As you may know, our mortgage insurance business is working with HUD on a pilot program to insure mortgage loans for Native Americans across the country, and I understand this may be announced if the President visits South Dakota in July.

On a different subject, I understand that the NEC is also playing a key role in the bankruptcy reform debate on the Hill. We want to work with you on this and hope you will continue to play a leadership role in crafting a workable compromise.

It is in the public interest to find a fair balance in this legislation. But finding this balance will take someone like you who has the respect of all sides.
