In Lisa's absence, I did a briefing for them today on new markets. We got a terrific reception. Obviously, they are hopeful that POTUS would come to LA. But they had good suggestions about the role that their chamber -- and others like it -- could play in creating the network of venture capitalists, business opportunities, and community development experts that has to happen to get the effort off the ground. They offered to think about developing specific commitment for their role and get back to us. We offered to provide them with more information about the programs. They have a meeting of other southern california chambers of commerce in mid-june and suggested that they might brief their colleagues on the initiative. Lisa should definitively follow up through Jay -- especially if LA is a potential site. I am happy to help if I can.

Also -- we should think about what role for national chamber of commerce in spreading the word to local chambers.

Other ideas they had were: (1) use the internet to get news out about the trip and the legislation and the idea; and (2) go directly to more venture capitalists -- who need to get engaged -- not just CEOs. They recognize that VCs are a harder sell but argued that they are the key and we should make greater effort at outreach. This could be a good role for Treasury.
