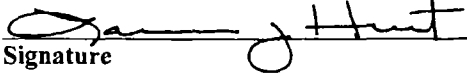

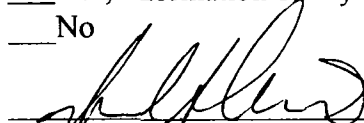

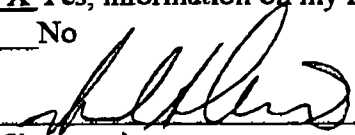

Session Title: Closing the Gap: How Can We Provide Positive Opportunities for All Teenagers?

Session Moderator: The Honorable Alexis Herman, Secretary of Labor

Thank you, Madame Secretary.

This White House Conference represents an important departure from the many other youth conferences. Our focus is less on how to control or reduce deficits and problems—the theme of most policy dialogues—but is on the other side of the coin. And that is how to promote successful, competent, and vibrant youth. In so doing, we more readily recognize that key actors in healthy adolescent development include families and their communities.

And as we focus in this session on America's most vulnerable youth, the shift is even more significant. It has become too commonplace to view vulnerable youth and their families and communities as problems to be managed or controlled. Strategies rooted in this belief are doomed to failure. I celebrate the fact that we can focus today on vulnerable youth and vulnerable communities as resources to be nourished.

My role in this session is to provide a framework for exploring innovative strategies for nourishing successful adolescent development and to apply this framework to the lives of vulnerable youth.

My colleagues and I at Search Institute in Minneapolis have devoted the past decade to framing a taxonomy of developmental building blocks, each of which serves as a powerful ingredient for positive health outcomes. These 40 developmental assets are rooted in the social sciences and designed to serve as a kind of script for mobilizing the developmental power inherent in relationships and social institutions.

Our research on this taxonomy of assets—conducted in hundreds of urban, suburban, and rural settings—powerfully demonstrates that these assets are cumulative or additive. That is, the more the better for predicting positive adolescent outcomes. And this powerful relationship holds across race, ethnicity, gender, and family income.

We use the asset framework to help communities frame long-term initiatives with an accent on unleashing the asset-building capacity of adult relationships, peer relationships, family, school, neighborhood, youth organizations, and faith communities.

In extrapolating to the most vulnerable in our cities, I offer several recommendations based on our research and theory for nourishing these developmental strengths.

The first two are perspective setting and are stated to counteract too-common stereotypes:

- All youth, including all so-called vulnerable youth, possess some of these assets. Two few, for certain, but there is a base of strength on which to build.
- In the most troubled communities there are people, places, and programs which already build developmental assets. Any work we do in vulnerable communities ought to begin with finding, celebrating, and empowering these strength-building resources.

In addition, I offer several overarching strategies for asset building with and for vulnerable youth:

- Place high priority on helping parents, guardians, and caregivers to know, understand, and utilize their capacity to nourish developmental assets.
- Transform the settings and places where vulnerable youth spend time—school, neighborhood, place of work, playground, youth organizations, public services. Each of these settings easily becomes an alienating place for vulnerable youth. Or equally likely, these settings may actually exacerbate vulnerability. I know that each of these places and settings has considerable capacity to become asset-building environments. The transformation requires new financial resources.
- Grow, support and sustain developmentally and culturally sensitive out-of-school programs.
- In unleashing the asset-building capacity of places, programs, and settings, think first about relationships. That is, the most viable strategy for raising engaged and connected youth is to guarantee that each benefits from several (if not many) adults who show up often, long-term, and with real intent to be friend, mentor, ally, and resource.

There are panelists and other experts here today who can open our eyes to innovations that build the developmental strengths among vulnerable youth. I look forward to hearing their wisdom on how this nation can mobilize to close the gap.

It's More Than Just a Game

Great people are those who make others feel that they, too, can become great.

Mark Twain

I recently had the opportunity to participate in the White House Conference on Teenagers sponsored by the President and Mrs. Clinton. As I listened throughout the day to recognized experts speak on the social, physical and psychological development of teenagers and the developmental needs of young adults, I couldn't help but relate their comments to my own personal experiences. A common theme became evident regarding the need for positive role models, programs that provide opportunities for participation and the impact a significant adult (other than parents) can have in the lives of kids. In so many ways, what we do in the coaching arena plays a critical role in the development of youth. It is more than just a game in which we are involved.

My soccer involvement began when I entered high school. My exposure to the game prior to that time was essentially zero. As I look back to those years, it was indeed my coaches that had the greatest impact on my life; individuals that took the time to listen, to celebrate successes and share setbacks. They had the gift of making us feel that we could become great.

One of the requirements of being on the varsity soccer team at my high school in Evanston, Illinois was to commit time as a volunteer youth coach. At the time, all the players were convinced that this was just the coach's way of being sure his program would continue to thrive when we graduated. As I reflect back on this strategy of community service through athletics, it was in reality a way for us as high school players to connect with younger players as positive role models. We in a sense became mentors to a younger generation, an experience that was good for us and beneficial to the younger players.

Athletics does provide opportunities for participation, an important developmental asset for youth. Research does show that young adults involved in three or more hours per week of school or community sports programs tend to do better in school and are less likely to be involved in self-defeating behaviors. In addition, involvement in athletic programs, such as soccer, also allows players opportunities for decision-making, conflict resolution and enhancement of self-esteem.

As coaches we all spend a great deal of time studying tactics, assessing how to improve our programs and implementing new strategies to make our teams more competitive on the field, all worthwhile endeavors and essential ingredients for successful programs. It is, however, the role we play as a significant adult in the life of a teenager, as a mentor and role model that may actually have the greatest influence on our players. All young people need the support of adults and the community to be successful. While it is crucial to pay special attention to those youth that have the least (economically or emotionally),

recent studies show that nearly all adolescents need (and want) more support than they currently have. As soccer coaches, we can continue to help fill the gap.

Youth make up only 24% of our population, but they are 100% of our future. They are our most valuable resource, as asset we cannot afford to waste. Thank you for making a difference in their lives through the sport of soccer.

This program trains teens to act as role models and teachers for younger students and gives teens the opportunity to lead discussions and lessons that teach tolerance, dealing with conflict, fairness, and other peer issues.

Teens play teaching role in Syosset 3rd grade classes

Synosset High School's peer educators this year have a new mission that they take seriously: helping 3rd graders with their social skills.

Teams of six 9th and 10th graders camp out in the district's 3rd grade classrooms, lesson plans in hand. They help the younger students tackle issues such as making friends, dealing with bullies and working out conflicts.

Each 45-minute session starts out with a class game or activity to break the ice. A lesson is introduced with a skit, a story or role-playing session. Later the students break into smaller groups for discussion, then reconvene as a class to summarize the lesson.

"It's really amazing how they look up to us," the high school students told

school officials. "We've really made a strong impression on the kids and they love having us. We've even had parents of the 3rd graders meet us and tell us how much their child enjoyed our visit." The teams all visit the same class each time and the teens say happily that the younger kids ask them by name to come back.

The high school students receive training in communication skills, sensitivity, rapport-building, lesson-planning, teamwork and problem-solving before they serve as peer educators for the youngsters. Based on the success of the program in its inaugural year, school officials predict the program will continue in the future.

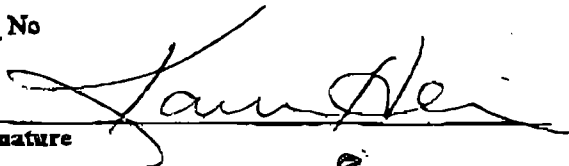
