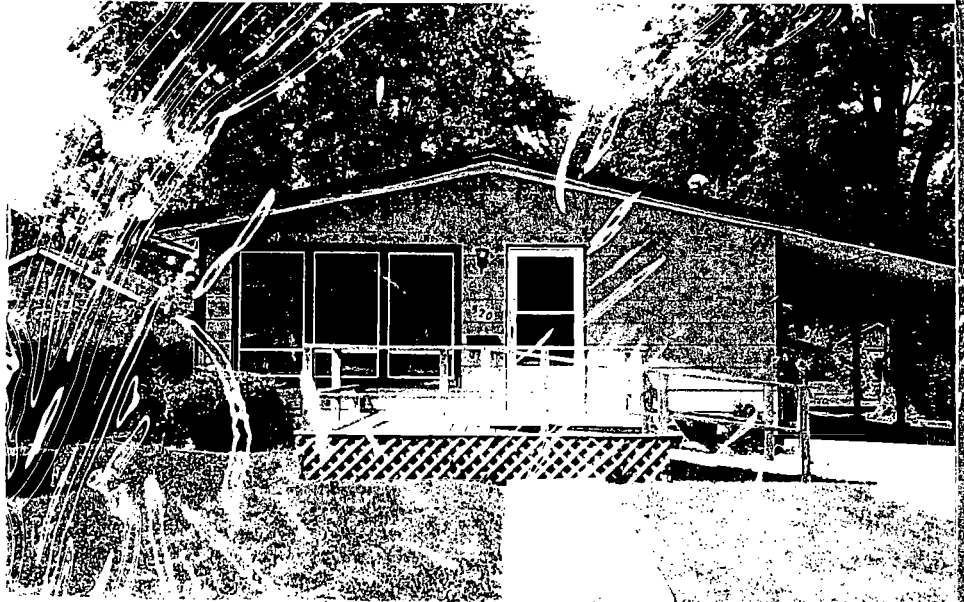

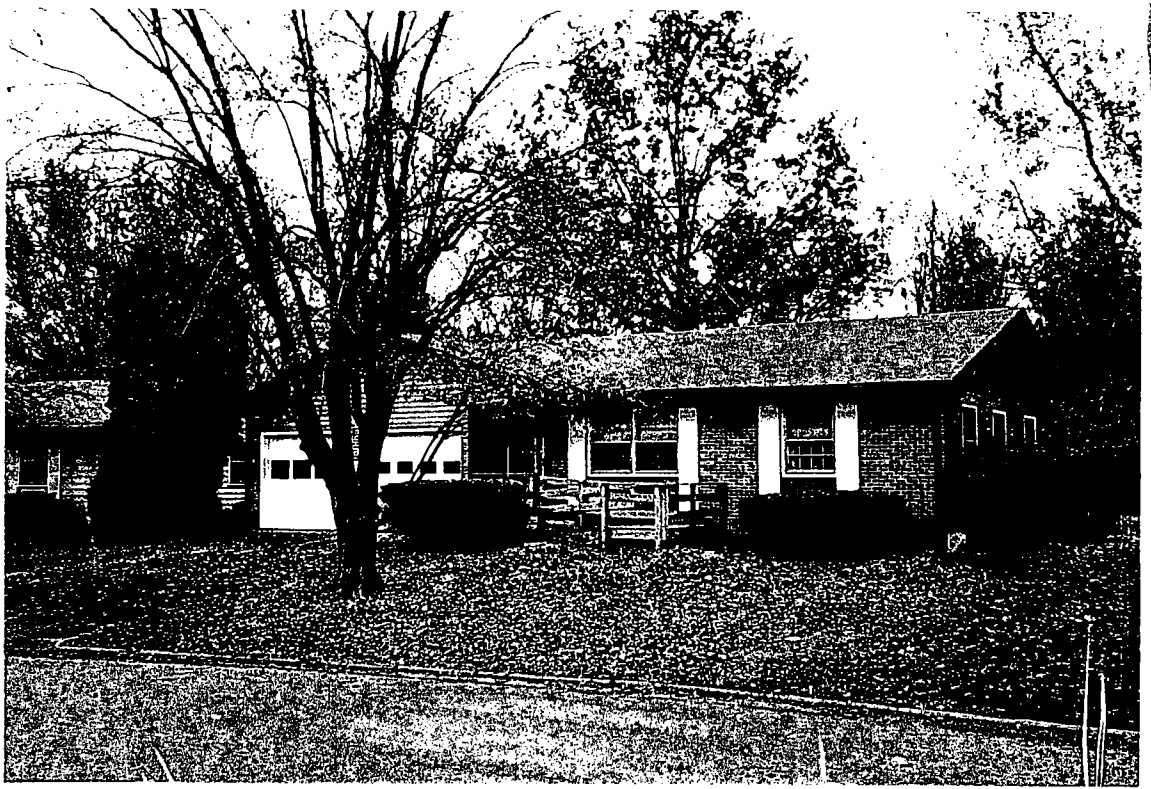

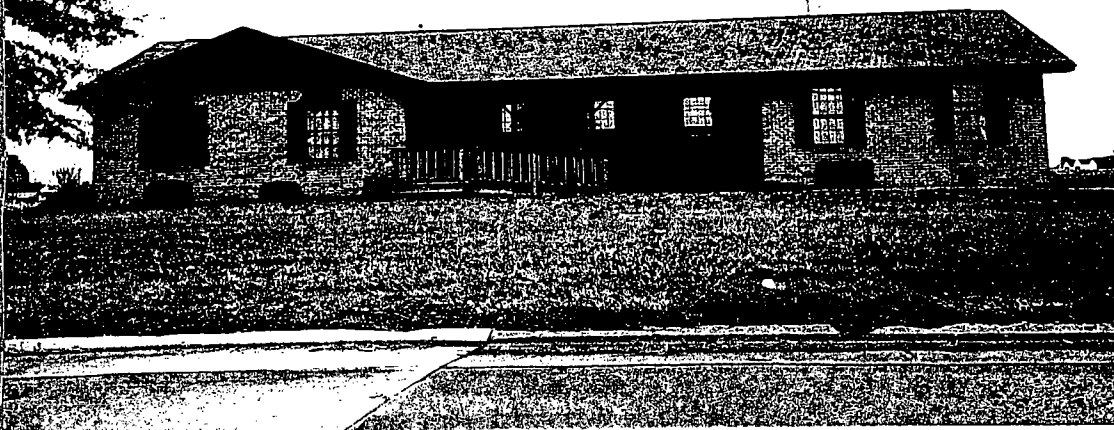

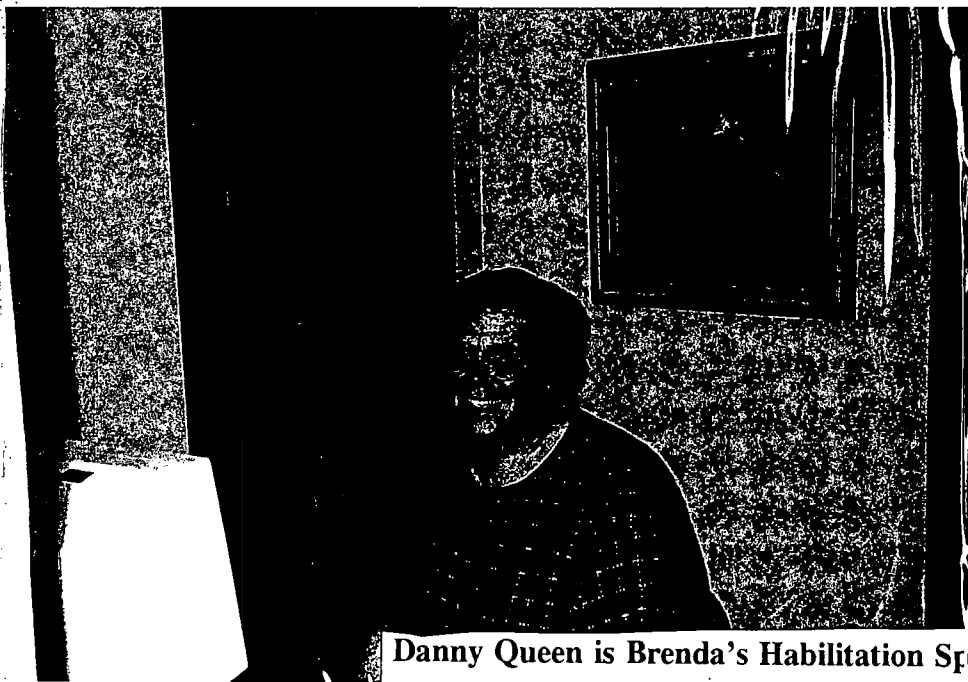

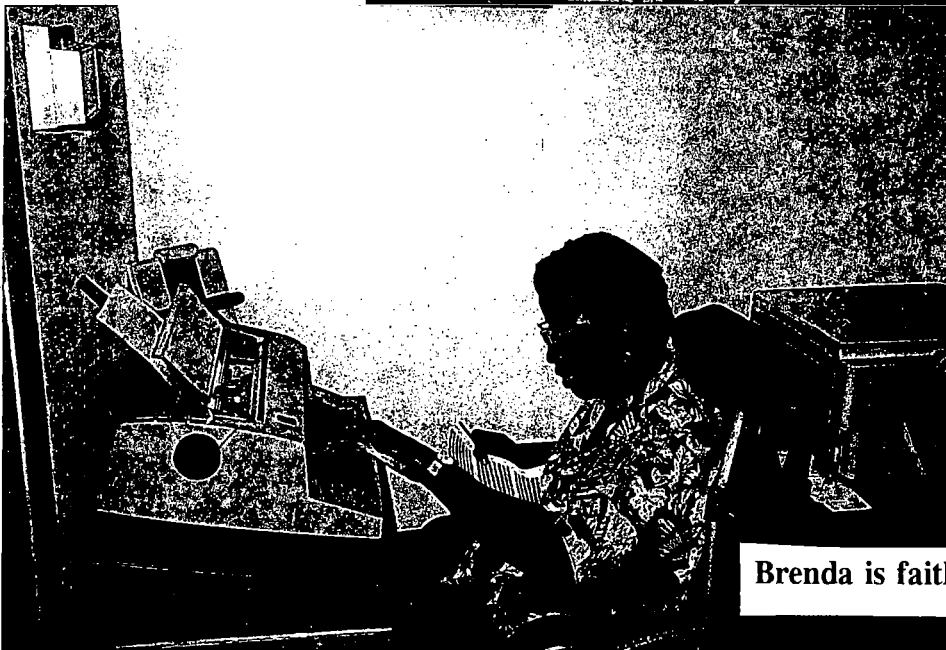

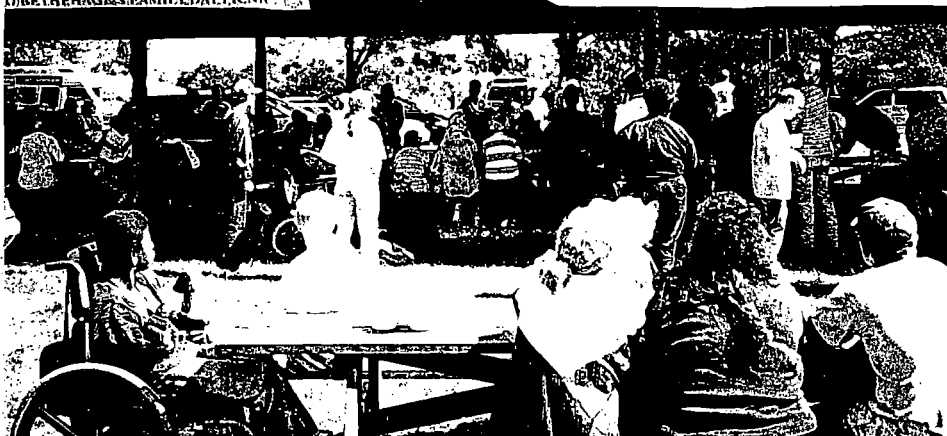

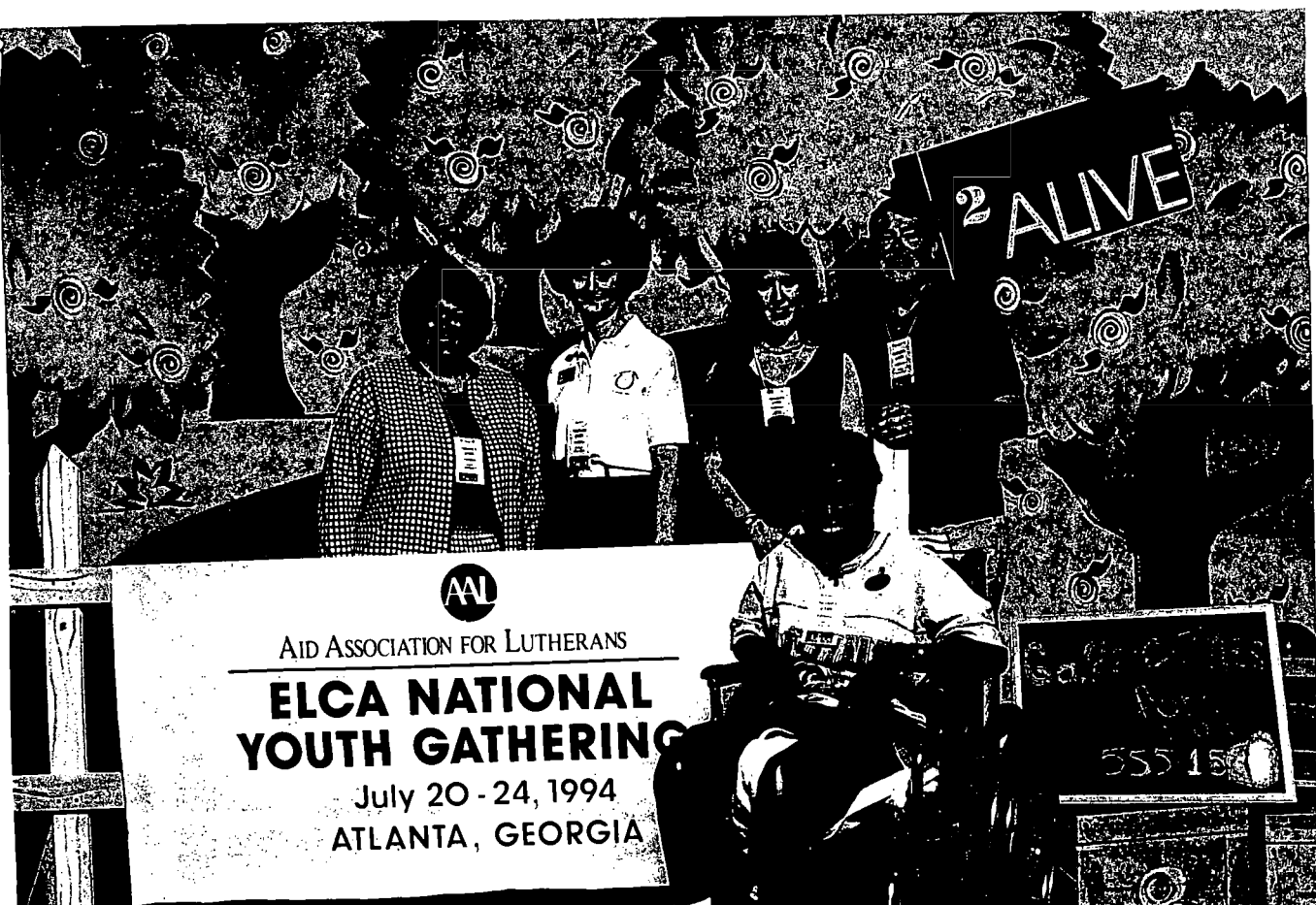

All referrals for admission should be made to Western Illinois Service Coordination. After receiving the required information, the Admissions Committee will determine an applicant's eligibility for consideration of admission to Bethphage. If deemed eligible, a screening evaluation will be scheduled. Admissions, as well as employment opportunities, are made without regard to race, color, religion, creed, ancestry, age, sex, disability or national origin. All applications on the prospective waiting list will be considered when an opening occurs. Bethphage has agreed to maintain a certain number of placements from state-operated and nursing facilities.
