SUBJECT: Meeting with Gephardt

You may want to raise three issues with Rep. Gephardt at the ballgame tonight: China MFN, Russia, and how to get the Democrats to be more supportive on foreign policy issues.

On China MFN, you might want to put what Rep. Pelosi said this afternoon about her bill having the votes to a reality test. You also may want to ask him what he thinks the minimum the Pelosi camp will accept on this. In addition, it would be helpful to find out whether Rep. Bonior, the House Whip, intends to push hard on legislation if he does not like what the President does on MFN. (Rep. Pelosi mentioned this afternoon that he is organizing a meeting of some religious and pro-Tibet groups on Monday.) As you know, Bonior was a key player in the NAFTA debate.

On Russia, you could engage him again on what he saw, what he thinks we ought to be doing and where our assistance program has problems. You may also want to ask him if he would like to discuss where he sees the fault lines with our program. Nick Burns said you should tell him that we are preparing a detailed response to the suggestions he raised in the report he did with Gingrich, including how we implement the program (he said to be oblique about personnel changes). Finally, Nick said to say "Go Red Sox".

The last point you may want to raise is how we can get House Democrats to be more supportive of the President's foreign policy. I am not suggesting that they not express themselves, but it would be better for everyone if they did so in private and not on the floor of the House or in the press. You might want to ask him to call a Leadership meeting that includes House foreign policy mavens to talk about the best way to work this out.

I say go Os.
