There are 7 steering committee members, 12 State Coordinators and 18 city coordinators.

Steering Committee Members:

Donna Dees-Thomases-- founder. Ms. Thomases founded the MMM in August after the California daycare center shooting. She is a public relations consultant for CBS Entertainment.

The Bell Campaign -- located in San Fran, this is a victim-led, grassroots organization committed to preventing gun death and injury. We would invite their executive director and/or board chair.

PAX -- Peace in Latin -- co founded by Talmage Cooley and Daniel Gross. Their mission is to create a powerful national movement to end gun violence.

Daniel Gross - co founder of PAX. His brother was critically wounded in a shooting atop the Empire State Building in 1997. Daniel left his successful ad career to found PAX. He is presently recognized as one of the leading national spokespersons on the gun violence issue.

Talmage Cooley -- founder of the Gun Violence Project in 1995 and co-founder of PAX. In 1997 PAX and the Gun Violence Project were merged. Talmage is known for creating innovative media strategies for the national anti-gun violence movement.

Handgun Control, Inc. -- a non-partisan, not-for-profit organization that lobbies in favor of reasonable gun regulations at local, state and national levels. We could include their ED, their chair, Sarah Brady.

Coalition to Stop Gun Violence -- founded in 1974. Their members include more than 40 religious, professional, labor, medical, educational and civic organizations. Their mission is the orderly elimination of the private sale of handguns and assault weapons in the US. CSGV seeks to ban handguns, assault weapons from importation, manufacture, sale and transfer.
