Subject: ABC News on Untapped Markets

While they made no mention of the President's New Markets initiative, ABC news tonight did a great story on the retail potential of inner city and minority neighborhoods.

They cited 7.7 million americans live in these neighborhoods, spend 75 billion a year, African Americans and Hispanics spend more per capita for clothes, furniture and other items than Whites, and estimated would spend 21 billion more if stores were closer.

They interviewed Majic Johnson ("this is business") and talked about his movie theaters in inner city neighborhoods, talked about how Starbucks and TGI Fridays are moving nearby. The CEO of the TGI Friday's chain said "we're big believers in the inner city."

They said that fear is keeping some retailers away, but Old Navy and Disney are moving to Harlem, Walmart is opening its first retail store in LA, and Home Depot is opening a number of new stores in inner city areas.

1. John Sturgill - Fantasy Custom Yachts. A very successful houseboat manufacturer located in the Empowerment Zone. He credits KHIC with assisting him in a successful startup.
2. Bill Deaton - Image Entry, Inc. This company converts data to different mediums, e.g. credit card receipts from paper to tape or disk. The company also is a government contractor. Very successful.
3. Jerry Weaver - Mid South Industries, Inc. It will be Weaver's company, Mid South Electrics that we potentially will be touring. Manufactures various "printed circuit boards", injection molded parts and electro-mechanical parts for Fortune 500 customers.
4. J.C. Egnew - Outdoor Venture Corporation. A premier defense contractor manufacturing large tents for the military. This is one of KHIC's earliest equity investments and has played a key role in its success over the past 26

years.

5. Lee Todd - DataBeam, Inc. A company that produces "white board" conferencing software that was sold to IBM in June, 1998. This was an SBIC equity investment and Mountain Ventures has played a key role in its success.
6. Ray McGregor - Cumberland Gap Provision, Inc. A manufacturer of high quality smoked meats. KHIC invested equity in this company and "packaged" the financing for an ESOP when the company was in danger of being sold and the results would be the loss of 175 high-paying jobs. The company is thriving today and employs over 200 people.
7. Steve Meng - Casecraft Corporation. KHIC has an equity investment in this company and provides various types of debt to this company. This is a classic local entrepreneur who has become successful in a very difficult geography of Eastern Kentucky.
8. Bob Kohlhep - Cintas Corporation. This is an example of KHIC building a manufacturing facility for a company as a method of inducing the company to come to Appalachia. KHIC still owns this manufacturing plant and leases to Cintas. Cintas has grown into a company selling over \$1 Billion annually.
9. Judy Schmit - This company is a high-quality injection molding company and is a start up in the Empowerment Zone.

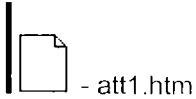
1. Keith Smith - Citizens Bank of Broadhead. A small rural bank whose customer is local Appalachian families.

- General Mills, Glory Foods and U.S. Bancorp invested a total of \$4.5 M into a minority-owned southern-style frozen food plant that has generated scores of new jobs in inner-city Minneapolis as well as fueling new business for sweet potato farmers in Mississippi.

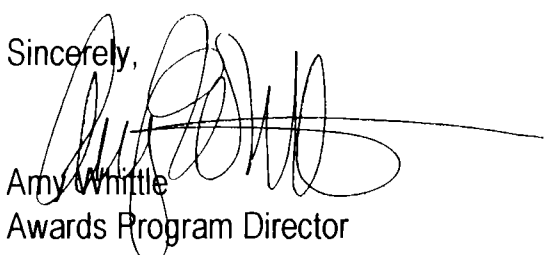
