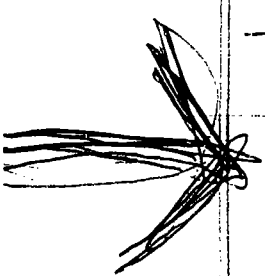

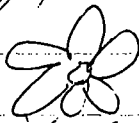

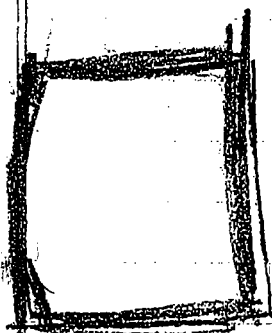

Teacher Training Issue Surfaces In Finance Debate

Republicans introduced their preferred teacher-training plan as an amendment to a bankruptcy bill slated for debate in the Senate yesterday and today, leaving education lobbyists scurrying to shoot it down.

The National Education Association (NEA) on Monday sent a letter to members of the Senate condemning a proposal by Sen. Judd Gregg, R-N.H., to attach the GOP's teacher quality plan to S. 625, the 1999 Bankruptcy Reform Act.

Gregg's amendment, like the House-passed Teacher Empowerment Act (TEA), H.R. 1995, would consolidate the president's smaller-classes program, the Goals 2000 initiative and the Eisenhower professional development program into one account for either teacher training or hiring. Unlike the House bill, however, Gregg would not require states to develop plans for employing a fully qualified teaching force by Dec. 31, 2003.

"The proposed amendment," NEA said in its letter, "provides no resources or requirements to ensure every child the opportunity to learn from a highly qualified teacher."

Financial Incentives, Too

Gregg, however, took the Senate floor yesterday to criticize President Clinton's \$1.2 billion program for reducing class size in grades K-3, claiming that Democrats are trying to usurp local decision-making power in education.

The Gregg plan also would offer teachers and school staff immunity from lawsuits related to school discipline, as the House proposed in both its juvenile crime bill, H.R. 1501, and its plan for educating disadvantaged children, H.R. 2.

Gregg would add some new wrinkles, too, creating tax deductions for teachers for their

CCSSO Calls For Equity In Preschool Programs

SAN FRANCISCO—State school officials on Saturday joined a growing chorus calling for federal and state policymakers to expand children's access to quality early intervention and preschool services.

Conference Report

The Council of Chief
State School Officers
(CCSSO), conducting
its annual meeting

here, passed a resolution Saturday calling for comprehensive planning in early childhood educational and health services, and emphasizing the need to ensure low-income families can benefit from the same developmental opportunities available to wealthier ones.

"It's a call to action," said Robert Bartman, Missouri's education commissioner and the outgoing president of CCSSO. "Right now, early childhood programs are typically available to the affluent ... Less affluent families don't have the same kind of options."

CCSSO is the latest among education reformers to stress the value of early childhood services.

Vice President Al Gore has proposed to make preschool available to "every child." And Sen. Jim Jeffords, R-Vt., wants to create a

Calif., Mich. Voters Reject Voucher Plans

California and Michigan school voucher proposals were solidly rejected in voting Tuesday, prompting teachers' unions and others who vigorously opposed the ballot questions to, not surprisingly, declare the beginning of the end for the school-choice movement.

"The resounding defeat of vouchers in Michigan and California should put an end to the myth that voters want vouchers," said Bob Chase, president of the National Education Association, the nation's largest teachers' union. "What parents and the public want are good public schools in their neighborhoods."

Both ballot initiatives were defeated by more than a 2-1 margin, with California's voucher question opposed by 71 percent of that state's (more on p. 6)

Ariz. Voters Pass Measure To End Bilingual Education

By a 2-1 margin, Arizonans on Tuesday voted to curb bilingual education in their state, passing an initiative modeled on a 1998 ballot measure in California. Under Proposition 203, all public school instruction must be conducted in English.

"We will comply in good faith with the mandates of this proposition, and we will do so in a way that respects children and does not harm children academically," said Laura Penny, spokeswoman for the state education department.

Clinton, Carper Emerge As Ed Panel Candidates

Democrats' net gain of three or four Senate seats could land them an extra slot on the education committee, leaving Democrats and even Republicans to start speculating on who could be coming—or going.

Election 2000

All standing members of the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions Committee with contested seats were re-elected, leaving a strong possibility the committee will be unchanged, especially if Republicans wind up with a 51-49 advantage.

But should a too-close-to-call race in Washington fall to Democrats—spurring a 50-50 split—Republicans could add another Democrat to the panel, for a 10-9 division that would more accurately reflect the makeup of the overall Senate.

Sens.-elect Hillary Clinton, D-N.Y., and Thomas Carper, D-Del., appear to be the most likely incoming senators to join the panel, which could also see its roster altered if current members opt to move to another committee.

Some media reported Tuesday night that Clinton is angling for a spot on the education committee, but a *New York Daily News* story said she also is interested in a foreign relations (more on p. 8)
