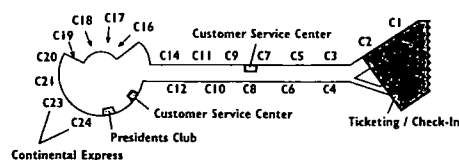

For international travel, except to and from Mexico, please reconfirm your reservations at least 72 hours prior to departure from each city in which a stopover is made.

Your baggage and personal property. On most flights you may check three normal size suitcases at no charge. Carry-on items are subject to operational limits and must fit underneath your seat or in an overhead storage compartment. A tag with your name, address, and telephone number should be attached to all baggage, and it is recommended that you put this information inside each bag, as well.

Do not pack valuables or irreplaceable articles such as camera equipment, jewelry, medicine, eyeglasses, securities, legal documents, antiques, computer and electronic items, etc. - in any checked bag, as Continental assumes no liability for these items.

On domestic flights, Continental's liability for allowed checked baggage is limited to \$1,250 per ticketed customer. International flights carry liability limits in accordance with international conventions. Any questions? Please ask us when you check in for your flight.

Restricted Articles. For your protection, hazardous materials like explosives, compressed gases, flammable liquids and solids, oxidizers, poisons, corrosives, loaded firearms and radioactive materials - are forbidden on board the aircraft, in your luggage or on your person.

Schedules and check-in time. Flight schedules are subject to change. Be sure to check the time and gate of your flight. Generally, you should (1) pick up a ticket at least 45 minutes prior to domestic departure, and (2) arrive at the boarding gate at least 15 minutes prior to scheduled departure time (30 minutes for international flights).

Exit row seating. The FAA has set standards for people who sit in rows that provide direct access to exits. Customers must be: at least 15 years old; able to see, read, hear and understand well enough to receive commands and give information to others; able to use both hands, both arms and both legs to reach the exit, open it, clear the seat row of obstructions, operate or stabilize any escape slide, exit the aircraft and assist others as necessary. In addition, they must be with no one requiring special attention such as a child and be willing and able to do all of these things without harm to themselves. Customers who cannot or do not want to meet these standards should ask to be reseated. No explanation is required. Any questions? Ask the gate agent who can provide a complete explanation of these requirements.

Smoking regulations. Federal Regulations prohibit smoking on all domestic mainland U.S. flights and on flights scheduled for 6 hours or less between the U.S. mainland and Hawaii, Alaska, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Continental prohibits smoking on all flights operated by it to and from international destinations. Smoking policies are subject to change without notice.

Just in case we're overbooked. Sometimes a flight may be overbooked and there's a slight chance that a seat may not be available. If this occurs, be assured that no one will be denied a seat until our personnel have asked for volunteers willing to give up their seat reservations in exchange for a payment of our choosing. With few exceptions persons denied boarding involuntarily are entitled to compensation. Rules for all fares and conditions are available at Continental ticket counters and boarding locations.

ADVICE TO INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS ON LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY

Passengers on a journey involving an ultimate destination or a stop in a country other than the country of origin are advised that the provisions of a treaty known as the Warsaw Convention may be applicable to the entire journey, including any portion entirely within the country of origin or destination. For such passengers on a journey to, from, or with an agreed stopping place in the United States of America, the Convention and special contracts of carriage embodied in applicable tariffs provide that the liability of certain carriers, parties to such special contracts for death of or personal injury to passengers is limited in most cases to proven damages not to exceed U.S. \$75,000 per passenger, and that this liability up to such limit shall not depend on negligence on the part of the carrier. The limit of liability of U.S. \$75,000 above is inclusive of legal fees and costs except that in case of a claim brought in a state where provision is made for separate award of legal fees

and costs, the limit shall be the sum of U.S. \$58,000 exclusive of legal fees and costs. For such passengers traveling by a carrier not a party to such special contracts or on a journey not to, from, or having an agreed stopping place in the United States of America, liability of the carrier for death or personal injury to passengers is limited in most cases to approximately U.S. \$10,000 or U.S. \$20,000.

The names of carriers, parties to such special contracts are available at all ticket offices of such carriers and may be examined on request. Additional protection can usually be obtained by purchasing insurance from a private company. Such insurance is not affected by any limitation of the carrier's liability under the Warsaw Convention or such special contracts of carriage. For further information please consult your airline or insurance company representative.

NOTICE OF BAGGAGE LIABILITY LIMITATIONS

Liability for loss, delay, or damage to baggage is limited unless a higher valuation is declared in advance and additional charges are paid. For most international travel (including domestic portions of international journeys) the liability limit is approximately \$9.07 per pound for checked baggage and \$400 per passenger for unchecked baggage. For travel wholly between U.S.

points federal rules require any limit on an airline's baggage liability to be at least \$1,250 per passenger. Excess valuation may be declared on certain types of articles. Some carriers assume no liability for fragile, valuable or perishable articles. Further information may be obtained from the carrier.

NOTICE - OVERBOOKING OF FLIGHTS

If the flight is overbooked, no one will be denied a seat until airline personnel first ask for volunteers willing to give up their reservation in exchange for a payment of the airline's choosing. If there are not enough volunteers the airline will deny boarding to other persons in accordance with its particular boarding priority. With few exceptions persons denied boarding involuntarily are entitled to compensation. The complete rules for the payment of compensation and each airline's boarding priorities are available at all airport ticket counters and boarding locations. *Some airlines do not apply these consumer protections to travel from some foreign countries, although other consumer protections may be available. NOTICE

If the passenger's journey involves an ultimate destination or stop in a country other than the country of departure the Warsaw Convention may be applicable and the Convention governs and in most cases limits the liability of carriers for death or personal injury and in respect of loss of or damage to baggage.
