

CRIME BILL -- DOLLARS FOR NEW HAMPSHIRE, 1995 - 2000
(Revised 8/22/94)

LAW ENFORCEMENT

- * **100,000 POLICE** -- Guaranteed minimum of \$44 million -- more than 500 police officers at \$75,000 per officer.
 - ** Given New Hampshire's share of the population and the additional \$6.5 billion in discretionary dollars, New Hampshire should expect a total of about \$70 million over the next 6 years.
 - ** Of the total, up to 85% can be used to hire about 800 police officers. At least 15% -- \$10 million -- can be used to help pay the training, overtime and administrative costs of implementing community policing in New Hampshire.
- * **PRISONS & BOOT CAMPS** -- \$13 million for prison grants, including military-style boot camp prisons. An additional estimated \$13 million is possible if New Hampshire meets the "Truth in Sentencing" target of second-time violent offenders serving 85% of their sentences.
- * **BYRNE ENFORCEMENT GRANTS** -- \$1 billion in the Trust Fund will help continue full funding for these grants, including New Hampshire's \$2.7 million annual share.
- * **RURAL LAW ENFORCEMENT GRANTS** -- \$1.5 million for drug and crime enforcement in New Hampshire's rural areas.
- * **DISCRETIONARY GRANTS** -- New Hampshire's law enforcement agencies and courts may apply for:
 - ** \$1,000,000,000 -- Drug Court programs (treatment backed up by drug testing and certain punishment for non-violent offenders currently on probation.) Estimated \$4.4 million for New Hampshire -- enough for about 2,200 offenders over six years.
 - ** \$320,000,000 -- Criminal record systems (Brady Law), communications equipment, and DNA testing; and
 - ** \$200,000,000 -- Judges, prosecutors and public defenders (estimated \$900,000 for New Hampshire).

PREVENTION PROGRAMS

- * **LOCAL PARTNERSHIP ACT** -- \$4.5 million in direct grants to cities and towns in New Hampshire. Wide discretion permits local governments to use the dollars for education, drug treatment, and jobs programs.
- * **VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT** -- \$3.8 million in grants for police, prosecutors and victims services; \$1.5 million in grants for shelters for battered women and their children; and New Hampshire can apply for a share of \$500 million in several discretionary programs.
- * **AFTERSCHOOL AND IN-SCHOOL "SAFE HAVENS" FOR AT-RISK CHILDREN** -- \$1.3 million for non-profit, community-based organizations in New Hampshire.
- * **DRUG TREATMENT IN PRISONS** -- \$1.6 million to treat up to an estimated 1,400 drug-addicted prisoners in New Hampshire prisons over the next 6 years.
- * **LOCAL CRIME PREVENTION BLOCK GRANT** -- \$1.2 million in direct grants to cities and towns for various programs, including:
 - ** **ANTI-GANG GRANTS** -- to give young people positive alternatives to gangs, such as academic and athletic after-school activities, mentoring programs and scout troops.
 - ** **MIDNIGHT SPORTS LEAGUES** -- to give at-risk youth nightly alternatives to the streets, and for the U.S. Olympic Committee to develop supervised sports and recreation programs in high-crime areas.
 - ** **BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS** -- to establish clubs in low-income housing communities, and to encourage police officers to live in those communities.
 - ** **TRIAD** -- for partnerships between senior citizens groups, police chiefs and sheriffs to combat crimes against elderly Americans.
 - ** **POLICE PARTNERSHIPS FOR CHILDREN** -- for partnerships between law enforcement and social service agencies to fight crimes against children, and for the creation of youth councils to combat crime.
 - ** **VISITATION CENTERS** -- for supervised centers for divorced or separated parents to visit their children in "safe havens" when there is a history or risk of physical or sexual abuse.

**** YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CENTERS -- to develop more effective education, training, research, prevention, diversion, treatment and rehabilitation programs for violent juveniles, including alternatives to school suspension and juvenile court diversion.**

**** SAFE SENIORS CORRIDORS -- to provide older Americans with enhanced protection from crime by increasing police presence and crime prevention activities by community groups.**

**** HOPE IN YOUTH -- to create Family Outreach Teams composed of youth, parents and school-parent organizers for mentoring, community organizing and peer counseling.**

*** DISCRETIONARY GRANTS -- State agencies and non-profit organizations may apply for a share of:**

**** MODEL INTENSIVE GRANTS -- \$626 million for intensive, comprehensive and flexible aid to areas, urban and rural, hardest hit by crime and violence.**

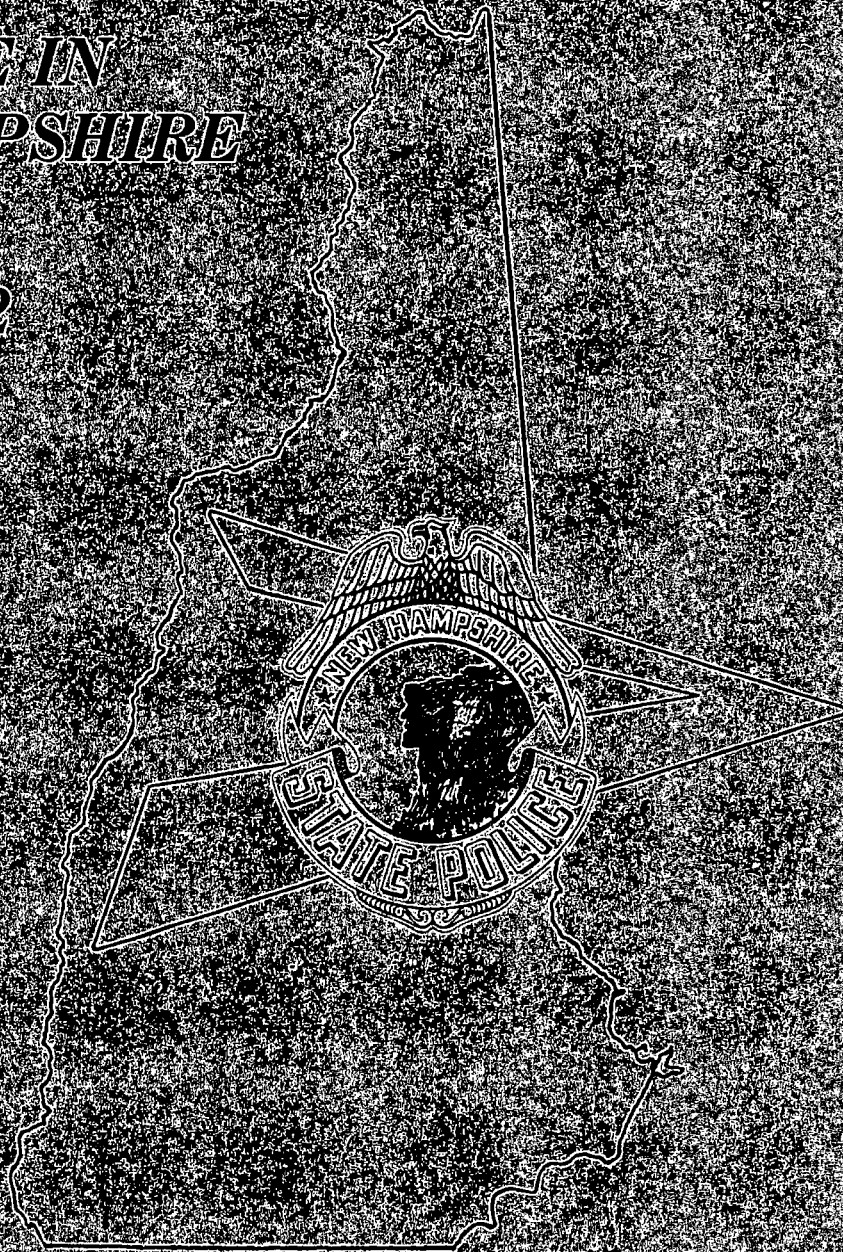
**** NATIONAL COMMUNITY ECONOMIC PARTNERSHIP -- \$270 million to extend lines of credit of up to \$2 million to community development corporations to provide small, low-interest loans to businesses in low-income neighborhoods.**

**** GANG RESISTANCE EDUCATION AND TRAINING ("GREAT") -- \$45 million for school-based programs to teach children to resist peer pressure and understand the negative impact of gangs and drugs.**

**** URBAN RECREATION AND AT-RISK YOUTH -- \$4.5 million to expand recreational facilities in high-crime areas.**

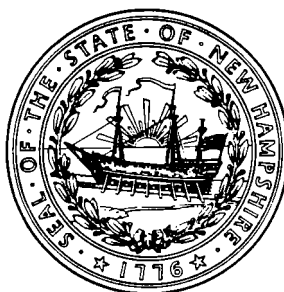

The State Police Uniform Crime Report Unit (UCR) is proud to present the sixteenth edition of "Crime in New Hampshire." This annual report contains 1992 statistics voluntarily contributed by Granite State law enforcement agencies.

It is a pleasure to announce a decrease in the reported number of serious crimes in our state which overall dropped 11.3 percent from 1991 to 1992. This is largely attributed to a decrease in reports of Burglary, 16.4 percent; Motor Vehicle Theft, 12.3 percent; and Larceny, 10.6 percent. Aggravated Assaults dipped 1.6 percent. Moreover, the number of reported homicides dropped from 33 in 1991 to 19 in 1992. On a less positive note, reported Rapes were up by 28.9 percent while Robbery crimes rose slightly. Drug Arrests increased by 16.3 percent.

The new National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is progressing. The UCR Unit, charged with implementing and overseeing the NIBRS program, has been conducting testing on the state, county, and local level to ensure the integrity of the system is maintained. In the near future we expect the NIBRS software to be installed and made available to all reporting agencies to allow them to participate in the new NIBRS program.

In closing, I would like to extend our sincere appreciation to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for their continued support and guidance as well as the expertise and technical assistance they've provided our on-going NIBRS program. In addition, all New Hampshire police agencies who contributed to this report should be commended as their contributions make this valuable report possible.

NOTIFICATION

The publication of "Crime in New Hampshire" has served the communities of the state for many years. From the beginning, this report has been a statistical reference that measure the "trends" of Part I and Part II crimes as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The Uniform Crime Report Unit of the Division of State Police has continually informed both the law enforcement community and the general public that this periodical can only represent data under these terms.

There are several important reasons why this document can only serve as a criminal activity indicator. First, the submission of necessary data is done on a voluntary basis by the police agencies in the state and the number of reporting agencies often vary from year to year. Secondly, inconsistencies arise in how data is interpreted by submitting agencies which can conflict with the federal definitions. Also, unfounded crimes are deleted from the year they are reported, not in the year of occurrence.

Readers are cautioned to keep these factors in mind when reviewing the data and are advised that if year to year comparisons are made crime rate percentages may vary.

TOTAL AREA - 9,304.3 Sq. Miles

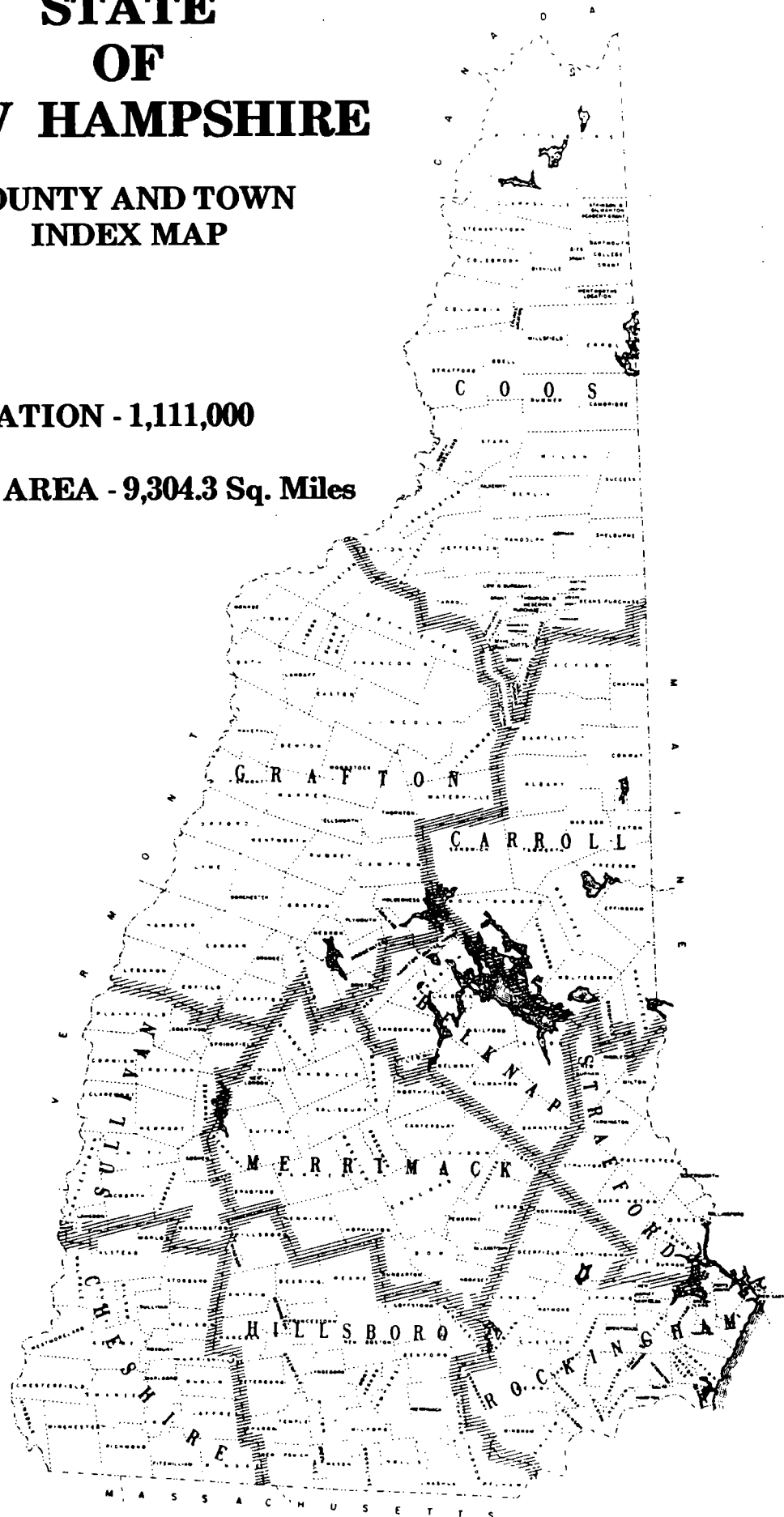

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Adult - In New Hampshire an adult is a person 18 years of age or above.

Cleared by Arrest or Exceptional Means - For UCR purposes, an offense is "cleared by arrest" or solved for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is (1) arrested, (2) charged with the commission of the offense, and (3) turned over to the court for prosecution. In certain situations, when the police have exhausted all leads and done everything possible to clear a case, the offense can be "exceptionally" cleared. The following conditions have to be met before an offense can be cleared exceptionally: (1) The investigation has definitely established the identity of the offender; (2) There is enough information to support an arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution; (3) The exact location of the offender is known so that he could be taken into custody; and (4) There is some reason outside law enforcement control that precludes arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Index Offenses - The sum total of eight major offenses used to measure the extent, fluctuation, and distribution of crime in a given geographical area. The eight offenses are: (1) Murder, (2) Forcible Rape, (3) Robbery, (4) Aggravated Assault, (5) Burglary, (6) Larceny-Theft, (7) Motor Vehicle Theft, (8) Arson. Each of these offenses is referred to as an "Index Offense."

Juvenile - In New Hampshire, a person 17 years of age or under.

Property Crime - Consists of the Index Offenses of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson.

Violent Crime - Consists of the Index Offenses of Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault.

CALCULATION OF RATES

Offense and Arrest Rates

To compute offense rates per 1,000 population, divide your community's population by 1,000 and then divide the number of offenses by the resulting figure.

Example:

- a. Population for your jurisdiction, 31,600.
- b. Number of known burglaries for your jurisdiction for a year, 341.

Divide 31,600 by 1,000 = 31.6.

Divide 341 by 31.6 = 10.79.

The burglary rate is 10.79 per 1,000 inhabitants.

The number 31.6 can now be divided into any offense class total to obtain a crime rate for that offense.

The same procedure can be used to obtain arrest rates per 1,000 population.

Clearance Rate

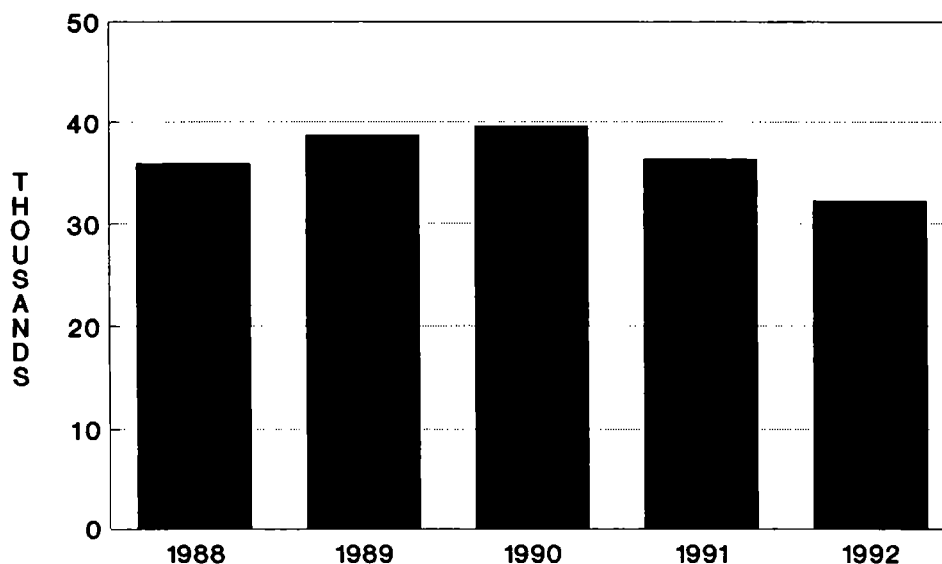
The percentage of crimes cleared by arrest is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of actual offenses known. This answer is then multiplied by 100.

Example:

55 Burglaries cleared	
341 Burglaries known	$.16 \times 100 = 16\%$

Your percentage of clearance for burglary is 16%.

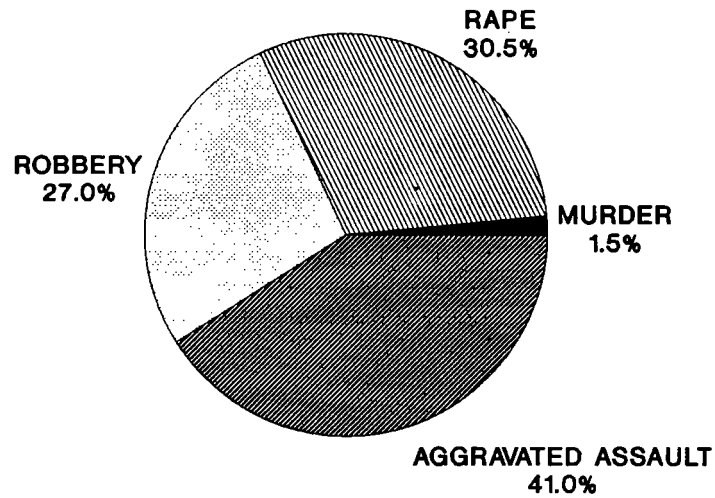

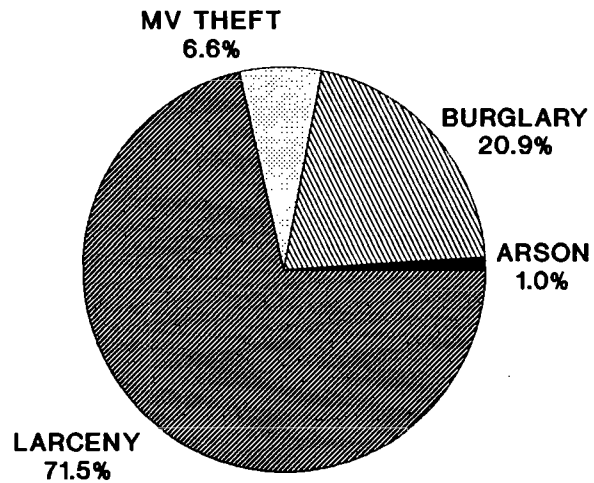

Percent of Property Crimes



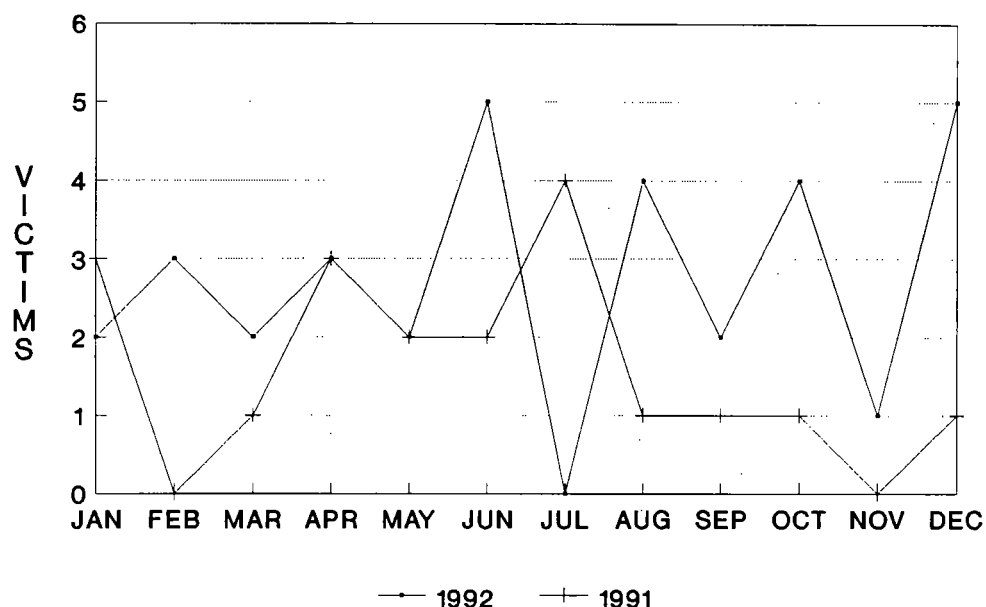

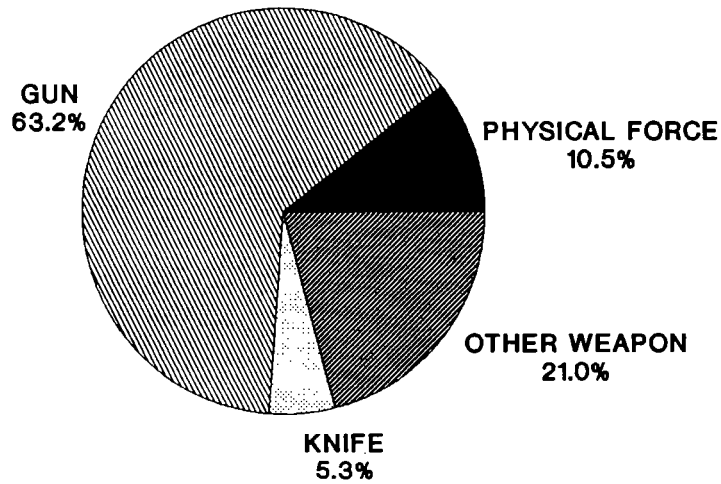

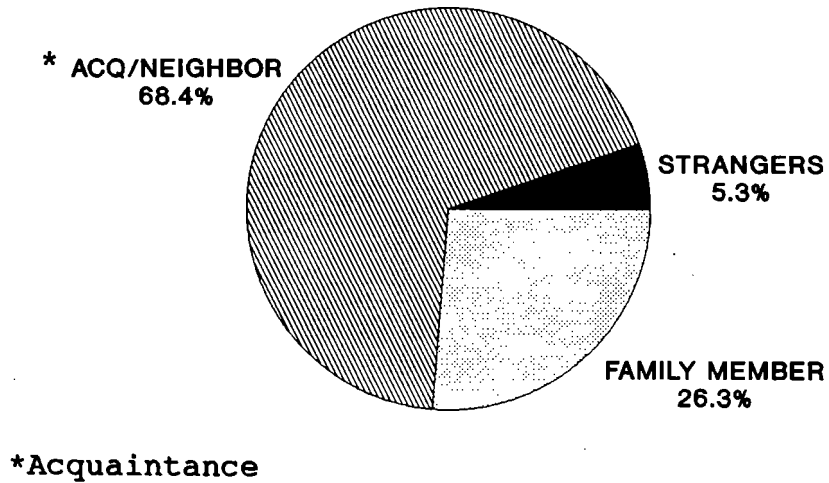

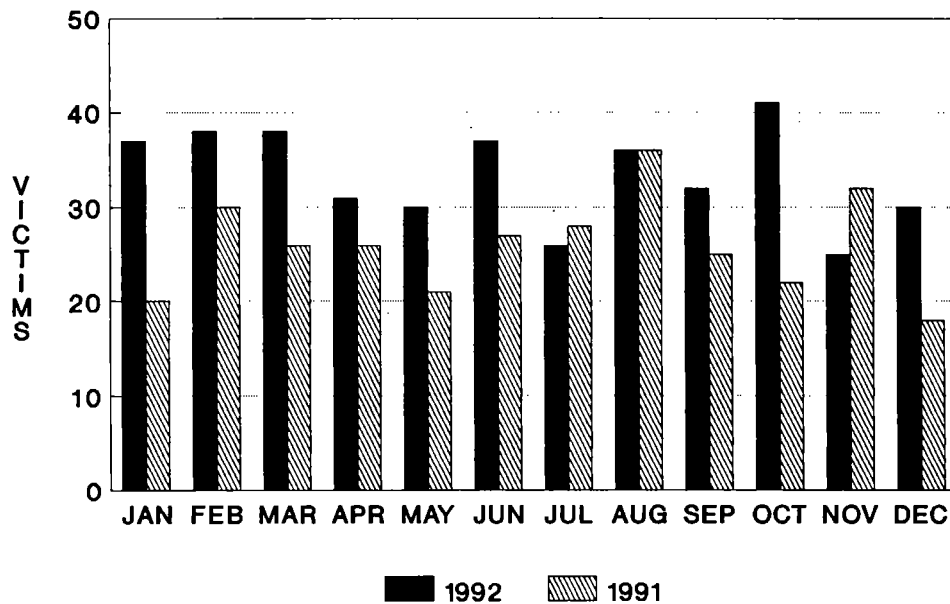
Relationship of Victim to Offender

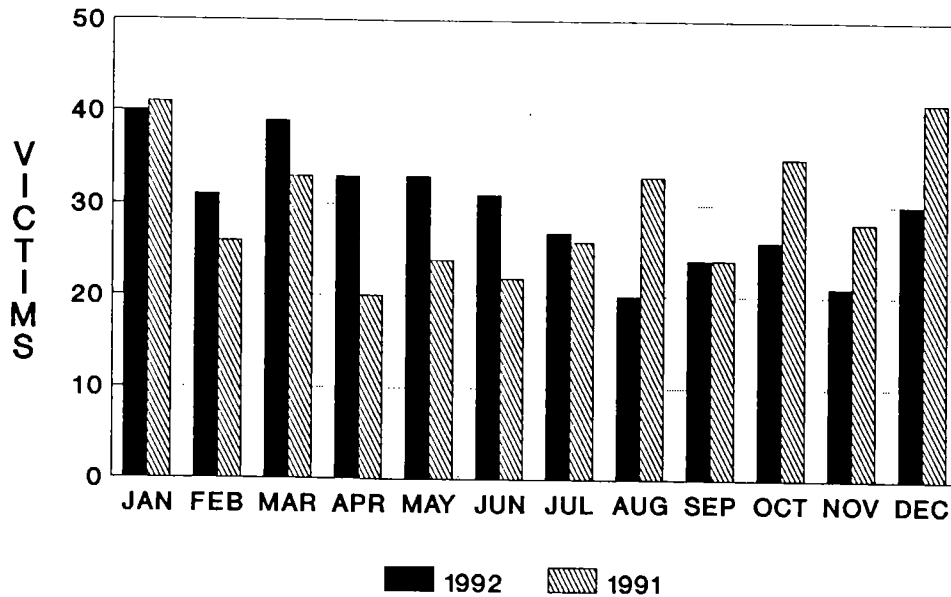

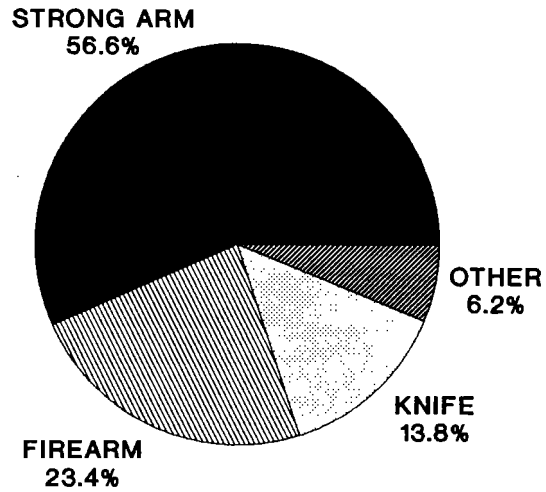

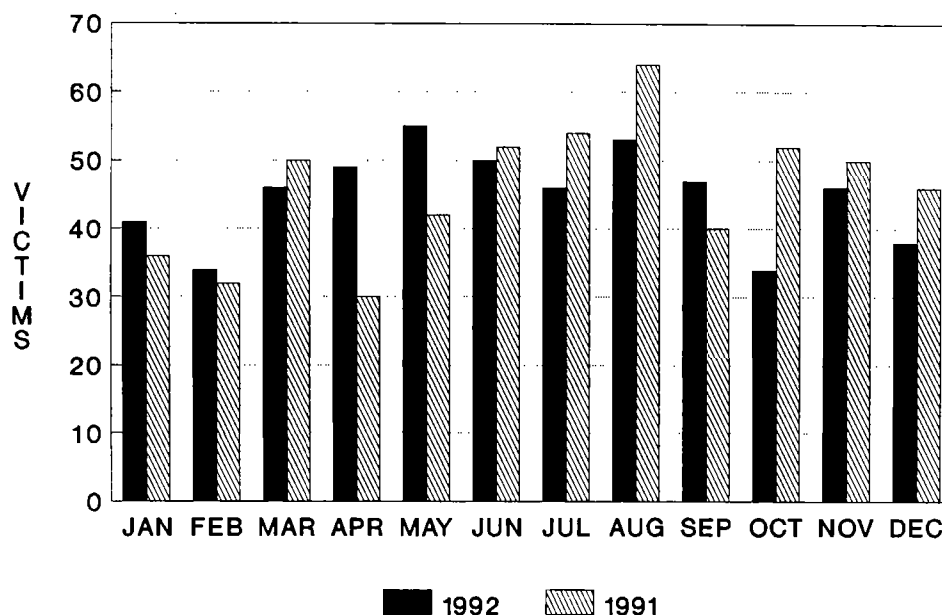

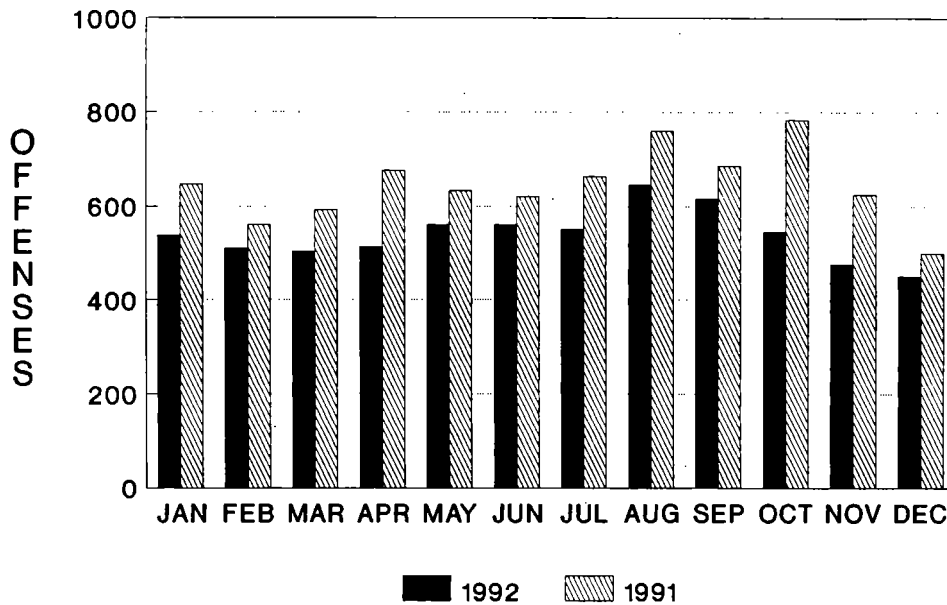

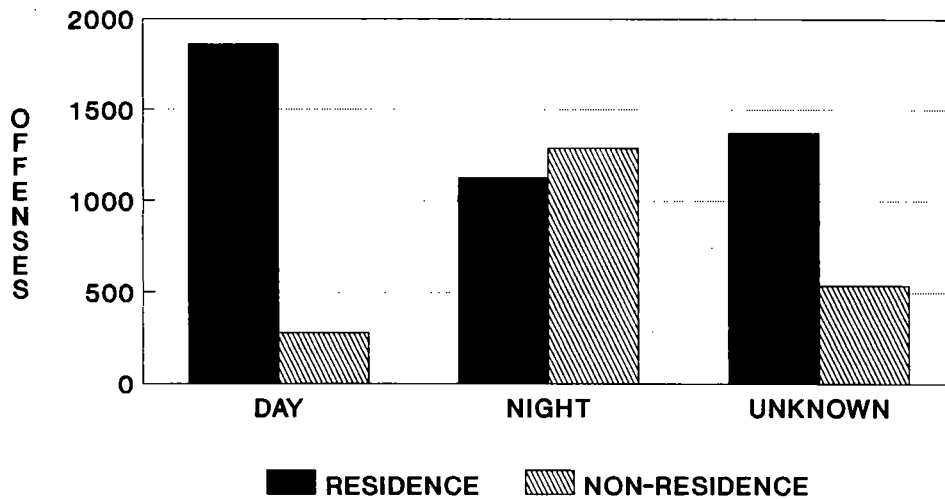

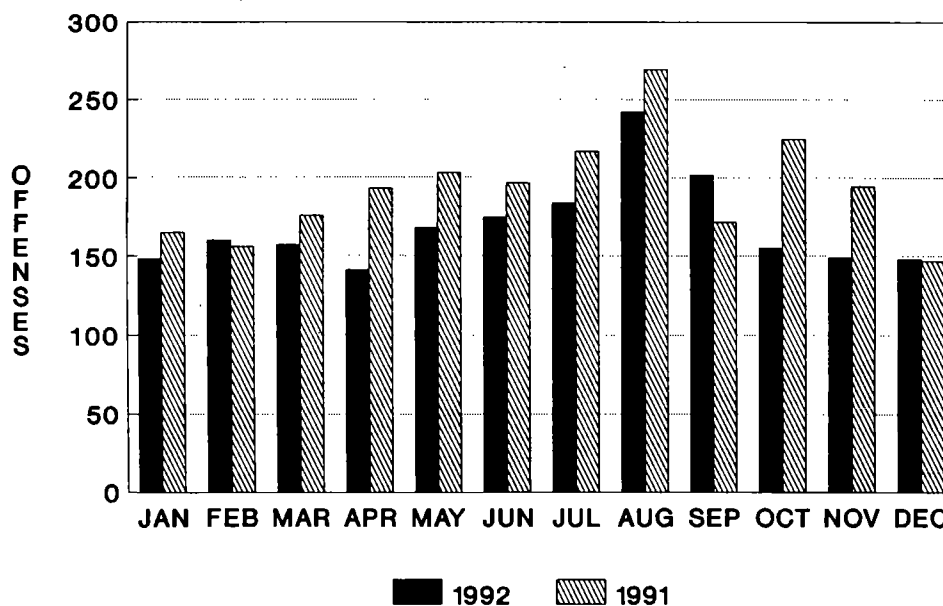

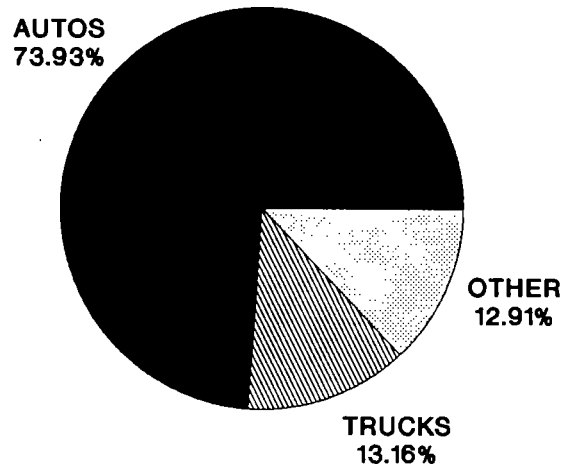

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFTS

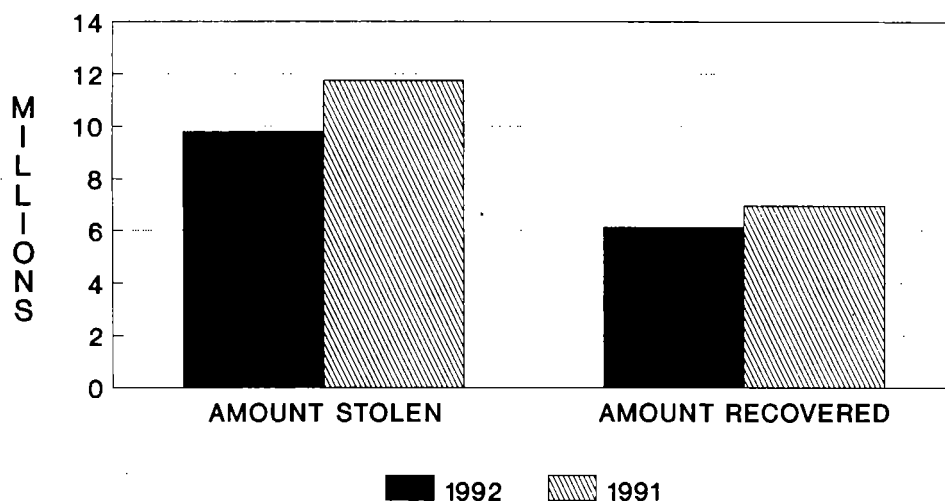
TYPE OF VEHICLE

STOLEN VS. RECOVERED

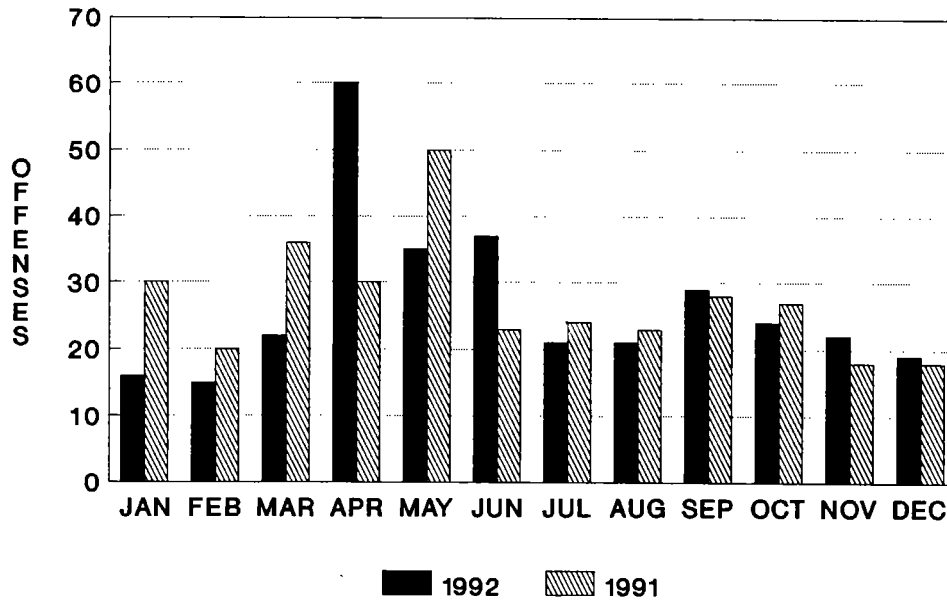

DOMESTIC ASSAULT

In 1979, the General Court mandated the Director of State Police to present an annual report to them concerning the nature and extent of domestic violence in our State. It was decided to collect this data in conjunction with the UCR program by adding a relationship category to the information collected in assaults. The following chart indicates the relationship of the offender to the victim along with the type of weapon used in aggravated assaults and the number of simple assaults for 1992:

UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING DEFINITIONS

PART II OFFENSES

- 08. Other Assaults** - Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim are included as other assaults.
- 10. Forgery and Counterfeiting** - In this class are all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
- 11. Fraud** - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.
- 12. Embezzlement** - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- 13. Stolen Property; Buying, Receiving, Possessing** - Included are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
- 14. Vandalism** - Willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property without consent of the owner or person having custody or control of such property. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property, such as: cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public restroom walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, tipping over gravestones, etc. Count all arrests for the above, including attempts.
- 15. Weapons; Carrying, Possessing, etc.** - This class deals with weapon offenses, regulatory in nature, such as:
- Manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons;
 - Carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly;
 - Using, manufacturing, etc. silencers;
 - Furnishing deadly weapons to minors;
 - Aliens possessing deadly weapons; and
 - All attempts to commit any of the above.
- 16. Prostitution and Commercialized Vice** - Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as:
- Prostitution;
 - Keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame;
 - Pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc; and
 - All attempts to commit any of the above.

- 17. Sex Offenses** - (Except forcible rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice.) Included are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, such as:

Adultery and fornication;
Buggery;
Incest;
Indecent exposure;
Indecent liberties;
Seduction;
Sodomy or crime against nature;
Statutory rape (no force); and
All attempts to commit any of the above.

- 18. Drug Abuse Violations** - Included are all arrests for violations of state and local laws, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs. The following are subdivisions of narcotic drug law arrests:

- (A) Opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine)
- (B) Marijuana
- (C) Synthetic narcotics - manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction (demerol, methadones)
- (D) Dangerous nonnarcotic drugs (barbiturates, benzedrine)

- 19. Gambling** - All charges which relate to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling are included in this category. To provide a more refined collection of gambling arrests, the following breakdown should be furnished:

- A. Bookmaking (horse and sport book)
- B. Numbers and lottery
- C. All other

- 20. Offenses Against the Family and Children** - All charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children, such as:

Desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport of spouse or child;
Neglect or abuse of child (if injury is serious, score as aggravated assault);
Nonpayment of alimony; and
All attempts to commit any of the above.

- 21. Driving Under the Influence** - The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

- 22. Liquor Laws** - With the exception of "drunkenness" (offense 23) and "driving under the influence" (offense 21) liquor law violations, state or local, are placed in this class. Included are:
- Manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing etc., intoxicating liquor;
 - Maintaining unlawful drinking places;
 - Bootlegging;
 - Operating still;
 - Furnishing liquor to a minor or intemperate person;
 - Using a vehicle for illegal transportation of liquor;
 - Drinking on train or public conveyance; and
 - All attempts to commit any of the above.
- 23. Drunkenness** - Included are all offenses of drunkenness or intoxication, with the exception of "driving under the influence" (offense 21).
- 24. Disorderly Conduct** - In this class are all charges of committing a breach of the peace. Include:
- Affray;
 - Unlawful assembly;
 - Disturbing the peace;
 - Disturbing meetings;
 - Disorderly conduct in state institutions, at court, at fairs, on trains, or public conveyances, etc.;
 - Blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language;
 - Desecrating the flag;
 - Refusing to assist an officer; and
 - All attempts to commit any of the above.
- 25. Vagrancy** - Persons prosecuted on the charge of being a "suspicious character or person, etc." are included in this class: Vagrancy; Begging; Loitering (persons 18 and over); and Vagabondage.
- 26. All Other Offenses** - Included in this class are every other state and local offense (except traffic violations) not included in offenses 1 to 25.
- 27. Truancy** - Reported only in the New Hampshire State Juvenile Arrest Report.
- 28. Incurigible** - Reported only in the New Hampshire State Juvenile Arrest Report.
- 29. Runaways** - Includes apprehensions for protective custody as defined by local statute. Arrests of runaways from one jurisdiction by another agency should be counted by the home jurisdiction.
