As you know, Randall Rutta wrote to you requesting a meeting of officials from the administration to discuss the Transportation Department's Project Action and USDA's AgrAbility Project. In response, Diana and I met with Chris Tiernan and Randall Rutta of Easter Seals and representatives from each department yesterday to discuss these programs. The meeting was informative, and both projects appear to offer practical, well-coordinated services.

The AgrAbility Project reaches out to farmers who have disabilities -- often as a result of injuries on the job. By providing linkages to disability service organizations and putting people in contact with other farmers who have experienced similar injuries, this program teaches people to continue to work and perform basic, necessary farming tasks.

Project Action identifies people with disabilities and addresses special transportation needs. Following the passage of ADA, the program was expanded to assist transit operators in implementing the law's transportation provisions. Project Action attempts to build partnerships between people with disabilities, advocacy groups, and the transit community in an effort to resolve disputes, avoid legal battles, and identify common ground. This project also has a promising and cost-effective emphasis on training and encouraging persons with disabilities to transition off paratransit and use accessible fixed-route services. Through research, demonstration activities and technical assistance, this project attempts to eliminate barriers to transportation and accessibility and assist in the implementation of the ADA.

Some background material is enclosed for your review along with a brochure on outdoor activities for children with disabilities that Randall asked us to forward to you. The representatives from the Easter Seals Society seemed pleased with the meeting, and Diana and I have additional materials on each project if you are interested.

Project ACTION is funded by the Federal Transit Administration and administered by Easter Seals.

The AgrAbility Project is an innovative USDA Extension Service program that engages cooperative extension services, nonprofit disability organizations, and rural volunteer resources in directly helping thousands of farmers, ranchers, and farm-workers with disabilities and their families to succeed in agricultural production. I have enclosed materials and brief videotapes on both programs.

Project ACTION and AgrAbility translate a modest federal investment (\$2.0 million each in FY 1995) into an array of valuable, practical services that benefit people with disabilities, their families, and their communities. Easter Seals and other disability advocates championed the creation and expansion of these programs to eliminate harmful barriers in transportation and rural employment/independent living. Both programs are essential and unduplicated.

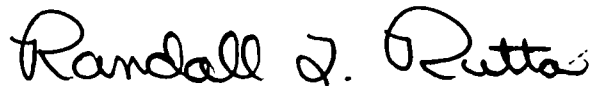
Project ACTION and AgrAbility advance the President's goals for persons with disabilities by promoting productivity, independence and community participation through individual empowerment, public-private partnerships, and volunteerism.
