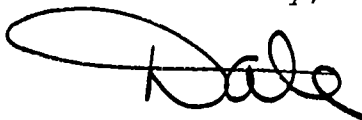

I am writing to seek your assistance or advice in arranging for President Clinton to speak to the St. Petersburg International Consortium of Universities in Washington during the period September 18-20th. I realize that Russian relations is not a primary focus for you, but hope that you can help this worthy cause.

The Consortium includes nine universities in St. Petersburg, Russia, and fourteen American universities with programs in St. Petersburg (see following material). Its purpose is to promote international cooperation in higher education. The September meeting in Washington will be attended by at least seven rectors (presidents) of St. Petersburg universities and by several American university presidents.

I will be out of the country July 1-17, but communications during this period can be directed to my staff coordinator, Candace Tatem, at (214) 964-2329.

ST. PETERSBURG INTERNATIONAL CONSORTIUM OF UNIVERSITIES

The evolving conditions in Russia call for new approaches and increased cooperation among higher educational institutions. To address these needs, the St. Petersburg International Consortium of Universities was created in 1993.

The Consortium, established in conjunction with the Center for Strategic and International Studies' International Action Commission for St. Petersburg (co-chaired by Dr. Henry Kissinger and Mayor Anatoliy Sobchak and directed by George Handy), is composed of universities with active interests in St. Petersburg. Many universities are emphasizing management training, education, or research, but universities with other interests (e.g., public policy, engineering, languages, fine arts) are also participating. The Consortium is co-directed by two members of the International Action Commission, Dr. Robert Rutford, former President of the University of Texas at Dallas, and Rector Ludmila Verbitskaya of St. Petersburg University.

The first meeting of the Consortium was held in St. Petersburg in November 1993. Strategic objectives for the Consortium were considered at this meeting, including informational exchanges, joint educational programs, facilitation and coordination of members' activities, identification of issues and goals for educational development, and efforts to increase financial support for higher education in St. Petersburg. The Consortium also explored ways in which it can assist in supporting the business development mission of the International Action Commission for St. Petersburg.

The Consortium's second meeting was held in St. Petersburg in June 1994. Cooperation with the International Action Commission for St. Petersburg and sources of funding for educational projects were considered in detail. The Consortium is proceeding with plans to establish a communications and learning center in St. Petersburg to support the distance learning activities of Consortium participants.

The Consortium elected two coordinators to manage its activities, Professor Richard Harrison of the University of Texas at Dallas and Professor Vassily Okorokov of St. Petersburg Technical University. Six working groups, composed of representatives from member universities, have been established to carry out the work of the Consortium. The working groups and their charges are:

Formal Structure - develop charter, by-laws, agreements and other documents necessary to formalize the Consortium. Co-chairs: Professor Jonas Engberg of Stockholm University and Professor Alexander Kravtsov of St. Petersburg University of Economics and Finance.

Information Exchange - collect and disseminate information on university programs and cooperative agreements, and serve as a clearinghouse for opportunities for program cooperation. Co-chairs: Professor Helene Breazeale of Towson State University and Professor Ali Osmanov of the Russian Pedagogical University.

Distance Learning - develop a specific project proposal for conducting remote instructional and research activities utilizing computer networks and telecommunications technologies. Co-chairs: Professor Steve Gardner of Baylor University and Professor Vladimir Shnaider of St. Petersburg Electrotechnical University.

Project Proposal Development - identify and prioritize additional Consortium projects and develop specific proposals for these projects. The development of detailed proposals may necessitate the establishment of subgroups or additional working groups for specific projects. Co-chairs: Professor Robert Hopley of the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and Professor Alexander Morozov of St. Petersburg University.

Financial - seek funding for project proposals approved by the Consortium. Co-chairs: Professor Dwight Jaffee of the University of California at Berkeley and Professor Ilij Beloglazov of St. Petersburg Mining University.

Business Ethics - develop code of ethics and supporting materials for Russian business, with emphasis on Russian-foreign business interactions. Co-chairs: Professor Richard Harrison of the University of Texas at Dallas and Professor Vassily Okorokov of St. Petersburg Technical University.

The next meeting of the Consortium will be held in Washington, D.C., on the week of September 18. Action on the recommendations of the working groups will be considered at that time.
