1. All dogs must be current on distemper and rabies vaccinations.
2. Dog owners are required to clean up after their dogs.
3. Dogs must be kept ON LEASH at all times. No retractable leads, please.
4. The League has the final authority in determining the suitability of any animal to compete.

Disqualifications

1. Overly aggressive behavior by dog.

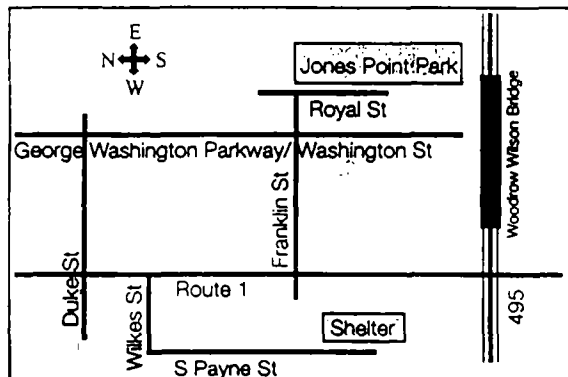

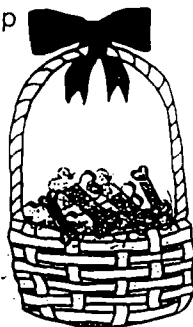

BONE HUNT. You and your dog collect bones together. Finders of the "Bunny Bone" win a special prize. We will have three different bone hunts, based on age groups, going on simultaneously: one will be for 13 years and up, one for 8 years to 12 years and one for kids under 7 years. For safety reasons, and due to feedback from last year's participants, in the 13 years and up bone hunt only the person actually holding the dog's leash can collect bones, although others are welcome to accompany them.

Pet etiquette: Proper behavior in the parks

Our family was in for a lot of adjustments when we got our first dog from the shelter a year ago. The dirt level in the house escalated, we all began getting a lot more exercise, and we found out the hard way the consequences of our new friend eating a Brillo pad. We also became initiated into the covert society of dog owners — an organization we hadn't even known existed.

It's not unlike having your first baby and discovering the underground world of Gymboree and Ruffi. You just had no idea it was there.

Fortunate dogs that live in our area have a myriad of places to roam with their owners. As long as they are on leash, dogs are permitted in almost all parks, with the exception of school grounds and public playgrounds. There are also places specifically designated as dog exercise areas where dogs are allowed off leash to run free. Some of these include particular sections of Founders Park, Jones Point, Fort Ward and Fort Hunt Parks, Chincapien Park, and the grounds of the Masonic Temple.

A complete listing of dog exercise areas can be obtained from the Animal Welfare League of Alexandria. The League strongly recommends that dogs be spayed or neutered before being allowed to romp free, thereby preventing any accidental encounters that produce unplanned puppies.

But there are other measures that a responsible dog owner can take to ensure that his/her dog's experiences with other dogs and people are positive ones.

When meeting another dog on a walk or in the park, ask the other owner if his dog is friendly. If so, allow the dogs to greet with slack leashes. Michelle Beardsley of Cavaliere Canine Professionals stresses that if you hold your dog back on a tight leash, he can feel your apprehension and become aggressive and defensive. Michelle also states the importance of being able to read the body postures of your dog and others in order to anticipate and prevent problems.

A dog that is friendly will have his ears up and tail erect. One that is not friendly will have his ears back and

tail down. Another thing to keep in mind when your dog is in a group of others is pack order. Suzanne Campbell of the Olde Towne School for Dogs says that a dominant dog will have his hackles up and will make direct eye contact with other dogs. Another sign of dominance includes tail flagging — an upward swinging motion — as opposed to wagging, a sideways swing. An obvious sign of dominance is one dog on top of another. Generally, if one dog is dominant and the other submissive, the encounter will probably go smoothly, but if both dogs are exhibiting dominant behavior, it's best to allow plenty of room, and to separate the dogs if necessary. Smaller dogs that feel threatened can display dominant behavior.

"A dog that is aggressive or has been in fights should not be off leash around other dogs," says Campbell. "It's not fair to other dogs and owners."

Before a dog is allowed off leash, even in a designated off leash area, he should be trained to come when called. Most of the dog exercise areas are not fenced, and a dog can get into a potentially dangerous situation or run off. Michelle Beardsley says that a dog should be taught to come using food.

In fact, she says that an owner should "reinforce with food 100 percent of the time for the first six months to ensure reliability." Suzanne Campbell recommends that dogs drag a short leash when roaming free, so that the leash can be grabbed or stepped on if necessary. But what if your dog does happen to get away from you or is heading off toward a road?

"Absolutely do not chase him," says Beardsley. "The dog will think it's a game and continue running. Call him and walk or run in the opposite direction to get him to follow you."

Encounters between dogs and children in the park must also be closely monitored. Parents should never allow children to approach a dog without asking the owner's permission. Dogs are often apprehensive around children because they tend to move quickly, and often raise their hands high above the dog's head, which can be interpreted as threatening. An owner should instruct his dog to sit to greet the child, and the child should be told to gently pet the dog under the chin, which is less intimidating than petting on the head.

Aside from informal time in the parks or on the trail with your dog, there are many activities for dogs and their humans through the Animal Welfare League. Coming up on April 11 is the Third Annual Doggie Bone Hunt and Easter Parade. Dogs and owners can search for Easter bones in three different (people) age groups — under 7 years, 8 to 12 years, and 13 years and up. Other activities that day

will include an egg roll, musical chairs, Bowser's Baseball, a 40-yard dash, and an Easter parade in which dogs and owners will be dressed in their Easter best. The fun starts at 9 a.m. at Jones Point Park.
