Prevention Works: Spotlight on Successful Prevention Practices

More and more, research shows those working in prevention that many strategies and programs "work" to protect our youth from substance abuse

while helping them develop into healthy, caring adults. Each month, Field

Notes will offer information on one prevention program or strategy that research has shown to be effective. No one program works for everyone. Instead, matching prevention practices to the specific needs of the community will result in greater outcomes.

Across Ages

The Across Ages program includes three components: elders mentoring youth, youth performing community service, and teacher training. Mentors meet with

students all year long and are carefully recruited, screened, trained, and

matched with one or two high-risk youth. Mentoring activities include tutoring, assistance with school projects, recreational activities, attending cultural or sporting events, performing community service, or just

time spent nurturing. Youth also perform community service by making biweekly visits to institutionalized frail elderly. Teachers are trained to

administer to sixth graders the Social Problem Solving and Substance Abuse

Prevention modules of the Positive Youth Development Curriculum (PYDC), which focuses on stress management, self-esteem, problem solving, substance

and health information, as well as social networks and peer resistance skills. In addition, students' parents are offered incentives to participate in activities with youth and mentors. Data demonstrate effectiveness in improving pro-social values, increasing knowledge of the

consequences of substance abuse, and engendering resilience to help youth

avoid later substance use by teaching them appropriate resistance behaviors.

Protective factors addressed include bonding to school and people with healthy beliefs and clear standards, obtaining resistance skills, and obtaining the opportunity to provide community service. This program also

addresses the risk factor of low commitment to school.

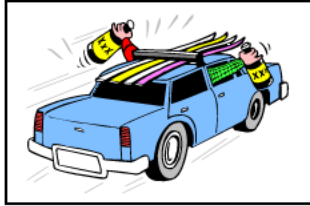
