A Closely watched attempt to cure AIDS will take longer than hoped
WASHINGTON (AP) Despite researchers' high hopes, one year of drug therapy has failed to rid newly infected men of HIV, so a highly publicized attempt at an AIDS cure will have to continue for at least another year.

The doctors have found evidence that the virus remains hidden in the lymph glands after they had hoped it would be gone.

"Has HIV been eradicated from any of our patients? The answer is unequivocally no," Dr. David Ho of the Aaron Diamond AIDS Research Center in New York said Wednesday night.

The experiment has produced more promising evidence that the AIDS virus can be vastly knocked down by aggressive treatment, but the researchers say it is too soon to know whether an AIDS cure is even possible.

The research is being led by Ho, who galvanized the international AIDS meeting last summer in Vancouver, British Columbia, by announcing the ambitious effort to wipe out AIDS. His research brought him widespread praise that included being named Time magazine's 1996 Man of the Year.

The experiment was intended to see whether it was possible to eliminate every last trace of the AIDS virus effectively curing it if treatment began soon after people caught the virus.

Combinations of drugs that include medicines called protease inhibitors can stop the AIDS virus from making new copies of itself. The researchers theorized that after a year, all infected cells would have died off, leaving the body completely free of HIV.

However, they worried that infected cells might remain hidden,

perhaps in the lymph nodes or the brain.

The experiment involved 24 volunteers who began receiving the drugs within three months of catching HIV. The plan was to treat them for one year, then stop the drugs and check their lymph nodes for the virus.

Ho outlined the results so far at the opening session of the annual Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections.

Four patients have dropped out of the study, and the rest have taken the drugs for periods ranging from seven to 16 months.

All signs of HIV have disappeared from the patients' bloodstreams, even using the most sensitive tests that can detect as few as 25 copies of the virus in each milliliter of blood.

The virus has also vanished from the men's semen, raising the possibility that they may not be able to spread the disease sexually.

However, tissue samples removed from five of the patients' digestive tracts turned up evidence of viral genes still hiding inside lymph cells of three of them. Ho said these copies of the virus may be defective and unable to reproduce.

Nonetheless, the doctors will continue the treatment for at least another year to allow more time for infected cells in the lymph system to slowly die off.

Doctors worry that otherwise these remnants of the virus might be able to reignite the disease if the protease inhibitors and other drugs are stopped.

"We don't see the virus DNA fading away. That may be enough to restart the process," said Dr. Calvin Cohen of the Harvard Community Health Plan in Boston.

Ho said he now thinks it may take two to 2 1/2 years for all the HIV-infected cells in the body to die, so treatment will have to continue for at least that long before doctors consider stopping it.

"Can HIV be eradicated from an infected individual? The answer is clearly we don't know, but it is important to find out," Ho said.

"Plan for Test to Determine If AIDS Can Be Cured Is Delayed a Year by Top Researcher"

Plans to stop treatment in an HIV-positive person--to determine whether the virus has been eradicated--have been delayed a year, AIDS researcher Dr. David Ho reported Wednesday. Ho, who heads the project at the Aaron Diamond AIDS Research Center in New York, had proposed to stop combination drug treatment in patients in whom HIV has been suppressed for two to two-and-a-half years. At a news conference in Washington, Ho said that his patients have not yet been asked to stop therapy in order to test the theory that AIDS could be curable. He explained that the delay was due to additional findings that suggest that HIV could hide in some tissues and reinfect the body if drug therapy is stopped.

"Genetic Advantage: Inside Science's Race to Learn Why Some Seem Immune to AIDS"

AIDS researchers are racing to develop drugs that mimic the HIV protection afforded some people by a newly discovered genetic mutation. The new finding is encouraging, but experts are concerned that the AIDS epidemic could get out of control before new therapies are developed. "If we don't get the next generation of drugs soon, we are going to be facing a terrible crisis," says Margaret Fischl, director of an inner-city AIDS clinic at Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami. She notes that, among the poor, where HIV is spreading rapidly, the most effective AIDS drugs are too costly. AIDS researchers are meeting in Washington, D.C., this week to discuss the benefits and limitations of the new drug cocktails. Three protease inhibitors were introduced last year, and a fourth is expected to be introduced by early next year.

Three South African scientists, who claimed to have developed a drug that kills HIV and can reverse the effects of full-blown AIDS, face criticism from other scientists for announcing their findings before they were subjected to peer review. "HIV Kits Target Untested Market"

Although the home HIV test kits offered by Direct Access Diagnostics and Home Access Health are similar, the two companies took different approaches to marketing the new products. Direct Access Diagnostic's test, called Confide, is promoted in a serious tone, featuring health care professionals in white lab coats, while Home Access' ads include more controversial themes. Kevin Johnson, of Home Access, said the company is planning to use more targeted marketing strategies in upcoming campaigns. One Home Access ad, geared toward young heterosexual males, was criticized by the Gay Men's Health Crisis for trivializing the implications of a positive HIV test. These ads reportedly emphasize that the tests offer a convenient, anonymous alternative to traditional HIV testing, while those aimed at a teenage audience focus more on the importance of getting tested. Arisa Cunningham, director of marketing at Direct Access,

meanwhile, says the company is promoting its test to a general audience. "We wanted to express an understanding of what it feels like for a person to have been exposed to the virus and to feel like they may be infected," she said. "Since the virus doesn't care if you're gay or straight, male or female, the message of understanding is universal."

"Medical Group Asks Entertainers to Drop Support of PETA"

Americans for Medical Progress, a group of doctors and seriously ill patients, held a news conference in December to urge celebrities to stop supporting animal rights groups because they thwart medical research. Susan E. Paris, president of the group, said the entertainers "cannot support People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals and a cure for AIDS at the same time." They argued that by trying to end animal testing, animal rights activists will delay research toward a cure for AIDS and other illnesses. Dan Mathews, of PETA, called the protest "a sign of our success."

"AIDS Cocktails Cut Treatment Costs, Two Studies Say"

Despite their high cost, the use of combination drug therapies for AIDS patients results in lower overall treatment

costs, two new studies show. The findings, presented at the Fourth Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections, reveal that the therapies, which combine protease inhibitors with older AIDS drugs, reduce usage of hospital services and other costly medical care. One study, conducted by researchers at Tower Infectious Disease Medical Associates in Los Angeles, found that for each dollar spent on the drugs, at least two dollars were saved in overall treatment costs. The findings gave AIDS activists evidence to use in their fight for increased government funding for the drug therapies, though both researchers and activists alike cautioned that it is still too early to know whether the drugs will be effective in the long term or what their impact on the health-care system will be.

"Study Indicates Why Herpes Is Factor in the Spread of AIDS"

New research shows that genital herpes sores contain high levels of HIV, leading researchers to believe that the virus that causes AIDS is more easily transmitted by those infected with the herpes virus. About two-thirds of those infected with HIV also carry herpes simplex virus 2, the genital herpes virus. Researchers at the University of Washington reported Thursday at the Fourth Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections that among 12 men with both HIV and genital herpes, HIV was found on herpes sores during repeated flare-ups in 23 of 24 episodes. The researchers suggested that the spread of HIV could be curbed by wider use of herpes drugs.

"Agouron Trial Boasts Safety of New AIDS Drug"

Agouron Pharmaceuticals' new protease inhibitor Viracept is safer and causes fewer side effects than the three protease inhibitors already approved, researchers say. Viracept, which is now being considered for federal approval, may also be beneficial for people who have developed resistance to other protease inhibitors, lab studies show. Results of human trials of the drug will be presented today at the Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections. In a study of 700 patients, Viracept, combined with two older drugs, was able to reduce viral load to levels below detection in 81 percent of the participants while causing only "moderately severe" diarrhea in about 16 percent of patients.

"Purported South African AIDS Breakthrough Angers Experts"

Three South African scientists seeking funding from the Presidential Cabinet to continue their research on a purported AIDS cure have been censured by other AIDS researchers for misleading the public. Following the scientists' presentation to the Cabinet, stories suggesting a cure for AIDS had been discovered were widely reported in newspapers. Experts criticized the three for attempting to secure funding from the Cabinet without subjecting their research to peer review and for raising false hopes among the public. The researchers have suggested that

the drug Virodene P058, which would be administered by a skin patch and costs just \$34 a month per patient, could improve the health of the sickest individuals in only two weeks.

"This Billionaire Gives Most of It Away"

Charles F. Feeney revealed Thursday that he has financed an anonymous philanthropic organization for more than 10 years, distributing more than \$600 million to various charities during that time. Among them is the National Crime Prevention Program, based in Washington, D.C., and its "Youth as Resources" project, which provides resources and encouragement to young people to create their own community projects for illiteracy, AIDS prevention, drug abuse, teenage pregnancy, and gun violence.

Invirase, the protease inhibitor made by Hoffmann-La Roche, was found to interact favorably with the protease inhibitor Viracept, made by Agouron Pharmaceuticals, researchers reported Thursday. Results of the preliminary trial showed that Viracept, which is awaiting federal regulatory approval, was able to increase Invirase exposures by five. None of the 14 patients participating in the 12-week trial had been treated with a protease inhibitor before.

"Virus Reveals How It Might Cause Cancer"

New research published in the journal Nature suggests that the Kaposi's sarcoma-associated herpes virus (KSHV or HHV 8) has a gene that could cause uncontrolled cell growth, leading to cancer. The researchers, led by Marvin Gershengorn of Cornell University's medical school, say the finding could help scientists understand the associations between viruses and cancers, as well as lead to new drug therapies. "What's really exciting about this is that it makes this receptor a potential drug target," said Gershengorn. "If we can show that this is related to disease pathogenesis, we might be able to discover drugs that ... turn the receptor off."

"Ulcer Medicine May Help Fight HIV"

An over-the-counter ulcer medicine appears to inhibit HIV and could delay or halt the progression of AIDS, according to Eric C. Fruhstorfer, president of Metatron, a company that investigates FDA-approved compounds. Fruhstorfer adds that the drug, called cimetidine, does not cause the side effects that other anti-HIV drugs do, noting that it is safe, inexpensive, and has already

received U.S. regulatory approval.

Improving the availability of sterile syringes as a measure to reduce the HIV transmission among injection drug users could be achieved through certain legal and public health approaches, according to Lawrence Gostin, of the Georgetown University Law Center, and colleagues. The authors report that laws in every state, the District of Columbia, and the Virgin Islands restrict the sale and possession of syringes. Additionally, eight states and the Virgin Islands require a medical prescription for the sale and possession of syringes, and 23 states have pharmacy regulations or practice guidelines that limit access to syringes. The researchers offer several strategies for improving the syringe availability to prevent disease transmission among injection drug users. Their recommendations include clarifying the medical merit of sterile syringes for blood-borne disease prevention, altering drug paraphernalia laws to exempt syringes, repealing syringe prescription laws and pharmacy regulations that limit the sale of syringes, and promoting the education of pharmacists, other health professionals, and law enforcement officers about disease prevention. Other suggestions include allowing local discretion in setting up syringe exchanges and establishing community programs for the safe disposal of used syringes. [Note: This summary is a clarification of one that appeared in the AIDS Daily Summary on Jan. 8, 1997.]

"AIDS Drugs Seen as Hope in Easing Patient Burdens"

While new experimental AIDS drugs offer patients even more hope that AIDS will become a manageable disease, experts at the Fourth

Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections agreed that drugs will not end the epidemic. An AIDS vaccine is critical to curbing the global epidemic, they said, because the drugs are too costly for poor countries. Researchers, however, also reported that ongoing clinical trials of drug combinations are yielding promising results. Other presentations focused on upcoming studies of methods to prevent the transmission of HIV from mother to infant, including a study of the drug nevirapine. At \$2, the treatment would be affordable everywhere, said Dr. John L. Sullivan of the University of Massachusetts Medical School. Researchers also reported advances in treating children with anti-HIV drugs.

"Triple-Drug Therapies Are Changing Patterns, Costs of AIDS Treatment"

The use of new combination therapies for AIDS may reduce the overall cost of treatment while prolonging survival, researchers reported at the Fourth Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections in Washington, D.C. last week. Protease inhibitors, which reduce the level of HIV in the body, and viral load tests, which allow doctors to determine this level, are key tools in the AIDS battle, the scientists noted. A September survey of 150 AIDS doctors found that 78 percent of their patients were taking anti-viral treatments. Half of that group was taking protease inhibitors. The drugs' dramatic results have impacted hospitals and hospices where AIDS patients are treated. Researchers at Tower Infectious Disease Medical Associates in Los Angeles report that, while total drug costs for patients at the center increased last year, overall health care costs dropped 23 percent due to fewer hospitalizations and less need for home health care.

"AIDS Treatment May Renew Immune System"

A protease inhibitor apparently has the ability to partly renew immune function in moderately advanced AIDS patients, researchers reported Sunday. AIDS specialist Dr. Michael Lederman, of the University Hospitals of Cleveland and Case Western Reserve University, reported the findings at the Fourth Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections in Washington, D.C., on Sunday. The study showed that a combination of drugs, the protease inhibitor ritonavir plus AZT and 3TC, boosted the immune system's CD4 cells, including cells which had never been exposed to HIV. Lederman said the study demonstrates the benefit of early treatment, but warned that doctors treating patients with powerful drug combinations should not discontinue added therapies used to treat opportunistic infections.

"AIDS Virus Is Under Control in 1 Twin, But Not the Other"

Aggressive treatment of HIV in an infected pair of newborn twins has apparently controlled the virus in a baby girl but

failed to be effective in her brother. The babies were started on a combination of three drugs at 10 weeks of age. Now, at 18 months, the virus, which was initially diminished, has returned in the boy. His sister continues to show no sign of infection. "Our goal is long-term suppression of HIV with potential eradication," Dr. Katherine Luzuriaga of the University of Massachusetts Medical School told participants at an AIDS meeting on Saturday. The twin study is especially interesting to researchers because, if AIDS is to be cured, it is most likely to occur in patients who have not had their immune systems damaged by HIV.

"Cautious Optimism for AIDS Patients"

The reports from the Fourth Conference on Retroviruses and Opportunistic Infections, which ended Sunday, include ones that found that fewer babies are being born with HIV and that the virus is spreading among young people. HIV infection in babies is declining, but, in New York City, the rate of transmission from mother to child has been halved, rather than cut by two-thirds. HIV infection via sex and drug needles, among people aged 13 to 25, increased 20 percent between 1990 and 1995, researchers reported.

"AIDS Toll Falls by Half in New York"

AIDS-related deaths per day in New York City have declined by about half in the last year, researchers reported Friday. The downturn started last March, continued during the summer and fall, and is now leveling off. "It's good news, which we haven't had for a while," said the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Harold Jaffe. AIDS-related deaths in New York reached the highest rate, 20.9 deaths per day, in November 1995. By November 1996, the rate had dropped to 10.1 deaths per day. Researchers attributed the decline to new treatments and increased funding for AIDS care. New York City received \$100 million in funding in 1994 through the Ryan White CARE Act, compared to \$44 million in 1993. Nationally, the AIDS death rate did not rise for the first time last year, CDC officials reported.

"Needle-Swap Program Lowers HIV Infection"

The rate of HIV infection among injection drug users in Baltimore is slowing, apparently due to a needle-exchange program. Researchers at Johns Hopkins University report that drug users in Baltimore County are contracting HIV at a higher rate than drug addicts in Baltimore City. Addicts who participated in the needle exchange had 40 percent fewer infections than those who did not participate. The program is set to expire this summer, but city officials are trying to persuade state legislators to continue it.

"Hepatitis B Vaccine: Prevention Saves Lives"

Wall Street Journal (01/27/97) P. A23; Thiel, Thelma King

Hepatitis B vaccination programs are critical for thousands of infants born each year, contends Thelma King Thiel, chairman and CEO of the Hepatitis Foundation International in a Wall Street Journal letter to the editor. Thiel says that a previous letter, which attacked such programs, helped promote prejudice against people with hepatitis B. She notes that 4,000 infants are born each year to mothers infected with hepatitis B, and asserts that vaccinations protect these babies from disease.

"Economic Impacts of AIDS"

Futurist (01/97-02/97) Vol. 31, No. 1, P. 4

Economic growth in Africa and Asia is being threatened by the spread of AIDS, cautions the International Food Policy Research Institute. A new study from the group claims that economies are being impaired under the influence of AIDS, because money that would otherwise be invested in education, agricultural research, and other areas is needed to pay for health care. Also, productivity is being lost because the disease claims workers in their prime. "AIDS will worsen the poverty of poor people by depriving them of their only productive resource--their labor," the Institute predicted.

"Networking for a Cure"

LAN (02/97) Vol. 12, No. 2, P. 105; Thorp, Patricia

ActionAIDS, Pennsylvania's largest AIDS-related service organization, depends on donations from technology companies to upgrade its growing computer system and keep it running. The Philadelphia-based organization uses a networked database to keep track of its 2,000 individual clients and the 100 families it serves. Clients receive information about HIV and AIDS, as well as legal assistance, and help with housing. Staff members can use the system to link clients with medical care and other services as well. A program for families, meanwhile, provides help with household management and child care, and the organization helps newly released inmates affected by HIV and AIDS readjust to society. ActionAIDS also helps increase AIDS awareness in communities through workshops and seminars. The group is staffed by 70 employees and 500 volunteers.

"Many Pneumonia Patients Don't Need Hospitalization"

Among the 4 million Americans hospitalized each year for pneumonia, more than a quarter could be treated effectively without being admitted, researchers at the University of Pittsburgh reported. Each year, more than 600,000 patients are hospitalized for pneumonia, the most deadly infectious disease in the United States and the sixth leading cause of death overall, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The unnecessary hospitalizations are attributed to the lack of standards to determine which patients should be admitted and which should be treated as outpatients. Pittsburgh researcher Michael Fine and colleagues published the findings in the New England Journal of Medicine last week. They found that, among 14,419 patients evaluated, the only ones who required hospitalization were those at least 50 years old with at least two unusual vital signs or confounding conditions like cancer and heart disease.

"Trials Support HIV Drug Combinations"

Presentations at an AIDS meeting in Washington, D.C. last weekend revealed promising results from many clinical trials of drug combinations. However, the multitude of possible therapies makes treatment decisions difficult for doctors. To that end, Glaxo Wellcome announced on Monday a joint research program with the California company Affymetrix to develop a treatment strategy for each patient based on HIV's pattern of resistance and the patient's clinical experience. "This will be a third stage in the development of tools to guide patient management," explained Glaxo researcher Brendan Larder.

"Bio-Technology General Corp.: Newest Heavyweight in Biotech Industry"

Investor's Business Daily (01/28/97) P. A4; Benko, Laura B.

Bio-Technology General's Oxandrin--an anabolic steroid to help patients suffering from weight loss due to cancer, AIDS, or other medical conditions--is producing strong sales. Analysts predict that the drug's success will help the biotechnology firm to grow at least 50 percent per year through the end of the century. Unlike competing drugs, which work by increasing fat and water, Oxandrin builds muscle and protein mass. Moreover, the drug may be taken orally, instead of by injection, and it does not increase the risk of liver poisoning, as do other anabolic steroids.

"Free Speech Through T-Shirt Sales"

Washington Post (01/28/97) P. A12; Rodriguez, Jose J.

In a letter to the editor in the Washington Post, Jose J. Rodriguez applauds the decision by U.S. District Judge Stanley Sporkin to allow the sale of T-shirts supporting Clinton/Gore, pointing out that T-shirt sales support many rallies and demonstrations. Rodriguez cites several events last year which were supported by T-shirt sales, including the display of the entire AIDS Memorial Quilt in Washington, D.C.

"Cancer Doctor's Practices on Trial in Texas"

Washington Post (01/28/97) P. A1; Pressley, Sue Anne

Stanislaw Burzynski, a Texas cancer doctor, is being tried for selling a drug that has not been approved by the Food and Drug Administration. Charged with making at least \$40 million from the drug, Burzynski says this figure spans seven years and includes the salaries of his 130 employees. His 300 patients and their families applaud the treatment, and they fear that if Burzynski is convicted, they will die without the medicine. Burzynski's drug, made from synthesized versions of peptides found in human blood and urine, has been marketed as a cure for ailments ranging from baldness to AIDS to arthritis.

"HIV Cases Jump 10 Percent in Hong Kong in 1996"

The number of HIV-infected people in Hong Kong grew 9.8 percent from 1995 to 1996, the Hong Kong health department reports. In 1996, 134 people became infected, bringing the total number of infections since 1984 to 776.

"AIDS Suspect Stoned to Death in Ethiopia"

Reuters (01/27/97)

A man suspected of having HIV was stoned to death in Ethiopia's northern Gojam region, the Ethiopian News Agency reported Monday. Andarge Zwede, an emaciated man traveling in the area, was reportedly condemned by a hysterical woman and then stoned by her and six other individuals, who were later arrested.

"The Media's Love Affair With AIDS Research: Hope vs. Hype"

Science (01/17/97) Vol. 275, No. 5298, P. 298; Cohen, Jon

The media's coverage of the advances in AIDS research in 1996 was full of optimism and suggestive of a cure. However, the good news--that new drug combinations can yield dramatic results--may be too positive, some researchers warn. The limitations of the drugs are mentioned in most stories, but usually overshadowed by the general tone of optimism. "The hype has affected everyone--patients, physicians who know a lot about HIV, and even institutional review boards that review clinical trials," said Roy "Trip" Gulick of New York University. The new combination drug therapy does not work for everyone, and long-term effects are still unknown. Drug-resistance is another concern, especially because the therapy calls for patients to take dozens of pills every day. The most misleading news reports, researchers say, have focused on studies to determine whether HIV can be eradicated in patients who start therapy soon after infection. "If you poll people--even people in the field--they're going to be totally confused [about] whether data show eradication of virus in primary infection versus established infections," said Anthony Fauci, director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases.

"International Experts Recommend Concerted Attack Against Infection"

Lancet (01/18/97) Vol. 349, No. 9046, P. 184; Griffin, George E.;
Van der Meer, Jos W. M.

Participants at a recent meeting titled "The Challenge of Infectious Diseases, the European Perspective" discussed methods for characterizing and tracking emerging infections and the increasing problem of antibiotic resistance. Pathogens rapidly develop resistance to antibiotics in response to environmental exposure. Study results presented at the meeting suggest that in the Netherlands and other European countries, antibiotic-resistant bacteria are less prevalent because antibiotic use is limited. Researcher John McGowan reported that dramatic changes in hospital practices in the United States, including shorter stays and fewer trained staff members, may be contributing to the rise in infections and resistance. McGowan said that by controlling the use of vancomycin in a hospital setting, the prevalence of vancomycin-resistant enterococci can be reduced by 60 percent. In the Netherlands, molecular typing of HIV-1 has revealed that strains of the virus infecting intravenous drug users are related to those found in the United States. Research also identified 1976 and 1980 as the start dates for the HIV-1 epidemic in the Dutch homosexual population and drug addicts, respectively.

report that AIDS-related deaths in New York City declined from 7,046 in 1994 to 4,944 in 1996, the editors warn that such good news could result in carelessness and complacency. They also say that AIDS-related deaths increased slightly in San Francisco in 1996 but decreased by a small amount in Los Angeles. The encouraging figures are attributed to the new protease inhibitors, increased federal funding for AIDS drugs, and ongoing education efforts, but the editors note that the statistics mean little in parts of the developing world, where HIV is spreading rapidly and funds for treatment are often not available.

"Rubber Gloves: Peril for Some"

New York Times (01/29/97) P. C7; Robbins, Jim

Allergies to latex, which in extreme cases can cause death, are an increasing problem for health care workers, fast-food servers, toll collectors, and police officers. Latex gloves became prevalent in many workplaces, especially in health care settings, in the 1980s when the threat of HIV infection became known. Researcher Dr. Margaret Fay, of the British latex-maker London International, reports that the number of people in the general population with the two types of latex allergies has now increased to 8 percent from 1 percent in 1980. At the same time, the number of dental workers with the allergies has increased from 7 percent to 40 percent and the number of other health care workers affected has risen from 3 percent to 20 percent. Some facilities have switched to latex gloves that are safer for sensitive workers. Powderless gloves or vinyl gloves are options for those with the allergies.

"Medicinal Use of Marijuana Gains Hearing"

Washington Post (01/29/97) P. A2

The Massachusetts Public Health Council agreed Tuesday to hold public hearings next month to discuss the merits of marijuana as a medical remedy. The Department of Public Health was given the authority to establish a program to research the medicinal use of the drug under a state law passed in 1991. A medical marijuana program would give patients legal access to the drug and protect them from arrest, but only marijuana grown by the federal government is legally allowed to be distributed for medical use. Thus far, the government has not agreed to supply the drug to Massachusetts or any of the 35 states with similar laws.

"3 Drug Makers Report Profits Better Than Forecast"

New York Times (01/29/97) P. D4; Freudenheim, Milt

Three large pharmaceutical and health care companies reported surprisingly strong fourth-quarter results on Tuesday. Of those, Merck reported a 19 percent increase in sales, led by sales of \$835 million for its cholesterol drug Zocor. Earnings rose 21.6 percent to \$1.04 billion compared to earnings of \$857.8 million in the same quarter of the previous year. The company's new AIDS drug Crixivan saw total sales of \$100 million.

"Across the USA: California, Vermont, Massachusetts"

USA Today (01/29/97) P. 11A

The San Francisco Cannabis Cultivators Club, which reopened earlier this month to provide marijuana for medicinal uses, is opening branches in San Jose, Sacramento, Arcadia, and Ukiah. Separately, a bill being considered by state lawmakers in Vermont would legalize physician-assisted suicide. Another measure, one that would ban the practice, is expected to be introduced this week. Finally, officials at Hoosac Valley High School in Adams, MA, are inviting health professionals to talk to students, staff, and parents about AIDS following the news that a student has the disease.

"Legislator Wants AIDS Test Before Marriage"

United Press International (01/29/97)

Rep. Reynaldo Calay, of the Philippines, is advocating proposed legislation that would require couples seeking a marriage license to first be tested for HIV. The lawmaker says the proposal is an attempt to prevent the spread of HIV.

"Beijing Stages Exhibition Against AIDS"

Xinhua News Agency (01/29/97)

Exhibits about HIV prevention and the current state of the epidemic in China are being presented in Zhongshan Park in Beijing. The event is being held by a coalition of organizations, including China AIDS, the Sexual Prevention and Treatment Association, and the Family Planning Publicity and Education Center. The project aims to educate people about the current number of HIV cases and the scientific basis of prevention efforts.

"Family Planning Pill [in Ethiopia] by End of Year"

The Ethiopia Social Marketing Program, a unit of the non-profit DKT-Population Services International/Ethiopia, is introducing Wyeth-Ayerst's Duofem onto the Ethiopian market. The low-dose oral contraceptive will be called "Prudence" in Ethiopia and will be available in pharmacies, private clinics and hospitals, factory clinics, and drug shops. The organization, which is expanding its HIV prevention efforts to include family planning, hopes the pill will help lower the country's fertility rate.

"NYC Hospitals See Decline in AIDS Patients"

Crain's New York Business (01/20/97-01/26/97) Vol. 13, No. 3, P. 1; Benson, Barbara

With the success of new AIDS therapies over the past year, New York hospitals, nursing homes, and hospices are seeing more and more empty beds and decreased revenues. If the downturn continues, some facilities may be forced to cut services and staff size. The number of AIDS patients hospitalized in New York on any given day was down to 1,402 in October, 42 percent lower than the peak reached in January 1993, according to the Greater New York Hospital Association. The past year saw the sharpest decline with the average number of patients dropping from 2,000

in July 1995. The average number of AIDS patient admissions and average hospital stay also decreased. Because the number of AIDS patients did not decrease, experts attribute the trend to better patient management, the rise in managed care, and the introduction of new treatments to prevent the opportunistic infections that previously sent AIDS patients to the hospital. More AIDS patients are being treated on an outpatient basis, but this trend hurts hospital revenues because "the outpatient side is not adequately reimbursed," notes Dr. Victoria Sharp, co-director of the AIDS program at Beth Israel Hospital. Facing declining revenues, AIDS doctors fear they will have to cut back staff and services.

"Why Grass Is Greener"

Business Week (01/20/97) No. 3510, P. 34; Stodghill, Ron II

Marinol, made by Unimed Pharmaceuticals, is the only prescription drug that uses a synthetic compound based on THC, the active ingredient in marijuana, to stimulate appetite. Sales of Marinol reached \$6.03 million in 1995. But AIDS patients who advocate the legalization of marijuana for medical purposes say Marinol acts too slowly and causes side effects. "I know so many people who get sick on the stuff," said John Hudson, director of Flower Therapy, a San Francisco company that supplies marijuana for medicinal purposes. Unimed claims that Marinol is safer than marijuana, because it does not contain carcinogens and is a controlled, clinical product. The drug is also covered by health maintenance organizations and Medicaid. Furthermore, at \$120 to \$140 a month, Marinol is less expensive than marijuana, which costs about \$800 for two ounces. Unimed President and CEO Stephen M. Simes claims that the true motivation behind recent marijuana use initiatives is not "purely medical," saying that "many just want to use it recreationally."

The federal government's stand against the medical use of marijuana is "misguided, heavy-handed, and inhumane," according to the editors of the New England Journal of Medicine. An editorial written by Jerome P. Kassirer, the journal's editor, in the Jan. 30 issue, supports doctors' rights to prescribe the drug for the seriously ill and adds that marijuana is safer than some legal alternative treatments like morphine. Kassirer noted that studies to prove the drug's benefit would be difficult to conduct because of the difficulty of measuring such responses as nausea. "What really counts for a therapy with this kind of safety margin is whether a seriously ill patient feels relief as a result of the intervention, not whether a controlled trial 'proves' its efficacy," Kassirer concluded.

"Changes Force AIDS Hospices to Close"

Richmond Times-Dispatch (01/30/97) P. A2; Estrin, Robin

Advances in AIDS treatment and greater acceptance of AIDS patients are causing a decline in demand at hospices, forcing many to close. AIDS deaths still claim as many as 40,000 Americans each year, but new drugs have restored the health of many patients and more dying patients are being accepted by family members and going home to die. Hospice workers are now making house calls to aid caretakers as they deal with the diarrhea, dementia, and pain the disease causes. Boston's Hospice at Mission Hill, as well as other hospices in Pennsylvania and California, has closed due to reduced demand. Some patient advocates are concerned that the trend could leave a number of AIDS patients without a proper facility as they approach death.

"Campaign For an AIDS Vaccine"

Boston Globe (01/29/97) P. A12

An AIDS vaccine is critical to ending the AIDS epidemic, but the government's current vaccine strategy is inadequate, argues a Boston Globe editorial. The editors point out that powerful new AIDS drugs are too costly and impractical for the poor in the United States as well as the developing world. They endorse, however, the recommendations of Max Essex, chairman of the Harvard AIDS Institute, to fully fund the U.S. military's vaccine research effort or create a private organization like the March of Dimes, and for the Clinton administration to set a goal for an AIDS vaccine by 2005, the 50th anniversary of the polio vaccine.

"A Place to Share Ideas"

At the World Economic Forum, a six-day meeting of the world's leaders in politics, business, and science, AIDS researcher Luc Montagnier will discuss the threat of emerging diseases. Montagnier, credited as a co-discoverer of HIV, will be among 1,700 participants at the Davos, Switzerland meeting. Other figures attending the event, which opens today, include Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, Microsoft's Bill

Gates, and U.S. House Speaker Newt Gingrich.

"Heated Battle Is Expected on Financing Birth Control"
New York Times (01/30/97) P. B6; Seelye, Katherine Q.

The Clinton administration is preparing a proposal to Congress that would accelerate spending on international family planning aid, a move that abortion opponents say would further the White House's "abortion crusade" in foreign countries. If the measure passes, \$215 million for condoms, birth-control pills, and IUDs would be released by March 1. However, if it does not pass, the amount would be reduced to \$92 million and would be released on July 1. The administration will argue that the loss of the \$123 million would reduce the number of condoms to be distributed by 50 million, birth control pill cycles by 4.8 million, and IUDs by 500,000. Abortion opponents claim the money would be used to promote abortion.

"New AIDS Cases Stabilizing in EU"

Although the number of new AIDS cases in Spain, Portugal, and Italy is still rising, the epidemic is stabilizing in the European Union as a whole. A total of 17,778 new AIDS cases were reported in all 15 countries in the first nine months of 1996, compared to 22,383 in 1995, the European Commission said Wednesday. Just under half the cases were attributed to intravenous drug use. Women accounted for 20 percent of HIV cases in 1995, up from 12 percent in 1986, the commission reported.

"Health-HIV/AIDS: China Finds Prevention Better"
IPS Wire (01/28/97)

An AIDS epidemic similar to the one in Africa can be avoided in China, officials say, pointing to strict measures to curb the spread of the disease. While the incidence of HIV infection is still relatively low in China, the Ministry of Public Health has revealed a medium- and long-term agenda for HIV prevention. The goal of the program, which will feature a nationwide monitoring network with 400 clinics and an advanced national laboratory, is to control the spread of the disease by 2000. The program will involve government agencies, schools, and the public in AIDS education and will crack down on the illegal blood market, drug abuse, and prostitution.

"False-Positive HIV Test Results Can Lead to Litigation"
Reuters (01/29/97)

False reports of HIV infection usually result in lawsuits against physicians and laboratories, according to a report in Medical Economics. Doctors who inform patients of HIV test results or who treat patients for HIV should protect themselves from litigation. David Curtin, a Washington, D.C. lawyer who has represented a patient in such a case, said doctors are surprisingly willing "to begin treating a patient for HIV simply on the basis of a single--and often unreliable--test."

"Evaluation of Safety Devices for Preventing Percutaneous Injuries Among Health-Care Workers During Phlebotomy Procedures--Minneapolis-St. Paul, New York City, and San Francisco, 1993-1995"

Of the 51 documented cases of health care workers becoming HIV-infected from an occupational exposure, 39 percent are associated with needle-stick injuries while drawing blood. Safety devices designed to prevent such injuries have been available in the United States, but their benefit has been difficult to evaluate, in part because many percutaneous injuries are not reported and observation of all procedures is not possible. To evaluate safety devices for phlebotomy, researchers from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, working with hospitals in New York City, Minneapolis-St. Paul, and San Francisco, compared the use of three safety devices to conventional devices. The devices were a reheatable winged steel needle, a bluntable vacuum-tube blood-collection needle, and a vacuum-tube blood-collection needle with a hinged recapping sheath. A total of 86 injuries were reported during the period when conventional devices were used, compared to 41 injuries during the period when the safety devices were in use. Of those 41 cases, 83 percent involved winged steel needles, while 17 percent were associated with the use of vacuum-tube blood-collection needles. In 61 percent of the cases, the injury occurred before the safety feature was activated, while in 15 percent, it happened during activation. In one-fifth of the injuries, the safety feature had not been activated. An editorial note accompanying the report says the results suggest that the safety devices can reduce the risk of occupational injury among health care workers, and that a significant risk reduction was associated with the vacuum-tube blood collection devices.

"Who Decides?"

Forbes (01/27/97) Vol. 159, No. 2, P. 47; Brimelow, Peter

An evaluation of federal funding for disease research reveals that of the National Institutes of Health's total expenditures, more is spent on AIDS research than any other disease. The NIH allocates a total of \$1.34 billion to AIDS, or \$31,453 per AIDS-related death. By comparison, \$364 million is spent on breast cancer, or \$8,210 per death, and \$123 million is spent on lung cancer, or \$815 per death. Analysts say the disparity is due, in part, to the fact that AIDS is a new disease and is being funded at a high level because of its immediate threat. Merrill Matthews of the National Center for Policy Analysis also notes that "political pressure works." The analyst points out that both AIDS and lung cancer can usually be attributed to personal behavior. However, Matthews notes that the funding disparity shows that Americans are more likely to think of AIDS patients as innocent while smokers are held more responsible for their disease.

"U.S. Plans Meeting to Study Issue of Medical Marijuana"

Experts on the potential medicinal benefits and risks of marijuana will convene at the National Institutes of Health in February to help resolve "the public health dilemma" created by new state medical marijuana laws, NIH director Harold Varmus announced Thursday. The National Institute on Drug Abuse is organizing the meeting, scheduled for Feb. 19 and 20. Participants will consider how to hold clinical research on the medical benefits and risks of marijuana. The Clinton administration, after threatening to prosecute doctors who prescribe the drug, has come under attack by physicians who say marijuana can benefit patients with AIDS, cancer, and other serious illnesses.

"Governors Oppose Clinton Proposal for Medicaid Cap"
New York Times (01/31/97) P. A1; Pear, Robert

The National Governors' Association has said that it will oppose President Clinton's plan to limit federal spending on Medicaid, claiming that it would shift the burden of providing care to poor people to the states. The New York Medicaid program, one of the country's most costly, would be hurt seriously by a federal cap. It enrolls more AIDS patients, who have a higher cost of care than other recipients, than does any other state. The cost of AIDS care, moreover, is likely to increase with the use of costly new drugs. A number of consumer and patient advocate groups are also opposing the Clinton proposal, including the AIDS Action Council, the Alzheimer's Association, and Catholic Charities USA.

"Market Place: Shares in Maker of a Flu Drug Soar, But Competitor Has Edge"
New York Times (01/31/97) P. D6; Fisher, Lawrence M.

Shares of Gilead Science rose dramatically earlier this week, after the biotechnology firm announced that it would initiate clinical testing of a flu drug. However, Biota Holdings, a little-known Australian company, is already conducting clinical trials of a potential influenza treatment and could market its medication first. Gilead is popular among analysts because it is one of the few biotechnology companies with an approved drug for CMV retinitis, a common disease among AIDS patients that can cause blindness. The company is also conducting clinical trials of other drugs for AIDS, herpes, and genital warts.

"A Medical Opinion on Marijuana"

The New England Journal of Medicine's approval of the medical use of marijuana provides a compassionate voice on the national debate, according to a New York Times editorial. Furthermore, the editors note, the journal's endorsement could make the government's opposition to medical marijuana more difficult. In its commentary on the issue, the New England Journal of Medicine

notes that the drug's risks, which are not as high as the risks from some legal drugs, are outweighed by its benefit for AIDS and cancer patients who are experiencing pain or nausea.

"Small Stock Focus: Flamel"

Shares of the drug-delivery company Flamel were up 1.375, or 22 percent, to 7.625 on the Nasdaq market Thursday, on news that the firm had initiated a Phase III clinical trial of its Viropump genital herpes drug.

"Glaxo's Chairman Planning to Retire; Skyes, Lance Are in Line for Key Posts"

Sir Colin Corness, chairman of Glaxo Wellcome, will retire in May and be succeeded by Sir Richard Skyes, now serving as the drug company's chief executive. Skyes does not plan to step down from his full-time executive position in the near future and will continue to hold primary management responsibility for both global strategy, and research and development. Sean Lance, a native of South Africa, was promoted to the position of chief operating officer. Lance has advocated flexible marketing strategies, which will likely mean developing and pricing drugs differently for different countries, especially drugs produced by Glaxo for hepatitis B, malaria, and AIDS, all of which are endemic in the developing world.

"Covert Health Reform Through Schools?"

Washington Times (01/30/97) P. A13; Criner, Lawrence

The Clinton administration is secretly aiming to create a new American health care system through public education reform, contends Lawrence Criner, associate senior editor of the World & I magazine, in a Washington Times commentary. As proof of his claims, Criner points to the prevalence of sex education in public schools, saying these programs infringe upon parental responsibility. He also notes that proposed school programs include personality screening, mental health testing, a database registry of students, sexual diversity instruction, and behavior-modifying drug therapy. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention announced in 1995 that it had collaborated with some 25 national education organizations to develop comprehensive health education programs throughout the country. However, Criner says that the CDC has not made these materials easily available to the public. He contends that the government's secret agenda, proposed as education reform, is an attempt to allow interest groups to gain influence in the classroom.

"AIDS Spreads in South China's Guangdong Province"

Reuters (01/31/97)

A 25 percent increase in HIV infections was reported in China's Guangdong province in 1996, according to the Xinhua News Agency. Last year, 54 HIV infections were reported in the province, including six that had progressed to AIDS. Sexually transmitted diseases were also reportedly on the rise.

"Not So Fast"

Village Voice (01/28/97) Vol. 42, No. 4, P. 38; Schoofs, Mark

New research suggests that a so-called "heterosexual strain" of HIV, proposed by Harvard AIDS scientist Max Essex, may not hold up to scientific scrutiny. Essex had reported that HIV subtype E seemed to be better suited to infecting the cells lining the vagina and foreskin than subtype B, which was spread rapidly among injection drug users in Thailand but had not caused a heterosexual epidemic. However, researchers from both Rockefeller University and the U.S. Army have not been able to duplicate Essex's findings. Essex maintains that the researchers used different research methods that could have caused the contradictory results. In other research, studies have shown that the amount of HIV in semen can be dramatically reduced when combination drug therapy effectively suppresses HIV in the blood. However, a man with no detectable virus in his semen could still infect someone. Researchers warn, therefore, that people should not stop practicing safer sex just because they have a diminished viral load.

"Susceptibility to HIV Infection and Progression of AIDS in Relation to Variant Alleles of Mannose-Binding Lectin"

Lancet (01/25/97) Vol. 349, No. 9047, P. 236; Garred, Peter; Madsen, Hans O.; Balslev, Ulla; et al.

Low serum concentrations of mannose-binding lectin (MBL) are attributed to three variant alleles in the MBL gene and are associated with immunodeficiency. Dr. Peter Garred, of the Tissue Typing Laboratory at Denmark's National University Hospital, and colleagues evaluated whether this genetic variation was associated with susceptibility to HIV infection and AIDS progression. They determined the prevalence of MBL polymorphisms in 96 HIV-positive homosexual men and compared the frequency of the variant MBL alleles in this group with that in healthy controls and high-risk HIV-negative controls. The authors report that 8 percent of the HIV-infected men were homozygous for the variant alleles, while only 0.8 percent of the healthy controls and none of the high-risk homosexual controls carried the variant alleles. No significant association was found between MBL genotype and AIDS progression, but the survival time after AIDS diagnosis was significantly shorter in the 61 men who carried the variant alleles than in those with the normal allele. The researchers concluded that individuals homozygous for the variant MBL alleles are especially vulnerable to HIV infection and that the variant alleles are associated with significantly shorter survival after AIDS diagnosis.

PRESIDENT CLINTON ANNOUNCES WHITE HOUSE APPOINTMENTS

The President today announced several appointments to the White House staff.

The President that Thurgood Marshall Jr. will assume the position of

Assistant to the President and Cabinet Secretary. Currently, he is Deputy Counsel and Director of Legislative Affairs in the Office of the Vice President. Mr. Marshall served as Senior Policy Advisor on the Clinton-Gore Transition Team and on the Gore traveling staff during the 1992 campaign. Prior to that, he was Senate Judiciary Committee Counsel. Previously, Mr. Marshall worked for then-Senator Gore as Deputy Campaign Manager for Issues in the 1988 Gore for President Campaign.

The President also announced that Maria Echaveste will become Assistant to the President and Director for Public Liaison. Ms. Echaveste joins the White House from the Department of Labor, where she was Wage and Hour Administrator. Before joining the Labor Department, Ms. Echaveste was Deputy Director of Personnel during the Clinton transition. Prior to that she worked for the law firm of Rosenman & Colin.

In addition, the President announced that Craig Smith will leave his position as Co-Executive Director of the 53rd Presidential Inaugural Committee to become Assistant to the President and Director for Political Affairs. Previously, Mr. Smith was Deputy Campaign Manager and Political Director of Clinton/Gore '96. He has worked in the White House as Deputy Assistant to the President for Presidential Personnel and for Political Affairs.

Robert (Ben) Johnson will be promoted to Deputy Assistant to the President and Deputy Director for Public Liaison. Mr. Johnson has been Special Assistant to the President and Associate Director in the Office of Public Liaison. Mr. Johnson served on the staff of the Mayor of the District of Columbia before joining the White House. He also served the District of Columbia government as Administrator of the Housing and Environmental Administration and as Administrator of the Business Regulation Foundation.

Minyon Moore, currently National Political Director for the Democratic National Committee, will serve as Deputy Assistant to the President and Deputy Director for Political Affairs. Prior to serving in her current position, Ms. Moore worked on various national voter registration/education campaigns, including the National Rainbow Coalition/DNC Voter Project. Ms. Moore also served as a senior official on the 1984 and 1988 presidential campaigns of Rev. Jesse Jackson.

Karen Skelton will also serve as Deputy Assistant to the President and Deputy Director for Political Affairs. She is currently Director of Political Affairs in the Office of the Vice President. Ms. Skelton joined the Vice President's Office from the Department of Justice, where she served as a trial attorney in the Environment and Natural Resources Division. Previously, she was field director of the Clinton-Gore 1992 Campaign in California.

Another recent addition to the White House staff is Beverly Barnes, who serves as senior advisor to Chief of Staff Erskine Bowles. Ms. Barnes handles media and communications for the Chief of Staff. Ms. Barnes comes to the White House from Podesta Associates, where she was Director of Public Affairs. Prior to that, she served as Chief of Staff for the Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs at the Department of Labor.
