYING AS COLUMBINE FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO COME TO GRIPS WITH THE REALITY OF THE TERRIBLE VIOLENCE THAT PERVADES YOUTH CULTURE, AND SAY THEY ARE READY TO MAKE IT CHANGE. THIS IS OUR OPPORTUNITY.

TO CHANGE VIOLENCE, WE MUST FIRST CHANGE OURSELVES. WE MUST CHANGE INTO A PEOPLE WHO BELIEVE THAT VIOLENCE IS NOT THE WAY TO SETTLE DISAGREEMENTS, WHO DO NOT BELIEVE THAT VIOLENCE DESERVES RESPECT OR IS MANLY, WHO DO NOT BELIEVE THAT IT IS EMBARRASSING TO ASK NEIGHBORS WHETHER THEY KEEP GUNS IN A HOUSE WHERE THEIR CHILDREN PLAY, WHO ARE NOT EMBARRASSED TO SAY I WON'T LET MY CHILD PLAY WITH TOY GUNS OR HIT OTHER KIDS; WHO ARE WILLING TO REACH OUT TO CHILDREN, TO TAKE TIME TO BE MENTORS, TO PROVIDE AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITIES, TO LEARN THE NAMES OF THE CHILDREN ON THEIR STREET, TO HAVE A FAMILY DINNER.

THE NATIONAL CAMPAIGN, OUR CAMPAIGN, IS WORKING TO MAKE CHANGE FROM THE INSIDE OUT. THE KEY TO OUR GOING FROM WORST TO FIRST, IS BUILDING A PARTNERSHIP, ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT WITH FULL BI-PARTISAN LEADERSHIP, ALL BUSINESS SECTORS, AND THE CHILDREN THEMSELVES. OUR GOAL IS NOT TO BUILD A NEW INSTITUTION OR BUREAUCRACY, IT IS TO SEED A MOVEMENT.

OUR PLAN WAS CREATED IN CONCERT WITH THE BEST MINDS IN AMERICAN BUSINESS, MEDIA, ACADEMIA, AND COMMUNITIES. THAT PLAN, HAS THE SAME THREE ELEMENTS OF ANY OTHER EFFORT TO CHANGE THE WAY PEOPLE THINK AND BEHAVE: EDUCATE, DEMONSTRATE, GENERATE.

FIRST, EDUCATION. WE NEED TO CHANGE THE NORM, TO HAVE PEOPLE START QUESTIONING THEIR BELIEFS. WITH THE HELP OF OUR MEDIA PARTNERS, WE ARE ASSEMBLING AN EDUCATION CAMPAIGN THAT INCLUDES ALL MEDIA. IN ONLY OUR FIRST FEW MONTHS, WE HAVE LAUNCHED A NATIONAL ADULT-DIRECTED WEBSITE, A YOUTH WEBSITE, A SPANISH LANGUAGE WEBSITE, FOUR MAJOR PUBLICATIONS, EDITORIALS IN 200 NEWSPAPERS, PRINT ADS IN THE NEW YORK TIMES, USA TODAY, AND DOZENS OF OTHER PAPERS, RADIO ADS WITH THE NFL, WEB BANNERS WITH AOL, NATIONALLY TELEVISED PROGRAMS WITH DISCOVERY AND COURT TV, AND WE ARE ONLY JUST BEGINNING. AS WE ANNOUNCED THIS MORNING WE WILL BE CO-BRANDING A SERIES OF 14 NEW PSAS THIS MONTH WITH ABC. WE ARE DOING YOUTH-CREATED PSAS WITH TIME WARNER. WE WILL BE DOING CONCERTS, CORPORATE PROMOTIONS, AND EVERY OTHER THING WE CAN DO TO CHANGE HOW PEOPLE THINK ABOUT VIOLENCE. BY THE END OF THIS CAMPAIGN, OUR GOAL IS TO TRIPLE THE NUMBER OF MEDIA IMPRESSIONS OF THESE MESSAGES AND MEASURE A REAL CHANGE IN PEOPLE'S UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT CAUSES VIOLENCE, WHAT THEY CAN DO TO PREVENT VIOLENCE, AND THEIR TAKING ACTION TO STOP VIOLENCE.

SECOND, WE ARE WORKING ON THE GROUND TO ACTUALLY DEMONSTRATE CONCRETE THINGS THAT COMMUNITIES CAN DO. WE ARE WORKING IN 15 HARD HIT COMMUNITIES TO SHOW WHAT CAN BE DONE, AND TO MAKE THESE COMMUNITIES LABORATORIES FOR SPREADING THE CULTURE OF

NONVIOLENCE. WE ARE GRATEFUL TO IRA LIPMAN WHO STARTED THE VISION IN MEMPHIS, AND TO DON BAER AND OTHERS FROM DISCOVERY WHO WERE A CATALYST FOR THE DRAMATIC CHANGES THAT ARE OCCURRING IN MEMPHIS. BY THE END OF THIS CAMPAIGN, WE INTEND TO DOUBLE THIS NATION'S INVESTMENT IN THE MOST EFFECTIVE VIOLENCE PREVENTION PROGRAMS, AND TRIPLE THE NUMBER OF INSTITUTIONS WORKING TO PROMOTE NON-VIOLENCE.

THIRD, GENERATE. TO CHANGE A CULTURE, PARTICULARLY TO CHANGE YOUTH CULTURE, WE MUST BEGIN BY LISTENING TO YOUTH -- THE NEXT GENERATION -- AND GIVING THEM RESOURCES. HENRY SCHLIEF AND COURT TV HAVE PIONEERED THIS WORK FOR US BY HOSTING YOUTH FORUMS AROUND THE COUNTRY. WE -- AND CORPORATE LEADERS LIKE ANNE ZEHREN AT TEEN PEOPLE -- ARE NOW SUPPORTING THE YOUTH LEADERS: WHO HAVE DEVELOPED THE GRASSROOTS MOVEMENT OF TODAY AND WILL BE THE OPINION LEADERS OF TOMORROW. BY THE END OF THIS CAMPAIGN -- WITH THE HELP OF OUR INVALUABLE PARTNER, SHINE -- OUR GOAL IS TO HAVE THREE TIMES AS MANY YOUNG PEOPLE WORKING ON-LINE AND IN THEIR SCHOOLS TO PROMOTE VIOLENCE PREVENTION. EVERY SCHOOL IN THE COUNTRY WILL HAVE ACCESS TO EFFECTIVE AND APPROPRIATE VIOLENCE PREVENTION CURRICULUM.

WE ARE HERE, AT A UNIQUE PLACE IN HISTORY. WE HAVE A CHANCE TO PARTICIPATE IN A LONG OVERDUE SOCIAL CHANGE. THE STARS HAVE COME INTO ALIGNMENT. VIOLENCE IS NOW THE NUMBER ONE CONCERN AMONG ALL

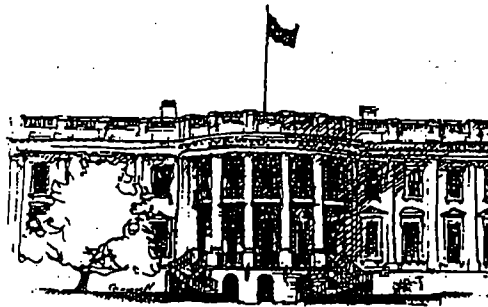
YOUNG PEOPLE. VIOLENCE IS NOW THE NUMBER ONE CONCERN AMONG CONSUMERS. 86% OF CONSUMERS WOULD FEEL MORE POSITIVELY ABOUT BUYING PRODUCTS FROM A COMPANY THAT IS TAKING ACTION TO STOP VIOLENCE. FOR TWENTY YEARS THIS NATION HAS SAT PASSIVELY AND WATCHED ITS CHILDREN DIE AND KILL IN THOSE PLACES WHERE THEY SHOULD BE GROWING AND LEARNING AND FINDING LOVE. THANK YOU, RONNIE, AND THANK YOU ALL FOR HELPING GIVE OUR CHILDREN A FUTURE.

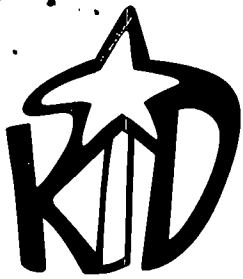

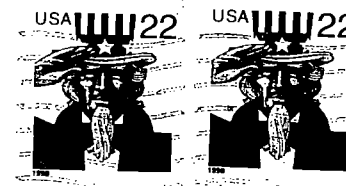

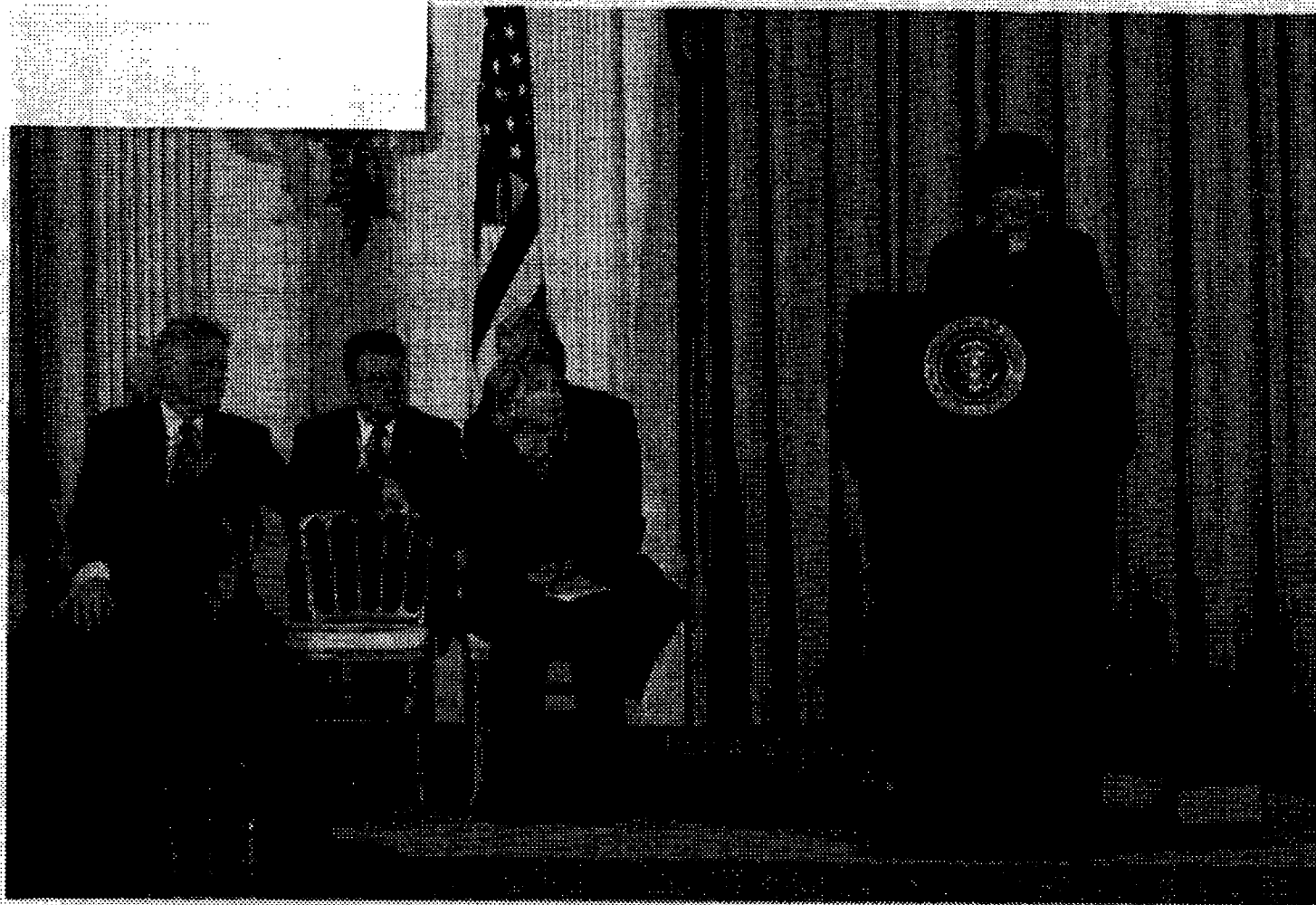
