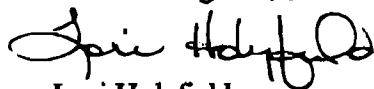

in-four children in the U.S. living in poverty and more than half of them residing in female-headed households.¹⁷ These figures are double that of our neighbor to the north, Canada, and are ten times that of Sweden.¹⁸ As table 2.1 demonstrates, when we combine race, ethnicity, and age, the figures become even more dramatic.

When we consider the youngest of these, we find that among female headed Latino families, 72 percent of children under the age of six live in poverty. For African American children in the same age category, 73 percent of those in female headed households remain in poverty.¹⁹ Poverty in our country is hardly a random event. Yet, when we search for causes, we find ourselves tangled in the rhetoric of individualism.
