TITLE IV - ECONOMIC SECURITY

Section 401. *Family Investment Package*: Expands the dependent care tax credit, establishes scholarship fund for early childhood teachers, creates a community reinvestment fund, expands parental leave, doubles the child care and development block grant and establishes a tax credit for employers that provide child care benefits to their employees.

Section 402. *Single Parent Protection*: Allows tax credit for person entitled to receive child support equal to amount of unpaid child support. Increases tax liability by same amount of person required to pay such support.

Section 403. *Work for Real Wages*: Helps welfare families in workfare and community service jobs achieve income that will support their children by allowing them to qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit. Requires that any unpaid work required as a condition of receiving benefits be credited as wages for the purposes of calculating EITC. Hours worked without direct compensation will be credited as though minimum wage were paid.

TITLE V - EDUCATING OUR CHILDREN

*Partnership to Rebuild America's Schools*: Schools are crumbling across the country. According to the GAO, it will cost \$112 billion to repair them. Rural, urban and suburban districts all face serious problems. This legislation provides \$5 billion in assistance to local communities that are now struggling to meet urgent school repair needs and to deal with severe overcrowding. Under the bill, half the funds would be distributed by states to school districts with the greatest need for assistance. The other half would be distributed directly to the 100 school districts with the highest numbers of poor children. School districts would be required to use these federal funds to leverage state and local support. Thus, the \$5 billion federal investment would result in an estimated \$20 billion for school renovation and construction.

TITLE VI - BUDGETING PROVISIONS

Provides for determining new budget authority and outlays resulting from this Act and reducing the national defense budget function by the amount necessary to offset the total increases.
