Event: Glamour magazine's 1999 Women of the Year Awards Gala. This year is particularly special because it marks the award's tenth anniversary (Glamour itself is 60 years old; it is the Women of the Year Awards that is celebrating the tenth anniversary)

Venue: Alice Tully Hall, Lincoln Center, New York City

Attendees: In addition to special guests of Glamour and the ten winners, invitees include all of our previous award winners (please see attached list), as well as members of the media. The venue holds about 1,000 people.

Date: The evening of November 11th

Other speakers: Glamour publisher Mary Berner, Glamour editor-in-chief Bonnie Fuller, ceremony keynote speaker Katie Couric

The award: Every year for the past ten years, Glamour editors, with the help of a distinguished Board of Advisors (consisting mainly of previous winners), select ten women (or groups of women) who've helped change the way the world sees women—and the way women see themselves. The winners inspire, incite and excite; they are the role models who tell young women and girls that they, too, can achieve their dreams. They have made the past year especially memorable and important for women.

This year's winners: This year's ten winners represent achievement in politics, entertainment, sports, business, science, the law, activism and more. As we prepare to enter a new millennium, this year's group of winners shows us that the possibilities for women are truly limitless. There will be ten Women of the Year Award winners and two Lifetime Achievement Award winners, as well as a special tribute to former Glamour editor Ruth Whitney, who passed away this year. Given the number of winners, it would probably be best to simply congratulate them all with one umbrella statement.

- **Points to cover:** **NOTE: Bonnie Fuller will introduce Mrs. Clinton's video, so she should probably open by saying, "Thank, you, Bonnie." She may want to send her regrets for not being able to join such an amazing group of accomplished women on this big night, but add that she is certainly there with them in spirit—it's a spirit of bravery, guts, talent and achievements that Glamour celebrates with these awards. Mrs. Clinton herself is a past winner (1992), so she may want to say something about the night she won, and what that meant to her. She should of course congratulate the winners and, since this is 1999, she may want to say something forward-looking about women and the new millennium.
