Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to seek your assistance in moving forward an important project for the nation and the District of Columbia – the creation of a National Health Museum at 2nd and C Streets, SW. As you may know, the National Health Museum has offered to purchase this site, which is to be vacated by the FDA in 2001, from the federal government at fair market value.

The American people deserve to have this important site made available for their benefit and use. As chairman of the board of this non-profit organization, it has been a long-held vision that such a museum will play an important role in providing information and inspiration for healthy living. With over \$500 billion spent each year to treat preventable injuries and disease, we believe unequivocally that the National Health Museum will provide returns to the American people that are beyond the imagination.

The proposal for designating the property for sale to the Museum has gained widespread support, with legislation introduced in both the Senate and the House by a strong bipartisan coalition of Congressional leaders. Here in the District, Mayor Anthony Williams and the Council of the District of Columbia have formally endorsed locating the Museum at this site. Both the National Capital Planning Commission and the Commission of Fine Arts have expressed support. The General Services Administration has indicated publicly that it will not oppose the sale of the property for the purpose of the National Health Museum.

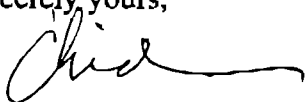
It is our understanding that the Office of Management and Budget may be reluctant to support the sale of this property to the Museum. It is for this reason that I am seeking your assistance.

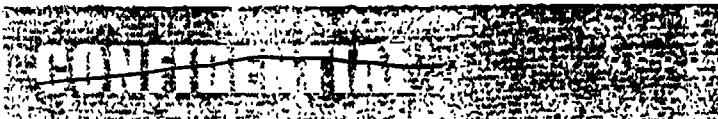
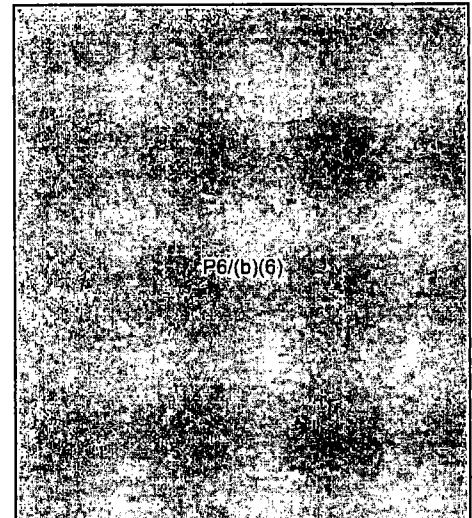
