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## **SAMHSA WORKS TO STEM THE SPREAD OF HIV/AIDS**

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) is the Federal Public Health Service Agency with a Congressional mandate to promote advances in the prevention and treatment of mental and addictive disorders through a grantmaking portfolio totalling more than \$2 billion.

Ensuring that all prevention and treatment services are accessible to and appropriate for all Americans, particularly those who are disproportionately affected by HIV/AIDS, is key to the SAMHSA mission.

### **SAMHSA RESOURCES FOR HIV/AIDS PREVENTION**

SAMHSA HIV/AIDS programs are coordinated through the Agency's Office on AIDS (Contact Barbara Garcia, Associate Administrator for AIDS, 301-443-5305). The annual grantmaking capacity for HIV/AIDS-specific services totals \$24.2 million. In addition, each of SAMHSA's three Centers -- Center for Substance Abuse Prevention, Center for Substance Abuse Treatment and Center for Mental Health Services -- invests substantial resources in other programs that also address the needs of individuals with or at high risk for HIV/AIDS.

#### **Center for Substance Abuse Treatment**

- ◆ **HIV/AIDS Community Outreach Program** funds projects targeting injecting and other high risk substance abusers and their sexual partners. Trained outreach workers access this hard to reach population and provide HIV/STD/tuberculosis risk reduction education and facilitate treatment referrals. Funds do not support direct substance abuse treatment. In FY 1995, \$7.5 million will support new projects and competitive renewals. The initial cycle is expiring (33 projects in 14 States, D.C., and Puerto Rico).
- ◆ **CSAT/BPHC Linkage Initiative** is a collaborative effort with the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) that provides funding for programs to develop comprehensive service demonstration models that link substance abuse treatment with HIV/AIDS/STD/tuberculosis, mental health and primary care services. Projects provide an array of services, including infectious disease screening and treatment, HIV/AIDS counseling, primary health care, outpatient addiction counseling, and family/collateral counseling. In FY 1995, \$7.8 million will support continuation of 18 projects in 10 States and D.C.

◆ **AIDS Training Grants** help education and training programs for health care professionals to modify curricula and strengthen the training opportunities in comprehensive care for people with or at risk for substance abuse, mental illness and infectious disease including HIV/AIDS and tuberculosis. The impact of these problems on racial and ethnic minorities is a special focus. In FY 1995, \$2.8 million supports continuing projects.

◆ **Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant:** States with AIDS case rates of 10 or more per 100,000 are required to set-aside 2% to 5% of their allotment, for early intervention services for HIV disease. FY 1995, Resources Not Yet Reported.

◆ **AIDS Health Care Worker Training** supports the education of mental health and other health care providers on the psychological and neuropsychiatric impact of HIV/AIDS. The program is being reannounced in FY 1995, with 5 to 6 new awards expected.

◆ **HIV/AIDS Mental Health Services Demonstration Program** is a collaborative effort between SAMHSA, NIH, and HRSA. Cooperative agreements are awarded competitively for programs to develop or expand mental health services for people with HIV/AIDS, or experiencing serious psychological reactions as a result of HIV/AIDS antibody testing. In FY 1995, combined funds totalling \$4.5 million support continuation of 11 services projects and one coordinating center.

◆ **High Risk Youth** grants are being supplemented to expand substance abuse prevention efforts to include HIV/AIDS prevention. In FY 1995, \$1 million supports 20 new awards. Program plans include possible expansion, with a concentrated focus on adolescent females.

## SAMHSA PROGRAMS WITH INDIRECT HIV/AIDS RESOURCES

### Center for Substance Abuse Treatment

- ◆ **Target Cities** funds a full range of substance abuse treatment and related services in the U.S. cities most affected by substance abuse. To make services more effectively and timely and to move substance abuse services into the mainstream of primary care, strategies to keep patients in treatment and reduce the likelihood of relapse, as well as efforts to recruit and maintain quality staff, are a focus. Central intake, assessment and referral systems are mandatory program components. Several programs provide HIV/AIDS prevention education, testing, counseling and medical care.
- ◆ **Addiction Treatment Training Grant Program** are awarded to State and local governments, hospitals, schools of medicine and osteopathic medicine, nursing, social work, and graduate programs in marriage and family therapy to increase the number of qualified addiction treatment providers. Training must include diagnostic and treatment issues related to HIV/AIDS and other infectious diseases.
- ◆ **Rural, Remote and Culturally Distinct Populations** supports communities in creating alcohol and other drug treatment services appropriate for their own rural, remote or culturally distinct location. Outpatient detoxification, treatment and maintenance services, case management, and HIV/AIDS, STD and tuberculosis screening, counseling and treatment are emphasized.
- ◆ **Residential Treatment for Pregnant/Postpartum Women & Residential Treatment for Women and Their Children** these service and demonstration programs support comprehensive residential services for pregnant and parenting women, including education, counseling and care for HIV/AIDS for both the women in treatment and their children.
- ◆ **Treatment Improvement Protocols (TIPs)** manuals delineate substance abuse treatment standards of treatment for pregnant women, criminal offenders, and juveniles, among others. Each was developed by a non-Federal consensus panel and includes information regarding HIV/AIDS prevention and services.

One TIP about to be published, *Treatment for HIV-Infected Alcohol and Other Drug Abusers*, includes guidelines for the spectrum of core services and treatment approaches that should be available to all HIV-infected substance abusers.
- ◆ **Criminal Justice (Incarcerated and Non-incarcerated)** grants support partnerships to develop and expand prison-, jail- and community-based substance abuse treatment services for adult and juvenile offenders. Services include screening, testing, referral, and treatment services for HIV/AIDS.

- ◆ **Critical Populations** grants support a range of services, including HIV/AIDS prevention, education and health services, to adolescents, racial and ethnic minorities, and residents of public housing.
- ◆ **National Capital Area Demonstration Project** is a model treatment program currently under development in Washington, D.C. Central intake and referral services will be established and residential treatment and aftercare enhanced. Primary medical care and specialized HIV/AIDS services -- counseling and testing, prevention education, and prophylactic medications -- are key components. Program evaluation will explore the optimal duration of residential treatment and the relative efficacy of enhanced and standard outpatient services.
- ◆ **Treatment Campus** cooperative agreements with States expand treatment capacity, improve treatment quality and act as a real-world laboratory for service innovations. Primary medical care and HIV/AIDS prevention education, testing and counseling are central to the campus concept, which brings together between six and eight health and human service providers in a common facility. Central intake, patient assessment, referral, and program evaluation are on-site. Providers are autonomous. The target patient population for each campus is 350.

- ◆ **Homeless Demonstration Projects** support outreach, diagnosis, assessment and referral to treatment for homeless persons with serious mental illness. These projects identify patients with substance abuse disorders that place them at high risk for HIV/AIDS.

- ◆ **National Prevention Training System** teaches people who have access to populations at special risk for alcohol and other drug problems how to use that access to prevent both substance abuse and HIV/AIDS. Specialized curriculum is being developed for CSAP's Community Partnership Program to address HIV/AIDS and focus on the specific cultural and ethnic issues of affected communities.
- ◆ **National Clearinghouse for Alcohol and Drug Information (NCADI)** distributes education materials, including monographs that describe HIV/AIDS prevention in adolescents and minority communities. A manual on HIV/AIDS in the workplace is also available through NCADI, 1-800-729-6686, English and Spanish.

◆ **Conference Grants** support conferences on alcohol and other drug abuse prevention, treatment, and other relevant issues, such as HIV/AIDS. *If qualitative capacity*

◆ **High Risk Youth Program** provides for outreach and support of community-based organizations which work with a broad range of youth "at risk". In addition to the HIV/AIDS supplements discussed under Direct Activities, this program focuses on support of general self-esteem enhancement, and empowerment activities. Specific attention is given to the prevention of HIV transmission in a new adolescent female module.

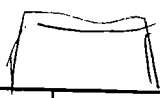
