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ACTION ITEMS FOR STATE DEPARTMENT AS SET OUT IN THE
U.S. INTERNATIONAL STRATEGY ON HIV/AIDS

AREA I: Promote More Active Involvement on HIV/AIDS Issues by National Governments.

Goal: Persuade other governments to do more nationally and globally to stem the spread of HIV/AIDS and to mitigate its impact.

Action step: Overseas posts will communicate the major objectives of the U.S. International Strategy on HIV/AIDS to appropriate host country officials.

AREA II: Enhance U.S. Participation on HIV/AIDS Issues Internationally.

Goal: Address HIV/AIDS in all appropriate international fora.

Action step: Department will ensure that the major tenets of the U.S. International Strategy on HIV/AIDS are promoted in relevant international meetings of the U.N. and other bodies.

Action step: Department will convene interagency meetings to discuss the international calendar and to develop cohesive approaches on HIV/AIDS issues.

Goal: Assist U.S. agencies in improving responsiveness to a range of HIV/AIDS-related issues.

Action step: Department will address the issue of the spread of HIV/AIDS in international peacekeeping and humanitarian missions.

Action step: Department will explore possibilities for closer collaboration with MDBs as a means of stemming the spread of HIV/AIDS.

AREA III: Enhance Awareness of Implications of HIV/AIDS.

Goal: Heighten awareness of Congress as to implications of global HIV/AIDS on U.S. foreign policy.

Action step: The State Department will convey to Congress the implications of global HIV/AIDS for U.S. foreign policy initiatives. At the same time, the State Department will support biomedical research and international prevention efforts as means reducing potential impact.

Goal: Heighten awareness within the U.S. foreign service community and other U.S. agencies of the foreign policy implications of global HIV/AIDS.

Action step: Department will distribute the U.S. International Strategy on HIV/AIDS to embassy personnel.

Action step: Department will use all available mechanisms, including formal training sessions and individual briefings for foreign service personnel, to discuss HIV/AIDS as a U.S. foreign policy concern.

Action step: Department will work with U.S.-based international businesses to gain a better understanding of the economic impact of global HIV/AIDS on U.S. business.

Action step: Department will continue to include HIV/AIDS-related discrimination and human rights abuses in regular embassy reporting.

AREA IV: Support U.S. technical agencies.

Goal: Support U.S. technical agencies in fulfilling the international HIV/AIDS objectives as appropriate to their individual agency mandates.

Action step: Department will assist USG agencies as necessary in strengthening or establishing international research and training collaborations and in gaining approval for HIV/AIDS vaccine trials and other research efforts.
