National Breast Cancer Coalition

Videotaped remarks on the occasion of
their November 14, 1994 Award Dinner

I regret I am unable to be with you tonight to support the groundbreaking work of the National Breast Cancer Coalition. I have said in the past that the fight against breast cancer is a matter of individual and collective responsibility. This evening's honorees could not exemplify this notion more.

First I would like to congratulate my good friend, Donna Shalala.

A year ago, leaders of the Coalition met with the President at the White House to push for a National Action Plan on Breast Cancer. That umbrella group had collected 2.6 million signatures -- one for every woman in the nation suffering from breast cancer -- calling for a national action plan. Two months later, Donna convened a conference to establish the plan which is today a framework to enhance the delivery of care, the research being done, and the policies being initiated in this fight.

Donna's energy, commitment, and sensitivity have brought us further along on this journey in a shorter time than many of us could have imagined. We are indebted to her for her leadership.

I congratulate Ron Perelman of Revlon for his generosity and wisdom. Ron's and Revlon's support of the UCLA Womens Cancer Research Program, the "Once a Year for a Lifetime" videotape and public relations campaign, and the Coalition's Campaign '93, which led to the gathering of those 2.6 million signatures and the National Action Plan, have reached a standard for corporate leadership which is rarely matched.

And my congratulations go to the survivors and activists, whose tireless efforts and dedication are the fuel for the success of any worthy cause. Thank you, Carol Vance Wall, State Senator Olga Menendez and Andrea McClure.

The President remains committed to the belief that every American deserves health security -- and the fight against breast cancer offers ample evidence of why we must continue to work toward that goal.

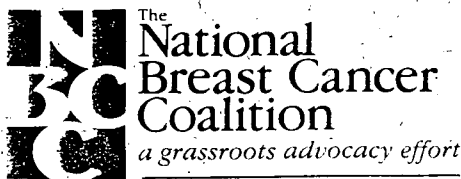
How is reform relevant to breast cancer? For all the wonderful scientific and medical advances being made, there are too many women in this country who can't afford diagnostic services like mammograms and can't afford treatments once a disease is diagnosed.

That's why we must get to a point where every American has coverage, where every American has comprehensive benefits that can never be taken away. We must get to a point where women aren't denied insurance because of a "pre-existing condition" -- namely that they had breast cancer. We must get to a point where every woman at risk is able to take advantage of the technology

we have -- be it mammography or Pap smears or anything else.

Under Fran Visco's leadership, The Coalition's 23 board member organizations in cooperation with thousands of members across the country have worked tirelessly to advocate increased research funding, to promote and provide better diagnostic services, and to increase public awareness. It has been innovative in its grassroots efforts and has forged relationships among scientists and consumers, industry and government to focus on finding a cure for this disease, a disease which spares no one and touches the lives of us all.

My first encounter with the Breast Cancer Coalition was at an emotional meeting two years ago in Williamsburg during the campaign. I am proud that we have come so far in just two years and know that with the Coalition's leadership, innovation and commitment we will go much further still.

Dear Anne,

You will recall that we spoke some time ago about a breast cancer event scheduled for the Fall that the National Breast Cancer Coalition is planning. I sent you a letter on March 3, outlining what was then the plan for this event. I want to update you on our plans and requests and see how we can get this moving through the system.

On Monday, October 17, 1994 at the Hilton Hotel in New York, the Coalition will hold its first gala, a dinner/entertainment/awards event. We ask that the President and Hillary Rodham Clinton act as honorary co-chairs of the dinner and that they participate in the program, in support of the Coalition and its goals.

At present, we plan to honor Ronald Perelman, the CEO of MacAndrews and Forbes, owner of Revlon, for his support for breast cancer research and the Coalition. We have asked Secretary Donna Shalala if she would also agree to be honored for her commitment to the National Action Plan for Breast Cancer. In addition, we will honor three women who have been advocates on this issue.

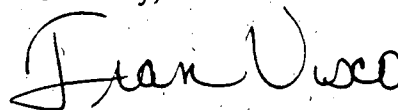

As I mentioned in my last letter, we are working with Lifetime Television, a cable network that focuses on women's issues. Lifetime intends to film the gala program and to air parts of it as a television special several nights later. The program will be a mixture of entertainment and information on breast cancer. Lifetime is working to secure name talent. To date, Sharon Stone has agreed to participate as a co-host. Lifetime plans to "package" this as a Lifetime Achievement Awards Show and intends to give its award to the Coalition.

The dinner itself will be a fundraiser for the National Breast Cancer Coalition - we have a list of possible co-chairs and are now approaching several requesting their participation. To date, Douglas MacCormick, the Chairman of Lifetime Television has agreed to act as one co-chair.

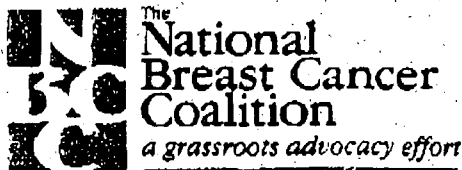

Dear Ann:

You will recall that we spoke briefly about a breast cancer event scheduled for the Fall that we would like Hillary Rodham Clinton to participate in. We are extremely excited about the possibility of this event going forward and of the White House participating.

Lifetime Television is a cable network that focuses on women's issues. In October or November of 1994 it wants to put on a television special that will honor individuals who have contributed to the fight against the breast cancer epidemic. This will be a 90 minute entertainment/educational event in which the audience will learn about breast cancer and about the National Breast Cancer Coalition and its efforts to focus the nation's attention on this issue. The tone will be a mixture of serious/fun/informative. This will be the first time that the entertainment industry will give breast cancer the level of attention it gives many other issues.

The special will be hosted by a high-profile television actress - Lifetime is talking at this time to Candice Bergen - paired with a news personality - such as Barbara Walters - to share hosting responsibilities and to set the tone for the evening. There will be a series of entertainers, both male and female and well-known personalities who have been diagnosed with breast cancer.

The event itself will be held as a gala fundraiser for the Coalition - a dinner and evening of entertainment at the Waldorf in New York. The event will be filmed and shown on Lifetime several days later. At the dinner, the Coalition will present honors. At this time, we envision that our prime honor will go to Ronald Perelman, the CEO of MacAndrews and Forbes, the holding company for Revlon, for his support of the Coalition and of breast cancer research. We are also considering honoring Matilda Cuomo and others for their work on this issue.

The televised portion of the event would also be a fundraiser for the Coalition - there would be an 800 number to call for general information and a 900 number to call to pledge financial support.

Lifetime also plans this as an awards event. It would like to have Mrs. Clinton participate in the event and to present the first award -- named for Virginia Kelly -- to me. While I find it awkward to send this letter since I am the one receiving the award, I don't know how else to get the message to you with the sense of urgency required, since we need to know as soon as possible if this is something Mrs. Clinton would consider.

Much of this is at the rough planning stage and I apologize for the informality of this note, but we are (as usual) behind schedule. Thanks.

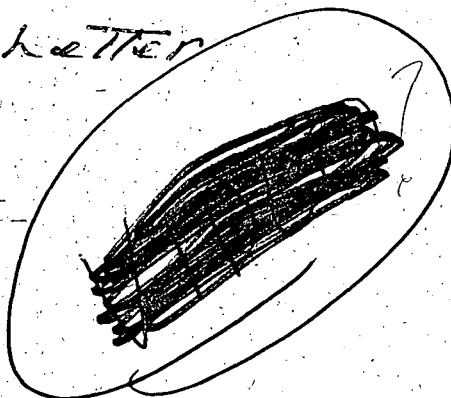

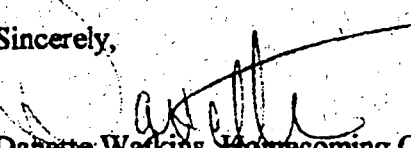

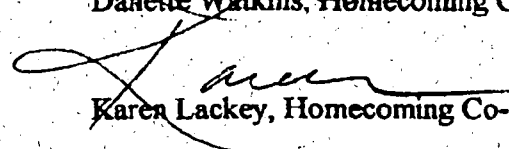
