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- A follow-up report that will synthesize the research, recommendations, and practical suggestions raised.
- The "Time with Your Teens" campaign announced at the conference which the Work and Families Institute and National Partnership for Women and Families have agreed to head. Together these groups are looking for resources and partners to assist in educating parents, employers, and other adults in the community about the importance of making time for teens, as well as innovative ways employers can help parents of teenagers balance their work and family responsibilities.
- The Navigating the New Media Task Force, also announced at the conference, will be meeting in the near future to begin working on creating and improving media tools for parents and teenagers.
- Convenings being organized by several of our agency partners, including the Department of Education's conference on High School Reform (June 14 to 16) and the Corporation for National Service's Youth Summit (June 22 to 25).
- Building a coalition to focus on how we can work to improve afterschool opportunities for middle and high school students. The Conference highlighted the clear need for more engaging activities for young people in the afterschool hours and highlighted the fact that few resources are focused on providing such opportunities. We will call a meeting in the next few weeks to explore how we can continue to educate the public on this issue and work together to provide greater after school opportunities for older youth.

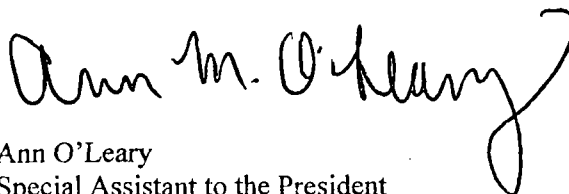
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We hope you found the conference to be worthwhile and hope that you will join us in our efforts to ensure that this event has a lasting positive impact.
