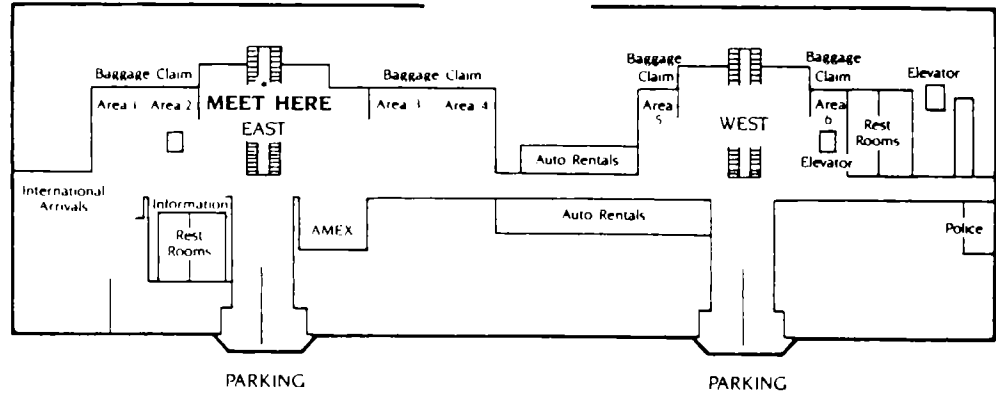

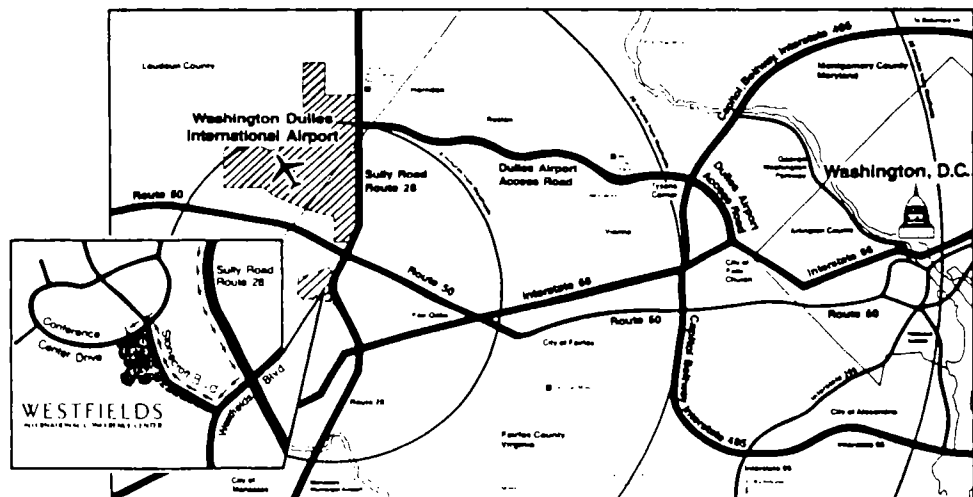

We invite you to join colleagues in the public and private sectors in a meeting to decide how best to inform the national debate about appropriate care for children. The purpose of the meeting is to address the child placement issues raised in the current welfare reform discussions, including the "orphanage issue." We hope the meeting results in a publication that describes areas of consensus, explores and delineates divergent perspectives, and presents the evidence on which these policy positions rest.

This publication will be written by a respected journalist who will be with us at the meeting. Participants will have the opportunity to review and comment on the draft document prior to publication and before their names are associated with it. The Milbank Memorial Fund has used this technique before in order to make available to decision makers information and analysis of significant policy issues. We enclose, with the hard copy of this letter, an example of a report which resulted from this type of meeting.

We are extending invitations to people from the child welfare profession, academia, business, government, voluntary associations, and philanthropy. The group will address a broad set of questions, including:

- When is it appropriate to provide out-of-home care for children?
- Under what circumstances should children be placed in congregate (group) care and what type of care should be provided for which children?
- What should the goals of the child welfare system be with respect to family preservation and reunification?

The meeting will be held in an East Coast location in March or April. It will begin with dinner and end by 3:30 p.m. the next day. The Milbank Memorial Fund and the Foundation for Child Development, the meeting co-sponsors, will pay your travel and incidental expenses for the meeting.



We hope you will choose to join us, and we look forward to hearing your views on these critical child welfare questions. 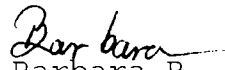
