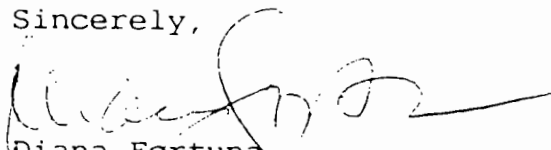
Dear Ms. McGregor:

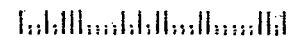

Dear Ms. Fortuna:

Thank you for agreeing to speak with the 1995 NPHHI Senior Policy Fellows. In reviewing our agenda, I would like to schedule a meeting with you from **2:00 - 3:30pm on Thursday, May 25th at your office**. It would be of great benefit to the fellows for you to discuss the goals, and position the Administration has regarding its current health care agenda, reform, and other health care initiatives in place. The Senior Policy Fellows will be dealing with issues related to Section 1115 Medicaid Waivers, regarding capitation rates, etc., and will be looking in great detail into five state level plans, in addition to providing them with very technical knowledge on these issues, it is also very useful to know or place these issues in a more broader scope and policy basis through meetings with a diverse group of health care professionals and organizations.

The Fellowship program, now in its fourth year, is conducted by NPHHI in collaboration with New York University's Wagner School of Public Service. As with previous years, five senior administrators from public hospitals (members of NAPH) throughout the country were selected for an enriched exposure to health policy. During their Fellowship year, the Fellows will spend three weeks in Washington, DC, meeting with individuals in the legislative and executive branches of the federal government as well as with representatives from many organizations interested in policy analysis and advocacy related to health policy. In addition to the diversity of knowledge we also incorporate meetings with various interest groups, similar trade and lobbying organizations.

In addition to providing the Fellows with an overview of the health policy-making process, the 1995 program will focus substantively on Medicaid, Section 1115 waivers and disproportionate share adjustments ("DSH"). During the first week in Washington, the Fellows were introduced to the health policy-making process, Medicaid, Section 1115 waivers, the legislative history of DSH and its relationship to public hospitals, Medicaid and the proposed and approved Section 1115 waivers. The remainder of

meetings scheduled for May and September will involve more substantive issues, and allotted time for the group to work on their topic to be presented and provided for the benefits of NAPH member hospitals, and as a legislative lobbying tool.

At your earliest convenience, please forward either by fax or by mail a brief biography of yourself. Meetings with the Fellows are generally very informal and are characterized by considerable interaction. If you have any additional questions, please call our offices at 202-408-0229. The 1995 Senior Policy Fellows include the following outstanding individuals:

- ♦ **LORI BERRY, MPH, MSW**, *Associate Administrator for Ambulatory Care Services; The Cambridge Hospital*

Lori Berry currently holds the position of Associate Administrator for Ambulatory Care Services. She has worked in this capacity for seven years and is responsible for the management of all ambulatory programs, as well as six neighborhood centers, hospital and community-based primary care programs, medical and psychiatric outpatient specialty clinics and the emergency department. She brings with her 15 years of knowledge and experience with public hospitals systems, primarily working with primary care services, and community and ambulatory care services. Ms. Berry obtained her MPH from Harvard's School of Public Health and her MSW from the University of Maryland.

- ♦ **DAVID JOHNSON, MMA**, *Director of Operations for Metropolitan Health Plan; Hennepin County Medical Center*

David Johnson has worked with Hennepin County Medical Center for 22 years and currently holds the position of Director of Operations for the Metropolitan Health Plan (MHP). The Metropolitan Health Plan established by Hennepin County Medical Center in 1983 is a 31,000 member HMO, of which 65% of its membership are Medicaid recipients.

- ♦ **DONALD SMITHBURG, MA**, *Associate Executive Director for Truman Medical Center, Executive Director for Truman Medical Center Charitable Foundation, and Chief Administrative Officer and Lecturer at the University of MO-Kansas City School of Medicine*

Donald Smithburg holds three positions with the Truman Medical Center Corporation. His various responsibilities include coordination of multiple departments within the hospital, supervising financing and construction of the \$11 million building expansion. As Executive Director for the TMC Foundation, which has assets of \$3.1 million in private gifts and \$11 million in property holdings, he is responsible for fundraising activities, grant acquisitions, annual giving, planned giving, and special events. He was a member of the 1992 NAPH Management Fellows program, in which he completed his individual project entitled "Affiliations in Medical Education: Kansas City Style", in which he explored the relationship between medical education and the public hospital system.

- ♦ **OTIS STORY SR, MHA, MA**, *Chief Operating Officer; University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey - University Hospital*

Otis Story is Chief Operating Officer and in this capacity has accomplished several professional goals for the hospital in terms of cost reduction for their productivity program, and their capital budget review process, as well as developing, and implementing their inpatient renovation project totaling \$6 million.

- ♦ **TONI SAENZ YAFFE, MPA**, *Assistant Director, Health Services, Planning and Development; Los Angeles County Department of Health Services*

Toni Saenz Yaffe manages corporate services in strategic and capital planning, information systems, systems evaluation and contract management. Her responsibilities include managing over 500 staff, annual revenues and expenditures in excess of \$100 million and a capital planning budget in excess of \$2 billion. As a 1992 NAPH Management Fellow, Ms Yaffe completed her independent project entitled "OB Access: Crisis or Opportunity." With activities by the state of California in implementing plans to transition a portion of its Medicaid population to managed care, Ms. Yaffe's role as key contact for the LAC-DHS requires her to provide substantial knowledge, have a better understanding of the issues, and identify ways to shape the implementation of the plan.
