Thank you for your letter regarding the block granting of supported employment and the Title I Rehabilitation Act.

I share your concern that people with severe disabilities should be served in the best way possible. As the parent of a disabled child myself, I feel strongly that even when costs need to be contained, cuts must not be at the expense of quality programs for the nation's children and adults with disabilities. I agree that block grants, in particular, may interfere with the provision of flexible services that respect the needs of the individual in preparing that person for employment.

With these concerns in mind, I and my staff will continue to closely monitor the Kassebaum and Goodling bills and to work with both Democrat and Republican lawmakers to ensure that any changes in the law respect both the spirit and intent of the ADA and IDEA.

Thank you again for your support of our continuing efforts to provide quality services for Americans with disabilities. We welcome your insights as we move through this critical planning process and we continue to appreciate the contribution made by R&T Centers like yours in supporting employment and independent living for this special population.

Dear Governor Engler,

Thank you for bringing to my attention the issue of Michigan's food stamp waiver proposal. I have been informed by Food and Consumer Services (FCS) that all Michigan waivers have been accepted except for the cash-out program. FCS indicated that cash-out was denied because the state's proposed plan for evaluation does not include a full impact evaluation. Because Michigan is the only state to submit a request for statewide cash-out, FCS considers an impact evaluation to be critical to assessing how such a statewide initiative will affect food stamp recipients.

I understand that you are engaged in discussion with FCS regarding options for including such a comprehensive evaluation. I have asked my staff to closely monitor this discussion and to notify me of any developments. Please keep me informed of your position on this matter so that we may arrive at a resolution that is satisfactory to all involved.

Thank you for your continuing efforts to best address the needs of the welfare recipients in your state.

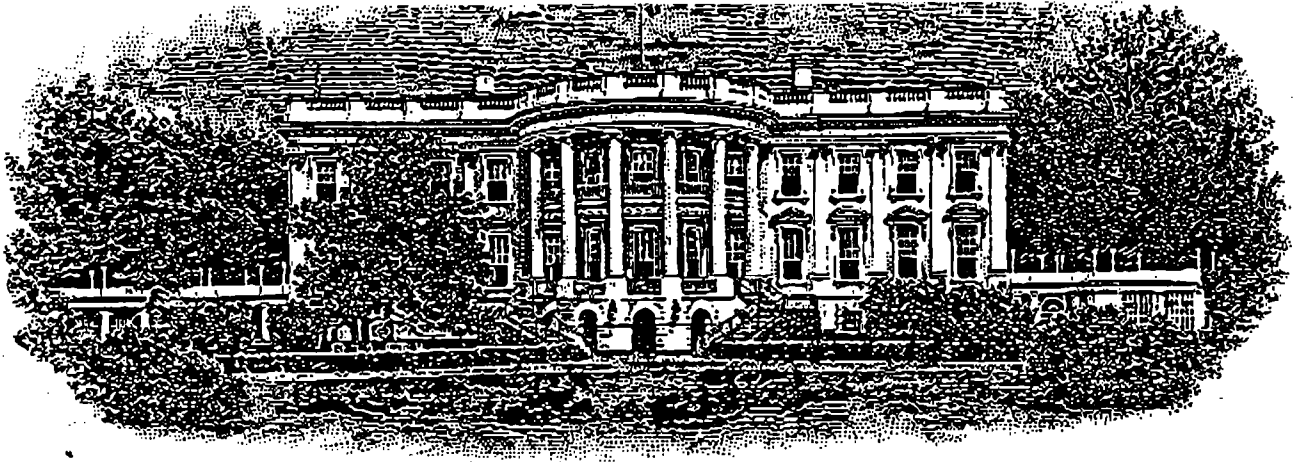

1995 WHITE HOUSE CONFERENCE ON AGING FACT SHEET

The fourth White House Conference on Aging (WHCoA) -- and the last of this century -- will be held May 2-5, 1995, in Washington, D.C. President Clinton called for the Conference on February 17, 1994. The WHCoA Policy Committee, a 25-member body appointed by the President and the Congress, set the dates and place at its first meeting on July 27, 1994. Senator David Pryor (D-AR) chairs the Policy Committee.

On January 25, 1995, the Policy Committee approved a theme and final Conference agenda. The theme is "America Now and Into the 21st Century: Generations Aging Together with Independence, Opportunity and Dignity." Four broad issues comprise the agenda: (1) Assuring Comprehensive Health Care Including Long Term Care, (2) Promoting Economic Security, (3) Maximizing Housing and Support Service Options, and (4) Maximizing Options for a Quality Life. In deciding on the theme and final agenda, the Policy Committee considered public comments on theme possibilities and a draft agenda published in the Federal Register October 12, 1994. In addition, reports and recommendations from hundreds of officially recognized WHCoA events throughout the country were considered in developing the final agenda, which was published in the Federal Register February 2, 1995.

Two cross-cutting concerns pervade the agenda and will influence discussions at the Conference. These are: (1) interdependence among generations and among members of extended families, and the responsibility of individuals to plan for changes that will occur throughout their lifespan; and (2) unique contributions and needs of special populations, especially veterans, caregivers (including grandparents), rural elderly, women, minorities and individuals with disabilities.

Purposes of the WHCoA are to shape resolutions that will influence national aging policy over the next decade and design a strategy for putting policy into action -- for implementing the resolutions the Conference produces.

The 1995 Conference, authorized by the 1992 Amendments to the Older Americans Act, will have 2,258 delegates. In addition, it will have up to 250 observers, individuals who may attend the Conference but not vote. Delegates are selected by governors, members of Congress, constituent organizations (including national aging organizations and veterans groups), the White House, the HHS Secretary and the WHCoA.

Since President Clinton officially called it on February 17, 1994, the WHCoA has developed a full national program of pre-Conference events and activities. More than 700 events have been held or scheduled, including local, state, regional and mini-conferences. In addition, the WHCoA, in partnership with other organizations, has conducted more than 15 focus groups in a variety of cities throughout the country to gain direct input from individuals, primarily seniors, on their attitudes about aging and their views on what the WHCoA should focus on and strive to accomplish.

Introduction for G. Andrew Fleming:

Andy Fleming, President and CEO of the Atlanta Paralympic Organizing Committee, is one of America's leading professionals in sports. He most recently served as director of sports and recreation of the Paralyzed Veterans of America where he directed the nation's largest wheelchair sports program. He is a nationally-recognized wheelchair athlete who won silver medals in national championship track and swimming, swam on a record-breaking relay team in national competition, and was part of several all-star basketball teams. He was elected to the National Wheelchair Athletic Association's Hall of Fame in 1994.

His work in sports for people with disabilities began in 1979, when he designed and ran an award-winning adaptive recreation program in Santa Barbara. In 1982, he became the first executive director of the National Wheelchair Athletics Association, where he organized the United States wheelchair team's participation in the world championships. In 1984, Andy was technical director for the first wheelchair track exhibition events held during the Summer Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

In 1992, he received the celebrated James Brady Award for national leadership and service to the disability sports community.

PROTECTION & ADVOCACY FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH MENTAL ILLNESS (PAIMI) FACT SHEET

Current System

- o There are five protection & advocacy programs -- Protection & Advocacy for Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PADD), PAIMI, Protection & Advocacy for Individual Rights (PAIR), the Client Assistance Program (CAP), and assistive technology. These programs are designed to provide legal assistance for persons with disabilities, including bringing lawsuits and negotiating better services. PADD is run out of ADD in HHS; PAIMI is run by SAMHSA; and the other programs are run by the Dept. of Education.
- o Under the current process, the Governor makes a one-time designation of an agency to receive the funds, which then continues to receive these funds year after year on a formula basis.

Budget Proposal

- o The budget places the \$22 million PAIMI program in the new \$326 million mental health performance partnership block grants to go to the states. The advocates (notably the National Association of Protection & Advocacy Systems) feel strongly that this is a serious mistake because these P&A's spend a majority of their time suing or harassing the states, especially state institutions. They charge that Governors in approximately 15 states appear to have an active interest in weakening these programs.
- o OMB and PHS are responding to these concerns by indicating that they will draft language that would wall off these funds within the block grant and require states to spend the same amount on PAIMI that they do today. They indicate that there will still be some advantage to the block grant because there will be a single application process.

Advocates' Response

- o The advocates respond to this by charging that there will be no administrative streamlining because the P&As do not even have to apply for funds today. Since currently, the funds flow automatically by formula, the advocates charge that the proposed system would actually be more cumbersome. Getting funds to the P&As would require that the state submit a plan to HHS and that the Secretary approve it. In addition, some states require state appropriation of federal funds, which would add the hurdle of state legislative action to the process.

They are also concerned that any proposal to wall off PAIMI will not survive the legislative process.

- o The advocates also criticize the process, charging that the decision to block grant PAIMI was made by low-level staff at PHS and OMB, without the participation of those knowledgeable about disability programs. They point to the November 8 meeting of the Administration Appointees with Disabilities group, which had a very positive discussion of these programs.
- o The advocates also allege that the National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors has discussed this issue with NGA staff and that they have taken the informal position that Governors do not want to be part of the P&A system. We don't yet know whether the position will become formal or communicated to anyone.
- o In arguing that Administration policy is not coordinated, the advocates point out that PHS and ADD have just told the state of Kansas that the P&A must be separate from state agencies that provide services and that their current arrangement violates regulation.
- o The advocates would like the Administration to signal that we are willing to retreat on this proposal, perhaps using the vehicle of SAMHSA's reauthorization.
- o One option that NAPAS has tentatively put forth is the notion of block granting the five P&As into one grant. However, others have cautioned that this would create significant tension within the disability community.
- o We have brought in the General Counsel's office, the Vice-President's office, and Mrs. Gore's office on this issue in order to get their views.

FACT SHEET

The Paralympic Games are the zenith of competition for elite athletes with physical disabilities. The fundamental philosophy guiding the Paralympic movement is that these world-class athletes should have opportunities and experiences equivalent to those afforded non-disabled athletes. In order to compete in the Paralympics, each athlete must meet strict qualifying standards and be selected to his or her national team.

Scope:

The 1996 Atlanta Paralympic Games will host:

- over 100 nations
- 17 sports (14 of which are Olympic sports)
- 2 demonstration sports during
- 10 days of competition
- Aug. 16-27, 1996

Competitors:

Elite athletes with physical or visual impairments, representing four international federations: the blind, paraplegics and quadriplegics, people with cerebral palsy, amputees and others (including dwarfs).

Size:

In terms of athlete services, the 1996 Paralympic Games will be roughly one-third the size of the Olympics, with:

- 4,000 athletes
- 1,000 coaches and team staff
- 1,500 officials, technical personnel and the Paralympic Family
- 15,000 volunteers

Organization:

The Paralympics are recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) and governed by the International Paralympic Committee (IPC).

Origin:

The first Paralympic Games were held in Rome in 1960 and have been held every Olympic year since, usually in the city or country hosting the Olympic Games.

The Seoul Olympic Organizing Committee organized the 1988 Paralympics, held in Olympic venues two weeks after the Olympic Games. In Barcelona, the Olympic Organizing Committee (COOB'92) hosted the Paralympic Games as well, in twelve days of glory and spectacle that drew more than 1.5 million spectators.

The Paralympics and the Olympic Movement

Internationally . . .

Leaders of the Paralympic movement have always sought a close association with the larger Olympic ideals, holding the Paralympic Games whenever possible in the city or country hosting the Olympic Games.

In 1984, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) embraced athletes with disabilities by recognizing their then-international governing body, the International Coordinating Committee of World Sports Organizations for the Disabled (ICC). Following 1984, there has been a stronger alliance of the IOC and the ICC, including partial funding of the ICC by the IOC. In 1992, the ICC was restructured and became known as the International Paralympic Committee (IPC). Many national Olympic committees of the IOC recognize and support programs for athletes who compete in the Paralympics.

Two important outcomes of this growing recognition of athletes with disabilities by the IOC and the National Olympic committees have taken place since 1984:

- The inclusion of exhibition events in Olympic Games held in Los Angeles, Seoul and Barcelona. The program, so well-received by spectators, consists of one event each for men and women in wheelchair track. It is the goal of the IPC to increase the numbers of events for athletes with disabilities in the Olympic Games.
- The inclusion of the Paralympics in the overall planning and structure of the Olympic Games both in Seoul and Barcelona.

Nationally . . .

With the passage of the Amateur Sports Act of 1978, the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) embraced American athletes with disabilities. The USOC provides a limited number of programs and services directly to elite athletes with disabilities, and supports programs of the major national disability sports organizations.

The USOC also provides partial funding for the USA Paralympic Team participating in the Paralympic Games every four years.

A Brief History of the Paralympic Games

The Paralympic Games were born of the vision of Sir Ludwig Guttman, an English neurosurgeon at Stoke-Mandeville Hospital in Aylesbury, England, in 1948 when he organized the International Wheelchair Games to coincide with the 1948 London Olympics. This first effort was symbolic; a deliberate attempt to connect the Olympics and the Paralympics was not made again until 1960, when the first Paralympic Games were held in Rome, just a few weeks after the 1960 Rome Olympics. In the first years, only wheelchair athletes competed.

Four hundred athletes from 23 countries joined together on that glorious day in Rome. The Paralympic Movement was created, and Sir Guttman was saluted by Pope Paul XXIII, who declared, "You are the de Coubertin of the paralyzed." Since then, the two events have shared cities four times (Tokyo 1968, Seoul 1988, Barcelona 1992, Atlanta 1996) and countries three times (Germany 1972, Canada 1976 and United States 1984). The Xth Paralympiad will be celebrated in Atlanta in 1996.

As the Paralympic Movement grew, other classes of athletes began to participate, including amputees, the blind and those with cerebral palsy. In 1982, the International Coordinating Committee of World Sports Organizations for the Disabled (ICC) was established as a counterpart to the International Olympic Committee, with four international federations under its umbrella:

- Cerebral Palsy International Sports and Recreation Association (CP-ISRA)
- International Blind Sports Association (IBSA)
- International Stoke-Mandeville Wheelchair Sports Federation (ISMWSF)
- International Sports Organization for the Disabled (ISOD) - governs amputees as well as *les autres*, athletes with a variety of other disabilities, including dwarf athletes.

In 1992, the ICC was restructured and has become the International Paralympic Committee (IPC).
