AIDS czar breaks ranks, endorses needle programs

SAN FRANCISCO -- The White House's AIDS czar publicly contradicted the Clinton administration Wednesday and endorsed needle exchange programs as an effective way to combat the spread of the AIDS virus.

Sandra Thurman, appointed by the president last year as director of the Office of National AIDS Policy, predicted that scientific evidence showing that needle exchange programs work without promoting illegal drug use will prevail in setting the administration's AIDS policy.

"Public health should be driven by science, not politics," she said, addressing the National AIDS Update Conference in San Francisco.

Also Wednesday, renowned AIDS researcher Dr. Jay Levy told attendees of the weeklong conference that a protein found in certain cells of long-term HIV survivors could lead to the development of an

AIDS vaccine. And he suggested that the triple-drug therapies now prescribed to anyone newly infected with HIV, the virus that causes AIDS, may actually harm the body's own ability to fight the disease.

Thurman, whose remarks were interrupted by a heckler demanding federal action on needle exchange programs, said that every day 33 Americans become infected with HIV as a result of drug injections. "I am haunted by the responsibility to use my position to do everything I can to stop this carnage," she said in advancing needle exchange programs.

She said scientific studies have validated the view of public health and medical organizations -- that handing out sterile syringes to people who inject illegal drugs reduces the spread of AIDS without leading to more illegal drug use.

Last year, the National Institutes of Health reported that "there is no longer any doubt that these programs work" and urged immediate action on them.

About 100 cities and counties throughout the country have needle exchange programs, including San Francisco. In Sacramento County, supervisors have opposed a needle exchange program.

The federal government prohibits the use of federal money to pay for the programs and Clinton's drug czar, Barry R. McCaffrey, wants it to stay that way.

Both McCaffrey and Thurman have said they would leave it to Donna E. Shalala, secretary of health and human services, to make the decision about funding.

"Hopefully, as our nation's top public health official, Secretary Shalala would consider science first and foremost in determining any public health policy," said Derek Gordon, communications director of the San Francisco AIDS Foundation. "Sadly, up until now it would appear that politics and not science has been leading the decision-making in the president's administration."

Now that every senior scientist at HHS has weighed in to certify the science ( that needle exchange programs reduce the rate of HIV infection and do not encourage drug use ) we are loathe to find a legitimate reason to withhold funding at this point. The Congress has already laid out the criteria for supporting NEP, so we have no reason to bounce the issue back to them.

The effectiveness of these programs has been demonstrated. That is what meeting the criteria means. Consequently, calling for demonstration programs, per se, makes no sense.

However, in communities that choose to use federal dollars for needle exchange programs, the programs will operate as a self selected demo project because of the ongoing national evaluation effort for the effects of these programs.

As part of a compromise I would recommend the following:

1. Require ongoing evaluation of the programs that choose to use federal dollars and ask for a comprehensive report at the end of 3-5 years ( the average duration of a demonstration project ).

2. Put a flat ban on the use of treatment dollars ( SAMHSA ). This would make clear the Administration's position that no treatment money should be diverted for needle exchange.

Part of any announcement on this needs to emphasize that this does not create a national needle exchange program and that there is no new money associated with the removal of funding restrictions. This is about flexibility of existing funds.

Sorry. I thought what I had suggested in the previous memo was a variation of option number 2.

What if we certify the science and then allowed state and local communities to opt into a national demonstration project if they chose to ( there are many HHS demonstration projects that have over 50 sites ). Any community that opted into the national demonstration would have to abide by the criteria put forward by the Congress, including referral to drug treatment. In addition, HHS could require that they participate in ongoing research and evaluation. Finally, we could offer a report to the Congress at the end of a 3-5 year period.

TALKING POINTS ON AIDS

June 4, 1998

Q: Is it true that President Clinton has lied to and betrayed people with AIDS?

A: The President continues to make the fight against HIV/AIDS a top priority. Since he took office:

funding for care and treatment for people living with HIV/AIDS has more than tripled and funding for research has increased by 50%

drug assistance programs that provide promising new therapies to people with HIV/AIDS have increased by more than 450%

a new vaccine research center is being built at the National Institutes of Health to focus on the President's goal of finding an AIDS vaccine within 10 years

drug approval at the Food and Drug Administration has been accelerated to record times

Q: Is it true that the The President's own Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS is prepared to resign as a result of his decision not to fund needle exchange programs?

A: While some members of the Council have expressed frustration from time to time, we are not aware of any plans for resignations. On the contrary, the Council members realize that their participation gives them a unique opportunity to develop policies that best meet the needs of people living with AIDS.

Q: What is your reaction to the criticisms of the Administration's position on needle exchange?

A: The Administration is committed to reducing the transmission of HIV and reducing drug use. We believe that the recent decision was the best way to advance these two goals. The Secretary of Health and Human Services made clear that appropriate needle exchange programs can cut HIV transmission without increasing illegal drug use. At the same time, the Administration tried to prevent the politicization of needle exchange by keeping decision making at the local level. We understand that this decision raises strong feelings on both sides, but we think that HHS's release of the scientific findings relating to needle exchange was critically important.

**DRUG CZAR AND AIDS CZAR AGREE THAT  
PUBLIC HEALTH POLICY MUST BE  
BASED ON SOUND SCIENCE**

(Washington, D.C.) -- Barry R. McCaffrey, Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy, and Sandra L. Thurman, Director of the Office of National AIDS Policy, issued the following joint statement:

Today, America is struggling with not just one epidemic, but with two. Tragically, the twin epidemics of AIDS and drugs are linked and impose devastating costs on individuals, families, and on our society as a whole. Together, we share a strong commitment to improving lives and to saving lives by promoting public health policies that are based on sound science.

We agree that drug treatment is the most effective tool not only in reducing the use of drugs but in reducing the sharing of needles, both of which contribute to the spread of HIV. Unfortunately, despite a 33 percent increase in federal spending since fiscal year 1993, drug treatment is only available for half of those in immediate need. We are strongly united in our desire to do everything that we can to expand the availability of drug treatment for all those in need, and to prevent the further spread of HIV among injecting drug users and people with whom they have sexual contact.

As for needle exchange, Congress has limited the use of Federal funds for sterile needle and syringe exchange projects until (1) the Secretary of Health and Human Services determines that exchange projects are effective in preventing the spread of HIV and do not encourage the use of illegal drugs; and (2) the project is operated in accordance with criteria established by the Secretary for preventing the spread of HIV and for ensuring that the project does not encourage the use of illegal drugs. The Office of National Drug Control Policy and the Office of National AIDS Policy remain dedicated to working with Secretary Shalala, and to supporting her efforts to ensure that public health policy is guided by sound science.

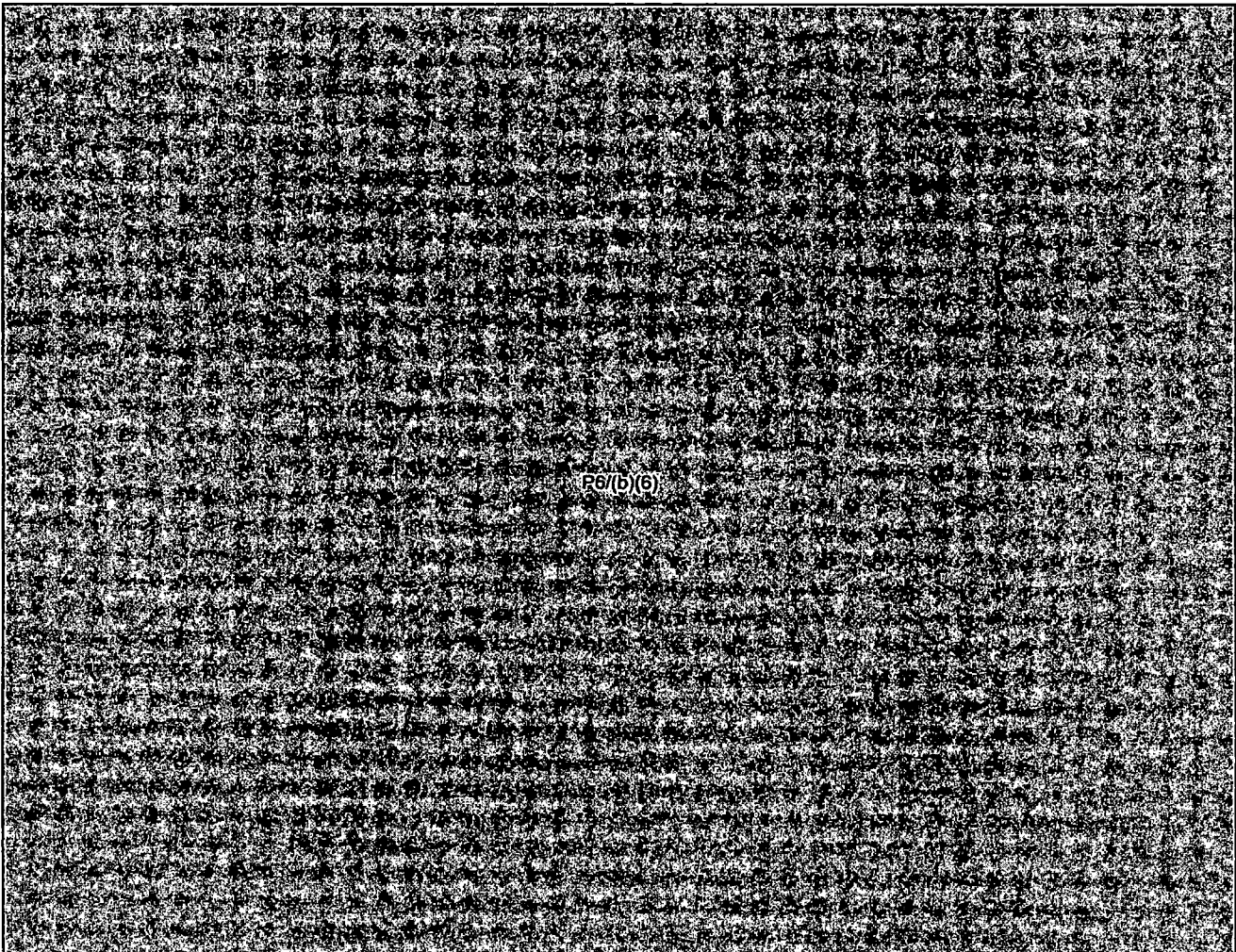

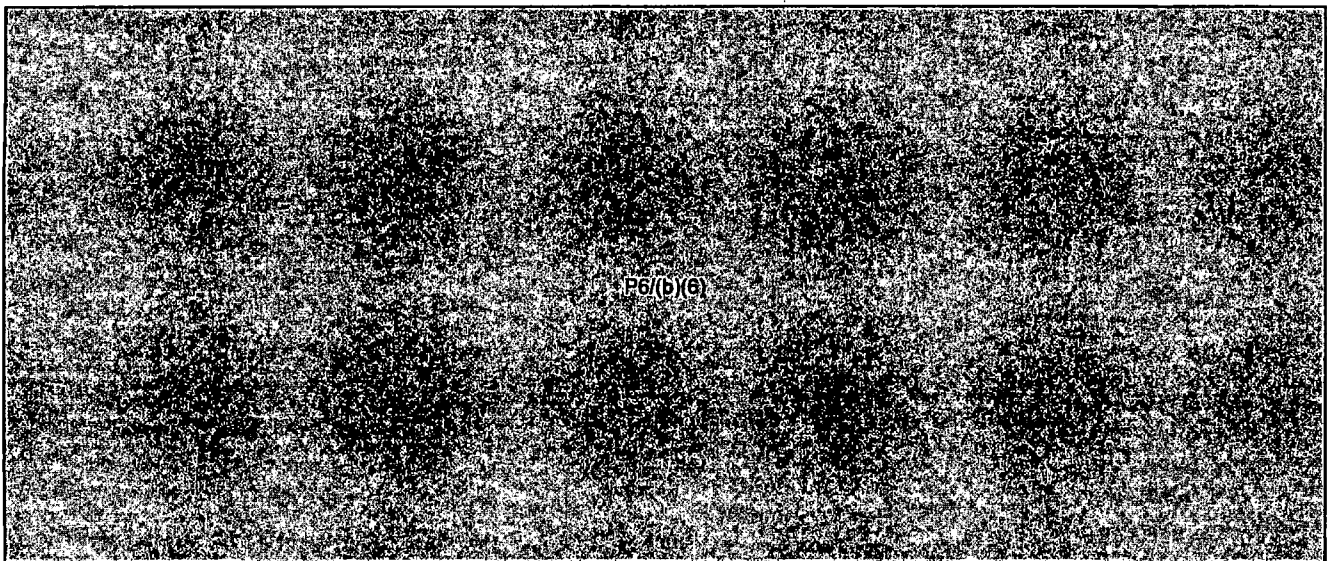

Subject: *AIDS and the African-American Community*

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### HIV/AIDS Epidemic Overview

HIV/AIDS is disproportionately impacting African-Americans in the United States. New infections are related primarily to injection drug use (either directly by needle sharing or indirectly through sexual contact with someone who has used drugs). Most new pediatric cases can also be indirectly attributed to drug use among a parent. The stigmatization of young gay and bisexual African-Americans males is believed to contribute significantly to their high risk of infection. A few recent statistics clearly illustrate the problem:

### HIV Infections

- 57 of new HIV infections are among African-Americans (these data come from 25 States that require reporting of HIV infections; these are generally low-incidence states—the situation is undoubtedly worse in high-incidence states like New York and California that report only AIDS cases)
- These same 25 states reported that recent HIV infections among 13-24 year olds were disproportionately among African-Americans (63 %); among women in this age group, 70 of those newly infected were African-American

### AIDS Cases

- AIDS is the leading cause of death for Blacks between 25 and 44 years of age
- African-Americans comprise 36 of cumulative AIDS cases and 45 of new AIDS cases in 1997, though they are only 13 of the US population
- 60 of new AIDS cases in women are among African-Americans
- 58 of cumulative pediatric AIDS cases are among African-Americans
- The rate of AIDS in 1997 was 20 times higher among Black women than the rate among white women (and 7 times higher in Hispanic women)

### Political Overview

Over the past few months, there has been increasing attention by the Congressional Black Caucus (CBC) and mainstream African-American civil rights organizations on the impact of AIDS on their community. This has been fueled by the Administration's decision on needle exchange.

Because injection drug-related infections occur disproportionately among African-Americans and Latinos, confirming that these programs save lives and then withholding Federal funding for them was perceived as a lack of commitment to addressing AIDS among communities of color. In a May 15, 1998 letter and press conference, members of the CBC requested that the Secretary of HHS "declare the HIV/AIDS crisis in the black community a 'public health emergency.'" Representatives Maxine Waters and Louis Stokes (who chairs CBC's health committee) have been strong proponents for visible Administrative action on these issues, and have been outspoken in their criticism of the status quo. In part, they believe that a declaration by the Administration of a public health emergency among African-Americans would help them to rally their colleagues and mainstream organizations to become more engaged on AIDS issues.

Julian Bond of the NAACP has subsequently echoed the need for action. In addition, the President's Advisory Council on HIV/AIDS has elevated the impact of HIV/AIDS on African-Americans and Latinos to its top priority at its June meeting.

It is important to recognize that Latino-Americans are also disproportionately impacted by HIV/AIDS, although on a national scale the epidemic is most severe among African-Americans. Other communities of color have been impacted by HIV/AIDS, but to a lesser degree than either African-Americans or Latino-Americans.

NOTE: It is extremely important that we develop a plan for realistically responding to the CBC's very valid concerns. Given the community's unmet expectations surrounding Medicaid expansion and the race initiative, it is imperative that we do not set ourselves up by appearing to either promise something we cannot deliver on or by attempting to do something that will be seen as purely symbolic. In addition, we want to ensure that while we seek to increase attention and resources on HIV/AIDS in the African-American community, we do not create a dynamic of the African-American community versus the gay community in a battle for AIDS funding.

*HHS has been working internally to craft a comprehensive response. They have promised us a draft by Friday and I will be sure to update you as soon as the information is available.*

### Suggestions for the NAACP Speech

You may want to consider the following for inclusion in the upcoming speech to the NAACP:

- an acknowledgment of the disproportionate impact of HIV/AIDS on African-Americans
- a commitment to actively engage this issue and to dialogue with Congressional and community leaders on finding solutions
- a commitment to push for appropriate funding for HIV prevention and care programs serving African-Americans, though this should not be construed as an effort to inappropriately shift funding away from existing programs that are still addressing urgent needs

- a commitment to continue working on increasing the access of poor Americans to quality health care, including those that are living with HIV or AIDS.
