Thank you, Senator Graham, for that introduction. Welcome to you and Mrs. Graham, Senator Harkin, Senator Torricelli, Lieutenant Governor McKay, Congressman Deutsch, Commissioner Nelson, Representative Bloom and Senator Jones.

And thank you to this audience. In large part because of you, because of your tireless work and unselfish devotion, in 1996 Vice President Gore and I carried Florida, the first Democratic ticket to do so in 20 years. And I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

You helped us win because you believe in a certain kind of America and were willing to put yourselves on the line to help achieve it. That is why you are here tonight.

I am here because I believe in a certain kind of America too.
