Thanks for the news that some of the proceeds from the Socks/Buddy book will go to an animal organization. This will make a lot of people (and animals) very happy.

I would suggest talking to Jim Monsma of the Washington Humane Society. He is responsible for the fundraising effort of the shelter here in D.C. I talked to him last year about the possibility of a Socks book and told him Mrs. Clinton had expressed interest in donating some of the proceeds to a shelter. I'm sure he can answer any questions you might have. His number is 202-576-6664.

The Washington Humane Society not only provides shelter, spaying and neutering, and adoptions for animals, they also have an educational program for local schools that teaches children the importance of caring for and treating animals well. Mrs. Clinton can designate which area the money can be used so that it can directly benefit the animals in the shelter or for one of the programs.

Okay, that is my pitch for the Washington Humane Society, which makes sense because the Clintons do live in D.C.

These figures were compiled by Jim Reagan, Assistant Superintendent of the U.S. Postal Service office located in the Old Executive Office Building.

The mail for the Bush Presidency is represented by the figures for the years 1989-1992.

The mail for the Clinton Presidency is represented by the figures for the years 1993-1998.

The mail figures for Socks and Buddy are subsets of the figures for the Clinton Presidency.

Unfortunately, we do not have any figures for mail received by the Bushes's dog, Millie.

The Postal Service can provide figures for mail received by President Bush, Mrs. Bush, President Clinton, and Mrs. Clinton individually. Because that will take some time, please let me know at your earliest convenience if you are seeking that sort of detail.

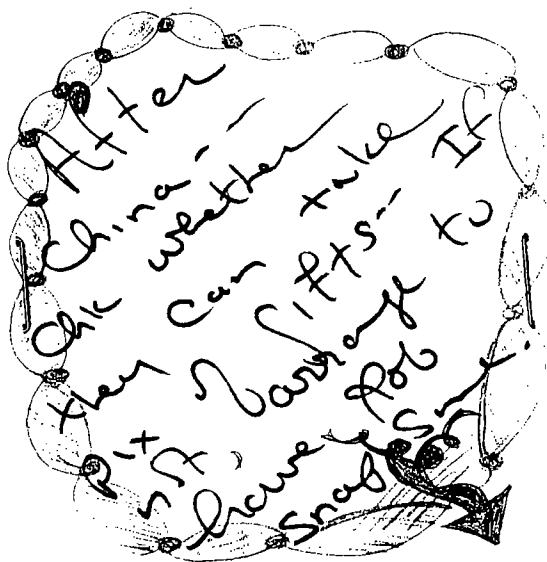

Thanks for taking the time on the phone, last week, to discuss my interest in exploring the possibility of Animal Planet producing a television special involving "Socks" and "Buddy". When I became aware of the book project using letters from kids to the White House pets, with which Mrs. Clinton is involved, I immediately started thinking about a companion television special that might very well serve the interests of the White House, Simon & Schuster, our family oriented cable network, and--most importantly--the viewing public.

The Potential Project

I understand the book is just beginning production and is expected to be released in time for Christmas 1998. Should you be interested, we would have no problem producing a special that could be scheduled to coincide with the release of the book. Keeping in mind that I do not know much about the content of the book, I'm imagining a program that would include letters from kids to "Buddy" and "Socks"--read by the kid's themselves. Questions posed about the First Pets could be answered during the course of the program. Viewers would be fascinated to learn more about the First Pets and what life is like for an animal living at the White House. Perhaps a select group of letter writers could meet the pets at the White House, along with the people who help care for them, and maybe even have a chance to meet The President and First Lady. There are a lot of possibilities we can discuss. And, incidentally, Animal Planet could help solicit letters (for use in the book and the program) by way of on-air spots and our popular web site, along with the many other ways we could help increase awareness of the project.

Who Am I?

A few notes about my own credentials. Included among more than 20 years of producing credits is my extensive experience with productions involving The White House. The best

people to ask about my successful track record would be Chief Usher--Gary Walters, Curator--Betty Monkman, Retired Curator--Rex Scouten or Neal Horstman of the White House Historical Association. I have worked with both President and Mrs. Clinton. They appeared in "WITHIN THESE WALLS: A Visit to the White House", the official history and tour that I produced for the WHHA while I was on staff at public television's WQED in Pittsburgh (right down the hall from Mister Rogers). I also directed President Clinton's live, nationally televised Town Meeting in Pittsburgh during his first campaign. More recently, I coproduced "UPON THESE GROUNDS: Exploring the White House Gardens", a companion to the earlier film, both of which play continuously at the White House Visitors' Center. I also worked with President and Mrs. Bush, on an earlier version of "WITHIN THESE WALLS", which is among the artifacts placed in a time capsule next to the South Portico in commemoration of the 200th Anniversary of The White House. And, I directed a program on teenage drug abuse, "THE CHEMICAL PEOPLE", hosted by Mrs. Reagan. In the summer of 1996 I joined Discovery Networks to head up production for Animal Planet.

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In just over a year, Animal Planet became television's fastest growing cable network, surpassing 40 million homes last month. And we're still growing!

Next Steps

I completely understand the complications involved in producing television at the White House and with The President and First Lady, having been through it several times. Advance planning is key. So, in order to prepare for any upcoming opportunities, I hope we can discuss this matter soon. I would propose a meeting among representatives of Animal Planet, Simon & Schuster and the Office of the First Lady to discuss a potential, mutually beneficial, collaboration. Being right in here in Bethesda, we are available for a meeting at almost any time. I'd love the chance to tell you more about Animal Planet and begin discussions about what I think can be an exciting project!

WHERE THERE'S THE WEB, THERE'S A WAY

When a 1-1/2-year-old collie/malamute mix named Nadas was sentenced to death for allegedly chasing a horse in September 1996, there was a collective cry of outrage within the animal welfare community. How

could they fight the law — Oregon's State Statute 609.155, which mandates a death sentence for canines who chase livestock? One individual willing to engage himself in the battle to save Nadas was Oregon animal activist Bob Schlesinger.

By posting, and then continually updating, Nadas' story on Ark Online, his magazine-format web site dedicat-

ed to animal issues, Schlesinger reached thousands of compassionate citizens who wrote, faxed and called in their concerns to government officials. "At the height of the story, as many as 2,600 people per day were visiting the site," he reports. All this caught the attention of California-based Last Chance for Animals, which helped land spots on TV's "Hard Copy." By February of this year, public pressure was so great that at the last moment, Jackson County officials amended the law — and Nadas was spared!

But Ark Online's editor and publisher hasn't begun to fight — or write. "Other Oregon Dogs on Death Row Desperately Need Your Help!" begins one of the articles that are currently highlighted at <http://www.arkonline.com>. "It isn't over yet," says Schlesinger.

TAKE A HIKE!

Imagine setting off with your backpackin' pooch for the hiking trail — and the first thing you see is the "No Dogs Allowed!" sign.

"Unfortunately, this happens frequently," says Colorado enviro-activist Kent Dannen, who has championed the cause of responsible dog-owning hikers who claim the same right to enjoy the National Park system trails as non-dog owners. To combat what seemed like growing anti-dog sentiment, the take-charge trailblazer went proactive, working with the U.S. Forest Service and the American Dog Owners Association

(ADOA) to develop a set of pocketcards designed to help educate dog owners about the rules of the trail.

"Above all, obey leash regulations — and urge other hikers to do the same!" states Dannen, who hikes regularly with one or more Samoyed pals.

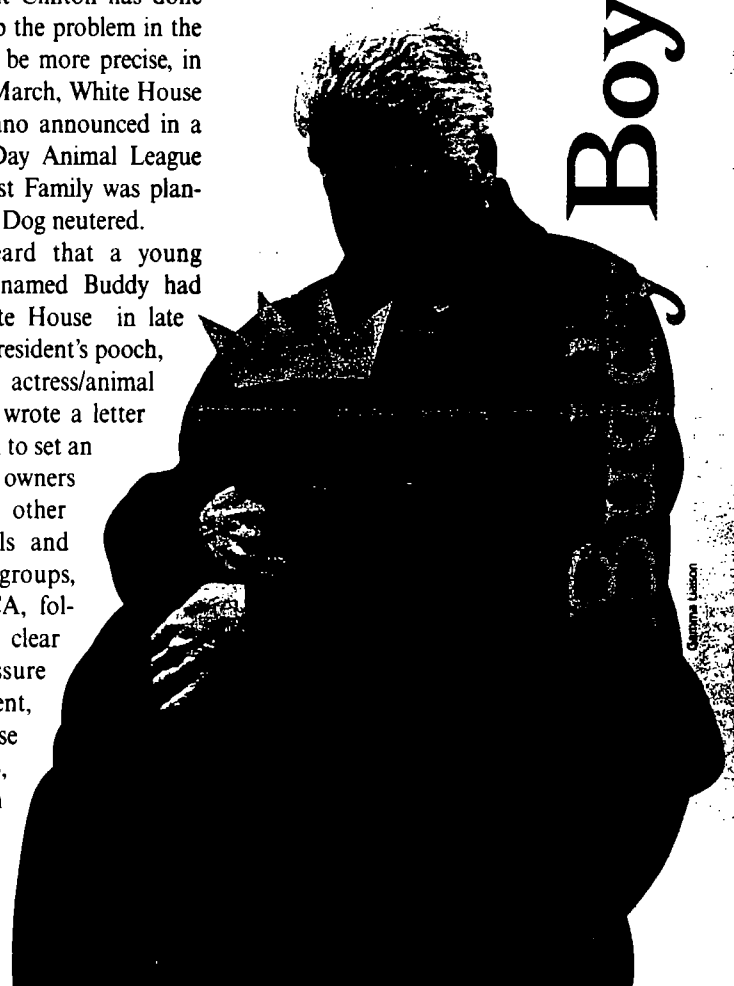
CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

When it comes to pet overpopulation, President Clinton has done his part to nip the problem in the bud — or, to be more precise, in the Bud-dy. In early March, White House doctor Connie Mariano announced in a letter to the Doris Day Animal League (DDAL) that the First Family was planning to have the First Dog neutered.

When DDAL heard that a young chocolate Labrador named Buddy had moved into the White House in late 1997 to serve as the President's pooch, the group's founder, actress/animal advocate Doris Day, wrote a letter to Clinton asking him to set an example for other pet owners by neutering Buddy; other concerned individuals and animal welfare groups, including The ASPCA, followed suit. It is not clear whether public pressure influenced the President, but in a White House briefing on April 24, spokesperson Michael McCurry noted that the Presi-

dent, "believing it the responsible thing to do," had arranged to have Buddy neutered the previous weekend. This is one presidential policy we are glad remained intact!

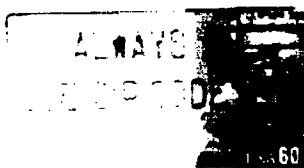

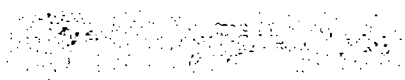

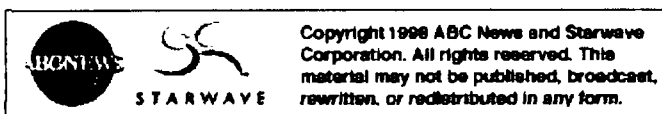

I thought it would be helpful for everyone to have an informal list of the points we'd like to cover at this meeting.

During the first part of the meeting, which Capricia and Robert will attend we need to:

- *Finalize the title for the book.
- *Schedule a photo session for Mrs. Clinton, Socks, and Buddy.

I hope this is helpful, and Jackie and I look forward to seeing everyone tomorrow.

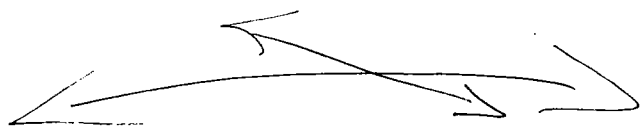

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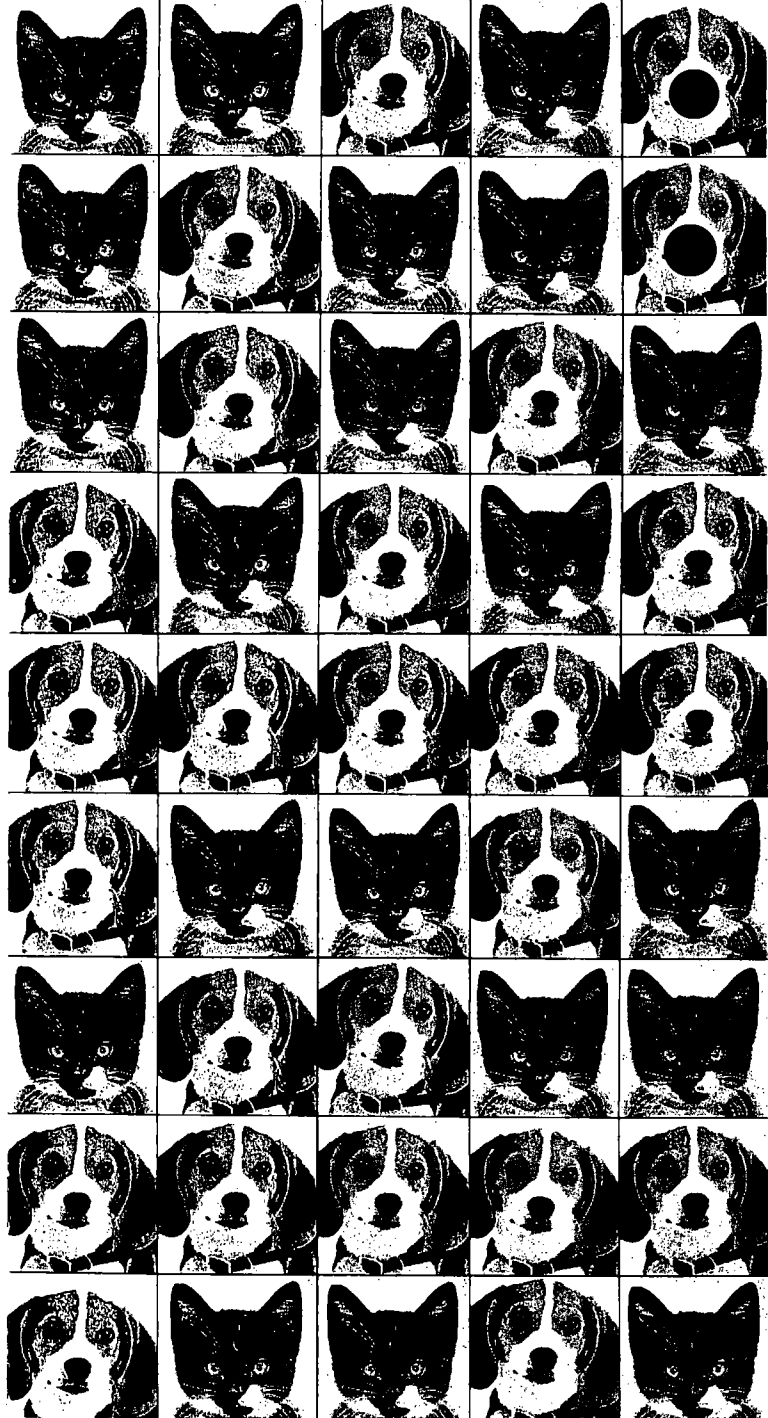

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"I Found A Stray...What Do I Do?"

There's a skinny, scruffy-looking terrier hanging around the restaurant dumpster. His collar is a faded red cotton, possibly with tags. He looks at you. You look at him. Do you hang your head and walk to your car, feeling sad that there are so many strays in the world? Do you get some scraps and try to lure the dog to you? Do you call the nearest animal shelter and wait for someone to show up?

For many caring folks, finding a stray can be a trying experience. No one really *looks forward* to dealing with a bedraggled, unfamiliar waif. Concerns for your safety (or the condition of your car's interior) are pitted against the nagging certainty that you may be this animal's only chance. If you don't help, who will?

When it happens on the way to a meeting, concert, or wedding, the person who gets involved is hoisted (in my book) to near-sainthood. I remember a man who showed up at the shelter on a miserable morning of torrential rain. Dressed to the nines, with a dirty, stinky dog at the end of his belt-now-leash, he had obviously been on his way to some very important job. But he couldn't pass the dog by.

We get many calls from people who don't get involved directly, but simply want to report the fact that a stray is in the area. Often, the stray is perceived as a threat; however, a good number of callers are genuinely concerned about the animal. They just aren't sure how to help.

SHELTER OR STREET?

If there's one universal truth in the animal shelter world, it's this: lots of people are uncomfortable with the idea of sending an animal to a shelter. We continue to hear things like, "Well, at least on the street he has a chance...don't you people just kill them?"

While not all shelters conform to the same high standards, most modern facilities (including ours) are vastly advanced over the "dog pounds" of fifty years ago.

So, let's set the record straight: At WHS shelters, strays are held a *minimum* of five days to give owners a chance to claim them. Unclaimed animals can then be adopted, and we do everything possible to make that happen. The only exception to this rule is made for feral cats (who have no home to return to), aggressive dogs including pit bulls, and extremely sick or injured animals without I.D. tags and for whom no lost report has been filed.

Is it better to let strays "take their chances on the street?" Sure ... if that street is miraculously devoid of traffic, rotting garbage, poison, broken glass, sadistic people, and there are animal rest stops with food, water, shelter and medical care at various points along the way.

Getting a stray off the street means the animal has a chance to return to his home or be adopted into a new one. It's his only real chance.

TO CATCH A STRAY

Our veteran Officer Littlejohn knows a thing or two about this. She can win

She offers him treats (balled-up wads of semi-moist cat food are easy to roll to the stray). While he eats, she loops her leash through its handle into a "noose."



He's eating out of her hand. At the right moment, she might pet him, then the "noose" can be slipped over his head. If he panics, she'll keep talking to him until he calms down and can be walked or carried.
