Advancing Women's Economic Security

Today more than ever, women work outside the home and make important contributions to the economic security of their families. Yet, women can face significant challenges -- they are more likely to rely on minimum wage work; they too often are paid less than men for the same work; they often have difficulty gaining access to credit to start small businesses; and, while they live longer than men, they reach retirement with smaller pensions and other assets.

As First Lady, Hillary Rodham Clinton has championed efforts to help women address these economic security challenges. She has given her voice to expanding opportunities for women, such as increasing access to microcredit, which are small loans made to non-traditional borrowers and have enabled thousands of American women start their own businesses. Mrs. Clinton also has pressed for increases in the minimum wage, for strong equal pay laws and for legal services for low-income families. In addition, Mrs. Clinton continues to participate in the Social Security reform debate, focusing her attention on ensuring that the features of Social Security that are important to women are preserved and strengthened.

Addressing the Needs of Children and Youth

The First Lady believes that ^{children should have the chance to} we all have a stake in ensuring that America's children reach their full potentials. As First Lady, Mrs. Clinton has been a tireless champion for children, particularly ^{those who are} our nation's most vulnerable children. ^{For example} As the Administration's chief advocate on foster care and adoption, Mrs. Clinton has worked to improve the lives of the nearly 500,000 children who live in foster care because of abuse or neglect. She has promoted adoption for children living in foster care and worked for the passage of landmark legislation, the Adoption and Safe Families Act of 1997, which reformed our nation's child welfare system and put children's health and safety first. ^② In addition, Mrs. Clinton has taken a special interest in educating Americans about the importance of children's earliest experiences to their later development and success. ^① In 1997, she hosted the *White House Conference on Early Childhood Development and Learning: What New Research on the Brain Tells Us About Our Youngest Children*. ^{She also} Also, Mrs. Clinton launched the Prescription for Reading partnership, a growing effort in which pediatricians "prescribe" reading to new parents as an activity that will enhance their children's development. Mrs. Clinton has also focused her attention on our nation's young people. She helped to create and promote Americorps, in which young people perform national service and earn a stipend for college education. Mrs. Clinton has also focused her attention on addressing factors that place our nation's young people at risk of drugs, teen pregnancy, and getting into trouble. She helped to launch the *National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy* and hosted the *White House Conference on School Safety: Preventing School Safety*.

Mrs. Clinton has long believed that while parents have the primary responsibility for raising their children, everyone has a role to play in helping them to achieve their full potentials. She has used her voice as First Lady to challenge all Americans to recognize and meet our responsibilities to America's children.

First Lady Hillary Rodham Clinton Domestic Policy Accomplishments

Since taking on the role of First Lady, Mrs. Clinton has made the concerns of America's families her top priority. To advance these issues, she has traveled across the country, spoken out about key concerns, and convened national leaders. She has been an advocate and strategist within the Administration on domestic policy. She has also highlighted issues in her syndicated column, *Talking It Over*. Some of Mrs. Clinton's most important contributions include:

Children and families

Early childhood development: Promoted children's healthy development in the earliest years of life by co-hosting the White House Conference on Early Childhood Development and speaking widely about recent developments in early brain development research. Worked for Head Start quality improvements and successfully advocated for increased funding for programs serving young children.

Child care: Co-hosted the White House Conference on Child Care and played a leading role in the development and championing of the President's Child Care Initiative. Was a major proponent of the 1993 Family and Medical Leave Act.

Child welfare and adoption: Served as major administration champion on adoption and foster care improvement through the development of the Adoption 2002 Initiative, the Adoption and Safe Families Act of 1997, and by speaking widely to encourage adoption and improvement of the child welfare system.

Youth: Successfully advocated for increased funding for after-school programs, participated in the White House Conference on School Violence, and spoke in support of national service throughout the country.

Children's television: Hosted a White House Conference on Children's Television, advocated for increased educational children's programming, and led a roundtable discussion with the President and Vice President on the V-Chip.

Education

Charter schools: Supports innovation in the public schools and advocates for the support of charter schools, including securing funding for DC Charter Schools.

School reform: Worked on behalf of the President's education agenda, visiting schools around the country in support of public school improvement.

Prescription for Reading: Launched the "Prescription for Reading" project to link health professionals with book publishers as a means to encourage reading to young children.

Arts education: Hosted Arts Education Call to Action at the White House. Launched President's Council on Arts and Humanities report *Coming Up Taller* on arts programs for at-risk youth and sponsored the Coming Up Taller awards at the White House.

Family economic security

Bankruptcy: Worked to ensure that bankruptcy reform legislation does not adversely impact child support collection.

Minimum wage: Strongly supported an increase in the minimum wage to ensure that working families do not raise their children in poverty.

Legal services: Works to provide low-income people with access to legal resources while preventing cuts in the Legal Services Corporation budget.

Microenterprise: To help low-income people become self-supporting, promoted expansion of microenterprise in the United States.

Women

Women's rights/history: Participated in numerous events to celebrate women's history and promote equal rights for women.

Family planning: Worked with the National Campaign to Prevent Teen Pregnancy to support a broad-based effort. Called for budget increases for family planning and supported legislation to require federal employee health plans to cover prescription contraceptives.

Working Women Count: Helped launch "Working Women Count!" to bring the concerns of working women to the forefront of policy development in the Administration.

Health

Universal health coverage: Chaired President's Task Force on Health Care Reform and played a continuing leadership role in support of universal health coverage. Advocated for the Kennedy-Kassebaum Portability legislation to extend hospital stays for new mothers.

Children's health: Opposed cuts in Medicaid, worked on behalf of the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and donated proceeds from *It Takes a Village* to children's hospitals.

Immunizations: Launched a Childhood Immunization Initiative and secured passage of the Vaccines for Children program. Spoke widely on the importance of children's immunization.

Tobacco: Advocated for comprehensive, national tobacco legislation and campaigned for California's tobacco tax ballot initiative.

Breast cancer: Launched the Medicare Mammography campaign and advocated to extend hospital stays for mastectomy patients. Promoted research and awareness of breast cancer through numerous events and columns.

Gulf war illnesses: Visited VA and Department of Defense hospitals, listening to veterans concerns. Worked to establish the Presidential Advisory Committee on Gulf War Veterans Illnesses and participated in events relating to the Committee's work.

AIDS: Promoted increased funding for AIDS research and prevention. Played a leadership role in pediatric aids, including work to encourage pregnant women to get tested and treated for HIV.

Disease Prevention and research: Advocated for Medicare preventive benefits and for increases in research budgets, including funding for epilepsy research. Worked to raise awareness of colon and ovarian cancer and to call attention to dramatic increases in asthma among children.
