Home HIV test kits, made by Home Access Health and Johnson & Johnson, are being marketed with distinct campaigns aimed at gay men, teenagers, and heterosexual adults in publications targeting each of these populations. Despite the relatively high cost of the tests, the anonymity they offer is attractive to many consumers, said Dave Mulryan of the Mulryan Nash advertising agency in New York. The Home Access kit costs \$39.95 in stores and \$49.95 by mail, while the Johnson and Johnson test costs \$35 to \$40 in stores and \$49.95 by mail. After years of opposition from the Food and Drug Administration, the tests gained approval last summer, but critics are now attacking the companies' marketing tactics and question the reliability of telephone counseling for customers who test positive.

"Haven for AIDS Patients"

Baltimore's AIDS Interfaith Residential Services (AIRS) organization provides housing and services to single adults and families with AIDS. The first AIRS house opened in 1988 and has been home to 72 people, and three additional AIRS houses opened this year. Using a \$1 million grant from the Department of Housing and Urban Development, AIRS and the St. Ambrose Housing Aid Center bought the houses, renovated them, and installed elevators and other equipment. The homes can accommodate up to 30 people.

"Across the USA: Connecticut, Vermont"

The Board of Selectmen in Windham, Conn., is requesting that the state end a six-year-old needle-exchange program on the grounds that discarded needles are littering the streets and parks. Separately, Vermont Gov. Dean spoke in opposition to efforts to legalize the medical use of marijuana, contending that better treatments are available. The Vermont Grassroots Party, which supports legalization, gained party major status in the recent election.

"Science & Health Bulletin: Zimbabwe--AIDS Now [Declining]"

PANA Wire Service (11/20/96)

The rate of HIV infection in Zimbabwe's Manicaland province is declining, thanks to education programs and subsequent behavior changes, health officials reported. In addition, Diarmund McClean, medical officer of health for the Mutare city council, said the transmission of sexually transmitted diseases like gonorrhea and syphilis is decreasing. Currently, an estimated 30 percent of the adults in the province are HIV-positive.

"Condom Sales Boom in Mali"

Condoms are being sold at an impressive rate in the West African state of Mali, according to the national committee against AIDS. A total of 2,265,926 condoms was reportedly sold in the first nine months of the year, compared to the 1,699,014 that were sold in all of 1995.

"FDA Conducting Inspections of New York Blood Centers"

Two New York City blood centers are being investigated by the Food and Drug Administration for manipulating the results of tests for HIV, hepatitis, and other infectious diseases, New York Magazine reports. The article charges that the centers altered test results to allow them to provide more blood to area hospitals. The FDA has responded, saying the centers were not suspected of "approving tainted blood as clean, but rather compromising safety precautions by failing to follow appropriate procedures." The agency continues to inspect the centers

regularly and said that "if we find there is an imminent hazard to the public health we can suspend operations at any blood center at any time."

#### "140 People Found HIV-Positive in Macao"

Xinhua News Agency (11/20/96)

Of the 140 people in Macao found to be HIV-positive, 110 are non-Macao residents, public health officials reported. Most of the non-residents are women from Thailand working in the entertainment business. The public health department reported that it will continue regular checks of people in the entertainment industry and will advise those individuals who test positive to leave. The department will also observe "World Anti-AIDS Day" on Dec. 1 to enhance AIDS awareness among residents.

#### "New Health Standards Issued in Tanzania"

In hopes of improving health care there, the Tanzanian government released new guidelines on Wednesday for the country's governmental hospitals. Patients will be charged for half the cost of their care, with the government paying the rest, and medical consultation fees will no longer be allowed. Health minister Zakia Meghi said special cases, like AIDS, tuberculosis, and cancer, will still be treated at no charge.

#### "AIDS Researcher Loses Libel Fight Against French Newspaper"

The French Supreme Court of Appeal has dismissed Robert Gallo's libel and slander lawsuit against the French newspaper Le Monde. Gallo made the charges against the paper and journalist Frank Nouchi in relation to coverage of the conflict between Gallo and French researcher Luc Montagnier over claims on the discovery of HIV in 1991. Nouchi's articles, based on a draft report from the National Institutes of Health, allege that Gallo had "contradicted the most elementary rules of scientific communication," and that he had used the virus discovered by Montagnier to develop the U.S. HIV test. The Court ruled that Nouchi's research was "serious and profound," and Gallo was ordered to pay all legal expenses incurred by Le Monde.

#### "Accentuating the Positive"

Entertainment (11/08/96) No. 352, P. 54; Watson, Bret

The HIV-positive character Jeanie Boulet on NBC's "ER," played by Gloria Reuben, is breaking new ground for prime time television by continuing her normal routine despite her infection. While other dramatic series have introduced AIDS story lines, the infected characters have typically become ill quickly. "ER" coexecutive producer Carol Flint noted, "That's not what we wanted. And it's turned out that our intentions are supported by what's going on right now in HIV treatment." NBC and Warner Bros. say no complaints have been filed about Reuben's character, who, as a physician assistant, works in the emergency room and has tried to keep her infection secret from co-workers

and patients. In the show, Jeanie was infected by her ex-husband, who contracted HIV while having an affair. Observers in the health care community say they are glad to see Jeanie continuing to work in the hospital, especially since a general misconception holds that HIV-positive health care workers should not treat patients. Flint also points out that the program's objective is to show Jeanie continuing to live a meaningful and productive life.

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"With Plague's Fury, HIV Spreads in Belarus Town"

In the town of Svetlogorsk, Belarus, more than 1,000 people have contracted HIV since June due to the sharing of needles by drug addicts. Officials say the virus may infect 90 percent of the town's 3,000 to 4,000 addicts within two years. Factors contributing to the epidemic, such as poverty, ignorance, and a huge population of drug addicts, have also helped fuel the spread of the virus to Russia and Ukraine. In Russia, 1,000 new cases are expected this year, five times the number reported last year. In Ukraine, more than 8,000 new cases of HIV have been reported in the last two years, but the actual number of cases is thought to be much higher than those reported.

"Chiron Drops Development of Vaccine for Herpes, Sending Stock Down 17 Percent"

Development of a vaccine for genital herpes will be halted due to its failure in two phase III clinical trials to prevent infection, Chiron reported. The company's stock declined 17 percent to \$18.125 on the news. Chiron had spent an estimated \$50 million on the vaccine's development over more than 10 years. The results support some analysts' opinion that Chiron's research pipeline is overrated.

"Judge Postpones Cash Payouts to HIV-Infected Hemophiliacs"

Philadelphia Inquirer (11/26/96) P. A8; Shaw, Donna

The proposed \$640 million settlement for HIV-infected hemophiliacs in the United States was delayed on Monday, because lawyers are still working on a plan to protect the money from federal and state government claims. U.S. District Judge John F. Grady told the claimants, who would each receive \$100,000, that he sympathized with their needs for the money, but that the deal was being held up by lawyers on both sides. Many of the hemophiliacs depend on government programs like Medicaid and Social Security, and they might be forced to pay the settlement money to the government if an alternative is not found. Lawyers for both sides said a solution might be found in an act of Congress.

"FDA's Kessler Will Resign Early in 1997"

David A. Kessler, commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration for the past six years, said Monday that he will resign early next year. Kessler said he had accomplished his major goals at the agency. Although praised by President Clinton, Kessler was criticized throughout his tenure from varying political standpoints. AIDS activists said he delayed the approval of important drugs, while some later complained that he approved them too quickly. Conservatives criticized his regulation of products ranging from vitamins to cigarettes.

"Venereal Diseases Rampant Among America's Teenagers"

Washington Post--Health (11/26/96) P. 7; Russell, Cristine

The United States has the highest rate of sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) of any developed country, and about one-fourth of the estimated 12 million new cases of STDs annually reported here occur in teenagers, a committee of the Institute of Medicine reported last week. The panel advocated increased efforts by schools and private health care plans, as well as government funding to study, prevent, and treat these diseases. The report said that \$10 billion annually is spent on treating and monitoring the diseases, which can cause serious health problems including cervical cancer. The panel recommended that schools increase education efforts about STDs, and provide access to condoms and health services.

### "AIDS Researcher Dies"

Richmond Times-Dispatch (11/26/96) P. B3

Dr. Kathelyn Sue Steimer, who led research into the development of an AIDS vaccine at Chiron, died recently at the age of 48. She was vice president for research in the vaccines division.

### "'Aunt' Bea Injured by Drug Needle"

Washington Times (11/26/96) P. C6

'Aunt' Bea Gaddy, a Baltimore advocate for the homeless who prepares a Thanksgiving Day dinner for thousand's of city residents, was treated at Johns Hopkins Hospital Sunday after stepping on an intravenous drug needle. Gaddy was given several shots and tested for HIV. She said she had found a man who was staying at her shelter shooting drugs, and she stepped on the needle he dropped.

### "China to Set Up AIDS Study Center"

Xinhua News Agency (11/25/96)

A national AIDS prevention and control center is being established in China, according to officials at the Ministry of Public Health. The estimated number of HIV cases in the country is between 50,000 and 100,000.

### "Research Issues Involving HIV-Associated Tuberculosis in Resource-Poor Countries"

Journal of the American Medical Association (11/13/96) Vol. 276, No. 18, P. 1502; De Cock, Kevin M.; Binkin, Nancy J.; Zuber, Patrick L. F.; et al.

Tuberculosis (TB) infects an estimated 8 million people each year, and it kills an estimated 3 million, mostly in developing countries. About 9 percent of all TB cases are linked to HIV infection. Some TB programs in developing countries are failing to control the disease, even though effective treatment is available. Understanding why these programs fail is important to developing strategies to deal with the increasing number of cases. Dr. Kevin M. De Cock, of the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and colleagues, note areas in which HIV's impact on TB must be recognized to effectively control the disease. The authors say that the current tools used to control TB need to be reassessed in light of HIV's impact on the disease. They also advocate increased resources for TB control and research, greater political commitment, and more evident leadership within the international public health community. The researchers point to the examples of good TB control programs and their positive results in some African countries and in New York City.

### "CD4-Dependent, Antibody-Sensitive Interactions Between HIV-1 and its Co-Receptor CCR-5"

Nature (11/14/96) Vol. 384, No. 6605, P. 184; Trkola, Alexandra; Dragic, Tatjana; Arthos, James; et al.

Certain strains of HIV-1 require the beta-chemokine receptor CCR-5 to infect CD4 T-cells. HIV-1's surface glycoprotein gp120 mediates the binding of the virus to the CD4 molecule.

Researchers at the Aaron Diamond AIDS Research Center, the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases, Progenics Pharmaceuticals, and Tulane University Medical Center sought to determine whether CCR-5 serves as a second binding site for HIV-1 at the same time of after the interaction between gp120 and CD4. They report that HIV-1 binds more efficiently to CD4 when gp120 and CCR-5 interact. The authors suggest that hindering the binding of HIV-1 to either CD4, CCR-5, or both, could be an important strategy for virus neutralization.

Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (11/22/96) Vol. 45, No. 46

Of the total number of AIDS cases reported by Sept. 30, 1996, 7,472, or 1 percent, were among children aged less than 13 years. Most children with HIV contracted the virus from their mothers. The number of children infected perinatally from 1986 to 1996 peaked in 1992. In 1994, research showed that treating HIV-infected pregnant women with zidovudine (ZDV) could reduce such transmissions by two-thirds. Recommendations were issued by the Public Health Service in 1994 and 1995 for HIV counseling of pregnant women and voluntary testing and treatment. The number of annual perinatal infections decreased 27 percent from 1992 through 1995. In addition, confidential reporting of HIV infection in children is required in 28 states. An editorial

note suggests that the rate of perinatal transmissions may have declined, in part, due to the recommended use of ZDV therapy.

#### "AIDS-Free in 1991, Cambodia Tops HIV Rate"

Washington Times (11/22/96) P. A16

Although Cambodia had virtually no AIDS cases five years ago, the country now has the highest HIV infection rate in Asia. Health officials estimate that 1 percent of the population, including 2.5 percent of pregnant women, is infected with HIV. The spread of the virus is attributed to prostitution and a lack of condom use.

#### "Across the USA: Kentucky"

About 50 residents of Kentucky will be subjects in a study of a vaccine designed to prevent HIV-infected individuals from developing AIDS.

#### "World AIDS Day--December 1, 1996"

This year's World AIDS Day, with the theme "One World, One Hope," will be observed on December 1 in 190 countries. AIDS has claimed the lives of 5.8 million people worldwide, including 1.3 million children. In the United States, World AIDS Day activities are coordinated by the American Association for World Health, the Joint United Nations Program on HIV/AIDS, the Pan American Health Organization, and the Department of Health and Human Services. #### "111 Kenyans Died of AIDS Daily"

An average of 111 Kenyans died from AIDS each day between January 1995 and June 1996, the Daily Nation reports. Assistant Minister for Health Basil Criticos said the figure represents only a third of the actual number of people suspected of having AIDS. AIDS officials have estimated that more than 1.7 million people in Kenya may be infected with HIV by the end of the year.

#### "Access to New AIDS Drug Demanded; Not Yet Approved"

U.S. Newswire (11/21/96)

Clinical trials are needed to test the safety and efficacy of new AIDS drugs for children and pregnant women, claims Bonita Judon, of the AIDS Policy Center for Children, Youth and Families. Judon will testify to a committee of the Food and Drug Administration today to urge their consideration of such trials.

"There is such a feeling of hope for adults living with AIDS. We must do everything possible to safely offer these new drugs to

children and pregnant women who need them now," noted David C. Harvey, director of the center.

#### "Many HIV-Positive Patients Use Alternative Therapies"

Reuters (11/21/96)

Physicians of AIDS patients should be aware that many HIV-infected people use alternative therapies, and do not always inform their doctors. A University of Nevada in Las Vegas survey of 127 HIV-positive patients found that 100 percent were using alternative therapies. Moreover, previous research published in the New England Journal of Medicine found that 70 percent of patients who use such therapies did not tell their doctors. Doctors should, therefore, be careful not to misconstrue side effects or drug interactions that may be caused by therapies they have not prescribed.

#### "AIDS--Confidentiality in AIDS Cases"

PANA Wire Service (11/21/96); Mulenga, Mildred

The issue of AIDS confidentiality, and the potential problems it causes, was discussed at a conference of experts in Zimbabwe Thursday. "If we stick to confidentiality, what about the wife at home who doesn't know that her husband has AIDS," asked a physician who treated several AIDS patients. The potential threat of spreading HIV to children was also discussed, as was the expense of an HIV test that deters many people. One participant suggested that the government provide voluntary testing to help stem the spread of the disease.

#### "Quantitative Image Analysis of HIV-1 Infection in Lymphoid Tissue"

Science (11/08/96) Vol. 274, No. 5287, P. 985; Haase, Ashley T.; Henry, Keith; Zupancic, Mary; et al.

The amount of HIV-1 in the body is considered a reliable measure of the progress of the infection, but little is known about the virus' ability to replicate and reside in lymphoid tissue. Ashley T. Haase, of the University of Minnesota Medical School, and colleagues, developed a method of determining viral load in the immune system's mononuclear cells (MNCs) and the follicular dendritic cells (FDCs) of the lymphoid tissue. They report that, before symptoms of HIV infection develop, a large, relatively stable viral load is maintained on the FDCs while a smaller viral burden infects the MNCs. Estimates of the numbers of infected cells in the lymphoid tissues and the amount of virus they could produce, the authors say, are consistent with the amount of virus detected in the bloodstream. Haase et al. say their findings will facilitate the study of virus production and storage in the lymphoid tissues over the course of infection and treatment.

#### "Ribozymes Enter Clinical Trials for HIV-1 Treatment"

Lancet (11/09/96) Vol. 348, No. 9032, P. 1302; Rowe, Paul M.

Diseases caused by RNA viruses may be treated by destroying specific RNA sequences with ribozymes. This strategy has proven successful in cell-culture experiments and in preclinical

studies, and the first phase I trial of a ribozyme is being conducted now in patients infected with HIV-1. Previous studies have shown that, in vitro, a retroviral vector could protect CD4 T-cells from HIV-1 infection by encoding two ribozymes that cleave two critical HIV-1 sequences. In the phase I trial, led by Flossie Wong-Staal of the University of California at San Diego, blood is taken from the patient, the vector is added, and the T-cells with added ribozyme genes are returned to the patient. To evaluate the trial, the survival time of cells carrying the ribozyme will be compared to those without the ribozyme. The first patient in the small trial was injected with the treated cells in September. Depending on the results, phase II trials will advance with the same vector, or another vector will be tested in a phase I trial.

Despite Chiron's failed clinical trial of a new herpes vaccine, some analysts say the biotechnology company's shares remain attractive because the company is so diverse. The failure of one product is not as serious a concern at Chiron because it has so many other candidates in development. However, the failed herpes vaccine will delay tests of a vaccine for CMV retinitis, a virus that causes blindness in AIDS patients, because it is based on the same technology. Vaccines for hepatitis C and HIV, which

also used the same approach, will be tested as planned.

"Japan May Approve the Pill, but Women May Not"  
New York Times (11/27/96) P. A1; WuDunn, Sheryl

Although Japan's legal ban of the birth control pill may be lifted as early as next spring, many Japanese women say they will not use it. Condoms are the most popular form of birth control, followed by withdrawal, and abortions are easily available when these methods fail. The government is concerned that the pill would reduce the birth rate even lower than the current rate of 1.4 children per woman, and that the rate of HIV infection would increase. Studies have shown, however, that HIV incidence does not increase among those who use the pill for contraception.

"Nationline: AIDS and Abstinence"  
USA Today (11/27/96) P. 3A; Bacon, John

Federal funds will be denied to Idaho school districts that teach any HIV prevention methods besides sexual abstinence, Idaho Schools Superintendent Anne Fox announced. Fox said the decision is based on public demand, and denied conceding to fundamental religious interests opposed to modern sex education. The policy may be the most restrictive approach to AIDS education in any state, an official at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said.

"Group Wants HIV Ruling Overturned"  
Toronto Globe and Mail (11/26/96) P. A3; Downey, Donn

Members of the Canadian AIDS Society are seeking to keep undisclosed the names of 13 HIV-positive men, claiming their identification would defeat the purpose of Ontario's Health Protection and Promotion Act and discourage others from seeking voluntary HIV tests. Madam Justice Janet Wilson of the Ontario Court's General Division ruled in 1995 that the names should be revealed in the public interest. Two types of anonymous HIV tests

are allowed in Ontario--those provided by clinics and by family doctors who do not have to identify the subject. The 13 men, who gave blood between December 1984 and September 1985, did not consent to HIV tests because they were told at the time that the test did not exist. Wilson ruled that, by revealing the names of the 13 men, the infringement on their rights would be "minimal," and the health of their partners could be protected.

"Public Forum: Facts of Domestic Partner Benefits"  
Boston Globe (11/26/96) P. D4; Sherman, Andrew D.

While domestic partners are increasingly included in employee health insurance plans and benefit programs, some businesses fear higher costs due to large numbers of AIDS patients and other factors. However, the rate of HIV infection and AIDS among those enrolling in such plans is small, and the cost is not significant when compared to other, more common illnesses. The average lifetime cost of treating an AIDS patient is about \$150,000, compared to \$500,000 over a few months to treat a premature baby. Cancer treatment can range from \$30,000

to \$100,000 over a lifetime. Less than 2 percent of the employees offered domestic partner benefits have enrolled, and only a small minority of this group are same sex male couples.

#### "Thailand Visit Caps Clinton Tour"

USA Today (11/27/96) P. 4A; Nichols, Bill

President Clinton ended his 10-day tour of Asia in Bangkok on Tuesday, and told his Thai audience that the U.S. commitment to the Asian Pacific is "stronger than ever." He also brought attention to two epidemics in the region: AIDS and drug use. "These forces of destruction defy traditional defenses, just as traditional barriers can no longer keep out ideas, information, and truth," Clinton said.

#### "Treat Patients on Individual Basis"

USA Today (11/27/96) P. 13A; Benjamin, Ken

In response to an editorial that appeared in USA Today approving of new liver transplant policies, Ken Benjamin, of the May Day Hepatitis Action Committee, objects to the policies on medical and ethical grounds. In a letter to the editor, Benjamin says the policy, established by the United Network for Organ Sharing, is unfair because it does not consider the survival prospects of each individual. He points out that it would be unsound to move a gay man down the transplant list based on the fact that gay men are more likely to have AIDS, and thus not survive the transplant.

#### "Ukraine Mulls HIV-Positive Prisons"

United Press International (11/26/96); Coumarianos, Philippe

Hoping to stop the spread of HIV in the prison system, Ukraine officials have proposed isolating HIV-infected prisoners in separate facilities. HIV has spread rapidly among inmates over the past two years, due to rape, homosexuality, and intravenous drug use. Officials say about 2,100 prisoners are infected, some 70 percent of whom are male. If approved by the government, HIV-positive prisoners would be moved to two existing jails which would be staffed by doctors and nurses trained in HIV care.

#### "Resistance to HIV-1 Infection Among Persistently Seronegative Prostitutes in Nairobi, Kenya"

Lancet (11/16/96) Vol. 348, No. 9038, P. 1347; Fowke, Keith R.; Nagelkerke, Nico J.D.; Kimani, Joshua; et al.

Canadian and Kenyan researchers studied HIV-1 resistance among prostitutes in Nairobi, Kenya, to determine if some individuals in a highly exposed group would be resistant to HIV-1 infection. The authors found that, among 424 prostitutes who tested negative for HIV-1 in 1985, 239 seroconverted by 1994. Forty-three of the women remained HIV-1 negative after three or more years. The researchers conclude that the incidence of HIV-1 seroconversion decreased with increasing duration of exposure, suggesting that there is heterogeneity in HIV-1 susceptibility or acquired protection from HIV-1. They conclude that a small percentage of highly exposed individuals are resistant to HIV-1

and that this resistance may be provided by natural immunity.

"Study: Depression Affects AIDS Survival"

American Medical News (11/18/96) Vol. 39, No. 43, P. 24

A new study of HIV-positive gay and bisexual men suggests that chronic depression is linked to shorter survival. Researchers at the University of California, San Francisco report that, out of 405 men, those who reported being depressed throughout the eight-year study period were two-thirds more likely to die than those who were never significantly depressed. Study author Tracy Mayne explained, "The more frequently a person is depressed, the higher their risk of dying from AIDS. If you treat the depression, the risk goes down." The findings were reported in the Oct. 28 issue of the Archives of Internal Medicine.

The fifth annual Day Without Art, a celebration of art and survival, was also observed. The works of HIV-positive poet laureate River Huston were celebrated with interpretations by students at the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts.

Meanwhile, in the United Kingdom, the number of HIV-1 infections decreased from 2,888 in 1994 to 2,623 in 1995, public health officials said.

"HIV, AIDS Not Separate, Court Rules"

American Medical News (11/18/96) Vol. 39, No. 43, P. 20

A federal trial court in Pennsylvania granted summary judgment to a blood products supplier and a hospital which were sued after a patient who had received an HIV-tainted blood product died from AIDS. The patient received a blood transfusion during a coronary bypass at the hospital in January of 1984. In January 1987, the hospital blood bank's director informed the patient's primary care doctor that the donor had tested positive for HIV. The patient also tested positive, and died of AIDS-related causes in September 1993. The patient's husband, who was not infected, sued the blood product supplier and the hospital for negligence, breach of warranties, strict liability, survival, and wrongful death. The court dismissed the strict liability and breach of warranty claims, and granted summary judgment on the other claims, given that the statute of limitations had expired. The infection was known in 1987, but the action was not filed until more than six years later. The court rejected the argument that HIV and AIDS be considered "separate and distinct illnesses," an allowance which would have extended the statute of limitations.

"Seeking Reasons for Disease Genes"  
New York Times (12/03/96) P. C1; Kolata, Gina

With new information about how genes impact diseases like AIDS and cancer, researchers are seeking to understand why such genetic advantages exist. Some are searching for advantages brought by mutated genes while more skeptical scientists are asking if there is evidence for a selection effect. Dr. Stephen O'Brien, a geneticist at the National Cancer Institute who is studying a genetic mutation that can confer immunity to HIV, believes that such mutations benefited populations in the past and were preserved. O'Brien has suggested that the gene might have been selected to protect against the Black Plague or tuberculosis.

### "Still Needed: An AIDS Vaccine"

In a commentary in the Wall Street Journal, H.R. Shepherd, chairman of the Albert B. Sabin Vaccine Foundation, urges the development of vaccines to prevent, and eventually wipe out, HIV. Shepherd describes the medical costs associated with AIDS treatment, and says that vaccines are the most cost-effective medical tool ever devised. As examples, he cites the eradication of polio and smallpox, and the savings attributed to vaccines for these diseases. Shepherd concludes that more funding must be allocated for research on an HIV vaccine.

### "Looking Past Fear of AIDS to See a Child"

When Wayne and Dianne traveled to New York City from rural Virginia to collect their newly adopted son, an infant born with HIV, they did not know whether he would remain HIV-positive. Three-fourths of babies born to HIV-positive mothers are not infected themselves, but test positive for HIV antibodies. The child was adopted through the Spence-Chapin Services to Families and Children, which arranges one-fifth of the 100 annual domestic adoptions of children with special medical needs. Few have HIV-positive mothers, however, in part because women with the virus often avoid making adoption plans in denial of their illness.

Colorado's El Paso County has reported decreasing rates of HIV, syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia since 1990. In Alaska, meanwhile, the number of women infected with HIV has increased 50 percent in the past year. The number of heterosexuals with the virus is 150 percent higher, and the HIV rate is rising in Hispanics and black men.

### "Courage, Luck, and Message of Hope"

Sarah Lazarus, of Concord, Mass., and others applaud the article and the Journal for helping to bring a personal AIDS message to a wide audience. Other readers note that, while Sanford described his relationship with his partner as a "marriage," he contracted HIV from a man he met in a bathhouse, "whose name he didn't catch."

### "Book World: Science vs. Reality"

In his book "Impure Science: AIDS, Activism, and the

Politics of Knowledge," sociologist Steven Epstein uses the U.S. AIDS scene as an example of what happens when the leaders of a social movement become part of the establishment. Epstein describes the actions of activists, scientists, politicians, drug companies, and physicians in their efforts to obtain recognition and save lives while protecting their own self interests as well. Reviewer Nancy Seideman says that the credibility fight around researcher Peter Duesberg, who challenges the idea that HIV causes AIDS, is the most interesting of Epstein's examples.

"Senate Tackles State Propositions Allowing Use of Illegal Drugs"

The enforcement of new laws allowing the medical use of marijuana in California and Arizona was considered Monday at a hearing of the Senate Judiciary Committee. Committee chairman Orrin G. Hatch (R-Utah) and other senators, are seeking increased enforcement of federal antidrug laws. Federal law-enforcement officials said they have no specific plan yet, but will pursue drug violators on a case by case basis.

Opera star Jessye Norman is producing an AIDS benefit Wednesday night that will be attended by stars including Whoopi Goldberg and Elton John. It will be held at New York's Riverside Church, and will be broadcast next year at this time. The concert will benefit an organization called Balm in Gilead, which leads the effort to involve black churches in the fight against AIDS.

"Characteristics of Women 50 Years of Age or Older With Heterosexually Acquired AIDS"

Of all the AIDS cases in women reported through December 1994, 9 percent were among women aged 50 and older, and most of these women contracted HIV through heterosexual contact. Little research has been done to determine the level of HIV risk behavior in older women. Barbara Schable and colleagues at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention interviewed HIV-positive women in this age group and report on their sociodemographic characteristics and sexual and other risk behaviors. They found that older women were more likely than younger women to live alone, not to have completed high school, to be tested for HIV while hospitalized, and never to have used a condom before testing positive for HIV. The CDC researchers conclude that physicians should try harder to recognize HIV risk behavior in older women, should encourage HIV testing, and should promote condom use.

"Generation of CD4 and CD8 T-Cell Clones From PBLs of HIV-1 Infected Subjects Using Herpesvirus Saimiri"  
Nature Medicine (11/96) Vol. 2, No. 11, P. 1272; Saha, Kunal; Sova, Pavel; Chao, Wei; et al.

In vitro studies of HIV have revealed widespread differences in the virus' ability to infect peripheral blood cells, probably a factor of individuals' differences in CD4 T cells, genetic backgrounds, and virus biology. Although these differences would be best studied at the single-cell level, T cells have a short life span. In the journal Nature Medicine, researchers at Columbia University describe a method using herpesvirus saimiri to establish long-term cultures of CD4 and CD8 T cells from the blood cells of HIV-1 infected patients. Their method allows the cells to be cloned and maintained in culture for at least eight months. The authors report that the cloned cells are able to express markers of mature T cells and are infectable with primary and laboratory strains of HIV-1. This method will allow researchers to study T cell biology, HIV-1 infection at different stages, and immune responses to HIV-1 exposure, they say.

"Devious Efforts to Legalize Drugs"

In a commentary in the Washington Post, Joseph A. Califano Jr.,

president of the National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University, criticizes the campaigns in Arizona and California to legalize the medical use of certain drugs. Califano contends that the Arizona effort falsely led voters to believe that the measure would toughen penalties for violent crime and support drug prevention and education, and that the loosened controls on LSD and heroin were barely mentioned. He says the campaign for California's Prop. 215 showed the measure as a way to help the seriously ill, and did not mention that it would require only the verbal recommendation of a doctor for anyone to use marijuana. Califano says the use of private money to fund the campaigns contributed to the misleading campaigns, and he suggests that Congress act to protect states from outside private interests.

In an effort to enforce California's new medical marijuana law, State Attorney General Dan Lungren issued guidelines for the drug on Tuesday. Lungren noted that it is still unclear how federal officials will treat doctors or others who could be prosecuted because the state law conflicts with federal law.

In a second letter, Scott Harris says the Senate hearings on the topic were misleading and featured exaggerated examples of marijuana use.

#### "S. Florida Events to Benefit AIDS Victims"

Two AIDS benefits in Miami on Wednesday will help to raise money for local AIDS patients. The Food for Life Network, which supports Meals-on-Wheels, a food bank, nutritional counseling, and special holiday dinners, will hold a progressive dinner, "Walk on the Avenue," in Miami Beach. In addition, the United Foundation for AIDS will hold a furniture auction that includes pieces from several South Florida celebrities. The goal of the auction is to raise \$100,000 for the Community AIDS Project, which provides testing, treatment, and residential services for people with HIV and AIDS.

#### "Money Crisis Sinks Betak Home for AIDS Patients"

Philadelphia Inquirer (12/04/96) P. B2; Collins, Huntly

Betak, the only nursing home in Philadelphia for AIDS patients, will be closed after the remaining 20 patients are moved, city officials and Mercy Health announced Tuesday. Financial problems have repeatedly burdened the facility since it opened four years ago, and Mercy said that the lack of state funding for the home

would almost certainly require that it be closed. Philadelphia Health Commissioner Estelle Richman said the city is now searching for other ways to provide care for AIDS patients.

#### "HIV Positive Not Linked to Suicides"

United Press International (12/03/96)

People who test positive for HIV are not significantly more likely to commit suicide upon hearing the news, researchers reported Tuesday. While previous studies have found that the onset of AIDS sharply increases suicide risk, testing positive for HIV does not have the same impact. The study, published in the Journal of the American Medical Association, was conducted among men who were rejected from military service because of medical conditions. The Johns Hopkins University researchers note the finding may "offer reassurance about suicide risk as a potential adverse effect of the over-the-counter HIV home test."

#### "AIDS Experts Stress Basic Research"

Basic scientific research is needed in the fight against AIDS and should continue to receive federal funding, AIDS experts told President Clinton Tuesday. Dr. Anthony Fauci, director of the National Center for Allergy and Infectious Diseases, said he told Clinton that basic research played a major role in two of the biggest recent breakthroughs--the discovery of the receptor that provides HIV protection to some people, and the development of the protease inhibitor drugs. Clinton pledged to maintain the administration's commitment to AIDS research. "I'm determined to keep pressing until we have a vaccine and ultimately a cure," he said.

#### "Maternal Viral Load, Zidovudine Treatment, and the Risk of Transmission of Human Immunodeficiency Virus Type 1 From Mother to Infant"

New England Journal of Medicine (11/28/96) Vol. 335, No. 22, P. 1621; Sperling, Rhoda S.; Shapiro, David E.; Coombs, Robert W.; Sperling, Rhoda S.

While study results have demonstrated that zidovudine therapy significantly reduces the risk of HIV-1 transmission from mother to child, the mechanism of this treatment is not known. Researchers for the AIDS Clinical Trials Group Protocol 076 Study Group, led by Dr. Rhoda Sperling of Mount Sinai medical school, analyzed data from a previous clinical trial to determine the link between maternal viral load, transmission, and the efficacy of zidovudine therapy. The researchers report that, out of 402 mother-infant pairs, the rate of HIV-1 transmission with zidovudine was 7.6 percent, compared to 22.6 percent among women who took a placebo. In both groups, transmission was not linked to maternal viral load. Zidovudine was found to be effective across varying viral RNA levels and CD4 counts. The reduction in viral load from base line to delivery in the zidovudine group was not significantly linked to the risk of HIV-1 transmission. The authors conclude that a high maternal viral load is a risk factor for the transmission of HIV-1 from an untreated mother to her

infant, and they suggest that maternal treatment with zidovudine be initiated in all HIV-positive pregnant women, regardless of viral load.

The New York Blood Center, a non-profit organization that supplies 80 percent of the blood to New York City hospitals and tests samples for other blood centers nationwide, is under investigation for failing to follow government safety guidelines. New York Magazine found evidence that, in order to compete with other blood suppliers, the center overlooks government safety regulations and its own standard procedures for testing and approving blood for distribution. Staff members at the center have also altered test results to allow blood to be shipped that should have been rejected and discarded documents that recorded these activities, the magazine reports. The Manhattan district attorney and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration have each begun investigations of the center, and the FDA has found dozens of blood units that were distributed despite improper testing. "Our sense of what's happening is that there's so much pressure for production that individuals may be encouraged to cut corners," an official at the agency said. "This doesn't mean--necessarily--that the blood is bad. But its chances of being good are not as high as they should be.

The approach is unlike previous gene therapy attempts in that it uses stem cells. The trial, a cooperative effort with Sandoz Pharmaceuticals, will start early next year.

#### "Medicinal Marijuana Brings Legal Headache"

New laws in California and Arizona that allow the medical use of marijuana are creating conflicts for drug officials, who have been meeting in Washington this week to determine how to enforce the measures. Advocates of the new laws are concerned that the measures could lose public support as some activists call for legalization of the drug. State officials are struggling to enforce federal anti-drug laws, while the new state laws say the use of illegal drugs is justified by medical necessity. For example, in California only the recommendation of a doctor is required for anyone to possess marijuana. The law allows doctors to recommend the drug for patients with cancer, AIDS, anorexia, chronic pain, or "any other illness for which marijuana provides relief." The drug is widely used by people with HIV to stimulate appetite and battle weight loss. Some experts say marijuana may suppress the immune system, however, and that chemicals in the smoke could be dangerous.

#### "HIV Donors' Names Ordered Released"

Despite objections by the Canadian AIDS Society, the Ontario Court of Appeals ruled Monday that the names of 13 HIV-positive men who donated blood in 1984 and 1985 should be disclosed. The judge held that the greater public interest was served by the disclosure. Although the ruling called for the release of the names within 24 hours, a lawyer for the AIDS society said he would ask for a delay while the society weighs whether to appeal the decision to the Supreme Court of Canada. The society had claimed that the release of the names would discourage people from seeking voluntary HIV testing.

Female condoms will become available in Zimbabwe in April or May of 1997, AIDS policy officials report. The British Overseas Development Administration and the U.S. Agency for International Development will help to provide the condom at a subsidized price. The sale of the female condom was approved in Zimbabwe in November, after 30,000 women petitioned the government for a method to protect themselves from HIV and other diseases. Of the 10.5 million residents in Zimbabwe, an estimated 1 million people are infected with HIV.

#### "Sudan--Health: Religious Leaders Oppose AIDS [Education]"

AIDS awareness programs in Sudan have been halted by conservative religious leaders, frustrating efforts by health

officials to fight the epidemic. Dr. Tajani Abdalla, head of Sudan's National Laboratory, said AIDS programs "have failed and will continue to fail, not because of funds, but because of the attitudes of the people." Islamic religious leaders, who believe that "Allah can cure AIDS," have repeatedly led opposition to AIDS education programs. In 1995, an estimated 7,000 Sudanese were reportedly infected with HIV, but the actual number is expected be much higher. The Islamic government has outlawed sex education through the media since 1993, and has also restricted the importation of condoms.

Health officials in Kenya have announced that the government's AIDS campaign has effectively slowed the spread of the disease in some parts of the country. Joshua Angatia, Kenya's health minister, reported that about 200,000 people had died from AIDS since 1994 and that an estimated 1.2 million people were currently infected with HIV. He also announced that the government was developing a national policy to deal with the social cultural factors that influence HIV transmission.

"New Approaches Reduce Perinatal Transmission"

To further reduce the rate of perinatal HIV transmission, researchers are testing new treatment methods, including more rapid delivery, shorter courses of zidovudine (AZT), and the combination of AZT and other drugs. Since 1994, when AZT was found to reduce transmission rates by two-thirds, the rate of perinatal transmission has declined from an average of 21 percent to 10 percent. Dr. Yvonne Bryson, of the University of California at Los Angeles, says that transmission may be further reduced to less than 2 percent. A trial combining AZT and the drug HIVIG, anti-HIV immune serum globulin, will be completed in two years. "What we are anticipating is a further reduction in the transmission rate, from that of 8 percent with AZT to something that we hope would approach zero," said David Gury, of North American Biologicals. Preliminary results from the study indicate that antigen levels were reduced to zero within 24 hours. Researchers are also evaluating the safety and efficacy of new antiretroviral drugs for the prevention of perinatal transmission. Many issues related to perinatal transmission--including the impact of viral load, childbirth conditions, and breastfeeding--are also being examined.

To infect CD4 cells, most sexually transmitted strains of HIV-1 require the Beta-chemokine receptor 5 (CCR-5) to act as a co-receptor. It has been shown that individuals with a homozygous defect in the CCR-5 gene are virtually resistant to HIV-1 infection despite repeated exposures. Further study has also

suggested that heterozygotes could be better able to survive infection than individuals without the defect. David D. Ho, of the Aaron Diamond AIDS Research Center, and colleagues, analyzed the CCR-5 genotype of 1,252 homosexual men to evaluate the impact of the gene on HIV-1 transmission and disease progression. They report that, while none of the HIV-positive participants were homozygous for the defect, 3.6 percent of the uninfected Caucasian men in the study were homozygous. Heterozygotes did not appear to have any protection from HIV-1 infection, but the authors say this group did seem to have some protection from disease progression.

"HIV Risk Behaviors and Obstacles to Condom Use Among Puerto Rican Men in New York City Who Have Sex With Men"  
American Journal of Public Health (11/96) Vol. 86, No. 11, P. 1619; Carballo-Diequez, Alex; Dolezal, Curtis

Little research has been conducted to determine what barriers to condom use exist for minority men, especially Latino men, who have sex with other men. To explore this area further, Alex Carballo-Diequez and Curtis Dolezal of Columbia University interviewed 182 Puerto Rican men living in New York City who are homosexual or bisexual. They report that, among half the men who engage in anal sex with other men, condoms were used inconsistently or not at all. Similar condom use was reported by two-thirds of the men who had vaginal sex, and by three-fifths of the men who had anal sex with women. Most of the men reported having unprotected oral sex and more than one sexual partner during the previous year. Thirty percent of the men were HIV-positive. The reason cited most often for not using condoms was dislike or discomfort, followed by perceived low risk, trusting and being emotionally connected to one's partner, unavailability of condoms or inconvenience, lack of control, and indifference. In conclusion, the researchers note the need for other HIV protection methods, such as a microbicide gel.

The 89 people who signed up to participate in Missouri's lottery to provide protease inhibitors to poor AIDS patients will all receive the treatment because there is enough money to treat 132 people. The Health Department will still have to hold a lottery, however, to select the remaining patients.

"D.C. Vote Sought on the Medical Use of Marijuana" Washington Post (12/06/96) P. C8

A proposal was filed by AIDS activists in Washington, D.C., on Thursday to put a measure on the city's next ballot to legalize the medical use of marijuana. The proposal is based on a similar measure approved by California voters, members of the group ACT UP said. ACT UP spokesman Steve Michael said the group was concerned about a proposal by U.S. Attorney Eric H. Holder Jr. to increase penalties for marijuana possession and sales. Petitions for the measure will be circulated after the city's Board of Elections approves the language of the proposal.

"A Federal Role Urged in the Fight on AIDS" Boston Globe (12/05/96) P. A3

Leading pharmaceutical company researchers agree that government leadership is critical to advancing the development of an AIDS vaccine, the AIDS Vaccine Advocacy Coalition reported. The group found that investors and managers are reluctant to pursue an AIDS vaccine due to the scientific uncertainty and long development times involved. However, if the Clinton administration promoted the idea that a vaccine is feasible and if the government were to begin investing in research and development, industry interest would follow, the researchers said. The 16 drug companies working on HIV vaccines spend less than \$40 million of the \$135 million currently invested in the project worldwide.

"Lessons on AIDS Hit Home"

Washington Post (12/06/96) P. C3; Frazier, Lisa

Students at Maryland's Forestville High School learned about HIV and AIDS this week through classroom experiments that simulated the spread of HIV with cups of water and a hidden formula. The students, who were each given a cup of water, were instructed to "mix bodily fluids," represented by drops of water. The "virus," initially concealed, was later revealed with a chemical test. On Thursday, speakers from Washington D.C.'s Whitman-Walker Clinic visited with the students, and an assembly was held at the end of the day in memory of family and friends who have died of AIDS.

"Parents Seek Faster Action in Getting New AIDS Drugs to Children"

Houston Chronicle (12/05/96) P. 3A; Neergaard, Luran

Because the new AIDS drugs known as protease inhibitors are not approved for use in children, physicians and parents are struggling to determine safe doses for children on their own. Drug companies note that earlier attempts at pediatric studies were stymied and that new studies of the drugs are planned for 1997. "In hindsight, perhaps we should have moved forward to get some experimental data" sooner, said a researcher at Hoffmann-La Roche.

"Inside the Beltway: Marriages That Work" Washington Times (12/06/96)

P. A7; McCaslin, John

AIDS activists in Washington, D.C. applauded the recent Hawaiian court decision to support homosexual marriage. ACT UP's Steve Michael compared his homosexual partnership with Wayne Turner to the Clintons' marriage. "Bill Clinton shouldn't be denigrating loving, committed gay relationships," he said. "He should be taking notes."

"More Bad News on AIDS Vaccine Attempts" Reuters (12/06/96)

The latest attempt to develop a vaccine against HIV has failed, researchers say. Joseph Eron and colleagues at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill tested their vaccine, called MNrgp120, in volunteers who were infected with HIV but had no symptoms. However, after 15 months, the researchers stopped the trial because it was clear the vaccine was not effective. Barton Haynes, of the Duke University Center for AIDS Research, said the findings at least show "that the destruction of the immune system by HIV is due to relentless and high levels of HIV replication."

"Physicians Living With HIV/AIDS"

Journal of the International Association of Physicians in AIDS Care (11/96) Vol. 2, No. 11, P. 20; Shernoff, Michael

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention released guidelines in 1991 recommending that HIV-infected doctors disclose their status to patients before performing "exposure-prone procedures." The guidelines came largely in response to outcry following the much publicized case of Dr. David Acer, the Florida dentist who is alleged to have transmitted HIV to patient Kimberly Bergalis. Earlier this year, however, leaders of the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association urged the government to consider changing these recommendations, on the grounds that there has been no proven case of HIV transmission from health care worker to patient. Many doctors with HIV do not disclose their status for fear that they will be forced from clinical practice. However, some physicians who disclosed that they were HIV-positive report career shifts to positions dealing with HIV/AIDS where their personal experience is beneficial. In Manhattan, HIV-positive doctors have formed a support group to help cope with moral feelings about disclosure and the anxiety of keeping their condition secret. Most of the HIV-positive physicians interviewed said they felt they had a moral responsibility to disclose, though they also felt the need to protect their own interests.

"HIV and Cigarettes"

AIDS Clinical Care (11/96) Vol. 8, No. 11, P. 94

HIV-positive individuals who smoke are more likely to develop certain medical conditions, but may be protected from the development of *Pneumocystis carinii* pneumonia (PCP), new research has found. The study, published in the journal AIDS, assessed the incidence of AIDS-defining opportunistic infections and other specific medical conditions among HIV-infected men. Smokers were found to be more likely to develop bacterial pneumonia, oral candidiasis, and hairy leukoplakia, and the effect was stronger in heavy smokers than in light smokers. No impact on Kaposi's sarcoma or other AIDS-related

opportunistic infections was found. The researchers did note an almost statistically significant protective effect of smoking against PCP, though smoking cessation and PCP prophylaxis were considered more beneficial overall.

I think the upshot from this that we need to deal with is articulating an ONAP administrative flow for SSS.

Some states offer privacy protection on some health issues, including AIDS, mental health, chemical dependency, and genetic information.

#### "Asylum Law Is Used in New Applications"

Washington Times (12/09/96) P. A6

People seeking asylum in the United States are increasingly being accepted on the grounds that they would face persecution in their native countries due to cultural or medical conflicts. Since 1994, when homosexuality was first considered a condition for asylum in the United States, more than 40 people have gained entry based on the fact that they were persecuted in their home country because of their sexual orientation. At least one man, a heterosexual, has been granted asylum based on the fact that he is HIV-positive.

#### "A Caution on AIDS Drugs"

Washington Post (12/08/96) P. C6

Continued vigilance in the fight against AIDS is needed, despite optimistic news about drug treatment, according to the editors of the Washington Post. Although protease inhibitors have helped many people with AIDS regain their health and strength, the writers caution that researchers do not know how effective the drugs will be for long-term use. The drugs do not work for all patients, and their high cost makes them inaccessible to many. In conclusion, the editors encourage sustained commitment to prevention and research.

#### "Reported Number of HIV Carriers in Mideast Doubles Over Past Two Years"

Xinhua News Agency (12/09/96)

The number of people in the Middle East with HIV has doubled in the past two years to 12,000, officials reported at a regional AIDS conference. The conference, sponsored by the Jerusalem AIDS Project, brought together more than 40 Israeli, Palestinian, and Jordanian health professionals and educators. Participants considered how to overcome the region's various conservative and religious barriers to AIDS education. A new task force on AIDS prevention was approved at the conference.

#### "200,000 Die of AIDS in Malawi in Decade"

Xinhua News Agency (12/08/96)

AIDS has claimed 200,000 lives in Malawi since the first case was reported in 1985, the Sunday Times of Zambia reported. According to the Malawian National AIDS Control Program, about 1 million of the country's 11 million people are HIV-positive. The disease is still not talked about publicly, however, despite high public awareness. More than 20 AIDS support groups have been established with support from local and international donor

agencies.

"Southern African Nations Pledge New Drive to Fight AIDS" Reuters (12/06/96)

A coalition of South African countries resolved on Friday to renew the fight against AIDS. The Southern Africa Development Community said it would focus on anti-discriminatory labor laws, access to inexpensive drugs, and a better flow of information. States in the region have some of the highest HIV infection rates in the world. Moreover, some people have predicted that AIDS may reduce life expectancy in South Africa to 40 years from 63 years in less than 15 years time.

"Hungary to Enhance Combat Against AIDS" Xinhua News Agency (12/06/96)

New laws being developed in Hungary will call for increased funding for AIDS education and treatment, the chief of the Hungarian AIDS Commission announced Friday. Kokeny Mikaly told participants at a two-day national conference on AIDS that the government will develop laws to standardize regular medical checkups for citizens as part of the country's AIDS campaign. He added that \$1.26 million will be allocated to the effort.

"AIDS in Jamaica Hits Women, Children" American Medical News (12/02/96) Vol. 39, No. 45, P. 13

The number of AIDS cases in Jamaica is rising, and the disease is increasingly affecting women and children, the country's health ministry reported. During the first nine months of 1996, 300 new AIDS cases were reported--twice as many as were reported during the same period in 1994. By the end of September, a total of 1,823 AIDS cases had been reported on the island since 1982. The ministry reported that, although more men have contracted the disease so far, the rate in women and children is rising quickly. More women of childbearing age are becoming infected and transmitting the virus to their unborn children.

"Hardly Immune to Biz Pressures" Crain's Chicago Business (11/25/96) Vol. 19, No. 48, P. 1; Oloroso, Arsenio Jr.

A merger between two Chicago non-profit AIDS organizations to form the city's largest AIDS agency is likely to be followed by similar pairings. The Howard Brown Health Center, one of some 250 non-profit AIDS service organizations in the area, is merging with Stop AIDS Chicago to form a new group with assets totaling \$2.5 million. As funding for AIDS declines, a shift away from many small agencies toward a few larger organizations is expected. Moreover, the Chicago Department of Health, which distributes about \$25 million in city, state, and federal AIDS funds to private groups each year, is advocating consolidation. Small groups favor maintaining a grass-roots approach; however, they risk being overcome by larger organizations. The deal between Stop AIDS and Howard Brown involves no money or exchange of stock, but will combine the organizations' staffs and reduce

administrative costs.

"Tuberculosis: Victorian Values?"

Economist (11/30/96) Vol. 341, No. 7994, P. 58

Although tuberculosis (TB) was believed to have been eradicated in Britain 10 years ago, it has resurged to around 6,000 new cases a year. The Health Visitors' Association, a British organization of nurses and health visitors, blames the resurgence on a return to Victorian social conditions. Members of the group say that many children suffer from malnutrition and poorly housed families are not always supplied with water and fuel. Previous studies have linked TB to poverty and homelessness, but the resurgence of the disease may not necessarily be attributed to poverty, since the general conditions of the poor have improved over time. It is more likely that other changes--like immigration, AIDS, and the emergence of drug-resistant TB--have made people more susceptible to the disease.

Washington Post (12/08/96) P. C8; McDonough, Howard J.

HIV-positive inmates in Washington, D.C.'s Department of Corrections system do not receive adequate care, and should be released if proper treatment cannot be provided, asserts Howard

J. McDonough, founder of the Washington AIDS Ministry, in the Washington Post. McDonough, who served for three years as a minister to AIDS patients in the D.C. system, writes that inmates with AIDS should not have to tolerate inadequate care, or die in prison. He claims that HIV-infected prisoners do not receive adequate diets that could help stave off malnutrition and wasting syndrome, and that the D.C. corrections system does not have a standard for treatment for inmates with HIV. In conclusion, McDonough suggests that greater cooperation between corrections officers and service organizations that help HIV-positive prisoners would allow more prisoners to be treated humanely.

"Drew Barrymore Launches Female Health Foundation--Global Initiative to Educate Women About Contraception"  
HealthWire (12/09/96)

Actress Drew Barrymore, along with public health advocates and the makers of the female condom, announced on Monday the launch of the Female Health Foundation. The nonprofit organization will be the first to be solely dedicated to heightening awareness of women's health issues, and will focus specifically on contraceptive options and the prevention of sexually-transmitted diseases. The foundation will help support a global outreach program to provide information and counseling about the female condom and contraception. The Female Health Company, the maker of the female condom, announced last week that it will be working with the Joint United Nations Program on HIV/AIDS and the World Health Organization to provide female condoms at a reduced price to 160 U.N. member states.

"AIDS Estimates in Eastern Europe Show Wide Disparity"  
Reuters (12/09/96)

Large differences exist in the number of reported HIV infections in Eastern European countries. For example, while Poland's Epidemiology Department of the State Hygiene Institute reported 4,215 HIV infections, the country's health minister said there have been 450 AIDS cases and 263 deaths due to AIDS. The Polish Health Ministry plans to launch a national HIV prevention program next year, as well as an aid program for HIV-positive individuals. In the Czech Republic, meanwhile, 290 HIV infections have been reported by the government, and officials in Bulgaria say the number of AIDS patients is much higher than the registered number of 185.

"Zimbabwe: Zimbabwe's AIDS Victims Hide Under [Fear of Discrimination]"  
Africa Information Afrique (12/09/96)

Discrimination and mistreatment force many HIV-positive women in Africa to keep their infection secret. The International Center for Research on Women has found that, while African women understand heterosexual HIV transmission and have access to condoms, they lack control of their husbands' sexual behavior. Moreover, according to the Harare Association for Women with HIV/AIDS, 80 percent of the women in Zimbabwe who have HIV are either widowed or divorced, and most of their husbands have died

of AIDS. About 90 percent of the women reportedly face discrimination in health care, education, and employment.

#### "Foscarnet Reduces Plasma Levels of Cytomegalovirus and HIV-1" Reuters (12/09/96)

Foscarnet was found to reduce the amount of cytomegalovirus and HIV-1 in the blood of patients who had previously been treated with antiretroviral drugs, researchers at the University of Minnesota say. Dr. Henry H. Balfour, Jr. and colleagues found a significant relationship between peak foscarnet concentration and decreases in levels of CMV and plasma HIV-1 RNA concentrations.

#### "HIV Predominantly Infects CD45RO Cells in Neonates and Infants" Reuters (12/09/96)

HIV therapy for children and neonates should target the CD45RO T cell population, researchers at the University of Florida report. John W. Sleasman and colleagues found that the number of HIV-infected cells was 10 times to 100 times higher among CD45RO cell populations, compared to CD45RA cell populations. The finding suggests that "T cells generally become infected after leaving the thymic environment," Sleasman said. The researchers suggest that directing antiretroviral therapy to the relatively small population of CD45RO cells might restore normal memory T cell function and enhance clearance of HIV-1.

#### "Don't Ask, Don't Treat"

Time (12/09/96) Vol. 148, No. 26, P. 20; Waller, Douglas

A 10-year-old AIDS research program, in which HIV-positive soldiers volunteered to participate in drug company tests, is quietly being cut by the Pentagon. Military officials deny that they are discontinuing the program, but records show that much of the \$15 million allocated to the program next year will be diverted. Researchers say soldiers are good subjects because they can be relied on to take complicated dosages on schedule. The Pentagon, however, reportedly objects to the program, because it keeps infected soldiers in the service longer.

#### "Suicide and HIV Infection"

Journal of the American Medical Association (12/04/96) Vol. 276, No. 21, P. 1743; Dannenberg, Andrew L.; McNeil, John G.; Brundage, John F.; et al.

While the onset of AIDS is known to be a significant risk factor for suicide, little is known about the impact of a positive HIV test on suicide risk. Knowing this level of risk could influence the counseling of individuals before and after they are tested for the virus. Dr. Andrew L. Dannenberg, of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and colleagues, assessed this risk for men who were rejected from military service because they tested positive for HIV, compared to those rejected for other medical reasons. Among the HIV-positive men, 10 committed suicide, representing 49 per 100,000 person-years. Among the men who were HIV-negative, 24--or 36 per 100,000 person-years--committed suicide. The suicide rates among both groups were somewhat higher than those for the U.S. general population. The authors conclude

that testing positive for HIV does not seem to significantly increase the risk of suicide for military applicants in the months after HIV testing.

#### "Targeting a Deadly Scrap of Genetic Code"

Newsweek (12/02/96) Vol. 128, No. 23, P. 68; Cowley, Geoffrey

New combinations of AIDS drug have benefitted many people this year, but the drugs are not effective for everyone and no one knows how long they will work. HIV damages the immune system by entering a white blood cell, combining its gene into the host cell's chromosomes, and replicating. A number of drugs have been designed to target different steps of this process, but HIV's ability to rapidly mutate has made it difficult to treat effectively. AZT, for example, was introduced nine years ago but was found to stop working within six to 21 months. Then, in the early 1990s, other reverse transcriptase inhibitors were introduced, including ddC, D4T, and 3TC. Combining one of these drugs--especially 3TC--with AZT proved more effective than AZT alone. The first protease inhibitor, Hoffmann-La Roche's saquinavir, was introduced last December, and was soon followed by Merck's indinavir, and Abbott Laboratories' ritonavir. Studies have shown that a combination of a pair of older drugs with one of these new drugs can lower the amount of HIV in the blood to undetectable levels. The drugs can cause many side effects, however, and are not effective for everyone. The combination is most promising in newly-infected patients, but no one knows how long HIV can be suppressed. Meanwhile, new drugs are in development, promising more power and fewer side effects.

#### "Checkmating Parasites"

Economist (11/30/96) Vol. 341, No. 7994, P. 83

One theory to explain the evolutionary benefit of sexual reproduction suggests that the frequent exchange of genes helps sexual organisms resist parasitic infections. Researchers at the University of Edinburgh have published a study which lends support to this theory and may influence the fight against infectious diseases. Drs. Andrew Read, Mark Viney, and Alan Gemmill focused on a parasite of rats, a parasitic worm known as *Strongyloides ratti* which can reproduce sexually or asexually, depending on its genes and its environment. The researchers manipulated the rats' immune systems to create four groups of rats with varied levels of immunity. They found that the worms which infected the rats with effective immune systems were more likely to produce sexual offspring than those in rats with compromised immunity. This finding is consistent with studies in AIDS patients who are infected with *Candida albicans*, the yeast that causes thrush. The spread of HIV and the growing population of people with compromised immunity could cause the evolution of infectious organisms to accelerate. Furthermore, as a result of various treatments for HIV, many drug-resistant strains of organisms are already emerging, including *Candida*. Dr. Read and colleagues suggest that treatment to reduce the extent of parasitic sexual behavior may be an important factor in public health.

I wanted to follow up with you on the AIDS budget numbers. First, I think the places you have increased - CDC's prevention program and Ryan White Title III b are right on target. Of course I would like to see increases across the board, but given the limitations facing us, you have chosen wisely. However, if there is any opportunity for additional increases, I would like to propose the following:

1. A small increase of \$2 to 5 million for Title IV. This would help states to achieve the Congressional mandate of a 50 percent reduction in vertical transmission by 2000. If this goal is not reached, we may be faced with mandatory testing of pregnant women.
2. An increase of \$10 to 30 million for the SAMHSA block grant. As my staff reported to you, there is a great need for an increase in treatment slots. Thousands are seeking treatment and placed on waiting lists. Many of them are women. Treatment, for those who are HIV infected as well as those who are not, can reduce HIV transmission.
3. Of course we will need more for the ADAP drug reimbursement program. The "possible addback" of \$25 million in your original table for Title II would be terrific. But would it be easier to request an increase through the supplemental process?

I cannot thank you enough for all your support and consideration for the AIDS programs. It has been a great pleasure to work with you.

#### "AIDS Protest Leads to Arrests"

Thirteen Philadelphia-area AIDS activists were arrested Tuesday at a demonstration against HealthChoices, a state plan that will require Medicaid recipients to join HMO's. Several hundred demonstrators called on the federal Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) to delay the state plan until it can guarantee quality care for AIDS patients and others with life-threatening chronic illnesses. "HealthChoices will kill people with HIV," said Jule Davids, of the Philadelphia chapter of ACT-UP. In response, HCFA released a statement which said the state must guarantee that AIDS patients have access to AIDS specialists.

#### "Doctors Battle Over Who Treats Chronically Ill"

Wall Street Journal (12/11/96) P. B1; Jeffrey, Nancy Ann

The rise in managed care has spurred a debate between primary-care doctors and specialists over who should provide routine care to people with chronic illnesses. Visits to specialists for routine care must often be approved by a primary-care doctor, but these doctors may have a financial incentive to limit such visits. Specialists say this can be detrimental to the chronically ill, who require a specialist for proper treatment. Primary-care doctors are claiming that specialists want to provide more routine care to benefit their own profits. Doctors, health experts, and chronically ill patients are divided over who should provide their routine care.

#### "Personal Health: Sex Education Made Easier for Parent and Teen-Ager"

New York Times (12/11/96) P. C13; Brody, Jane E.

Parents of teen-agers should use events in daily life, like news reports and television programs, as opportunities to talk with their children about sex, notes New York Times writer Jane E. Brody. Besides the risk of pregnancy, teen-agers are at risk for sexually transmitted diseases, including chlamydia, gonorrhea, herpes, and AIDS. Alexander Sanger, president of Planned Parenthood of New York City, said that it is critical for "parents to convey to the child that they will be there to help no matter what the crisis." Schools and doctors can also help educate teens about sexual risks, according to Brody.

#### "Hemophilia Group's Submission Flays Ottawa, Red Cross"

Toronto Globe and Mail (12/10/96) P. A3; McIlroy, Anne

The Canadian Hemophilia Society charged Monday that both the federal government and the Canadian Red Cross had more than a year's warning to protect the country's blood supply but failed to take proper precautions. In the group's final submission to the Krever inquiry into the tainting of Canada's blood system, it

said that the threat of HIV to the blood supply was known by mid-1983. "We had that opportunity to protect the blood supply before the epidemic hit Canada as hard as it hit the United States. That opportunity is what was squandered, and the squandering of that opportunity has led to the death and the infection of many Canadians," said Bonnie Tough, the lawyer for the Canadian Hemophilia Society.

#### "ER' Takes Pains to Realistically Show HIV's Impact"

USA Today (12/11/96) P. 4D; Painter, Kim

Unlike previous television characters, ER's Jeanie Boulet, played by Gloria Reuben, will continue her job and her life despite her HIV infection. Advocates of AIDS patients applaud the development. "What they're doing has been very true to the experience of HIV-positive healthcare workers," says Ben Schatz, executive director of the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association. In the NBC show, Jeanie was infected by her estranged husband and faces the conflict of working with her former lover who tests negative and does not want to work around her anymore. She keeps her infection secret from her employer, and pays for her own treatment to keep her condition off her insurance records. According to ER producer Lydia Woodward, "It was of interest to us to know what it's like when a health care worker has the disease and how it does and does not change the nature of the job. It's not our intention to watch Jeanie die."

#### "Baltimorean Says He Found Condom in Food"

Washington Times--Metropolitan Times (12/11/96) P. C7

Fear of AIDS prompted Lawrence McNill to call a nurse's hotline on Monday after finding an unwrapped condom in the bottom of a box of Chinese food. The Baltimore, Md., resident was told the food could not have been tainted because the heat and oil used to cook the food would have likely killed any germs. McNill, who has filed a police complaint over the incident, says he believes the condom was not cooked with the food but was in the box before it was filled.

#### "Howard Professor to Lead D.C. Health Panel"

Washington Times (12/11/96) P. B7; Goldreich, Samuel

Howard University professor Bailus Walker was chosen to take over as chairman of Washington, D.C.'s Health Policy Council. He will oversee the city's conversion of Medicaid to a managed-care system, the reorganization of the D.C. General Hospital, and the city's public health clinics. A new D.C. Council committee will study ways to reduce the cost of Medicaid, possibly by expanding alternatives to residential treatment for senior citizens, the developmentally disabled, and people with chronic illnesses like AIDS.

#### "Sisters at Greater Risk"

Essence (12/96) Vol. 27, No. 8, P. 66; Kashef, Ziba

AIDS was the leading cause of death among African-American women in 1993, and the number of AIDS cases in this population increased 65 percent in the two years that followed. The rate of

HIV transmission to children has slowed, meanwhile, and treatment advances have been promising. However, the high cost of care is not covered by Medicaid and other programs for the poor. Dr. Mark Smith of the Kaiser Family Foundation encourages black churches, organizations, and political figures to lead the fight against AIDS in their communities, emphasizing education and prevention. While the new protease inhibitors have been heralded as near miracle cures for AIDS, the patients who do not respond to the drugs face disappointment and a sense of failure. AIDS experts estimate that between 10 percent and 30 percent of people with HIV do not respond to the new drugs. Society's desire to see an end to the epidemic, however, has fueled media accounts favoring the positive outcomes of those who enjoy renewed health and hope. Patients who are getting sicker, however may feel "like there's something wrong with them, because they're supposed to get better. And people don't want to see them still out there in the community," according to AIDS specialist Howard Grossman. Other problems with protease inhibitors, including expense, side effects, and regimented dosing requirements, have led others to reject the treatment. Although some patients endure side effects, including pain, diarrhea, and nausea, to remain on the therapy, activists are concerned that longer longevity does not justify the decreased quality of life. "A lot of people tend to minimize the side effects they're experiencing because of the hype," says Becky Trotter, editor of newsletter for the People With AIDS Coalition.

"AIDS Vaccine Research Leader"

Nobel Prize-winner David Baltimore has been selected to lead the AIDS vaccine research effort at the National Institute of Health. His appointment is expected to be announced today. Out of the 15 potential vaccines being tested, none are promising enough to merit efficacy trials, and pharmaceutical companies seem to lack interest in vaccines because the need is greatest in developing countries. Immunologist Barry Bloom, of the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, noted that it is important for Baltimore to

"persuade industry that it [a vaccine] is important enough to work on. He has to work with Congress and the regulatory agencies to find appropriate incentives for industry to do what they do best, without losing money for their shareholders." Mark Herrington, of the Treatment Action Group, a New York City advocacy organization, applauded Baltimore's appointment, saying "it shows that the NIH recognizes past approaches have failed and new leadership is necessary."

#### "Hype and Hypocrisy on Animal Rights"

Wall Street Journal (12/12/96) P. A12; DeBakey, Michael E.

Animal rights groups like People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals, which opposes the use of animals for biomedical research, are responsible for delaying medical progress, claims Michael E. DeBakey, chairman of the Foundation for Biomedical Research in a commentary in the Wall Street Journal. The author claims that through lobbying, vandalism, and harassment, these groups prevent, slow, or stop research into deadly diseases like AIDS and cancer. He points out that animal research was critical to the progress in eradicating polio, treating diabetes, and performing organ transplants. DeBakey also notes that the research community strives to limit the number of animals used in research, but that the use of animals is vital to many areas of biomedical research.

#### "Baboon Cells Failed, But AIDS at Bay"

USA Today (12/12/96) P. 4D

Jeff Getty, the AIDS patient who received a transplant of baboon bone marrow nearly one year ago, reports he is having "the best year I've had in about five years." Although the baboon cells did not take hold in his bone marrow, Getty says his improved health is probably due to the radiation phase of the treatment and the use of protease inhibitors. "We've learned that chemotherapy and radiation, which they feared would ... kill anybody with late stage AIDS, was in fact probably the most beneficial thing I've done in five years," he said.

#### "Biotech Firm Wants to Test Vaccine for Papillomavirus"

MedImmune has asked for FDA permission to initiate the first clinical trials in humans of a preventative vaccine against human papillomavirus. The tests will start in January, if approved. The biotechnology firm appears to have moved ahead of Merck & Co., which is working on a similar vaccine. Human papillomavirus is believed to play a role in the development of cervical cancer and genital warts.

#### "Banned in Boston: Guaranteed to Help Make a Show a Hit"

Among the works banned from a Boston charity auction show to benefit the AIDS Action Committee of Massachusetts was a photograph by Herbert Ritts. The photograph, that of a naked male torso, was removed with works by nine other artists because they reportedly offended the building's owner and manager, the

Chiofaro Company. However, the banned works attracted interest in the ARTcetera show, and the auction raised a record \$475,000. An exhibit by Ritts at the city's Museum of Fine Arts, which opened the same week as the charity show, has also gained added attention as a result of the controversy.

#### "Are Gays to Be Held to Double Standard?"

In a letter to the editor of the Wall Street Journal, Richard Turner responds to letters by others questioning the lack of fidelity in gay relationships. Writers had cited a story by David Sanford about his survival of AIDS, criticizing him for a casual sexual encounter. Turner notes that infidelity is common in heterosexual relationships as well, and asks whether gays are held to a different standard.

#### "New Findings on How HIV Works"

United Press International (12/11/96); Wasowicz, Lidia

Government researchers reported Wednesday on how certain factors influence the progression of AIDS, creating new possibilities for treatment. Scientists at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases said the findings, published in the journal Nature, suggest new approaches to HIV treatment. Various factors in an individual's immune system influence how successfully HIV can replicate, including the specific immune response to HIV as well as genetic factors and other non-specific attributes. Researchers, for example, learned how cytokines regulate the level at which HIV replicates and how the activation of the immune system allows HIV to replicate more efficiently.

#### "STD Prevention Education Campaign Launched by CDC"

A conference on sexually transmitted disease (STD) prevention education, sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Social Health Association, is being held this week in Tampa, Fla. CDC Director David Satcher emphasized the need for increased efforts from the private sector to complement the education programs and other public health programs operated by the government. "We must take every opportunity to reach our young people with the information they need to prevent STDs, and to provide as a part of routine healthcare practice, the screening and treatment needed to prevent serious complications," Dr. Satcher said. Officials at the conference are discussing recommendations made in a recent Institute of Medicine Report to curb the spread of STDs, especially among young people.

#### "HIV's Other Immune-System Targets: Macrophages"

Science (11/29/96) Vol. 274, No. 5292, P. 1464; Balter, Michael

Although T lymphocytes have been the most-studied target of HIV, the virus also infects macrophages and dendritic cells, which are also critical in the immune system. Recently, at the Third International Workshop on HIV and Cells of Macrophage Lineage, researchers reported that macrophages may be an important site of

virus production, and that they may also help HIV enter the brain and infect T cells. Scientists had suspected that macrophages provided a reservoir for HIV, but recent reports have discounted that theory. Many experts now believe macrophages and dendritic cells may have a more direct and important role in HIV infection than was previously thought. Sharon Wahl of the National Institutes of Health and Jan Orenstein of George Washington University reported at the conference that, during the late stages of AIDS, macrophages can serve as HIV factories in some tissues. Other research presented focused on the role of macrophages in the infection of the brain and CD4 T cells. Researchers discussed the possibility that macrophages may determine which strains of HIV are able to establish infection.

"Characteristics of Foreign-Born Hispanic Patients With Tuberculosis--Eight U.S. Counties Bordering Mexico, 1995" Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report (11/29/96) Vol. 45, No. 47, P. 1032; Moser, K.S.; Ocana, M.; Mohle-Boetani, J.; et al.

The incidence of tuberculosis (TB) in the United States increased 61 percent from 1986 to 1995, in part because of the immigration of people from areas where the TB is prevalent. In 1995, 22 percent of all foreign-born TB patients in the United States were born in Mexico, and 81 percent of these cases were reported in the four states bordering Mexico. A 1995 study of the immigration and migration patterns of Hispanic foreign-born TB patients found that 40 percent had immigrated from non-border areas in Mexico. The prevalence of single-drug resistance was 1.6 times to 3.2 times higher among study subjects than among U.S.-born non-Hispanic patients living in the same region. Furthermore, the prevalence of multidrug resistance was 6.8 times higher among foreign-born Hispanic patients than among U.S.-born non-Hispanic patients. An accompanying editorial note advises that TB surveillance efforts should be increased in non-border regions of Mexico, a location from which many of the foreign-born Hispanic patients had immigrated. The editorial also suggests that Directly Observed Therapy may improve TB control and reduce the prevalence of drug resistance in Mexico and the United States.

"Study of Anti-AIDS 'Needle-Exchange' Programs Is Ethical, NIH

A controversial study designed to determine the benefit of needle-exchange programs is not unethical, an expert panel told the director of the National Institutes of Health on Thursday. The \$2.4 million study, proposed by Dennis Fisher of the University of Alaska, calls for the random assignment of two groups of drug users--one group which would have access to the program, and one which would not. Previous studies have shown that needle-exchanges can reduce the spread of HIV but have raised questions about other problems the programs may cause. The proposed study was criticized by a consumer advocacy organization, which asked NIH Director Harold Varmus to reject funding for the study. The study was postponed, while an expert panel reviewed it. The group, chaired by Yale University professor Robert J. Levine, approved of the study, and Varmus said he would make a final decision on the study by next week.

"Nobel Laureate to Head Panel Pushing for AIDS Vaccine"

Nobel Laureate microbiologist David Baltimore will head the government's AIDS vaccine research effort, the National Institutes of Health announced Thursday. Baltimore will chair a committee to search for new vaccine approaches and revitalize the decade-long project. The appointment of a vaccine research leader was called for in a major report on the nation's AIDS research effort released earlier this year. Baltimore's appointment was applauded by researchers, advocates for AIDS patients, and critics of current vaccine development efforts.

"FDA Panel Recommends Hemophilia-Drug Approval"

An advisory panel to the Food and Drug Administration recommended for approval a treatment for hemophilia B developed by Genetics Institute. The panel also suggested that safety studies continue while the drug, called BeneFix, is marketed. Genetics Institute noted that the drug would be the first of its kind not derived from human plasma, lowering the risk of transmitting blood-borne viruses like hepatitis.

"What Do We Want?--What Kind of Impact Do You Feel These Social Movements Have Had on Today's Values?"

A Wall Street Journal poll of 2,003 Americans on values and morals found that the country's social movements over the past 30 years have improved society. Americans agreed, by margins of four to one, that the civil-rights movement, the environmental movement, the AIDS-awareness movement, the religious or family-values movement, and the women's movement have all had positive impacts on society. The AIDS awareness movement was more widely approved of than the "religion and family-values movement." Even among those who said they were very religious, 78 percent said the AIDS-awareness movement has had a positive

impact on society.

#### "Blood Is 'Filthy,' Inquiry Told"

To prevent further tragedies involving the use of tainted blood, Canada's blood system should look to self-donations and directed donations, a lawyer for relatives of people who received HIV-tainted blood told the inquiry into Canada's blood system. Making her final statements to the inquiry on Tuesday, Dawna Ring said that "to create a safe blood system, we must recognize the true characteristics of blood--that it is filthy." Ring recommended that hospitals, rather than the Canadian Red Cross Society, take responsibility for blood collection.

#### "Medical Marijuana Reply Due Soon"

President Clinton will receive recommendations by Christmas on how to handle new state laws that allow the use of marijuana for medical reasons, administration officials said Thursday. White House Drug chief Gen. Barry McCaffrey and other anti-drug policy officials met with Clinton Thursday, and encouraged him to speak out more on the two propositions. Clinton objects to the new laws because they threaten to increase teen drug use or the process by which drugs are approved for medical use.

The hostess said she held the event for the "professional women involved with issues concerning your countries and dealing with struggles such as breast cancer, AIDS, and hunger, an opportunity to relax and to share resources."

#### "Spread of HIV Gains Pace"

The rate of HIV infection is increasing in Africa and Asia, and the virus is appearing in Central and Eastern Europe for the first time, the United Nations Program on HIV/AIDS reported. The agency said that sub-Saharan Africa is the hardest-hit area, with more than one in 20 people infected. UNAIDS Director Peter Piot criticized complacency about AIDS in the industrialized world and urged renewed commitment to prevention efforts. Three million people have contracted HIV this year, and 1.5 million have died of AIDS.

"T Cell Telomere Length in HIV-1 Infection: No Evidence for Increased CD4 T Cell Turnover"

Science (11/29/96) Vol. 274, No. 5292, P. 1543; Wolthers, Katja C.; Wisman, G. Bea A.; Otto, Sigrid A.; et al.

HIV-1 infection results in the progressive loss of CD4 T cells, a gradual increase in CD8 T cells, and a decline in immune function. CD4 T-cell count starts to drop at an accelerated rate about one-and-a-half years to two years before the onset of AIDS. One theory holds that the rapid CD4 T cell turnover caused by HIV infection eventually results in the exhaustion of the regenerative capacity of the immune system. Frank Miedema, of the Netherlands Red Cross Blood Transfusion Service, and colleagues, used an analysis of telomeric terminal restriction fragment length to measure the turnover of CD4 cells, compared to that of CD8 cells, over the course of HIV-1 infection. They found that turnover increased in CD8 T cells, but remained stable in CD4 T cells. The authors suggest that increased CD4 T cell counts after drug therapy may not be due to repopulation by new cells but may represent a redistribution of activated memory CD4 T cells.
