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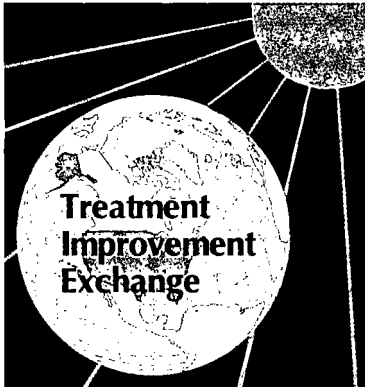

On behalf of the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment, thank you for accepting our invitation to make a presentation at the fourth CSAT-Sponsored State Systems Development Program (SSDP IV) Conference. The conference will take place April 29-May 1, 1998, in St. Louis, Missouri, at the Regal Riverfront Hotel. The theme of this year's conference is, "Meeting Client Needs: Customizing Services."

The conference planners and I are appreciative of your willingness to serve as panelist and make a presentation during the workshop, **I-2: HIV/AIDS-Federal Initiatives**, which will take place **April 29, 10:45 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.** This workshop will be one of several concurrent workshops being offered in this time period. Attendance at past conferences ranged from 500 to 660 participants and included staff members from the State and Territorial Alcohol and Drug Abuse Agencies; staff from local service providers; representatives from alcohol and other (AOD) drug-related associations, as well as other national associations; and representatives from various Federal agencies. There is usually a good cross section of people from the AOD and related fields in attendance and the conferences offer excellent opportunities for interaction among peers.

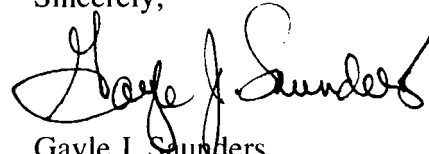
Specifically, SSDP Conference activities provide State and Federal officials and Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant providers a forum to jointly: a) Enhance Federal and State accountability for use of SAPT Block Grant funds; b) Improve State management of Alcohol and other drug treatment and prevention programs; c) Improve treatment quality overall; and d) Disseminate knowledge. address this year's theme. They are: Customer Services: Addressing the Unique Treatment Needs of Consumers in Different Settings; Youth and Families; and Managed Care. The conference structure includes a plenary session for each track, followed by concurrent workshops within that track. The three conference tracks will not be held concurrently, but will proceed sequentially.

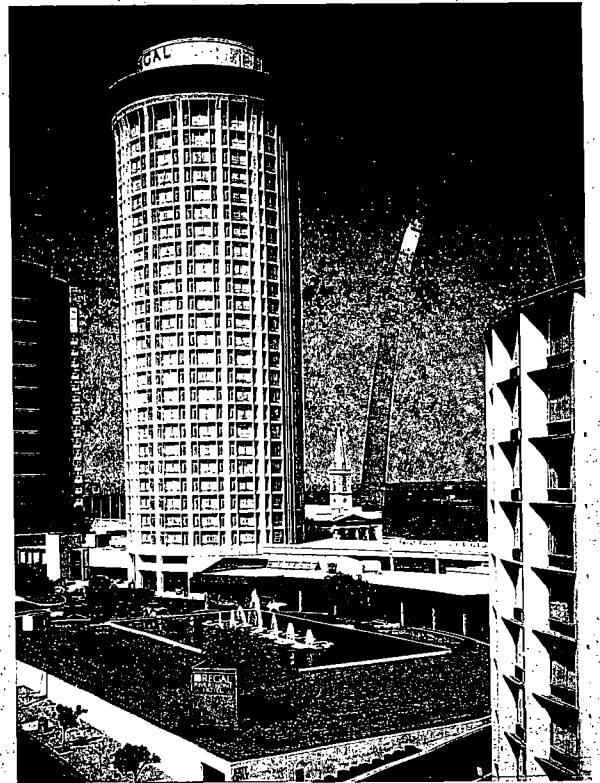
