OVERALL

- The 15 Urban Zones designated today are expected to attract over \$19 billion in private and public sector investment over the next 10 years if Congress provides full funding for \$1.5 billion in proposed grants, along with nearly \$2 billion in already approved tax-exempt bonding authority.
- The Urban Zones estimate they will create or retain over 75,000 jobs in the next 10 years as a result of federal assistance.
- The 15 new Urban Zones average about 10 square miles in area.
- The new Urban Zones contain a total of 712,000 residents.

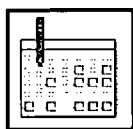
