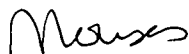
...people like us are not supposed to have Congressional dinners.

Dear Colleague,

Who speaks for you? Who speaks for your community? The answer should be you.

We need you to join us in Washington. We need you to stand with us to claim your place at the table. Now more than ever, we need the new Congress to hear the voices of people on the front lines of this epidemic. Join us May 22-23, 1995 for **Our Place At the Table**.

This spring Congress is considering several issues that will have lasting impact on our communities. The Ryan White CARE legislation is up for reauthorization (S 641), Senator Kassebaum (R-KS) has a bill (S 142) to block grant CDC money to the states, Rep. Ackerman (D-NY) has introduced the Newborn Infant HIV Notification Act (HR 1289), the Surgeon General's nomination will be reviewed, HOPWA, FDA and the Office of AIDS Research are under attack, and we are fighting '95 budget rescissions while monitoring the '96 appropriations process.

Join us for two critical days in Washington. The challenges posed by the ideology embodied in the Contract with America will be the central focus of this year's Our Place At The Table. The conference is designed to explore advocacy and grassroots organizing strategies. On May 22 we will hold briefings on all the above issues and then some. The briefings are to prepare you to meet with your Congressional delegation. On May 23 we will visit the hill. We want you to meet with members of your Congressional delegation or their legislative/health aides.

On the evening of May 22, we will hold our Congressional Dinner at The National Press Club, 529 14th St., NW. This annual dinner brings together people on the front lines with members of Congress.

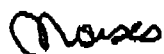

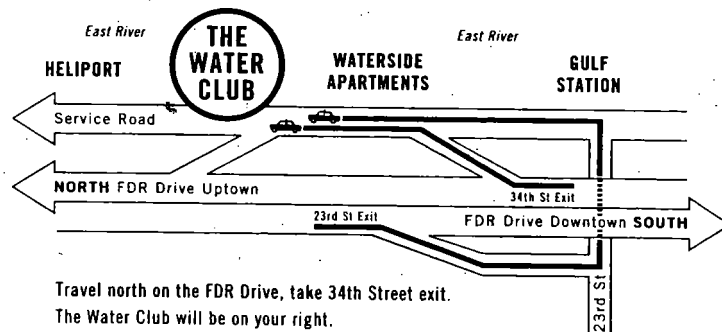

Greg Louganis

Three-time Olympic competitor and winner of four gold medals, Greg Louganis is considered the most accomplished diver of all time. A participant in the 1994 Gay Games, he helped organize a public protest of the scheduling of the 1996 Summer Olympics in Cobb County, GA, a county that had adopted an anti-gay resolution. This brought him to the forefront of activism in the lesbian and gay community. Mr. Louganis's autobiography, *Breaking the Surface*, addresses the difficulties he faced as a gay youth and his commitment to helping instill self-esteem and opportunity in today's gay and lesbian youth.

Patricia Fleming

National AIDS Policy Director since August 1994, Ms. Fleming has helped to refocus the Office of National AIDS Policy, developing plans for staffing, budget, and interdepartmental relations. Throughout her 21-year career in government, she has been at the center of the national battles against poverty and discrimination. For nearly 10 years she has been a central figure in the effort to respond to the critical challenges posed by the HIV/AIDS epidemic, impacting significantly on the health of children and youth.

Mr. Skovgaard is an attorney in private practice in New York City and co-chair of the Board at Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund. Mr. Skovgaard represented HMI Board member Bill Hibsher and his late partner Bill Johnson in their successful suit against TransWorld Airlines for its failure to make frequent flyer miles available to same sex couples. Last fall Marc and Barry celebrated fifteen years together; their commitment to each other and to the lesbian and gay community makes them role models for today's youth.

Virginia Apuzzo

Executive Director of the National Gay Task Force from 1982 to 1985. Ms. Apuzzo made great strides in the fight to increase AIDS funding and was instrumental in the development of projects to combat anti-gay violence. During her tenure at the National Gay Task Force, social security benefits were secured for people with AIDS and the first AIDS hotline was established. Until recently Ms. Apuzzo was President of the New York State Civil Service Commission and Commissioner of the New York State Department of Civil Service.

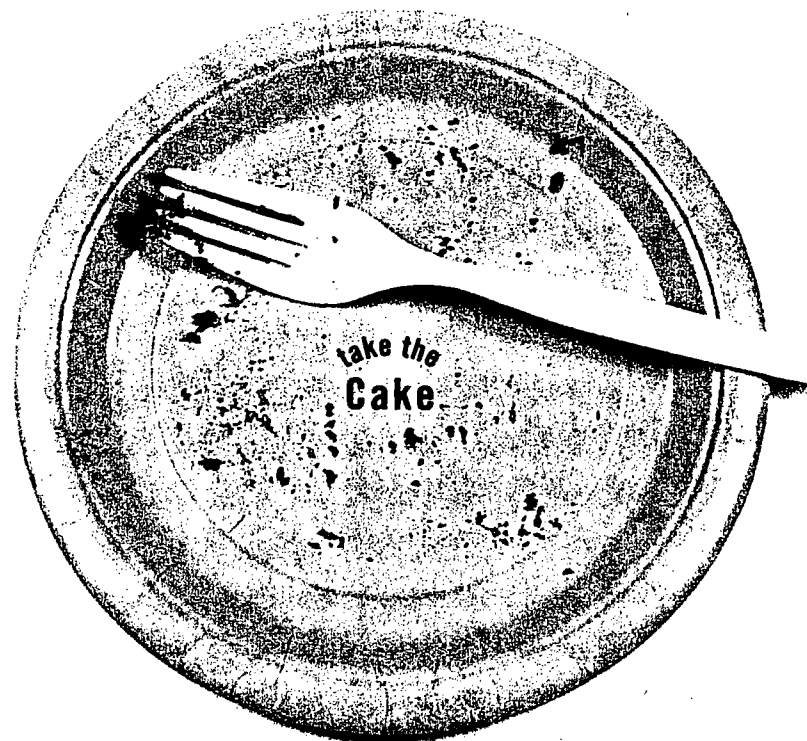

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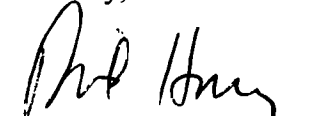

Dear Ms. Fleming,

I am writing to invite you to a very special event, "The Fifth Annual Chef's Best Dinner and Auction to Benefit Food & Friends." Food & Friends is the only organization in the Washington metropolitan area providing freshly-prepared meals to homebound individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS. Our support also includes individualized nutritional assessments and counseling, nutrition and HIV education and cooking classes, and the friendship of our volunteers. Since we opened our doors in 1989 we have served over 584,000 meals to 2,510 people.

Six days a week, Food & Friends volunteers deliver three nutritious meals each to more than 400 men, women and children living with AIDS. These meals provide clients with a day's worth of nutrition and calories. Our menus are designed to meet the special nutritional needs of people living with HIV disease: high in protein, carbohydrates and calories, low in salt, acid and fat.

Because the meal delivery program is labor intensive, it has only been made possible with the assistance of 700 volunteers who staff 17 weekly kitchen shifts and 61 daily delivery routes. It is this support that ensures that more than 1,200 meals are delivered each afternoon Monday through Saturday. And, due to the generosity of many, including all involved with Chef's Best, our meals are provided at no cost to our clients.

On Monday, May 15th chefs from more than 50 of the finest dining establishments in Washington will prepare and serve their finest creations, and then go one step further to donate their talents to a live auction which features travel and food packages. The event begins at 6:30 p.m. and is being held in the Washington Hilton International Ballroom. There will be 1,500 guests each paying \$150.00, all of which supports our programs.

The fund raising success of this event is second to none and has become a cornerstone of our development program. It has grown from 220 guests raising \$40,000 to 1,200 raising \$236,000 - costs have ranged from \$5,000 in the first and second years to \$30,000 last year.

Ms. Fleming, I hope you will be able to join us for what promises to be a very special evening. Please have someone on your staff call to let us know if your schedule will allow you to attend.
