BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation creates the opportunity for young people to understand the world and translate that understanding into positive actions. This public Foundation, a non-profit 501(c)(3), was formed April 1998 to promote tolerance for differences, respect for others and the empowerment of students through education and community service.

Gerda Weissmann Klein's story as told in her autobiography, All But My Life, is the basis for the HBO documentary, One Survivor Remembers, which won an Oscar, Emmy, and two Cable Ace Awards in 1996. The story of Kurt Klein and his family was featured on the award-winning PBS special, America and the Holocaust: Deceit and Indifference, part of the *American Experience* series. Together, the Kleins represent the finest values and ideals for all mankind. Their special story has been the basis for their life's work and they have chosen to share it with the world.

Gerda, as a survivor of the Holocaust, and Kurt as her liberator, have used their experiences as a catalyst for helping to preserve the memory of the Holocaust and to draw on the lessons learned from that dark period of history. It is their hope that this message will contribute to the alleviation of the world's ills. Gerda Klein's autobiography, her HBO video, and Kurt Klein's PBS documentary, along with their personal speaking engagements, are important tools for remembering the past.

Our world today may be different from that which Gerda and Kurt faced as young adults; however, many of the same issues confront us today. All of us recognize the increasing violence in our schools, the lack of tolerance for diversity, and the loss of respect for personal differences. In particular, the murders at Columbine High School in Colorado and the shootings at the Jewish Community Center in Los Angeles, California indicate the depth of intolerance that continues to unfold amongst our nation's youth as well as our adult population.

Many of us wonder how to make the world a more positive place for us and for our children. The Kleins help us answer this question through the telling of their story and the projects they have undertaken on behalf of others, particularly those which enable young people to feel empowered. It is evident that the future of our communities rests in the hands of our children.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation was formed to promote education, to teach tolerance, to lessen prejudice and discrimination and to encourage community service focusing on local hunger relief.

FOUNDATION PROGRAMS

The first project for the Foundation was designed to preserve the message of Gerda and Kurt Klein for future generations, as well as to fulfill the following goals by:

- Creating a program imparting Gerda and Kurt's message of tolerance and acceptance that would have an emotional and educational impact on middle and high school students.
- Making the program available to every middle and high school classroom in the country.
- Designing and implementing a student driven hunger relief community service project to partner with the educational program
- Educating teachers to the easy use of the educational program and the community service project.
- Evaluating the impact of the tolerance education program and community service project on student behavior.
- Providing a new vehicle for the continuity of Holocaust education which will continue into the 21st century.

The initial project involved the development of two interrelated program packages—the *Tolerance Promotion and Education Program* and the *National Community Service Program*. The *Tolerance Promotion and Education Program* involved preparing and distributing to public and private schools throughout the country materials and programs explaining the Holocaust, utilizing them for educational purposes related to history, and raising moral and spiritual questions that impact on contemporary issues.

The *National Community Service Project* component is being designed and begun for students viewing the educational programming. This was created so that the knowledge gained by the students would be translated into meaningful, positive actions. **The concept of pairing the teaching of tolerance with the performing of community service directed toward hunger relief is totally unique.**

Tolerance Promotion and Education Program

To achieve the initial goals a five part series for national educational television entitled, "Memories, Voices and Choices: Lessons Learned from the Holocaust and Global Genocide" was created and broadcast late Spring 1999. Gerda and Kurt Klein were the hosts of these live interactive broadcasts involving students, faculty and educators. Books and curriculum materials were provided to approximately one million students and teachers in the viewing audiences.

The Foundation was responsible for bringing together MCET (Massachusetts Corporation for Educational Telecommunications—a non profit corporation); Michael Berenbaum, President and CEO of the Survivors of the SHOAH Visual History Foundation; The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum; Anti-Defamation League, New England Region; Indiana Academy at Ball State University; Center on Hunger and Poverty, Tufts University; Adelman Reisboard Consultants; and Gerda and Kurt Klein as partners in the development of this five-part series. A description of the program series from MCET's official spring program guide is included with the Foundation's proposal.

To assess the impact of the series on its more than one million viewers, the Foundation is in the process of conducting follow-up interviews with faculty and students. To date, the reaction of students and faculty shows how the program format and subject matter touched the depth of their souls. A teacher from an inner city school in Washington, D.C. mentioned that not one of her students, prior to preparing for the series using the curriculum materials, had any knowledge about the Holocaust or its impact on the world. Those same students had tears in their eyes as they viewed the sessions and asked questions such as, "Is there anything happening today, like in Kosovo, that reminds you of what happened when you were a young girl?"

The students from a Hudson High School Civics class in Massachusetts wrote, "Your stories and memories that you shared with us about the Holocaust were perhaps the most powerful words that any of us had ever heard. The things that you tell people and feelings that you express through interviews, documentaries, and in your autobiography, will surely aid in the fight to ensure that what happened during the Holocaust will never happen again." The students felt empowered by Gerda and Kurt Klein's strong belief in their ability to help guide the future—a future filled with greater acceptance and understanding of others.

Next Steps for Tolerance Promotion and Education Program

The creation of a permanent educational video for the *Tolerance Promotion and Education Program* with the Kleins' story and message of understanding has been completed; however, the work of the Foundation for the program has just begun. The first phase of the initial program for the Foundation unfolded even more rapidly than the original time line had projected, and reached a larger student audience than the creators of the program had envisioned. Seed money, raised from a private foundation and a few donors, funded this first phase.

MCET has already committed to rebroadcasting the programs during the fall of 1999. We estimate that over one million more middle and high school students will participate in the five part educational series, "Memories, Voices and Choices." Additional dollars are necessary to supply books and curriculum materials for the series' rebroadcast as well as the ongoing staff costs necessary to conduct a formal evaluation of the content and the impact of the series on the students and faculty. The results of such an evaluation process are reflected in the resource materials and support services for the future broadcasts of "Memories, Voices and Choices."

A major goal for the Foundation is to make this educational series available to every middle and high school classroom in the country. In order to begin to fulfill this goal, additional staff time needs to be devoted to developing new partnerships as well as using existing partnerships to position "Memories, Voices and Choices" before additional student viewing audiences. This particular phase of development is labor intensive requiring many small meetings, discussions and phone conferences to enable various partners to envision how working together will enhance the impact of the unique concept of tolerance education and hunger relief community service. The Foundation is in discussions with McDougal Littell, Future Farmers of America, End Hunger Network (media professionals who have joined together to address hunger relief) and PBS about the best way to reach more students with the Kleins' message of tolerance and understanding.

National Community Service Program

By promoting the message of tolerance, the educational series designed for the *Tolerance Promotion and Education Program* helps students learn from the past, and teaches the importance of assuming responsibility for others. It is not enough just to learn about tolerance. To encourage students to take action as they assume this responsibility, the Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation is establishing the National Community Service Program (NCSP) to enable students in communities across America to play a role in ending the scourge of hunger. A copy of the program is attached to this proposal. It is Gerda Klein's greatest wish, "that no child should ever know the hunger she once knew."

In this country, more than 13 million children live in households that are hungry or food insecure. Even with the stronger economy of today, more people are using food pantries for assistance. Thirty five percent of the clients served by emergency food programs are children. Michelle Larson, a 12 year old whose mother has been out of work for several months and can only afford to feed her family one meal a day, says "When I'm hungry, I feel like I'm dying. I eat ice because it fills me up with water....." What better way for students to demonstrate what they have learned from the series "Memories, Voices, and Choices" than by assuming the responsibility for hungry children like Michelle. By participating in the educational series and the community service project, students will be able to address some of the needs of hungry children in their community.

Students have already demonstrated this kind of response. After taking part in the educational series, "Memories, Voices and Choices," students are highly motivated to act upon what they have learned. Students attending Upper Darby High School in Pennsylvania, for example, felt the need to organize their own project for hunger relief by collecting can goods and non-perishable food for a neighborhood family—a mother and five children left destitute.

The NCSP is key to helping students translate their newly learned understanding of tolerance into actions as they integrate their learning with community service. The hands-on activity of feeding hungry children, knowing more about the needs of hungry children and advocating for hungry children establishes the connection between tolerance education and the need to assume responsibility for others. The unique concept of combining tolerance education with community service focused on hunger relief through the National Community Service Program impacts how this generation of students will think and act as the adult leaders of the future.

Next Steps for National Community Service Program

The NCSP was unveiled as part of the package sent to each participating school in the first showing (April 1999) of the educational series. To properly implement the community service program focused on hunger relief, the following activities must be organized and initiated:

- Volunteering in a community soup kitchen or participating in a food drive
- Quantifying the needs of hungry children in the local community
- Advocating for hunger relief programs with local legislators

Staff needs to be in place to guarantee that these activities are occurring in each school in order for the students to realize the maximum benefits of the NCSP. Most classroom teachers, with their already overcrowded schedules, barely have enough time to prepare their students for the educational series using the Foundation's curriculum materials let alone be responsible for the implementation of the community service program. The Foundation needs to provide that additional support necessary to monitor and supervise the program through the use of coordinators. Coordinators, trained and hired by the Foundation, will be assigned to various schools and/or student organizations to oversee the implementation of the NCSP.

Two coordinators will be necessary to begin phasing in an implementation program for the NCSP. During the first year one coordinator will work with only 5 schools to develop the most effective process to maximize the effects of the NCSP on the students as well as the best use of the teachers' and faculties' limited time. This coordinator will work closely with the classroom teacher or advisor on each step of the NCSP program. The second coordinator will do more general support of a larger number of schools and/or student organizations. This will involve an exchange of volunteer hunger relief projects, evaluation activities exchange, and advocacy program exchange. This second coordinator will act as a resource for a large number of schools rather than being intensely involved with the teachers and faculty of a limited number of schools. The two coordinators will require a clerical support person to help correlate written resource materials and communications with the schools.

After one year of experience working with the NCSP, the coordinators, foundation staff and the Kleins will be able to further define and simplify the implementation of the NCSP. This will insure that the program is teacher friendly but will yield the same powerful results of helping students, who have participated in the educational series, "Memories, Voices and Choices," assume responsibility for others by focusing on hunger relief in their local community.

- Arranged for resource materials and curriculum guides from The U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, to be given to all schools viewing the five-part series.
- Partnered with J. Larry Brown, Director of Center on Hunger and Poverty at Tufts University to develop the concepts for the National Community Service Project (NCSP) dealing with children that are hungry in each of their communities (copy of the NCSP program is attached to this proposal)

PLANNED PROGRAM EXPANSION

The Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation will fulfill its mission of reaching today's youth to teach tolerance for individual differences and to encourage their participation in community service to help end hunger in their communities through the expansion of the Foundation's two inter-related programs, the *Tolerance Promotion and Education Program* and the *National Community Services Program*. Both programs will expand existing projects as well as develop new and exciting projects to continue the Foundation's mission as follows:

Tolerance Promotion and Education Program

- National marketing and broadcast of the five-part program with updates reflecting contemporary human rights issues
- Design tolerance education curriculum to be used with the five-part program
- Organize a series of "parlor meetings" to raise awareness of the Foundation's mission to generate funds to continue the programs.
- Partner with BellSouth and Georgia Public Broadcasting to develop a program for high school students at the Carter Center with President Carter, Representative John Lewis and Gerda Klein discussing tolerance and human rights, past present and future.
- Development of a project using The Blue Rose, a book written by Gerda Klein about a special needs child, as another vehicle for teaching understanding of individual differences.
- Translation into Spanish of Promise of a New Spring, a children's book about the Holocaust, emphasizing the teaching of tolerance for distribution in countries where Spanish is spoken.
- Publish EPOH, a story about a child with cancer, written by Gerda Klein. Design an educational program using this story to teach acceptance of those who are ill.
- Development of videos and CD ROM recordings, to be used to distribute The Blue Rose, Promise of A New Spring and EPOH.

National Community Service Program (NCSP)

- Establish the community service program focusing on hunger relief in each of the new schools participating in the educational series.
- Develop hunger curriculum to be used with the community service program
- Partner with organizations associated with prominent individuals in the entertainment industry interested in eradicating hunger to organize an event to launch the NCSP targeted for the Fall of 2000.
- Develop follow up programs to highlight student accomplishments in working toward ending hunger in their communities.
- Launch a hunger relief community service program to complement the educational program developed with BellSouth and Georgia Public Broadcasting
- Partner with Future Farmers of America (half million high school members) to promote the NCSP.
- Develop communication materials and vehicles like Web site and student publications to share information about student driven hunger relief programs, student advocacy efforts, etc.

- Design mentoring program to match prominent individuals interested in hunger relief with students and student organizations participating in the NCSP.
- Organize a march of one million students to Washington, D.C. to advocate support for our nation's hungry children as a culminating event in the Spring of 2001.

CHALLENGE AND OPPORTUNITY

The Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation offers an opportunity for young people to make their world better through personal responsibility, tolerance education, and community service to end hunger. Events of the past year have emphasized the lack of tolerance in our country and have indicated the urgency to reach as many students as possible. Children care deeply about the future and often feel frustrated by school violence, intolerance, poverty and hunger. The Foundation believes that our youth can help to make the world better now, and need not wait to reach adulthood before having the opportunity to do so.

Through the example of the Kleins—Gerda as a survivor of the Holocaust and Kurt as her liberator—young people can help to free the world of prejudice by assuming responsibility for its betterment today. The combination of the tolerance education programming with the hunger relief community service program offers the best opportunity for us to help shape this generation's behavior toward one another. By promoting youth community service to end domestic hunger, the Gerda and Kurt Klein Foundation is an investment in American youngsters, our nation and a more caring world.

I am looking forward to discussing the issues of teenagers on May 2nd. For many years I have worked in the non-profit and government arena in New York City and nationally. Also, I was Chair of the National Youth Employment Coalition. Presently, I am Executive Director/CEO of the YWCA of the City of New York.

I am writing this note to let you know of a new effort of the YWCA-NYC: The Center for Girls.

The goal of the Center and the girls' programs is to influence public policy, advocacy, and legislation; to provide technical assistance and encourage professional development; and, of course, to provide direct services.

As part of the Center for Girls, we have started a symposium series to highlight the professional development needs of individuals who work with girls in after-school programs, schools, churches and synagogues, community based organizations, camps, etc. Thus far in the series we have highlighted Penny Colman, author of "Girls- A History of Growing Up Female In America" and Debra Zimmerman, Executive Director, Women Make Movies, who showed clips of films made by women about girls around the world. This was followed by Girls Wellbeing: Issues Related to Physical and Mental Health. On May 25, 2000 the symposium topic will be GirlTech: The Impact of Technology and Internet on Girls' Lives. The technology theme will extend to other symposiums in the fall, we will also look at issues relating to girls from immigrant families growing up in New York City. This current planning is only the tip of the iceberg. We are working closely with many other non-profit organizations in New York City to publicize and support the ground swell of concern that so many feel about the minimal attention given to girls issues.

As we planned the Center for Girls, we reviewed the literature about girls and conducted many focus groups around these issues. The attached information struck us as most dramatic. If it would be helpful for you to use this information on May 2nd, please do so.

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Information Related to Girls Development

- ◆ Teenage girls are twice as likely as boys to become depressed during adolescence; with depression rates as high as 30%. (Barbara Littman, *Everyday Ways to Raise Smart, Strong, Confident Girls*).
- ◆ When girls and boys are asked if they would like to become a member of the opposite sex, boys almost universally say no. In contrast, girls react favorably to the possibility, citing many advantages. (Barbara Littman, *Everyday Ways to Raise Smart, Strong, Confident Girls*)
- ◆ Girls and Women account for nine in ten cases of eating disorders, which have the highest mortality rate of all psychiatric disorders. (The National Council Research for Women)
- ◆ 80% of fourth-grade girls say they are dieting (National Organization for Women).

Information Related to Girls' Education and School Environment

- ◆ In an analysis of high-school history textbooks, researchers Myra and David Sadker found that less than 3 percent of some books referred to women, others less than 2 percent, the extra texts were described as "inclusive" by the publishers. (Barbara Littman, *Everyday Ways to Raise Smart, Strong, Confident Girls*)
- ◆ In a national study of over 1,600 students, the American Association of University Women found 85% of girls surveyed said they had experienced sexual harassment in school.

New York City Specifics – Information Related to Girls' Education and Environment

- ◆ In New York City schools, girls consistently scored below boys in math and science tests. In reading tests, they outscored boys in grades 2 through 8 and then slipped behind in scores during 9th and 10th grade. (The New York Women's Foundation)
- ◆ According to The New York Women's Foundation, New York City demographics portray a disturbing and unhealthy environment for girls aged 9-15, showing that teenage girls in the city live in poverty far too often and that more than half of all children in female-headed households live in poverty.

Demonstrate the Need for Greater Amount of Girls-Specific Programming In New York City

- ◆ A survey of New York City youth programs revealed a tremendous need for positive development programs for New York City girls. Of the 75 program respondents, only 10 had girls-only programs. Of the 67 programs that served girls as well as boys in their programs, only 23% of the total program participants were girls. (Academy for Educational Development)

- ◆ Of more than 100,000 girls served by surveyed programs, approximately 1,100 girls (1%) were served in girls-only programs. (Academy for Educational Development)
- ◆ Of the surveyed agencies, two-thirds did nothing special to recruit girls to their programs. (Academy of Educational Development)
- ◆ Children spend less than 20% of their waking hours in school. (National Institute on Out-of-School Time)

Demonstrate the Benefits of a Girls-Specific Programming Focus

- ◆ In 1970 only 1 in 27 high school girls played varsity sports, and female college athletes received less than \$100,000 in athletic scholarships. In the 1990's 1 in 3 high school girls play varsity sports and female college athletes received \$1,790,000 in athletic scholarships.
- ◆ Every woman who has won a Nobel Prize in science, except one, attended an all-girls school at some point in her academic career. Students at all-girls schools take math and science classes at double national average. (*The Girls Pages*, Charlotte Milholland)
- ◆ Resiliency studies of adults from high-risk backgrounds who went on to be successful as adults identify the support and unconditional acceptance of a caring adult as a critical factor in that success:
 - Girls who have a Big Sister are 46% less likely than their peers to start using illegal drugs; minority participants are 72% less likely.
 - Girls who have a Big Sister are 27% less likely to start drinking; minority participants are 50% less likely.
 - Girls who have Big Sisters are 84% less likely to skip a day of school.
(The Carnegie Council on Adolescent Development)
- ◆ A recent report from the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports show that participating in sports can help girls develop stronger bodies and minds. For example:
 - Girls who engage in athletics develop more self-confidence and high self-esteem, as well as a more positive body image. They are also more likely to take on leadership roles in other areas of their lives.
 - Physically active girls show fewer signs of depression, anxiety, and other symptoms of stress.
 - Girls who play sports perform better in school, are less likely to drop out, have higher standardized test scores, and are more likely to attend college.

Demonstrate the Need for Providing Girls with the Resources and Information Necessary to Acquire Skills and Make Life Decisions for Today's Economy

- 90% of women will have to take care of themselves economically at some point in their lives. (Syracuse University)
- According to an employment data summary by Girls Count, 90% of today's kindergartners will be employed in jobs that do not exist today.
- The number of women and minorities in the workforce is rising and expected to continue rising -by the year 2000, only 15% of the incoming workforce is expected to consist of white men. (US Department of Labor)

Demonstrates a Need for Educating the Community about Girls Issues

- Among women philanthropists over the age of 53, 72% saw women and girls as a high priority for funding; among women aged 35-53, 55% did; and among women aged 22-35, the figure was only 32%. (National Council for Research on Women)

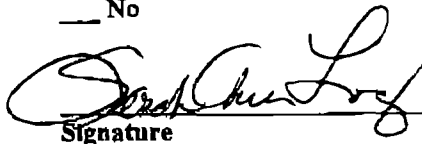

ALA Washington Office Report

Kids are our future. It's obvious, isn't it? The children of today are the adults of tomorrow and they will fill all the roles we fill. If we care about the viability of our society, we have a vested interest in making sure that tomorrow's adults and tomorrow's leaders are caring and well educated. Wouldn't we hope also that each generation would improve upon the previous one?

Serving America's children is one of our strong suits as librarians. The Benton Foundation produced a 1996 report on public libraries, "Buildings, Books & Bytes." When a Foundation survey asked participants to rank library services, the responses ranked services to children highest. "Eighty-three percent of those queried rated them as very important. More than half of adult Americans (54 percent) took their children to the library at least once or twice a month and families with children were particularly strong library supporters."

There are two pieces of legislation pending in Washington that would help librarians serve children. First is the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This legislation is expiring and needs to be renewed. A small portion of the Act concerns school libraries. Representative Major Owens (D-NY) and Senator Jack Reed (D-RI) have been our champions. They have introduced legislation (HB 3008, SB 1262) that would earmark money for school libraries for books, materials and other library services needs. These Federal dollars for school libraries are essential. In Illinois a recent survey showed that average copyright dates in non-fiction in school libraries around the state were over 20 years old. In other school library situations, the money might be used for computers or whatever is needed to bring school libraries up to a high level of intelligence

The tragedy in Columbine, Colorado focused nationwide attention on teenagers and how they spend their leisure time. At the White House Conference on Teenagers, the need for caring adults in the life of young people was underscored. Many libraries offer after school programs. For example, the Earle A. Rainwater Memorial Library in Childersburg, Alabama provides a work-study program in the library to show teens that they can overcome adversities through educational activities such as book discussions presented in partnership with the Childersburg Housing Authority. This is a simple program; many variations on the theme are offered in other libraries around the country.

Representative Xavier Becerra (D-CA) has drafted legislation titled the "Reading Enrichment After School Development Act" (READ), that would expand the 21st Century Community Learning Center (CCLC) program to include public libraries. The CCLC, a Clinton Administration initiative, was created to address the lack of after school programs for many students. This innovative legislation would provide seed money for libraries to develop after-school programs for students for reading, computer use, and access to a broad range of informational material, such as the Internet, for educational purposes.

We have two needs – improved school libraries and after school programs for children and young adults; we have three bills with a champion for each of them. Now your work is needed in these areas. Make sure your Federal legislators sign on to these initiatives. If they are reluctant, make efforts to educate them about the importance of school libraries and the importance of what libraries in your community do for children after school. Several years ago, when Mary Summerville was President of the American Library Association, her theme was "Kids Can't Wait". Mary's theme still resonates. Work in these areas and do your part so libraries can help kids greet the future better prepared than we were.

White House Conference Experience – May 2, 2000

It was my great honor and privilege to be invited by President and Mrs. Clinton to the White House Conference on Teenagers: "Raising Responsible and Resourceful Youth". The conference was held on Tuesday, May 2, 2000 and included parents, teens, policy makers and other experts—about 200 people in all. A short video was shown which featured vignettes of teenagers and parents from various parts of the country. The purpose of the video was to serve as a snapshot of teens today.

The conference officially began to the tune of "Hail to the Chief." President and Mrs. Clinton walked into the room accompanied by the parents and children who had been featured in the video. Mrs. Clinton began the conference by noting that it is hard to be a teenager today. Teens say this and parents say they worried about their teenagers. Mrs. Clinton tied the White Conference and teenagers back to the 1997 White House Conference on early learning and childhood development. She said that both conferences aimed to underscore some of the common misconceptions that parents have about their children and offer strategies for raising responsible and resourceful youth.

Mrs. Clinton talked about a new task force on "Navigating the New Media Age", a public/private effort for parents and teens to find resources through the media to help parents monitor teens use of media. (See www.parentingresources.ncjrs.org) for more information.) Within the next 6 months a single Internet site providing one-stop information for all media ratings and labels will be established. The portal will also point to other non-commercial teenager friendly Internet resources. Mrs. Clinton highlighted the YMCA survey on teen-parent communications released at this event. (See <http://www.ymca.net/> for a precis) Findings were that the vast majority of teens still turn to their parents in times of trouble but also that parents and teens have different views on ways they interact and even on the topics of their conversation.

President Clinton was the next speaker. He said, "Everybody has a story. Everybody has a spark inside. Everybody needs a chance." He also said that the most important work of society is raising children. He talked about the need for parents to balance their family life with their worklife, with special attention to the importance of family meals together. He mentioned various government programs that are aimed at helping parents raise healthy responsible children.

Ben Casey, president of the YMCA of Metropolitan Dallas delivered the keynote address. Mr. Casey's remarks were followed by two panels. The first panel addressed, "Who are today's teens and what do they need" and the second panel was concerned with, "What can parents do to help teens and what can communities do to help teens and parents." Mrs. Clinton offered closing remarks. After that there was a buffet lunch and then breakout sessions. I attended the breakout session on "The Village: How can the community better support parents and teenagers?"

Here's a summary of what I learned:

The news is positive. Most teenagers grow into healthy, responsible productive adults. High school enrollment is high today and more teens are volunteering. Harmful behaviors including drug use are on the decline. But the stories that grab the headlines are the stories of tragedies such as Columbine High School and Fort Worth. The numbers of organizations devoted to helping children and teenagers is impressive and there are many good stories about their successes. But these stories of organizational success or the stories of individual teenage success are not generally told. Part of the conference included several impressive teenagers whose record of accomplishments, often against significant odds, belie their young years.

But, drug use and teenage pregnancy are still too high. Violence, especially gun violence, is a fact of life for many teenagers. One panelist reported that the highest volume of violence is the first hour after school. These are issues worthy of our concern.

Steps toward solution

Parents are a big part of what teenagers need. In the YMCA study, it was clear that while many parents believe they are discussing issues such as sex, violence, and drug and alcohol abuse with their children, that children have a different perception. For example, 61% of parents say they talk frequently to their children about values and beliefs but only 41% of children report such conversations. While families share an average of 80 minutes together each day, young teenagers expressed a desire for more time with parents. One-quarter of all parents report eating no more than four meals a week with their teens. Education and family time were the top teenage concerns according to the poll. Parents worried about alcohol abuse.

“It takes a Village”, the title of Mrs. Clinton’s 1996 book was mentioned several times as an approach to the solution. In other words, parents are just part of the answer for teenagers. Other communication channels that are important include communication between parents and school officials, dialogue among community institutions serving this age group, opportunities for kids to tell their own stories, and the role of other adults in the community, especially employers of teenagers. One speaker pointed out that four out of five teens work while they are in school and that employers often become their most significant mentors.

Another thread that ran throughout the conference was the efficacy of teen volunteer programs, sometimes called service learning or community services. One speaker pointed out that teenagers in learning to be adults, need the opportunity to practice adult roles. In the past, in the more rural economy, there were “chores”. Chores meant that you had a responsibility, that you mattered, and that your existence was important to the family. Speaker after speaker underscored that idea, saying that young people wanted opportunities to work and to contribute. They want to give back. They are not interested in what was described as “herd programs”, in which everything is done for the teen and they are just observers—in a herd. They want a menu of choices and they want to be active and to have a planning or leadership role.

Other speakers pointed out that whether it is in paid employment, volunteer work or participating in an after school program, there are possibilities for people other than PARENTS to have an influence on young people. After schools opportunities are where civic lessons take place. It's where teenagers spread their wings and fly for the first time as adults.

Followups for AIA and for Libraries and Librarians

Throughout the day, I never had a chance to talk. There was no one else from the library community participating and no one said the "L word. This made me very sad. So many libraries are doing such good things for teenagers after school. I know of excellent after school library programs that involve and are meaningful to young people. How is it that in a meeting of 200 people concerned about this issue, and 25 speakers, no one mentioned libraries? Once again the only answers I can think of are: (a) often we are not at the table and (b) whatever we are doing, we don't tell our story very well.

Public libraries and libraries in schools, community colleges and other institutions of higher education are often the central point geographically for teenagers. Librarians need to be involved in more networking, more partnerships, and more leadership roles in solving community problems for young people. It's time for librarians to step up and convene all the possible groups who care about teenagers in the community. Go around the circle and let each group say what they are doing. Do an inventory of what's available and, at the least, help publicize each other's offerings.

Several government programs were mentioned at the conference that sounded like they were perfect for library participation. One concerned "Community Coaches." The Association for National Service will be awarding \$5 million in grants to place a "community coach" in nearly 1,000 schools. Community Coaches, AmeriCorps members, teachers and counselors help students make the most of their community services and can act as a vital link between the schools, the

business sector and the local community. This initiative is modeled after the "Do Something" initiative which is already supporting Community Coaches in 100 schools in 75 communities across the country. Who and where are these coaches and do they know anything about libraries in their community?

The new Federal budget also includes \$7.5 million for America's Promise, Colin Powell's national crusade to help all children grow into healthy, strong and productive adults. Are libraries working with General Powell at the local level? At the national level I have made some efforts to link with America's Promise but haven't received a response. I should try again.

As a participant in the conference I learned about a number of government and organizational websites of interest to teenagers. For example the President announced a new website for teenagers, www.americasteens.gov which is a gateway to Federal and other publicly supported websites for teens. The site was developed by 17 Federal agencies and cuts across a variety of government departments. Are libraries studiously collecting web addresses and building gateways and portals of information aimed at teenagers? YALSA's "Teen Hoopla," www.ala.org/teenhoopla is certainly a good beginning.

The structure of the panels interested me. The panelists sat at the front of the room with Mrs. Clinton. There were approximately 5 people on each panel. Some read their remarks, others spoke more extemporaneously. Interspersed among the panelists were people in the audience who were called upon by pre-arrangement. In our materials, there was biographical information on the panelists as well as these audience participants.

Two of the most surprising panelists were Danny DeVito and his wife Rhea Pearlman. They are spokespersons for the After School Alliance, a Los Angeles based group that aims to offer after school programming for every child in the community by 2010. Yes, Danny DeVito is really funny, even in talking about a serious subject. He reported on talking to his own children, three teenagers.

He described a talk with his son as "uptalk." Apparently the youngster ends every sentence with his voice slightly up. Danny said he reckoned his son was afraid he would be cut off and would not be listened to if his sentences sounded like he was finished. An interesting observation, I thought. Rhea Pearlman spoke passionately about the LA program.

After lunch, the breakout sessions were held in the White House Conference Center which is a house about two blocks away. We were walked over by various aides. My breakout session was co-chaired by Deputy Attorney General Eric Holder and Representative Ellen Tauscher (D-CA). There were five panelists in my breakout session and 17 other participants. I folded remarks from this session into my observations earlier in this report. I suppose that the purpose of breakout sessions was to give everyone a chance to speak. The session was scheduled to conclude at 5:00 and but the panelists were still speaking at 4:30 when I left. If I had to criticize anything, I guess it would be that the people who spoke were those who did so by prearrangement.

In conclusion I would note that the White House is a pretty formal place but one does have a sense of being in a home. It doesn't have a strongly institutional feel. It's rather homey, but also rather opulent. The ceilings are very high, the Oriental rugs are very real. The oil portraits are mostly of famous Americans. I was thrilled to be included.
