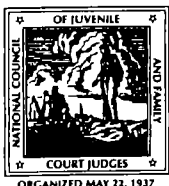

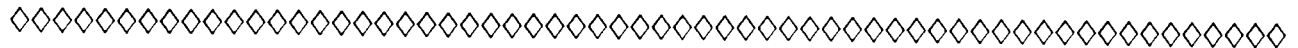

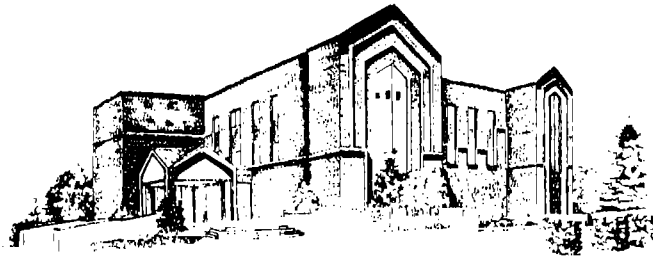

It was a pleasure meeting you and Lyn today during your visit to the headquarters of the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges. I enjoyed sharing information regarding projects of mutual interest.

As per your request, I have enclosed names of lead judges for two of our model court projects. The first consists of lead judges for our project entitled, "Improving Court Practice in Child Abuse and Neglect Cases." With the assistance of funding from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, we are working with these lead judges and key players in each jurisdiction to identify areas of practice in need of improvement, and to work toward effecting change and providing better outcomes for children. Key players involved include: judges, child welfare professionals, attorneys, guardians ad litem (GALs), court appointed special advocates (CASAs), and others.

Courts are at varying stages in this process, and continue to meet to work toward goals and objectives. The Salt Lake City Juvenile Court has come up with some innovative ideas for handling caseloads and providing permanency for children. Chicago and other sites are planning activities over the next year which will assist them in reaching their goals. (For your information, the dates for the Chicago conference which I mentioned were set just this afternoon - April 9-10, 1997. I will send further details as they become available.)
