Re: Grants made to localities visited by President Clinton during the New Markets tour.

Since President Clinton's New Market Tour, HUD has announced the winners of many of our grant competitions. Following is a brief description of the grants we have released, as well as which went to New Market sites.

HUD GRANTS RELEASED SINCE THE PRESIDENT'S TOUR

Community Outreach Partnership Centers Program: The annual COPC grants, which have been awarded since 1994, help colleges and universities provide technical assistance, training, and applied research to community-based organizations and local governments. The activities of COPC projects are chosen and designed jointly by the schools and neighborhood groups. Through doing this work together, college students learn about these communities and neighborhood residents gain access to the knowledge and resources of the higher education institutions. *Announced September 13, 1999*

Housing Opportunities for People with AIDS(HOPWA): provides critical housing and other support services that: Help people with HIV/AIDS remain in their homes by providing rental assistance and supportive services such as meals, transportation, and counseling; provide housing to people with HIV/AIDS and their families facing homelessness. *Announced October 5, 1999*

Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HCBU): The HBCU Program helps HBCUs expand their role and effectiveness in helping their communities with neighborhood revitalization, housing, and economic development. *Announced September 21, 1999*

Hispanic-Serving Institutions Assisting Communities: HSI awards funds to qualified community colleges to provide tuition and other assistance to low-income, full-time students who are pursuing degrees that promote community building. *Announced September 20, 1999*

Local Housing Counseling Program: Local housing counseling agencies use these grants to counsel first-time homebuyers, homeowners and renters facing financial difficulties and other

housing-related problems. In addition, the organizations help people, including minorities and people with disabilities, to become more aware of homebuying opportunities. *Announced August 12, 1999*

HOPE VI Revitalization and Demolition Grants: HOPE VI is transforming public housing. The grants are used to provide public, affordable and market-rate housing and to demolish severely distressed public housing. The grants also help public housing residents find jobs and provide supportive services. *Announced August 30 – September 10, 1999.*

Economic Development Initiative (EDI): HUD's Economic Development Initiative grants go to localities to fund economic development activities that create jobs, primarily for people with low and moderate incomes. HUD created the EDI grants in 1994 to work in tandem with HUD's loan guarantees. *Announced July 14.*

Brownfields Economic Development Initiative (BEDI): HUD's BEDI grants fund environmental remediation, site preparation and construction of brownfields. Brownfield sites include abandoned factories and other industrial facilities, gasoline stations, oil storage facilities, dry cleaning stores, and other businesses that dealt with polluting substances. Since 1993, the Clinton Administration has taken a series of actions to clean up and redevelop brownfields and return them to productive use, including: providing seed money to communities for revitalization; removing regulatory barriers to redevelopment; and providing a targeted tax incentive to businesses that purchase and clean up the sites. *Announced August 5 - 11, 1999.*

Youthbuild: Youthbuild helps high school dropouts gain self-sufficiency by teaching them marketable construction skills. In Youthbuild, participants work to build and rehabilitate low income housing. *Announced October 7, 1999.*

Welfare to Work Housing Vouchers: The vouchers are targeted to families who are currently receiving, are eligible for, or who have left welfare within the last two years, and for whom the housing assistance is essential to obtaining or retaining employment. Without stable, affordable housing, their dream of self-sufficiency may never become a reality. These vouchers, therefore, are a critical tool to help families with children move from welfare to work – successfully *and* permanently. Also, this effort addresses the desperate need for housing that many low-income families face. *Announced October 1, 1999.*

Family Self Sufficiency: Family Self-Sufficiency grants will go to public housing authorities in Connecticut to hire coordinators who will help get jobs for adults receiving HUD rental assistance. *Announced October 1, 1999*

Family Unification Program: Families benefiting from the Family Unification Program have separated or are about to be separated because of domestic violence, homelessness or unsafe housing conditions. The families are primarily single mothers and their children who are homeless, battered women who have fled their homes with their children to escape abusive husbands or boyfriends, and families living in slum housing unfit for children to occupy. The grants fund rental assistance subsidies that enable parents to pay just 30 percent of their income to rent privately owned apartments. *Announced October 4, 1999*

Section 8 Project Based/Designated Housing Mainstream Vouchers: Public Housing Vouchers. *Announced October 4, 1999*

Economic Development and Self Sufficiency Grants: These grants will help public housing residents get jobs by funding job training and job placement, childcare, transportation to jobs, education programs, and loans and training to help public housing residents start small businesses. The grants will also fund programs for elderly residents and people with disabilities to help them live independently. Made to Indian Country in this time frame. *Awarded on August 19, and September 30, 1999.*
