### Biodata on Current Members

ALBERT L. ANDERSON, D.D.S. - San Diego, California, appointed May, 1984 term expiring May, 1993. Dr. Anderson is retired from a practice of pedodontics in San Diego, California. Prior to this, he was Dental Chief of Staff of the Children's Hospital in San Diego. Dr. Anderson received his B.S. degree from the University of the Redlands and his D.D.S. from the University of Southern California. He has been active for many years in a large number of important civic and political activities. Dr. Anderson and his wife, Jean, are the parents of three children.

KENNETH L. BARUN - Naperville, Illinois, appointed August 1990 term expiring May, 1995. Mr. Barun was appointed President, and CEO of the Ronald McDonald Children's Charities in Oak Brook, Illinois in January 1993.
