Minutes of January 9, 1995 meeting of the National Disability Policy Review Convenors.

The first meeting of the convenors of the National Disability Policy Review (NDPR) was held from 3:15-4:15 in room 211 OEOB and was attended by the following participants:

Carol Rasco, Jeremy Ben-Ami, Bob Williams (HHS), Kate Warren (HHS), Judy Huemann (Educ.), Connie Garner (Educ.), Susan Daniels (SSA), Ken McGill (SSA), Judy Feder (HHS), Lynn Margherio, Lisa Fairhall (OMB), Richard Green (OMB), Diana Fortuna, Liz Savage (DOJ), Elisabeth Cohen.

INTRODUCTION/ REVIEW FOCUS AND DIRECTION:

Carol Rasco, who facilitated the meeting, welcomed convenors, commented on official membership of commissioners on the review team and encouraged work groups to enlist their participation;

Judy Heumann then stressed the challenge of over-arching principles incorporating the various perspectives of the working groups;

NEXT MEETING OF FULL REVIEW TEAM/ AGENCY INFORMATION REQUEST:

* stressed the importance for convenors to meet regularly (at least once before each meeting of full review team (Carol Rasco);

a sample agency information request form was then distributed by Lisa Fairhall; before next full meeting of the team, Lisa and Richard plan to present information thus providing a common starting point; (the group agreed to get comments to Lisa by close of business Wednesday 1/11 - final request form to be sent out with updated work plan and letter from Carol Rasco and Alice Rivlin requesting form completion).

{For the next full meeting of review team we will also presenting the lay of the land/ changing attitudes by bringing in speakers and providing papers either already in existence or drafted by Judy Heumann. The need was also expressed that all review team members be as educated and aware as possible with regard to issues affecting individuals with disabilities}

NEXT STEPS:

Guiding Principles:

* highlighted the importance of giving thought to two issues: 1) how we will get wide spread input from other agencies and the community and how to incorporate this input and 2) whether we intend them to be or not, they will become public and we should be thinking through the consequences of that (Bob Williams).

Adult Employment:

* work group has met and discussed and modified a charter and short-term work plan. Each participant was asked to provide data - no full response at this time. Next meeting scheduled for

Wednesday 1/11; need employment and training side -- working on labor representation at next meeting (Susan Daniels);

School-to-Work:

* highlighted the importance that review principles remain in sync with over-all administration view. Example: cash benefit programs -- helpful for DPC staff to provide information to ensure consistent direction (Judy Heumann);

* balance between cash and in-kind benefits is difficult to discuss when we're not sure what other thinking is taking place (Susan Daniels);

* the group will be meeting next week -- pushing for labor to attend -- will look at data and charter and use Lisa's information request (Judy Heumann);

Accommodations:

* currently looking at accommodations policy developed in Bush administration and adopted by all agencies; will meet by the end of the month to review/ reality check (Liz Savage);

Childhood:

* the short-term agenda will include: IDEA and SSI options; and the long-term agenda will identify broad areas - health, education, income support, data (in terms of what data do we need?), consolidation and streamlining issues; asked each member to take the lead on an issue; meeting with advocacy groups late next week (Judy Feder);

ADVOCACY GROUPS:

Jeremy Ben-Ami expressed an interest in a meeting of convenors and advocacy groups, the timing and list of groups were then discussed; some comments listed below;

* might be wise to have more meat on the bones: data/ clarity/ time line; we are currently meeting with advocacy community to discuss IDEA -- mentioned possibility of sending a letter or an over-view memo (Judy Heumann);

* mentioned the possibility of including advocacy groups in the discussion of the guiding principles amongst the convenors prior to presenting the principles to the full team -- possibly in 3 or 4 weeks? (Carol Rasco and Jeremy Ben-Ami);

* February is more realistic (Bob Williams/ group agreed);

Jeremy Ben-Ami gave an overview of activity on the legislative end including the bi-partisan composition of meetings on the hill. Carol Rasco highlighted the importance of including representatives early.

Group agreed to meet at the end of the week of 1/31 to discuss guiding principles.

Agencies are requested to do the following:

1) Identify each program administered by the agency serving individuals with disabilities. Include all programs that:

- o provide direct Federally administered services or benefits to individuals with disabilities,
- o fund State, local, non-profit or private activities serving or benefitting individuals with disabilities,
- o mandate or regulate (without necessarily providing Federal funds for) State, local, non-profit or private behavior with regard to individuals with disabilities.

2) For each program identified, provide the following information :

- o Agency, Bureau, Account, and Program Title
- o A short description of the program. Include program goals, funding mechanisms, authorized activities, eligibility criteria, and any definitions of disability or other relevant terms (such as "impairment") established in law or regulations. Identify performance measures, if available. Provide title and citations of authorizing statute, and citations for implementing regulations.
- o Type of service or benefit provided:
 - a. cash,
 - b. medical,
 - c. vocational rehabilitation,
 - d. education or training,
 - e. research,
 - f. other (specify)
- o Number and demographics (e.g., age, socioeconomic status) of individuals with disabilities served. If participation of individuals with disabilities is incidental (e.g. health-related research), but significant, provide the proportion of individuals with disabilities served relative to the total population served, if known. (If agency cannot estimate the proportion of individuals with disabilities served, so indicate.) Briefly describe any trends or changes in demographics of populations served, and explain.
- o Budget authority and Outlays for FY 1994, and FY 1995 (estimated), relative to individuals with disabilities served. (If agency cannot estimate the proportion relative to the number of individuals with disabilities served, so indicate, and provide program

totals, or best estimate, with assumptions stated.)

- o Funding provided by non-Federal sources. (Provide break-out by entity.)
- o Nature and periodicity of data collected on services/benefits provided and populations served.
- o Roles of Federal and non-Federal entities in administering the program.
- o Major administrative and/or programmatic issues currently confronting the program.
- o Any other information about the program that would be important for policy decisions. (E.g., key advocacy groups, major Congressional supporters.)

3) Program descriptions, and list of all identified programs, should be provided in hard copy and in Wordperfect format on a diskette. Please keep materials as brief as possible, while responding in all categories.
